CHINA'S PREMIER ATTACKED

Posters say Mr. Chou is being soft

CHINA'S Prime Minister, Chou En-lai, came under attack yesterday in the country's mounting power drama as thousands tramped the streets to demonstrate against opponents of Chairman Mao Tse-tung.

Posters in Tienanmen Square accused Chou of going soft in the struggle — of going soft on the campaign against the Head of State, Liu Shao-chi and the party secretary, Teng Hsiao-ping.

Anti-Chou posters were first on display in Peking on Friday but were swiftly replaced with others supporting him. The new posters said Chou had tried to shield the Finance Ministry. Liu Hsien-shan from criticism for bourgeois policies.

A report by the Peking correspondent of a Japanese daily newspaper said that Chou had broken his silence and advised Red Guards to concentrate their attacks on Liu Shao-chi and Teng Hsiao-ping.

According to the newspaper, which was quoting wall posters, Chou advised the Red Guards to leave other Chinese leaders alone. From yesterday's scenes in Peking it appeared his advice was not followed.

Streams of invective

A big rally was staged in a workers' stadium to denounce the party propaganda chief, Tao Ch'u, who has been taken with the Head of State and party secretary as opponents of the cultural revolution.

Many thousands thronged the main shopping street in Peking and looked at posters denouncing the chief. Dorens of Red Guard loudspeakers were poured out streams of invective against the chief and his disciples.

The latest Vice-Premier to come under attack is Hsien Fuchun, who is Minister of Public Security. Slogans demanded that he should be "burned" and others say "Open Fire" Minister of Public Security.

LOCAL Government in Nairobi came to a virtual standstill yesterday when 2,000 City Council officers, clerical and administrative workers and technicians stopped work under the Ministry of Local Government's refusal to approve expenditure on an agreed new salary structure.

The administrative City Hall closed the city's hall writing and correspondence and stopped the city's garbage collection services and other departments.

City Council officials said they were unwilling to come to an agreement to raise pay and were keeping such financial records as water supplies and garbage collection.

Students remained on duty at municipal departments and the city's police force. Before noon the national flag flew at half-mast in the highest building of the city.

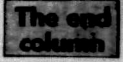

SPRIT OF TASHKENT

A YEAR HAS PASSED since the Tashkent Declaration was signed and all the talk on both sides since then has been of the spirit of Tashkent. It is a year since we prove much in our words but little in our lives.

The Tashkent came into force in 1966. It was signed by Mr. Koyenji, who invited Indian and Pakistani leaders to meet on Soviet territory. It was a landmark occasion because of the hope of resolving the territorial dispute over possession of Jammu and Kashmir, which had flared up since the war of 1965.

The conference ended in the tragic deaths of the Indian Prime Minister Mr. Shastri. After signing the agreement with President Ayub Khan. His successor, Mr. Indira Gandhi, continued on several occasions that there is no change of Indian policy in the Tashkent, emphasizing the need for peace and stability.

The Declaration, designed to introduce an era of peaceful co-existence, set out a road to the eventual settlement, contained key points, including renunciation of war against each other as the fundamental principle, and in addition to two countries agreed to broaden economic and cultural co-operation and to stop hostile propaganda.

Plebiscite in Jammu and Kashmir

Propaganda continues, no less hostile because it is in a quiet zone and it can put its full force into it during the recent hostilities. The root cause of the friction remains, for the issue has not resolved about the future of Jammu or Kashmir. Moreover, the dispute continues over the Rann of Kutch, which lies between N.W. India and West Pakistan. This dispute was admitted to arbitration after signing of the Tashkent Declaration in July 1965, immediately providing the two sides with a mechanism for settling the dispute.

Yesterday's anniversary of Tashkent was marked by a message from President Ayub to Mr. Koyenji, saying that the Declaration had now been fully honoured and expressing disappointment. Indian replies on progress have been made against Indian refusal to come to terms and to accept the principle of a plebiscite.

In mid-1966, India invited Pakistan to another "Tashkent" conference, a reference to Tashkent having no prior conditions. This invitation remained unaccepted and subsequent diplomatic efforts have been abandoned without result.

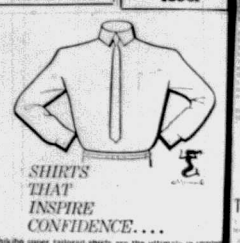

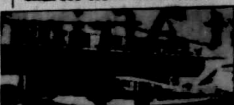

Minister launches voluntary hospital scheme

The voluntary Hospital Insurance Scheme which came into force on January 1 for a contribution of only 18/- a month has already proved itself a success in any one year to the contributor, his wife and his children under the age of 18 years, the Minister for Health, Mr. O'Leane, said yesterday.

A contributor could, if he wished, pay at the higher contribution rate of 20/- a month, in which case up to £168 could be paid as benefit in the course of the year.

The Minister said that this was the second leg of the Ministry's programme to make hospital insurance available to all persons in the country. The first leg was effected on August 1 last year, which was the compulsory scheme which laid all persons with taxable incomes of not less than £50 a month.

