## BRITAIN MAY BAR DEPORTEES

### Dar rush to book berths to India

Indian and Arab traders ordered out of Tanzania may be barred from entering Britain. Even though they hold passports describing them as citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies.

India has already said that she will not accept any deportees of Asian origin who do not hold Indian passports. Travel agents yesterday reported a high number of bookings for ships to India.

Mr. William Watson, Head of a Statement on the part of the Canadian High Commission in Dar es Salaam. The statement said: "A situation may arise in which a person holds a passport describing him as a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies but has in fact lost that status as a result of the independence of the colonial territory from which he derived his citizenship."

#### Status may be lost

For example, persons deriving citizenship from connection with Zanzibar before December 10, 1963 may have lost their status, but if the change was made less than five years ago (ie. between February 1, 1962 and December 9, 1963) they may still hold a passport in which they are described as citizens of the U.K. and Colonies. Such a passport would not give automatic right of entry into the U.K.

Some persons who were formerly British-protected persons may have lost that status. Those who have not are passport holders by BPPs.

## Shifita ready for 'third phase' of guerilla war

SHIFITA are preparing for the "third phase" of their guerilla operations in Kenya's north-eastern districts according to reports reaching Nairobi from Somalia.

A visitor to Somalia was taken last week to an administrative outpost at Baidweya, close to Mandera, where he met with local Kenyan, Somali and Shifita. This report is based on an interview he gave to an East African Standard reporter.

Baidweya is used by Shifita for initial parts of "mass" anti-land operations in which they are taking a number of families from Baidweya to the north-eastern districts.

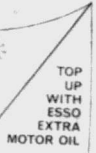

# THE STRAINS ON MARRIAGE IN A CHANGING SOCIETY

## FUTURE OF DEPORTEES AN ISSUE OF THE GRAVEST human significance is raised by the decision of the Indian Government to accept any of the people of Asian origin with expulsion notices in Tanzania, if they do not hold Indian passports.

In defence of the spokesman of the Indian High Commission in Dar es Salaam, who made this announcement, it is said that most of those who have received notices to leave are respected and hold British, American, Canadian or other passports. It may or may not be substantiated, but it is in any event important to the principle, though crucial in the immediate situation.

There are now, or will be in the future, many people of Asian origin who will have East African holding passports at all, or who are at least British protected persons if they obtained British or other passports in India and Pakistan, having been born in one of the British Commonwealth Territories. Their home countries are East Africa.

The Indian Commission's statement is tantamount to saying that, despite the fact of 'rich kin' in the Indian Government, ways to handle all responsibility for people who are plainly of Indian origin, unless they hold Indian passports. Despite India's own domestic difficulties, this is a far-reaching and a humane gesture.

Mr. Dar es Salaam, it is understood that, although it is impossible to know how many of those involved, but British passport, others are British possessed and a few hold Indian passports. The few, therefore, have a refuge, the majority, however, do not, which they must find elsewhere. Should Britain be expected to take all people of Asian origin who may have East Africa during the next few years, either on deportation orders or because they are being considered 'undesirable'?

### Commonwealth solution suggested

During the month described, it seems likely that between 50,000 and 80,000 people of Asian origin, whether immigrants in their own right or born of Asian stock, will have East Africa. A 'golden bridge' will be distributed to them, a basic reality of life experienced by the 'non-desired' officers in the Civil Service, but Government cannot escape their obligations as human beings. This kind of solution is not an unusual phenomenon after a country attains independence, writes Brian Brinkley.

The Tanzanian situation is complicated in the circumstances of the severance of diplomatic relations, because there is no direct British representation, a factor which is not so relevant of the qualities of tragedy, judged against the background of Tanzania's membership of the Commonwealth. India and Pakistan are also members. The solution to a human problem, such as this, could be sought within the Commonwealth by consultation with the principle of the U.N. Refugee Commission, and taking in refugees from various countries, can scarcely be justified on humanitarian grounds in driving away people who have no homes to go to, let alone a future.

An interesting statement from the Canadian High Commission, which is handling British affairs in Dar es Salaam, Asian and African traders who have been with us, but who are citizens of HK and colonies, and just about to leave. Many of them are British subjects and protected persons who enter Britain on entry certificates issued by the British Commonwealth Act of 1962 which make several conditions, principally that an immigrant from the Commonwealth must have a job to go to or be able to prove he can support himself and his dependants without taking a job.

