Best ways to help sought by Ministers

FOOD for the victims of flooding in Nyassa is still the area's most important problem. Requests for further supplies were made to the Ministerial delegation which visited Nyassa yesterday on the orders of the Prime Minister.

Mr. Kroyahla, the delegation met local and Government officials, Members of Parliament and the Regional Assembly in Kismu to discuss the situation created by the floods and the measures that could be taken to deal with it and alleviate suffering.

The delegation was led by the Acting Minister for Home Affairs, Mr. Ashing Onoko, who was accompanied by the Ministers for Agriculture, Mr. M. W. Mwenda; for Natural Resources, Mr. McKenna; the Minister for Labour and Social Services, Mr. Mwenesi.

Water guarantee wanted

With them were the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Lands and Settlement, Mr. P. D. Mariani, and the Permanent Secretary for Home Affairs, Mr. W. Mwenda. They flew over the Kano Plains, the Kilo Delta in South Nyassa and the Buvaya area of Central Nyassa to see the affected areas.

At the meeting in Kismu, long and short-term problems were discussed, and later Government officials and Regional Assembly Members met to draw up proposals for submission to the Cabinet.

The Ministers were told that something had to be done to guarantee the town's water supply. If the flooding became permanent, special arrangements would be needed for the rebuilding of the filtration plant and the construction of new pipe lines.

The Ministers were told that the main communication system for the main Kismu-Kilima road was being damaged by the floods. It was suggested that the Government should consider the possibility of building a road to the town from the Kano Plains.