In this scheme the Ministry will have the advice and help of the National Hospital Insurance Advisory Council which has now been set up with Mr. K. C. K. O'Shannon as its first Chairman. The Acting Director of the compulsory scheme, Mr. T. Turner, will also help in advising the Minister.

£35,000 MONTHLY BENEFITS

The Minister handed over membership cards issued under the voluntary scheme to the first applicants and said that help was really prompt, for on production of the cards at any of the 150 hospitals approved under the scheme, the Hospital Fund benefits would be deducted from the patient's bill before it was presented to a contributor.

Mr. O'Leane said the compulsory scheme had proved to be a great success, for 50,000 persons had been registered as contributors and nearly 100 hospitals approved under the scheme. Some £35,000 was paid out to about 700,000 contributors every month.

NEW PLAN FOR HOTEL FINANCING

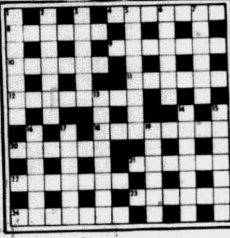

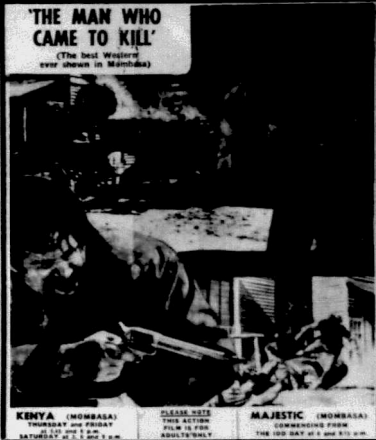

TAIWAN PLANES CLASH WITH MiGs

Pilots claim two Red fighters shot down

Chinese Nationalist pilots based on Taiwan claimed to have shot down two Communist jets yesterday in the first air battle reported between mainland and Nationalist forces for a year.

It was also the first reported clash between the Nationalist forces of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek and the Communists since the current leadership struggle in Peking began.

The Nationalist Defense Ministry said 12 Communist MiG-19s jumped four Nationalist planes on a routine patrol over the Nationalist-held offshore island of Quemoy.

Communists 'kept guessing'

The outnumbered Nationalist pilots shot down two MiGs and the rest fled back to the mainland, the Ministry said. All the Nationalist fighters returned safely to base.

There was no immediate report from Peking on the matter. But the Nationalists kept up their war of nerves.

Asked if they would take advantage of the current situation to invade the mainland, the Nationalist assistant military spokesman, Col. Hsu Tzu-hua, told reporters that the Generalissimo's forces were awaiting the right moment to attack. Asked when the right moment would be, he said it is better to leave the Chinese Communists guessing.

But there is no evidence of any Communist action for several weeks. The Generalissimo's forces have engaged twice in the traditional annual air exercises with Washington and other nations which have not been reported in the United States.

In the past two years the Nationalist forces have shot down 10 Communist jets in their territory, and the Communists have shot down 10 Nationalist jets in theirs.

Reports of the clash in Quemoy came from a Nationalist radio broadcast which said the Nationalist forces had shot down two Communist jets and captured the wreckage.

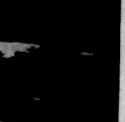

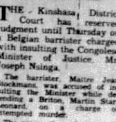

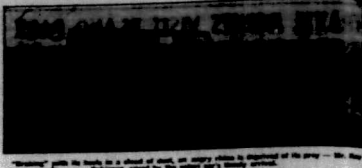

Exceptional success for Mao would enable China to make "a more important contribution to the world Communist movement," he was quoted as saying.

Earlier at a mass Army rally in honor of the visiting Albanian, En Chou, a member of the Politburo and co-chairman of the National Defence Council, described the revolution as "the battleground of an overall trial of strength between the proletariat and the bourgeoisie," including its agents, within the party, according to the Chinese News Agency.

Guinea's newspapers said Chou, in an earlier speech attacked industrial leaders, who incited workers to disrupt the economy.

UGANDA ORDERS 10 accused of aiding Sudanese rebels

Kampala.
Ten Roman Catholic priests have been ordered to leave Uganda, the Government, announcing the withdrawal of their immigration permits, said they had given assistance to the Anyanya, the Southern Sudan rebel group, and had harboured refugees.

Eight of the men are Italian priests, members of the Verona Fathers, and the other two are Spaniards who have been working in Northern Uganda.

Some of them have been stationed in Acholi District and others in the West Nile State. Some have been in Uganda for only a year or two, but it is understood that at least one served in the country for about 20 years.

Doctors served on the priests by police officers yesterday instructed them to leave the country within 24 hours.

Army ambushed

The Government statement said: "These persons have, over a long period, engaged themselves in activities prejudicial to the security and stability of Uganda by giving assistance of various kinds to Anyanya, the Southern Sudan rebel group, and harbouring refugees contrary to the laws of Uganda."

The statement goes on to say that the priests were taken within the territory of Uganda, thus involving Uganda in the Sudanese conflict. As a result of these activities Anyanya forces have, from time to time, crossed into Uganda, burnt houses, ambushed Uganda army and police units, and caused peaceful development and well-being across the border with the Sudan and almost brought a wretched situation, therefore.

