K.C.G.C. TO BECOME Take-over proposals in White Paper

It will be succeeded by the Voice of Kenya under the name of the Kenya Commission of Inquiry and Information, which was explained in a White Paper issued last night in Nairobi.

"It is our intention to keep the Voice of Kenya free and independent," the Minister for Information, Broadcasting and Tourism, Mr. Acheng Onyiah, said during a briefing to correspondents. "The Voice of Kenya will cater for all groups in the country and for the aspirations of all individuals."

The Minister affirmed that, although the Government proposed taking over control of the K.C.G.C., the Frms would continue to enjoy freedom, as had been shown by the Government and stated publicly by the Prime Minister, Mr. J. Kenyatta.

MEASURES to get more African women into employment were discussed yesterday at a meeting of the East African Women's Seminar at Kabete. The seminar was organized by John Okoth, only for pre-adolescent women and was held in a room at the Kenya Club.

ONE WEEK TRIKE ON EVICTIONS AGREED

THE KENYA FEDERATION OF LABOUR UNIONS has agreed to a one-week strike on evictions. The strike is to be held in support of the Kenya Land Commission's report on evictions. The Federation of Labour Unions is the largest of the trade unions in Kenya and has a membership of over 100,000. The strike is to be held from Monday to Sunday, starting on Monday, January 14th.

DISPARITY IN EDUCATION

There were a number of reasons for this, Mr. Odeyo-Low said. The disparity in education and experience, for instance, many European women had finished education and working experience abroad so that Government and firms wanted efficient people they naturally employed them. Asian women also had better education and experience than African women.

There had also for a long time been a racial attitude on the part of most employers who wanted to employ either Europeans or Asians in skilled posts before employing Africans themselves were allowed to do so.

Mr. Odeyo-Low said that the Government should take steps to improve the position of African women. He said that the Government should provide more training opportunities for African women and should encourage them to take up technical and professional courses.



Diplomatic sources in Singapore said the Premier had been arrested. The radio named the "coup" leader as General Kouprasith Athisa, the Vientiane commander, with the police chief, General Siso, as second in command.

Many leading neutralists were reported held in buildings ringed by troops. In Washington, the State Department said the U.S. "categorically opposes" any seizure of power and called for "immediate release of the neutralists as a first step towards restoring the situation."

The British Foreign Office said Britain was "disturbed" by the takeover, which it regarded as contrary to the spirit of the 1962 Geneva conference agreement which neutralized Laos.

Day after resignation

It said the Foreign Secretary, Mr. R. A. Deller, as co-chairman with Ruzana of the conference, would consult with other Governments principally concerned. In Paris, where the Lodian King Savang Vatthana is due for a visit on April 29, a Foreign Ministry spokesman said France "deplores the coup."
