Members of Mao Tse-tung stepped up their battle for Chinese leadership yesterday with a call for the seizure of all publishing houses owned by "bourgeois reactionaries".

They also issued a new call in Shanghai to revolutionary farmers to overthrow rich landlords and reactionary Right-wing elements. They said the peasant masses would "beat back the evil gusts of counter-revolutionary economic higher wages and better working conditions not supported by the State."

A Beijing correspondent reported from Peking that the opening statement of the Defense Minister, Lin Biao, that China would "total civil war" did not appear to be borne out by information available in the capital.

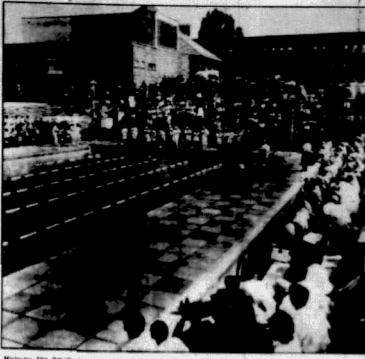

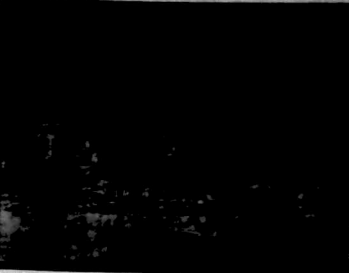

NATION'S ECONOMY BOOMING

Good prospects for 1967—Mr. Mboya

The country's economic boom, which began early last year, continued into the first quarter of 1967 at an even more accelerated rate. Quarterly Economic Report published by the Planning and Development.

Building activity

The report outlined round harvests of several major agricultural commodities, a sharp increase in the level of construction activity and a "high level of optimism in businessmen's expectations for the future" continuing to prevail in the third quarter of last year.

In the private sector, the sales index in the third quarter rose by 16 points over the previous quarter's figure, pointing agricultural.

TRADE BOOM IN KENYA

THIS IS THE KEY paragraph in the quarterly economic report presented yesterday by the Ministry of Finance. Capital investment is rising despite the adverse effects of the British Government's decision to suspend economically motivated aid and the possibility of being somewhat reduced. A high, perhaps slightly high, proportion of capital investment is going into construction, leading to a notable revival in the building trades. Here, however, Kenya is placed at some disadvantage because so many Asian workers were paid and they are also receiving their skilled hands which could prove a serious handicap to the building industry unless Africans can take up these trades quickly and efficiently.

Improvement of agriculture

After a run of difficult weather, Kenya's agriculture picked up last year in several respects, particularly in the production of coffee, tea, maize and permanent grass. The increased maize harvest has enabled a recovery of 117,000 bags to be built up against the average of 100,000 bags in the past. The fall strategy target is 1,000,000 tons. There is no danger of another national shortage but per capita supplies will have to be moved from high yield areas to districts where they are needed.

The increased production of coffee has enabled the Government to increase its investment in the D.A. factor that permits production of more coffee at a lower cost. Temporary nature, the road lift from Nairobi to Mombasa operated by the East African Railways and Harbours Administration to relieve congestion at Kilindini resulted in a substantial profit. India's army on top of the world

INDIA'S belief in the immunity from attack across her high cold frontier in the north was rarely shattered by the Chinese in 1952.

But the lesson was learnt, and today India maintains a fully trained army guarding the frontier, which sometimes runs through territory more than 20,000 ft. high.

The glory of the special problems that were overcome to train and equip this army is told here by CLAUDE MOISY of Agency France Presse.

RHODESIA'S Prime Minister, Mr. Smith, announced yesterday that he was going to establish an independent commission to help to draw up a new Constitution for Rhodesia.

In a policy speech in Parliament covering a wide range of topics, Mr. Smith said the Government was going to lift Press censorship provided a suitable alternative could be found to safeguard the country's security, and establish a tribunal to inquire into the cases of those held in detention under the country's emergency laws.

He told a crowded Parliament "It was something for which the Rhodesian Government had contracted with the British Government in their acceptance of the 1965 Constitution."

His speech reached back to the days immediately before the break-up of the Federation of Northern and Southern Rhodesia and Nyasaland, and up to the time of the last talks about the cruiser Tiger with the British. From Minister, Mr. Wilson.

Mr. Smith accused the British of using "typical double diplomacy" in telling Rhodesians there was no question that the Federation would be broken up.
