## Bill seeks popular vote for Presidency

**Parliamentary vote to change the method of electing Kenya President to be put to referendum**

Parliamentary candidates will be notified by each of the registered political parties taking part in the election. Each party may nominate only one candidate, and no candidate may stand without the support of a political party.

To be President a candidate must still win a constituency seat in the election. The Bill proposes to restrict the number of candidates who stand in an election to the number of seats in the constituency. The Bill also provides for a referendum to be held in Kenya to decide whether the present method of electing the President should be retained or whether a new method should be adopted.

It is proposed that at the time of a general election every elector should be given the chance to vote for the presidential candidate of his choice as well as his constituency M.P.

## Kenya Asians find India a gateway to Britain

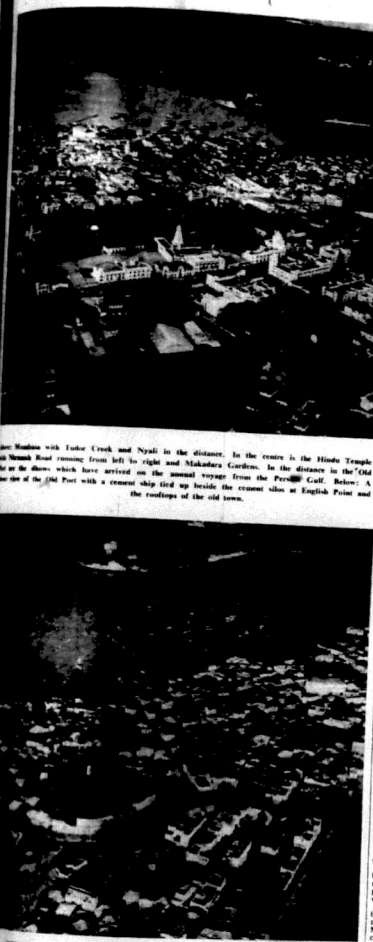

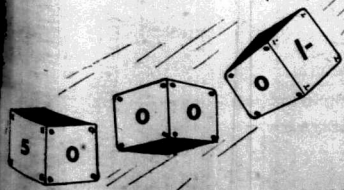

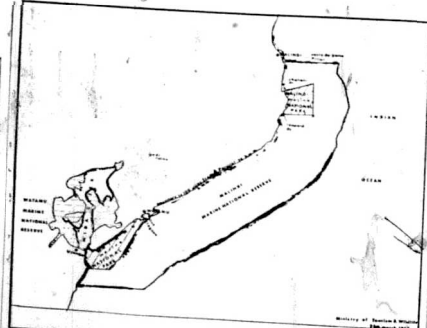

**KENYA LEADS WORLD WITH NEW MARINE PARKS**

**Standard Staff Reporter**  
 Announcing the formation of two marine national parks and two marine national reserves yesterday, the Minister for Tourism and Wildlife, Mr. Ayodo, claimed for Kenya the distinction of being the first country in the world to comply with the recommendations made by the first World Conference of National Parks on marine sanctuaries.

The two parks, which come into being today, are situated near Malindi and Watamu. Mr. Ayodo said they should be a significant addition to the tourist attractions of the national park system.

One, the Malindi Marine National Park, is between Chaniro Point and Lamoo Point, to the south of Malindi township, and (about 10) nautical miles out to sea.

The other, the Watamu Marine National Park, lies from the entrance of Malindi Creek and south of high-water-mark to the reef.

The Malindi Marine National Park covers 70 square nautical miles of sea, extending from just past south of Malindi to just a 100-ft wide strip of shoreline along high-water-mark.

Yesterday Mr. Ayodo also gave the director of the Kenya National Parks, Mr. Peter Olenka, a cheque for £15,000 for national park development, £4,000 of which is to be used specifically for setting up new parks on their feet.

The National Parks staff working in the new areas already immediately. Mr. Ayodo said: "We have an office on the beach at Malindi and this will be used as our administrative head quarters. We will start right away with about a dozen squats and residential huts. He declined to name the new warden who would take charge of the area. Presumably he will be back, Mr. Ayodo said.

The aim of the two parks, according to the minister, is the maximum protection of all marine life, but for the time being, the fish to be protected will be honoured.