RHODESIAN FRONT CRACKING

SIGNS of DISSENSION are apparent not only in the Rhodesian Front. Mr. Smith's party which has powerful parliamentary representation, but in the country at large. 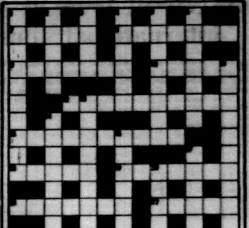

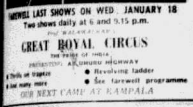

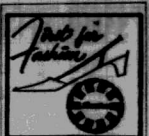

It was the illegal Rhodesian regime, Mr. Ian Smith, who is increasing rising pressure to make clear his policies, after Cabinet meeting yesterday to plot Constitutional changes and a new Parliamentary session, which begins next week.

It was the Cabinet's first meeting in nearly a month and came at a time when many members of the ruling Rhodesian Front were expressing apprehension at what they consider the aimlessness and indecisiveness of Government. Parliament meets next Wednesday for the first time since the breakdown of the negotiations with Britain. It is said rank and file members of the Rhodesian Front want a definite policy statement on where Rhodesia goes now that it seems unlikely there will be any recognition of independence talks between Britain and the breakaway region.

Apart from the legislation on constitutional amendments, the Cabinet was also reported to be discussing the Malvern Petition, initiated by the former Prime Minister of Southern Rhodesia, Lord Malvern.

The petition urges the Government to adjust the Constitution proposed by Britain during the talks ahead of the British General Election. The petition, headed by a group of white Rhodesian business and professional men, has collected about 3,000 signatures. It was signed by Mr. Smith next week.

Those who left Tanzania in protest against African rule at the time of independence, taking all their money with them, will not be allowed to return. This was stated by a spokesman of the Ministry of Home Affairs in Dar-es-Salaam yesterday.

He was clarifying remarks attributed to the Minister of Home Affairs, Mr. Sijona, in an interview with the Government newspaper the *Nitobe* last week.

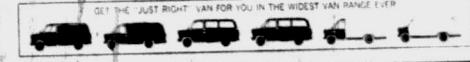

TRADE RESTRICTIONS

IN TIMES WHEN far too much "hanging" goes on in statements made in one country about another, it is surprising to find the proceedings of the C.I.A. which is supposed to symbolize that Africa is not ready to accept to read the good message issued by Uganda's Minister of Commerce and Industry.

Mr. Obwangwe criticized restrictions on the movement of goods inside East Africa, saying such restrictions were contrary to the general policy of the Economic Community as at the Summit Conference held last year in Nairobi. Mr. Wilson has been pushing the British case for entry into the European Economic Community during his visit to Rome, in order to participate in the benefits of a bigger and freer market. The trends appear to be set in the opposite direction in East Africa.

Such trends of policy have been mentioned by talk about East African economic unity yet, in practice, the countries have been drifting apart. Admittedly, all have their individual requirements and ambitions; their Governments are responsible first for their own people, and it will come from the greatest number. Economic aid policies, will finally shape the destinies of those, as of other countries.

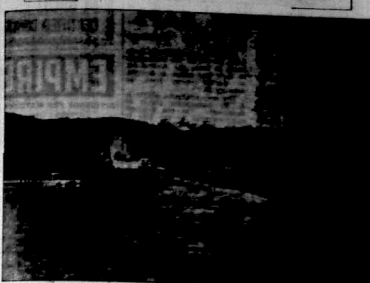

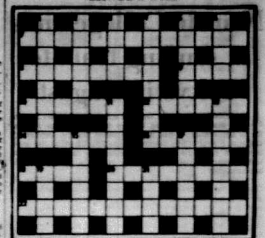

SOUTH AFRICA Plan to deal with action by U.N.

PEKING LEADERS COMMIT SUICIDE
SOUTH AFRICA yesterday announced plans to increase conscription and make all medically-fit male citizens liable for military service.
President Swartz, in a speech at the formal opening of Parliament, announced that the present nine-month conscription period would be extended and the selective ballot for conscripts abolished.
He made it clear that the Government was taking steps to use South Africa because emboldened by a major international crisis through the defiance of United Nations resolutions in Rhodesia and refusal to hand over South West Africa to the U.N.
The Government will be introduced to abolish the ballot and to lengthen the period of compulsory military service and to provide for compulsory military service for all medically-fit male citizens of the Republic. The President said he saw no further details.

30 pct. conscripted in past

President Swartz said that in the past three years about 10 per cent of the male population have been called for service on the basis of the selective ballot. The President said that the new measures would mean that 30 per cent of the male population would be called for service in the next three years. He said that the Government was taking steps to ensure that the new measures would be implemented as soon as possible.

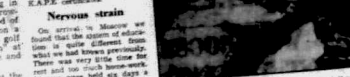

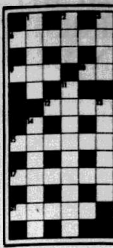