People of Asian origin in East Africa may not be British passport holders or legally British citizens, but have no possible connection with Britain. Many will be ready to go to India or Pakistan in order to make a new start if they have to leave East Africa. They will be considered more or less as refugees, with no companions in any of the other parts of the world, and not treated on their legal merits. Such an arrangement must be made by both the Indian and Pakistani Governments, usually by the former in view of the anticipated exodus. The British Indian High Commission, however, would like to see the Indian and Pakistani Governments, together and in discussion, make arrangements which would be more than the Commonwealth solution in London.

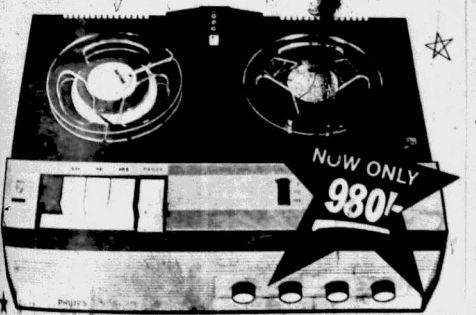

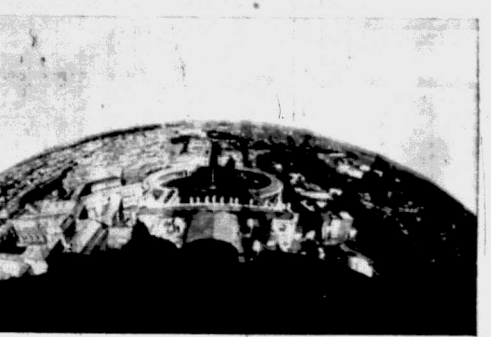

SECONDARY EDUCATION

EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES in Kenya have recently attracted wide attention, both as to the quantity and quality of the facilities available in secondary schools. An allocation of 50 per cent to African children in secondary schools which were previously predominantly Asian or European is not only perfectly understandable but can be considered as only a first step.

The Government of an independent country must be concerned chiefly with national education for the children of its own citizens and cannot indefinitely continue to subsidize the education of children of other nationalities. It is only equitable to provide for the children of its own citizens and to provide for the children of other nationalities on a basis of reciprocity.

Clearly, conditions will have to be such as to attract parents to the schools. Parents will not send their children to a school if the school is not of a standard which is at least equivalent to that of the best schools in their own country. It is equally important to believe that parents are all in the same boat, to the extent that they are not to send their children abroad for their education. Many parents in Kenya do not want to be faced with the same problem.

The fee of K250 per annum, but at the cost of one child sent abroad, is probably an underestimate, because fees at all public schools exceed K200. It is unrealistic to suppose children of people living in Kenya can find fee places in British secondary schools. Moreover, an outlay of £750 as quoted by the correspondent, means much more in Kenya before income tax is levied. How many talented people can afford to spend £1,000 or more per head for their children's schooling?

Some parents are fortunate enough to obtain educational scholarships under government or other schemes, to which the Kenya Government is a party, but no income tax relief is granted for similar purposes, to parents who are privately employed. A revision of the tax allowances for children's education is indicated, in order to bring about uniformity, abolishing the privileges enjoyed by expatriate civil servants and territorial aid experts compared with the lot of privately employed people.

One possible solution advanced here has not been widely understood. The formation of an international school in Kenya, a private school of this kind, with children sent abroad will solve one of the most vexatious problems for expatriate families on the Kenya Government, while liberating additional capacity for local children.

# Farmers' earnings go up 50 per cent

### STOP BUSH POLITICS IN CO-OPS'

In his annual report for 1966, the Bungoma District Agricultural Officer, Mr. Khim, has shown that each returns to farmers in the area of the Western Province increased compared with £255,812 for 1965.

Mr. Khim also stated that the biggest crop was maize. This went up from £272,000 to £300,000 followed by coffee, £122,000 from £51,200. The average for both the crops, however, remained the same each year.