The parks would be marked by buoys, with separate markers for the coral garden areas. Mr. Ayodo said Members of the public would be charged free to visit the coral gardens on the same scale as other

flows to national parks on land. In other areas of the parks there would be no charge for swimming between high and low water-mark, and residents on land adjacent to the parks would not be charged for boat or motor-cruiser access to the water.

Traditional rights of navigation would be observed, but fishing would be allowed. Spear fishing, spearfishing and poaching would be prohibited.

Mr. Ayodo said other marine parks might be designated if they were found to merit this treatment. In a prepared statement issued yesterday he said:

"Realizing that the protection of wildlife and its habitat is just as important in the sea as on land, and that Kenya's tropical waters offer as fine an array of spectacular fish as any place in the world, the Government of Kenya made provision for the establishment of a marine national park."

It is an excellent day to announce this morning that I have signed the Gazette notice declaring these marine national parks.

Before dealing specifically with these areas, I would like to draw your attention to the international importance of so protecting these waters. It is the first country in the world to actually establish marine national parks in accordance with the recommendations made at the World Conference of National Parks held in America in 1962.

The conference invited the Governments of all those countries having marine fisheries, and other large marine fisheries, to establish a number of marine parks and reserves of strategic marine parks or reserves of special significance from the point of view of marine resources and further extending national parks and reserves.

The two new marine national parks have been declared to give complete protection from human interference with the beautiful marine flora and fauna, on the same scale as protection has been given to our many other national parks, to the terrestrial fauna and flora.

The coral gardens of red, yellow and green coral, interspersed with many other varying shades of these

colours, are the habitat of many thousands of different species of colorful fish, including Angel and Parrot fish, starfish, different crabs, comber, lobster, sea urchins, and even Rickettsia or sea slug which is a great Chinese delicacy.

Also among the coral can be seen, swarming to the slightest movement, the beautiful marine plants such as sea anemone, and a multitude of different kinds of sea weed, giving a blaze of colour in shades of red, yellow, brown and fawn.

"Added to this, we have the vast array of shell fish, which give even more beauty and colour to this spectacular underwater garden. Of particular importance are the large Tiger Cowrie and the Giant Cowrie shells which can be found in almost any colour. They vary in size from a few centimetres to several inches, and their very beautiful shells have been collected for souvenirs in such large numbers that today they are rare. They were, therefore, the first to be protected in the parks. The Combs - also called the Brown and Brown Turbo shells and of course, limpets, gastropods and of course, sponges, water moulds, in protecting this wonderful habitat for pearls, and its other additional results is the tourist attraction of our country."

# Commons backs motion condemning Rhodesia

A Conservative amendment to a Government motion on Rhodesia was defeated in the Commons on Wednesday night by a majority of 94 (191 to 27).

## LABOUR DEFEATS TORY AMENDMENT

The British Government in an emotionally charged Parliamentary debate has beaten another motion against Rhodesia and its immediate peace talks.

## ISRAELI STAGE BIG ARMY PARADE

Israel will stage its largest military parade in Jerusalem on May 21 to mark the 20th anniversary of Israeli independence.

## President by popular vote

Amendments proposed to Kenya's Constitution convert the former indirect election to direct method of electing a President. As set down in Mr. Njoroge's Bill, to be introduced into the National Assembly next week, the new system removes the presidential election from the hands of M.P.s in the House, placing it instead with the people through popular vote.

The amendments fulfil the intention that the President should derive his mandate directly from the people, thus setting a different course from the draft rules produced last year by a Select Committee. The new proposals are altogether more attractive and logical than the method set down in the Constitution adopted at independence. They do not tally with either the American or British models, since they are tailored to suit Kenya's own political conditions.

Provision is made for the election jointly of M.P.s and the President on the same party ticket and indeed on the same ballot paper. What is envisaged is that the parties will choose their leaders to go forward as presidential candidates. The name of the party's presidential nominee will be paired with that of its constituency candidate. The individual voter will inscribe the cross casting his vote for (a) the presidential and (b) the constituency candidate.

There is no limit to the number of political parties, provided every party nominated by a local authority elects, as in having authority elected, it is intended that independent candidates will disappear, because nobody can get elected unless approved by the party leader. This stipulation is intended to prevent candidates confining the electorate by attempting to start a party though not officially chosen.

