# MORE TANZANIA FIRMS NATIONALISED

## Moves against other concerns expected

**SWITCH IN BANKING BUSINESS**  
TANZANIA'S eight leading flour-milling firms were nationalised by the Government this effort from noon yesterday. This move follows the nationalisation of the country's banks at the beginning of the week.

The firms affected by the latest take-over are Tanzania Millers' Charide Industries, Pure Food Products Ltd. G. R. Jirwa, Nourmahamed Jussa, Kevla Sattar Mills (at Mbeya), Associated Traders Ltd. (at Morogoro) and Kiswani Mills (at Dodoma).

Succession in Dar es Salaam said yesterday afternoon that the Tanzania Government had also acquired majority interests in a number of the country's leading industries. These were understood to include both Tanzania and Kilimanjaro Breweries, B.A.T., Tanganyika Extract Co. (Bata) and Bata in all of which a 50 per cent holding had been acquired. A 30 per cent holding had been acquired in the new cement factory at Waza Hill— a 12,000-ton undertaking opened this week in which the Government held a 20 per cent interest with 10 per cent in the hands of private enterprise.

In addition, it was announced that 14 societies, many of them with Kenya affiliations, have been struck off the Registrar's List and other culture-related registration.

### Compensation negotiations

The milling firms nationalised yesterday have said that negotiations to reach agreement on 'full and fair' settlement will begin as soon as complete nationalisation is complete. The basis for compensation negotiations for 1966, with all assets and liabilities— including liquidation value of the 1965-66 holding year— will be under the control of the National Agricultural Products Board.

The seven companies in which the Government has acquired a 50 or 30 per cent holding have been told they will have to negotiate compensation with the National Development Corporation. These were corporations which have what firms this compensation would take over over what period it would be paid, but business officials said it would most probably be paid to some extent at least, from the profits of the affected firms.

# Tanzania wants Security Council to visit Africa

MR. John Makola of Tanzania took the chair at the 21st meeting in 1967 of the U.N. General Assembly's Special Commission on Colonialism and almost unanimously attached Britain and Portugal to their African opponents.

Mr. Makola suggested that the Commission should be made up of the five permanent members of the Security Council and the five non-permanent members, but that the Council should also have the right to appoint additional members.

It was not clear whether the Council would be asked to make a formal visit or whether it would be a fact-finding mission. Mr. Makola said that the Council should also have the right to request the United States to contribute to the cost of the mission.

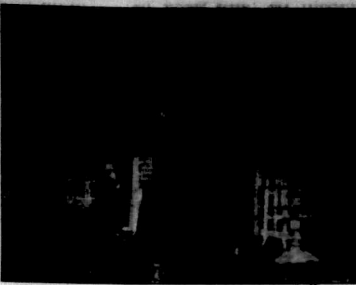

## BANKS TAKE-OVER LEGALISED

### Accelerated aid to poor promised

**TANZANIA** had nationalised the banks because it intended to extend the minority sector to people at subsistence level. It planned to do this in 15 years, whereas the foreign commercial banks could not do it in less than 50 years.

### PEACE DOOR STILL OPEN IN VIETNAM

President Johnson has given an assurance that the door to peace remains open through U.S. planes dropping supplies to the Ho Chi Minh front.

This assertion was made by the Tanzanian Minister of Finance, Mr. Jamal, at a crowded meeting of the National Assembly in Dar es Salaam yesterday. It had been specially called to legalise the nationalisation of the nine Tanzania banks, which was announced last week, as part of the nation's policy of "socialism and self-reliance".

The Bill, which was enthusiastically passed by a debate in which Mr. P. called on the nationalised bank to provide more finance for farmers, provided for the establishment of the National Bank of Commerce to take over the commercial banks' business. Introducing the Bill, Jamal told the Assembly: "The phase of political revolution is over. We have now entered the phase of economic revolution. With our heads cool and our hearts warm, we shall succeed."

Mr. Jamal told the House that commercial banking had been in the hands of foreign interests since the beginning of colonial rule. Banking was a vital sector and was obviously a great danger to national independence. He said that the Government was determined to remove control and dependent on the objective of securing profits for shareholders living.

The council would take over the functions of the Coloured Community Council, the latest stage in its development to self-administration, the Minister said. A Prime Minister would be responsible for the appointment of members who would be elected by the community.

He said it was intended to hold elections to the representative council towards the end of next year or early 1968 immediately afterwards, pending the administration of the affairs would be transferred to the newly formed Council.

Mr. Viljoen said the Government would adhere to an underlying principle by 1961 for the previous Prime Minister, Dr. Verwoerd, that the representative council would be elected by the community and by the representative government.

Under the terms of the Representation of People Act, 1956, the Government would be responsible for the election of the council to be appointed by the Prime Minister.

