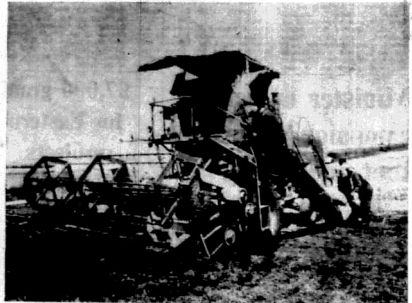

Trade and entry permits

Stringent application of the trade and entry permit regulations could seriously increase unemployment in Kenya. Mr. George Lyons argued in a recent letter. He has received support from other correspondents, including Africans.

The burden of complaints on every side is that uncertainty has been heightened throughout commerce and industry, while many Africans have been thrown out of work because expatriates are leaving. The Asian exodus will run into many thousands, some Europeans as well, but there will not be a transfer of jobs to citizens. Some will shut down their business and almost all will be behind out of work servants.

One correspondent today queried the case of a modest business being closed, resulting in 25 employees losing their jobs. "Never has the commercial community been faced with so many shutdowns," writes a second, who fears that unless the appraisal is made "irreparable damage to the prosperity of Kenya will be caused."

Self-deception that all is well is dangerous to the country's welfare. A sure sign is the Stock Market, where prices are drifting and speculation was — "because it hampered economic development without encouraging indigenous enterprise."

Two more new roads serve areas with heavier traffic



Now that the completion of the Nairobi-Mombasa road is in sight with a mere 24 miles left to be bituminised, the Ministry of Works is this year concentrating on several new road projects to be launched in other parts of the country. These are, of course, in addition to the projects already in progress.



The old road through Tsimba (in the distance) will soon be replaced by the new road now under construction.

This section comprises a total of 90.3 miles which is now being bituminised to gravel standards. Another project to be launched shortly is an Eastern Province road near Mera, covering over 110,000 to construct and starting out improvements on more than 55 miles around Mera Kenya, composed of eight miles between Embu and Mera, another six-mile stretch between Mera and Keroga, and 41 miles beyond Mera to Tsimba, linking Nairobi with Mera on the main trunk road leading to Kisumu in the North Eastern Province.

"The construction of roads is a very laudable aim," Mr. Simon Mwangi, the Ministry's Engineer-in-Chief, explained. "Apart from the actual time it takes to build roads—which can be anything from two to five years—a great deal of survey and research has to be done

before a final decision is taken on which roads in which part of the country have first priority and are economically profitable."

Roads are reported made by Provincial representatives in collaboration with the Ministry of Works. Teams then set out to survey the area and assess the urgency of building or improving on the roads in that region. After

consultations are held at headquarters, the decision is then taken as to which roads merit construction. Factors include rate of traffic, growth, agricultural productivity, population density and so on.

Much as the Ministry would like to respond to public demand for roads, growth on the Tsimba-Mera section also rose by 12.5 per cent and on the Keroga-Keroga section it climbed up by 15 per cent.

The project in Nyarua will form part of the trunk road from Keroga through South Nyanja to serve the highly fertile Keroga highlands, marketing centres like Keroga, other centres such as Mera, and settlement schemes of the district, gold mining at Mbaraka and the fishing industry at Lake Victoria.

It will also provide yet another vital outlet between Keroga and neighbouring Taitania, a great enhance confidence between Keroga and the rest of Kenya as there is no direct rail connection to Keroga and beyond.

The agricultural wealth of the area is well known and the road will give a boost to the marketing

of dairy produce such as cotton, sugar and pyrethrum. The existing road will be bituminised after resurfacing and widening and will also involve the construction of six reinforced concrete bridges and the laying of large pipe culverts.

The project in Eastern Province is part of the Keroga-Eldoret highway programme linking Nairobi with Aden, Aden and the same area link Keroga, the Keroga-Eldoret Provincial administrative centre with the rest of the country.

The Keroga-Keroga portion will also link Keroga District headquarters (Keroga) with a good road leading to the capital via the Fort Hall road.

Keroga is the centre of a productive area near Mt. Kenya where crops like maize, coffee, tea and beans are grown. The recently established tea nursery and tea factory at Keroga will also receive a boost with the bituminisation of the land.