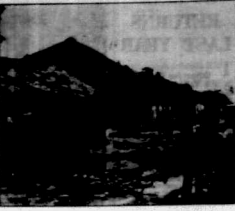

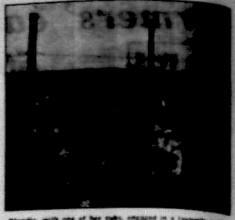

## CHINESE PROTEST REJECTED

### Stay out of our affairs says Kenya

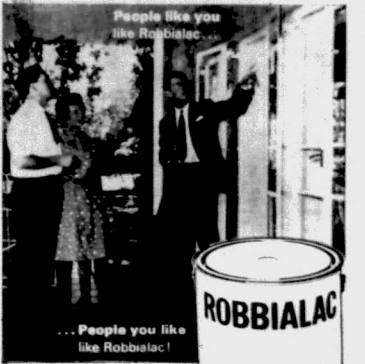

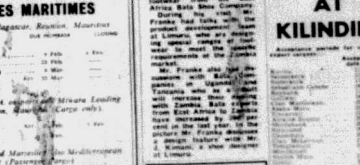

# Engineer to ask for rationing of city's water

Nairobi's City Engineer, Mr. M. S. Mwenja, will today ask permission from the City Council to take "stern action" to reduce the water consumption because the council's plan for a voluntary reduction has been ignored by the public.

Nearly two weeks ago the council asked the public to help conserve water in the face of the continuing drought. Yesterday, a council spokesman "negligible" and the City Engineer would today present certain proposals to the council to reduce the water consumption.

Nairobi uses 15,000,000 gallons a day. If consumption continues at this rate, the city will face a water crisis by the middle of next month unless the rains break. In fact, at least one week's continuous rain is needed for the underground streams, which feed the city's supply dams, to begin running again.

## YIELD NOT BIG ENOUGH

Asked why Nairobi Dam was not being utilized, the present rate of flow of water into the dam is between 250,000 and 500,000 gallons a day and the yield was too small for the cost. He added that the dam was considered a standby in the event of drought and would only be used in the "direst emergency".

Vegetable prices in Nairobi's municipal markets have risen as a result of the drought and some prices have risen by more than 100 per cent. A spokesman for the market said that while vegetables were the drought was the reason for the sharp increase in prices.

The wholesale prices for the various grades of Mwingi Lane Market have risen from 40/- to 20/- per cwt. to between 22/- and 24/- per cwt.

Other vegetables with the highest increase were green peas at 20/- per cwt. and three types of beans at 18/- per cwt.

At comparable rates for the week ending 28th January, while both vegetables and fruit were still at record prices, shortages would be expected if the drought continued.

Shortage of milk butter and eggs was also reported. According to Nairobi retailers, the shortage of eggs was due to a report on the radio on 25th January that the Government had decided to restrict the export of eggs to 25 per cent of the total production.

The order, made by the Minister of Finance, Mr. Jamal, is understood to have been designed to stop a panic flow of capital out of the country following Monday's nationalisation of banks.

All currency going to Kenya or Uganda is now subject to control, where before there was none, although business transactions will not be affected.

Kenya and Uganda are now in the same position as other countries in the Sterling Area, with the same exchange control regulations apply.

All foreign business, including that with the rest of East Africa, is likely to be held up for a day or two until a channel for transacting foreign business can be found.

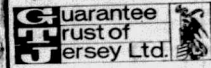

The engineers were drafted to the park for practical training following classroom lessons. Most of them have been in the Army for nearly two years and either have had engineering training lasting more than a year.

Staff Crickie said this was the first bridge-building work that had undertaken so far although a bridge group helped with the construction of a terrace at Lake Nakuru.

The main road to the park was yesterday closed to tourists as engineers laid up one bridge that was in danger of collapsing.

The bridge was blown up with 100 pounds of explosives and said it is rebuilt separate will have to make a detour to the park and enter from the western side.

Work is already under way to rebuild the bridge and intermediate after the old one had been demolished engineers began putting up the new structure which will span 25 feet.

