DAR ESSALEM BANK PAYMENTS Tanzania accounts opened in Nairobi

Two announcements in Dar es Salaam yesterday made it clear that Tanzania is anxious to return to more normal financial and trading relations with Kenya and Uganda.

POPE MAY ANNOUNCE CURIA REFORMS

The Vatican newspaper, L'Osservatore Romano, has reported that Pope Paul VI is expected to announce reforms of the Curia in the near future. The reforms are believed to include a restructuring of the hierarchy and a greater emphasis on pastoral work.

The Bank of Tanzania issued a statement setting out new arrangements for business payments between Tanzania and Kenya and giving guidance to people from Tanzania travelling to Kenya. At the same time, the bank's Governor, Mr. Edwin Mtei, was quoted as saying that Tanzania's recent extension of exchange controls to Kenya and Uganda was still regarded as a temporary measure.

Mr. Mtei said that it was impossible to predict when the measure would be lifted. It was always a temporary measure though. Once we are quite sure that operating procedures will not bring a panic episode, which we can record.

In the statement, the Bank of Tanzania said that it understood that some people and firms in Kenya had been unable during recent weeks to make payments to people and firms in Tanzania because Kenyan banks had not accepted the payment orders on the 400 cheques that they issued for the purpose.

System dismantled

The statement added that a temporary arrangement had been made after the dissolution of Kenyan banks for payments to be made to Tanzania and Kenya. It also mentioned that the system of payment orders had been dismantled and that people and firms in Kenya had been advised to use their respective banks to make payments to Tanzania through commercial banks and the Central Bank.

The National Bank of Commerce of Tanzania was now being allowed to handle all payments to and from Kenya, people and firms in Tanzania should inform their bank in Kenya that they should now be notified in Nairobi of the Central Bank of Commerce of Tanzania in order to ensure that the Tanzanian payment system is fully operational.

Currency now accepted on Indian ship

Mr. H. B. Robinson, Director of the Indian Ocean Shipping Corporation, announced that the company's ship, the S.S. 'Indra', had accepted the Tanzanian currency for payment of freight and other charges. This was the first time that the Tanzanian currency had been accepted for such purposes on an Indian ship.

U.S. food pact with Ghana

The United States and Ghana have agreed to a new food pact, which will provide for the supply of foodstuffs to Ghana from the United States. The pact is expected to be signed in the near future.

Transmitting elephants

NOBODY SHOULD BE ASTONISHED by anything an animal does or is said to do in this part of the world, which is animal crazy. If cats can write letters, what is there remarkable about a lion paying a courtesy call?

Thunder, as he was named, on the end of a lead was led by a lady up the office staircase with two gentlemen pushing from the rear, while the staff watched. Transmitting elephants started a B.B.C. programme newsworthy by the V.O.K. the other day. Mr. John Njoroti has been conducting research in some of the African savannas "Round the World". One intriguing suggestion is to use powerful radio transmitting sets to contact about elephants.

First, catch-up elephants, then strap a transmitter on its back. The job is repeated for several others in the herd. If you think of the Marconi to go to all that trouble to invent wireless for elephants, just consider the scientific knowledge, time, money and effort that went into making satellites.

Signals transmitted from the elephant borne radio are to be picked up by satellites in orbit, two days away. As each satellite goes into its own Colorado, it might be thought the data would be played back to the earth station, giving the scientific information about elephant transmitters. But the satellite is supposed to be the special qualifications an elephant has to be chosen as a radio carrier for this purpose.

Experiment in the belly of a whale

Only Kenya elephants are mentioned in the Guinness Book of Records. The elephant is the largest animal on land. It has been known to weigh up to 10,000 lbs. and to be 10 ft. tall.

Movements of animals and birds and the way they migrate have been and are being studied by the use of radio tags and other methods. Both have been tried on elephants. The first was in 1954 when a radio tag was attached to the ear of a bull elephant in the Gull Stream area of the Gull Stream National Park. It was a 100-watt transmitter which was carried by the elephant on the back. Some 300 reports to the Gull Stream Game Warden and a card to be filed in the Gull Stream Game Warden's office were received from drifting bottles recovered from the sea and analysed every month or so by the Gull Stream Game Warden.

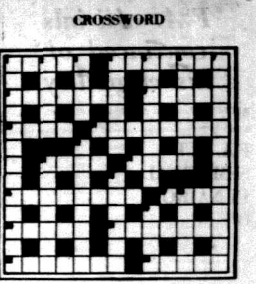

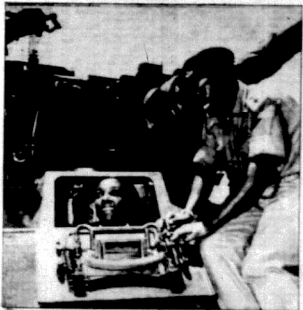

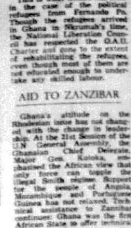

PEACE SHAM BY AMERICANS

Duplicity on Vietnam says Mr. Kosygin

The Soviet Prime Minister, Mr. Kosygin, yesterday accused the Americans of shamming to bring about peace in Vietnam. They had misled the world by their declarations in favour of peace, he said. Mr. Kosygin added that the U.S. was doing all it could to stifle the possibility of peace raised by the North Vietnamese Foreign Minister, Nguyen Du Trinh, in January.

"All it wants to do is to suppress the desire of the Vietnamese people for freedom and independence," Mr. Kosygin said at a Soviet news conference. "Everybody sees that pronouncements of the U.S. about a peaceful settlement are nothing but word-mongering, calculated to deceive public opinion, while the actions are the actions of an aggressor."