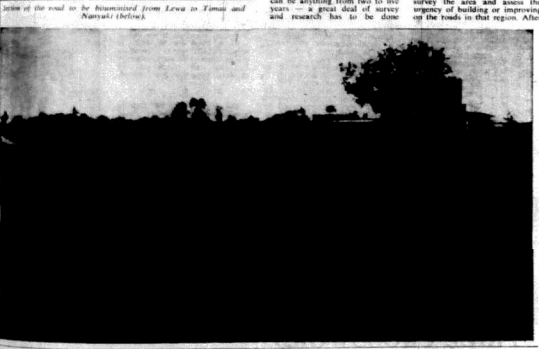
Not only will the Embu-Eta stretch cater for surrounding areas producing tea, coffee, maize, pyrethrum, tobacco, cotton and so on, but it will serve a densely populated area. A cattle ranching scheme is to be started here soon.

The Nanyuki section of 41 miles is being completely resurfaced so that instead of passing tortuous curves through wild, unenclosed land the road from Tsimba through Embu leading to Mera will now pass through the new Mera settlement scheme, the large sheep and wheat farms nearby and it will run straighter and wider than the former narrow road built for emergency purposes in 1945 by the Ministry of Works to speed up communications with Embu.

Already, the soil has been dug up by tractors and a broad, brown path has been cleared through the green plant near Mera in preparation for the building of the newly aligned road.

Both projects—in Eastern and Nairobi Provinces—are by no means the only road works being planned this year by the Ministry. They are integral parts of a general road programme by the Ministry to establish new roads and improve existing ones throughout the country.

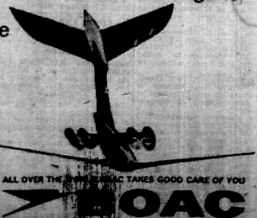

Record-world jungle has few survivors

Of the 50 or so new pop records that a disc-jockey is sent every Monday, about five will survive the week. In another fortnight, only two will have escaped oblivion.

These will be heading towards the charts — that cross between the record league table and racing formbook on which the life of the pop music industry depends. And out of every 10 new releases, only one reaches the lower end of the charts. It can count itself fortunate.

What are the charts and what do they mean?

Usually, the more spectacularly these, the more famous they fall. Three weeks on the charts is about average.

Of course, there are exceptions. Groups like the Beatles and Rolling Stones rarely enter the charts lower than 10th position. Others, like the Foundations and the Bee Gees, have worked their way to first position.

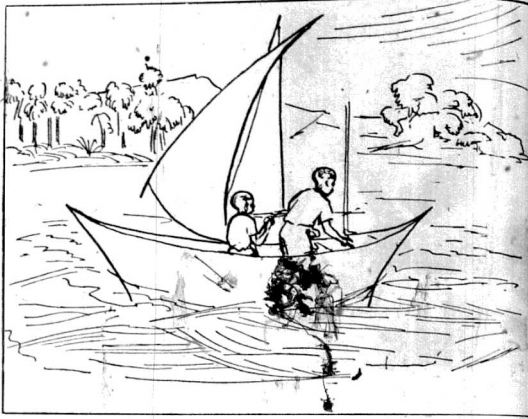

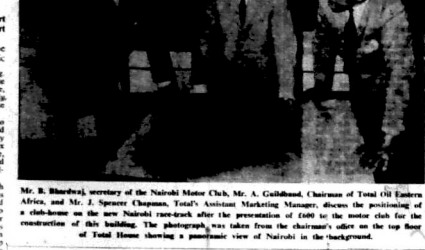

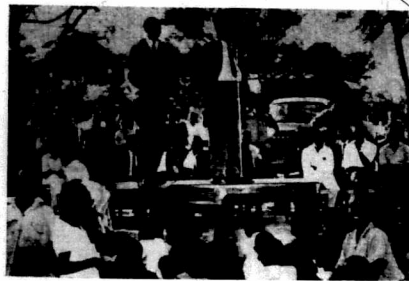

Five years ago a young girl, Miss X, arrived at Kenyatta Hospital in Nairobi. She was suffering from a disease whose name strikes terror into the hearts of people throughout the world. Cancer. Miss X, just one year then, had a form of the disease peculiar to Kenya and other countries across the central belt of Africa. The tumours usually affect the face but can appear in other parts of the body.

In the girl's case, both ovaries were cancerous. Normally such a case would have little hope of survival. All that the future holds is the prospect of agonising pain and a lingering death.