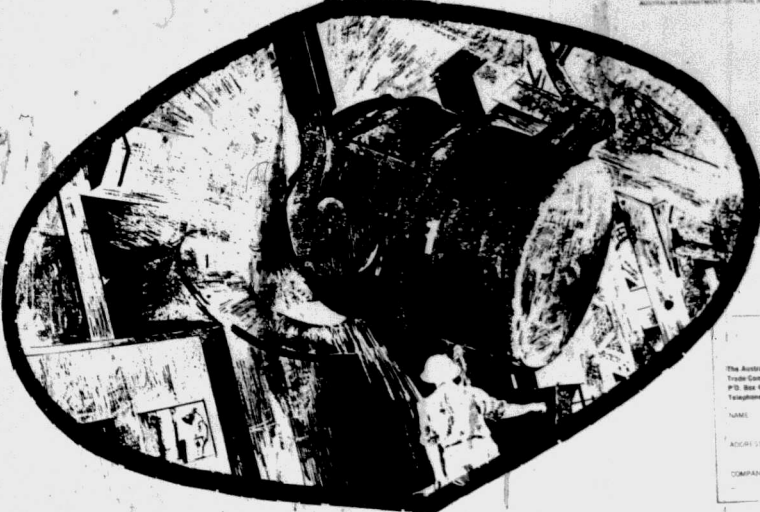

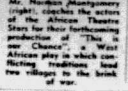

Interest will be payable half-yearly and amortisation is expected for 10 stock of multiples of £10. Stock will be available in multiples of £1.

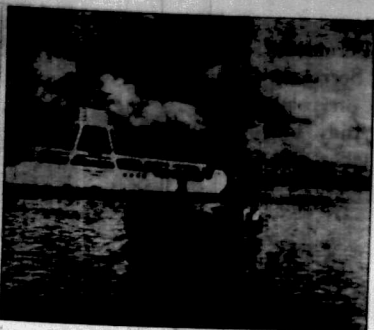

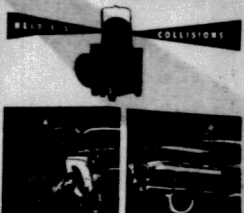

## NATIONALISATION POLICY

**AFTER EVALUATING THE IMMEDIATE** results of the decision to take over the Tanzania banks, the Kenya Treasury re-affirmed the Government's attitude to nationalisation, as expressed in Sessional Paper No. 18 defining African Socialism and its application to planning in Kenya.

The relevant passage states: "Nationalisation, since it does not allow for additional resources for the economy as a whole, will be used only where the national security is threatened, higher social benefits can be obtained, or productive resources are seriously and clearly being misused, where means of control are ineffective and financial resources permit, or where a service is vital to the people and must be provided by the Government as part of its responsibility to the nation."

The Kenya Government and Kapsi are not bent on nationalisation for the sake of nationalisation, but would not hesitate to take over concerns being run to the detriment of the public interest, or where a rift exists between private enterprise and governmental efforts to plan.

A statement issued by Mr. Odino identified Kapsi with President Nyerere's remarks on nationalisation, saying its implementation was "actively awaited". However, it is only fair to say Mr. Odino's statement, was made before the bank takeover.

Nevertheless, if anything, confusion increased in East African banking circles, with conflicting policies being pursued. The Central Bank of Kenya drew public attention to its advice to commercial banks in the view of the uncertain position regarding transactions between the Central Bank of Kenya and the Bank of Tanzania. No clear answer has resulted of how Tanzania will carry the banks, particularly if expropriate staff leave for banking in a highly developed country. Some banks are being forthcoming as to how or when compensation will be paid.

"Let me stress my belief that not only are we doing well in the agricultural sector, but that we can, by judicious planning of our agriculture, continue to expand for many years."

The Minister officially opened the conference after hearing a speech by the K.N.F.U. President, Mr. J. H. Fropold, which he said, hinted that things were not what they used to be.

**CERTAINLY NOT BANKRUPT**

Mr. McKenzie said: "I intend to open by making it clear that I do not accept that there is nothing but gloom in agriculture. We hear nothing these days except complaints. One would think that agriculture was on its last legs."

This was not so he said, and though perhaps not booming all round, the agricultural sector of the economy was certainly not bankrupt.

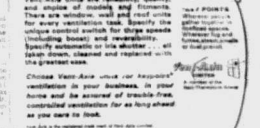