Mr. Kosygin also hit out at the U.S. for actions which he said helped the aggressors. "At a time when the U.S. does all it can to prevent talks and end the war, its actions have proved disappointing," he said.

Mr. Kosygin spoke on Vietnam for the first time since he joined the British Prime Minister, Harold Wilson, in an abortive attempt to get peace talks started in London last month. He was accompanied by a six-member delegation from the American Embassy in North Vietnam.

"Unacceptable demands" He accused the U.S. of posing "unacceptable demands" to Hanoi after the North Vietnamese Foreign Minister's statement that peace talks could start once Hanoi was hailed by Mr. Kosygin as the Foreign Minister's offer was an "extremely generous peace initiative".

He added: "There was a possibility of starting talks, and this is just what the U.S. is trying to do with such an offer. However, the American Government did not use this opportunity and the U.S. continues to make its aggressive threats and its forward demands to the Vietnamese people."

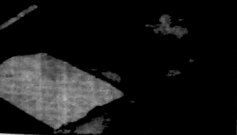

Nairobi City Council cannot continue much longer to finance education without some assistance from the Government, the chairman of the authority's Education Committee, Mr. A. Akoko, said last night.

Presenting his 1966 report to last night's meeting of the council, he stated that last night's expenditure for the year had risen to £1,062,000. Against this, the council had been able to set a sum of £946,700 which the council had had to find from its Graduated Personal Tax revenue.

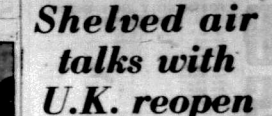

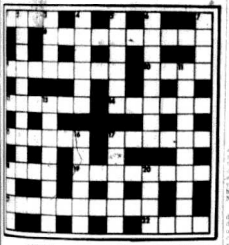

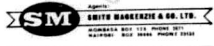

CAR INSURANCE PREMIUMS

A MEASURE OF RELIEF on motor insurance premiums charged in Kenya has been achieved as a result of negotiations between the Government and the Kenya Association of Motorists from March 1, applies only to the basic fee calculation for three motorists having different accident and claims records.

Income not derived from payment of non-employed persons.
Method of Tax Payment
Under section 8 and 10 of the Graduated Personal Tax Act, the City Council of Nairobi has concluded that persons from whom tax is due in respect of income not derived from employment (i.e. self-employed or non-employed persons) shall pay the tax in full on or before the 31st day of March in the tax year.

The taxpayer shall have the option of paying such tax in twelve monthly instalments. Such payments are to be effected by depositing a tax card from the Council and affixing to it each month stamps of the value of the instalments. The stamps are to be purchased from the Council and cancelled by writing thereon in ink or by indelible ink for the date on which they were affixed, and the tax card is fully stamped if and only if the monthly instalments if, and only if, not later than the 31st day of March in the tax year, from the City Council tax card and stamp it up to date.

**Many rent refunds made
under new Act**

Many Kenya tenants have had their house rents reduced by landlords and have received rent refunds as a result of the Rent Restriction Act, which came into force towards the end of last year.

The Act applies to tenanted houses with monthly rents exceeding £20 and to tenanted commercial premises exceeding £25 a month. The maximum percentage by which rents may be reduced is 25 per cent. The Act also provides for the recovery of arrears of rent which were being paid in excess of the lawful amount at the time the new law came into force.

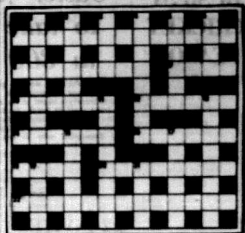

TENSION MOUNTS IN NIGERIA

Break-up imminent say Easterners

TENSION mounted in Nigeria yesterday as crucial talks at the future of the Federation were again boycotted by the key Eastern Region's Governor, Lt-Col. Ojukwu of Ibadan. It was the second day of the talks, by the country's Supreme Military Council, in Benin City, in the mid-West.

The meeting was called by Nigeria's military Head of State, Lt-Col. Yakubu Gowon, after Lt-Col. Ojukwu threatened to take the wealthy Eastern Region out of the Federation. He has also refused to recognise Col. Gowon as supreme military ruler since the coup last month.

The Eastern Region's Governor, Lt-Col. Ojukwu, has refused to attend the talks and has called for a general election in the region.

The military leaders have warned that they will take further action if the crisis is not resolved by the end of the month.

The Government has offered to negotiate with the Eastern Region on the basis of the 1963 constitution, but Ojukwu has refused to accept this offer.

ONE or more Western delegates are expected to table proposals next week to give practical effect to the United Nations General Assembly's decision to divest South Africa of its mandate to govern South West Africa.

Informal discussions in New York and representatives of the United States, Canada and Italy had discussed privately how the U.N. might deal with the problem and that their ideas would be presented shortly in a formal memorandum.

The United States, in particular, has been criticised for failing to put forward any firm proposal for the consideration of the 14 members of the Security Council.

It is understood that the American representative, Mr. William Rogers, was appointed to be the American representative with the announced aim of making a meaningful contribution.

In fact, he has been somewhat flustered by leaving the impression in the quarters of the United States that he is not interested in solving the South West Africa problem, but is only interested in making a statement which will be made at the committee.

The committee, headed by Mr. Jameson, has already held a number of meetings and will probably report back to the Security Council in the next few days.

The General Assembly is expected to recommend that the issue be transferred to the Security Council.

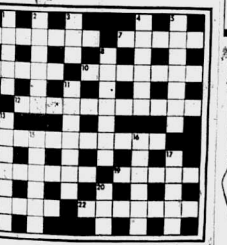