A little more than six months ago, however, the girl, now markedly restored to the hospital as a mother-to-be and has since given birth to a perfectly normal, healthy child.

The young mother — she is still in her teens — was one of numerous young Kenyans suffering from the particular form of cancer known as Burkitt's lymphoma. It was named after the man who first brought the attention of the world to the disease, Dr. Denis Burkitt.

The girl was one of the first of a growing band of young people who owe their lives to the pioneering advances made by Kenya research surgeons and doctors.

The surgeons at Kenyatta Hospital who, for some years, have been carrying out research into the forms of cancer most prevalent in this part of Africa are leading a claim to fame.

"We prefer to say that it is patients as in a state of long-term remission," said one.

The fact remains that of the long-term remission patients, few have any trace left of the cancer disease, but they are kept under observation and return to hospital from time to time for a full check-up.

World-wide interest has been shown in Burkitt's lymphoma. It is believed in some quarters that it is derived from certain types of virus.

Research is going on in Sweden, Kenya and other countries across the continent in the United States. One reason for this is that from young Kenya cancer patients.

Doctors believe that it may be for which a virus can be identified along because of a laboratory study that it may be linked in some way to one of the world's greatest child killers, acute leukaemia.

The virus may be transmitted, it is thought, by mosquitoes, ticks or flies. The highest incidence of Burkitt's lymphoma occurs in areas of high humidity, high temperatures and high rainfall, such as around Lake Victoria and the Great Lakes. The reason the incidence is so high in these areas is not clear.

The fight against the disease in Kenya has been heightened by the introduction of a new form of treatment which involves vaccinating the patients with extracts of cancer tissue.

Best results from vaccine

This has been going on since 1961 and is one of the most advanced forms of cancer research. Kenya is about the only country in the world where it is particularly type of therapy is being perfected.

Each week on Monday afternoon, a batch of tissue and blood serum from patients at Kenyatta Hospital is air-transported to the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm.

There in the laboratory of Prof. George Klein, a leading tumour biologist, the tissue is subjected to radiation.

It is exposed only long enough to stop the cells multiplying themselves but not sufficiently long enough to kill the cancer cells.

A week later the tissue is returned to Nairobi where it is passed through a sieve and after being introduced into a saline solution, is given to the patients as a vaccine.

Every patient is vaccinated with his or her own tissue. This is essential as with any organic transference, patient's body might reject the tissue of an other subject.

The patients are also treated with the best results, or as is the case with Burkitt's lymphoma, growth has occurred in cases where it would have been expected to be a source of the tissue.

The Kenya research team has published a paper which shows quite clearly that results are better where patients have received the vaccinations and drugs than those where treatment has been by drugs alone.

About 250 cancer patients are being treated at Kenyatta Hospital each year and of these about 40 are children suffering from Burkitt's lymphoma.

Some in whom the disease has progressed to a more advanced stage or in two areas will probably die. But even now at the hospital there is a little girl who has reached Stage Four of the disease where the brain has usually been invaded.

A year or so ago this girl would have been doomed. Now the doctors are confident the disease will be reprieved.

The prospects for children on the island of Kenya has affected only one area area is fairly good. As much as 71 per cent of them will progress into the long-term remission stage, which is an achievement and a triumph for the research team.

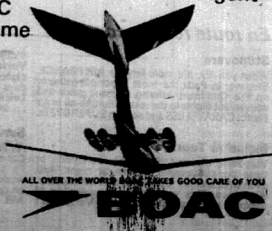

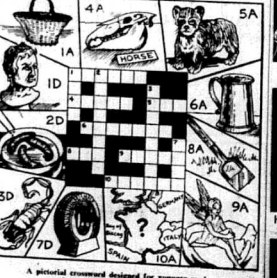

Asian immigration from East Africa to Britain is to be limited to less than 1,500 a year under a new Bill to be introduced in Westminster next week.

The figure of 1,500, for whom vouchers under the Commonwealth Immigration Act are to be set aside, will also include people from Aden, Malaya and Singapore.

The Home Secretary, Mr. Callaghan, said yesterday that the law would also close loopholes which allowed Commonwealth immigrants from other areas to stay in Britain even if they entered the country illegally, provided they avoided detection for more than 12 months.