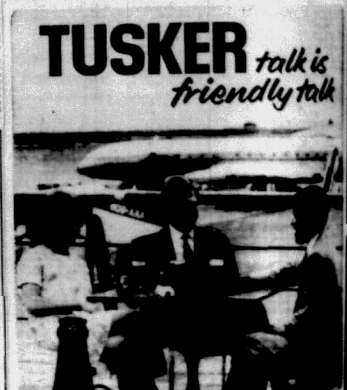

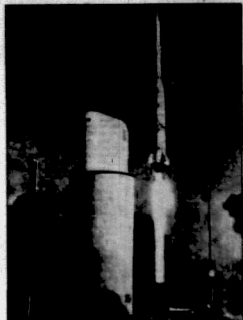

# RESULTS

THERE were 4,019 candidates from Kenya for the Cambridge School Certificate examination in 1962, which was 71% more than the previous year. Of these 4,019 were school candidates, 3,369 were Government - maintained schools presented 3,369 candidates of whom 4,097 gained a full certificate, or 74 per cent, three per cent better than in 1962.

There were 1,661 private candidates of whom 256 gained a full certificate (19.1 per cent) of the 1,661 candidates who failed to gain a full School Certificate, 1,405 were awarded a G.C.E. 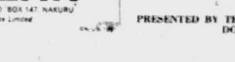

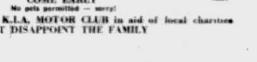

## BUILD-UP IN BORDER FRICTION Soviet troops taken prisoner says China

**BUILD-UP** of friction and potential hostility on the border between China and Russia was reported yesterday. Sino-Soviet relations are reported to be breaking point, and Red Guard posters in Peking claim that there have been border incidents in which Chinese troops have taken Russian soldiers prisoner and then released them.

Both sides are reported to have reinforced their troops in the border regions. The Chinese Foreign Minister, Chen Yi, charged last December that the Soviet Union had moved 13 divisions of troops from Eastern Europe to areas adjacent to China. Even schoolboys in the Soviet Far East are being trained in the use of firearms.

Moscow Radio has stepped up broadcasts in the languages of the Central Asian nomadic Turkic tribes who live on both sides of the border. The Soviet Union has claimed that four years ago 70,000 Uighurs and Kazakhs fled to Soviet Central Asia, claiming Chinese persecution. While most of the frontier is agreed between Moscow and Peking, China is thought to dispute the ownership of about 20,000 square miles of territory.

### Important Soviet base

The area includes the important Soviet naval base of Vladivostok and the burgeoning commercial port of Nakhodka.

In Taiwan the official Nationalist Chinese Central News Agency said 100 people were killed and 500 injured in a clash between pro-Mao elements and troops who retook control in Central China.

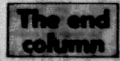

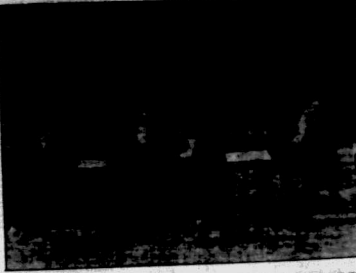

More than 10,000 people lined the slopes facing the harbour entrance as the President inspected a guard-of-honour mounted by the Kenya Navy and then turned to receive the cheers of the *Harambee*'s crew as it sailed by. Cheers and offers in the harbour had been close as that workers could watch the ceremony.

Later in Kilindini Harbour President Kenyatta boarded the *Harambee* and was greeted by the chairman of the new shipping line, Mr. T. R. Mbiti, who introduced Captain P. C. Richardson and the ship's officers to him.

# 30,000 new lines planned for East African phones

Major improvements in telephone and telegraph services throughout East Africa were brought nearer last night with the announcement of the approval of a loan equivalent to \$4,500,000 for this purpose. The East African Posts and Telecommunications Administration programme had been based on the telephone subscribers waiting list and on a growth rate of approximately conservatively estimated at six per cent annually.

## NO HALT IN W. GERMAN AID TO AFRICA

West German aid to Africa will continue to be at least as high as in the past, according to a statement by the German Minister for Economic Cooperation, Kurt Grottel, last night. He said that the German Government would continue to support the African continent in the same way as in the past, and that the amount of aid would be determined by the needs of the African countries.

Automatic teleex exchanges will be installed in Nairobi, Kampala, Kisumu, Mombasa, Addis Ababa and Mada. Additional frequency telegraph systems, including telex, are also envisaged. Provision has been made for the purchase of telegraphs.

## TRADITION OFFENDED SAYS M.P.

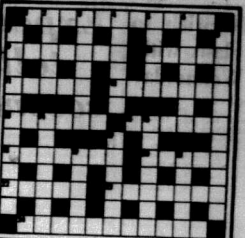