Dependants allowed

The Bill would deal with the sudden rise in immigration into Britain of those Asians in Kenya who took British citizenship when Kenya became independent in 1963, and who were leaving now because of uncertainty about their futures.

The Home Secretary said in a feature there would be an allocation of 1,500 vouchers a year for immigrants, whose dependants would be allowed to join them. "In this way it will be more possible for immigrants from East Africa to arrive here at a rate at which they can be absorbed into the community," he said.

REVIEW OF LEISURE TRENDS AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN EAST AFRICA

From Dar es Salaam the Air Comore takes some two and a half hours. From time to time far below there will be a fishing boat to break the monotony of blue sky and sea; but for the most part there will be nothing.

With still more than an hour's flight ahead, a tiny mound appears on the horizon which gradually increases in size.

This is La Karulla, an active volcano (7,874ft) that dominates the island. From the distance it appears to rise sheer out of the sea, but the effect of refraction should not be overlooked as it often is by a haze of white smoke.

This is the first dramatic view of the Comores. An island comes into view. Here a group of men on a pale blue velvet cloth stand on a fishing boat in the region of the tropical vegetation and the plane makes a rapid descent to land at Moroni Airport.

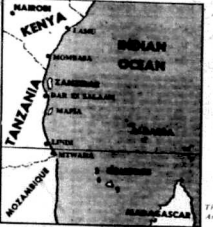

Coconut trees or great clumps shell for the hotel and beach from the heat of the day and provide a picturesque surrounding.

The excellent French food and wine are, of course, a welcome change from the terrace of the Hotel. There is a magnificent view of the jagged rock coast that stretches for miles.

For the goggling and spear gun enthusiast there is, no need to travel far. A few strokes from the beach and he is swimming over crumbling rocks encrusted with coral and absorbing in multi-hood tropical fish. Facilities for deep-sea fishing will shortly be offered to add to the attraction of this hotel.

GERALD CUBITT describes a visit to the Comoros Archipelago

The three other main islands were placed under French Protection in 1901. In 1902 a law was promulgated that placed them all under the Governor of Madagascar and the Comoros Archipelago became known as the "Madagascar Dependencies".

Madagascar, known as "Madagascar" since all his conquests rights to France.

The French administration was centred in Diouaï, a small island near to Moroni, which became the capital. The French granted the Comoros the status of a colony in 1947 and the islands became an overseas territory.

They retained this status after the neighbouring countryside was placed in the hands of a Council of Government and a Chamber des Députés.

The natives of the Comoros Islands are of mixed origin. The population includes Arabs and Chinese, Timanaka (Indian to Malawi), Antalanas, settlers from Madagascar, Malak and natives from the continent of Africa.

One of a total population of 250,000 people about 80% are French and Creoles. The fauna of the islands is much more closely related to Madagascar than to Africa and there are certain birds and a species of lizard that are unique to the archipelago.

Grande Comore is the largest island and its main town, Moroni, is the seat of government. It is an attractive little town situated at the foot of La Karulla. It has a long wharf and a well-protected harbour that provides sanctuary for the fishing boats that seek shelter from the occasional severe storms.

Behind a very narrow twisting street and old stone houses, some with magnificent carved wooden doors similar to those that can be seen in Zanzibar, the market place is a busy scene. The market is in Moroni.

Each morning the women from the neighbouring countryside come to the market to sell their produce. They wear a rich variety of patterned cloths that provide a kaleidoscope of colour, almost too confusing to be photographed.

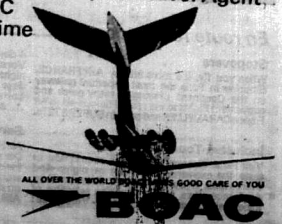

I put in several methods of the right width for the vase. I found during the arranging that "Florapak" has a major advantage for people like myself. Earlier attempts at professional-looking arrangements have gone away the moment I made a false move and placed a stem in the wrong place.

Putting it out again has meant at least half of the arrangement being pulled out with it. This does not happen with Florapak as stems slide smoothly and easily out without upsetting the rest of the flowers.

Florapak can also be used by cutting up into squares and packing them tightly into a vase. Another use is to crumble it inside a closed plastic bag and add it to the water.

When it is thoroughly absorbed, it can be pressed into a container and covered with crumpled wax paper.