The responsibility of strict discipline all the way from the local committees to the centre is implicit in the new electoral system. Nobody can be elected from the floor of the House as a constituency M.P. There are additional provisions to cover the eventuality of a presidential election being challenged and finally invalidated. It follows the party will choose its own presidential candidate, not nationally popular, commanding general support, and also acceptable in his own constituency, for a definite

A change in nomenclature is proposed for the Specially Elected Members, whose numbers remain 12, but they are now to be called "Nominated Members." They are provided with special experience and/or to make up a working majority if the ruling party has only a slender lead in the House.

The group of pictures was taken at a typical working day and the photographers explained the fascinating contents of the pictures were exhibited. Pictures taken in the situations and circumstances in which pictures are taken can be interesting and instructive, and members learn a great deal about technique. Apart from the print and slide covering, the society members professional photographers to institutions, which a suitable model can be found, members bring their contacts and equipment along to show them and slides.

The fact that the society has a president and vice-president who are the subject of photography from two entirely different viewpoints—Mr. Whittingham from the purely technical and Mr. Morris from the artistic—should make for some lively controversy during meetings this year, so that members will have the benefit of both kinds of criticism for guidance in their work. The days when the society used to have to meet around a table to place for their meetings are thankfully past. In 1952 it had difficulty in expanding because of this problem and because it could not set up a dark room and storage cupboard. The same year an opportunity arose for the society to settle when construction of the Kenya Girls' High School was completed and the girls moved out of their 'Arboretum' dormitories. The Kenya Arts and Crafts Society moved in, and has since held its weekly meetings there. With the move, society members became wood-workers, electricians, plumbers and painters. Some from unskilled positions were assisted in learning the art and craft, and photographs of furniture were taken in exchange for expert assistance and walk-board, and from the interior changed shape to a large room with cupboards and darkrooms at the back. Electrically order and the necessary equipment were arranged and the new 'home' was ready some weeks later. Chief figures in the society have been the president, Mr. Dick Whittingham, and Mr. Jack Bennett, who is one of the best photographers in the society, has having won many excellent prizes in the Kenya Travel and Photography competition. He had another which he had exhibited at the Royal Photographic Society Exhibition in Britain. He was also a past president of the society. The objects of the society are to promote the study and practice of photography in all its branches, to disseminate technical, artistic, and scientific information, and to stimulate the interest of the public in the art and objects of the society by holding exhibitions, public lectures and demonstrations. With this in mind, the society held an exhibition of photographs in the Kenyan Maile Theatre for three weeks last year. The society's dark room and printing equipment is available for the use of members and approved visiting photographers on deposit of 25/- for the issue of a dark room key. The deposit is refunded with the return of the key. Another facility for members is a photographic library. There is a wide representation of the society, and all members have different aims and objectives in becoming members. About 90 per cent of the members are non-participants in the social photographic side, but come regularly to the meetings to see the slides and prints, and perhaps join in the general discussion. The most of the remaining people prefer colour photography to black and white. Very often members attend the meetings merely for the social aspect, or because they want to learn about photography. Some enjoy the illustrated talks, and others prefer the photographic outings. There is also an incentive for members to enter for the annual competitions, for which there are ten cups to be won.

The Gram Cup was presented in 1959 by Mr. James Gram who was a well-known mountaineer climber. He was a member of the Colonial Judiciary and the society's significance stemmed largely from his help and advice. He presented the cup when he became Chief Justice of Nyasaland, and the cup is awarded for the best colour picture of the year. The Phloxus Cup is awarded for a picture taken by artificial light. Other well-known personalities in the photographic world who have presented cups in the society are Mr. Peter Griffin, a professional Nairobi photographer who specialises in portraits, and whose cup is awarded for the best portrait, and Mr. Derek Carter, who was head of the Kenya Police photographic section and better known as a motor car manufacturer East African Motor enthusiasts. The Grams Cup is awarded for a technical picture. Beginners in photography also have the chance of winning a cup, as the Kodak Shield and Phloxus for colour slides and the Field Shield for black and white prints are all for beginners only. The Society's Premier Trophy, awarded for the 'Picture of the Year' is the Watkins Pichford Cup, presented by a retired member of the society who was a leading photographer in East Africa.

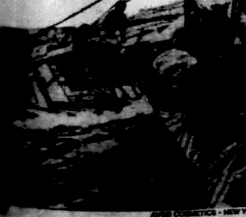

Right time to think of lawns

Now that the rains are really with us this is the time to think of reconditioning or planting a new lawn.

Seed grass is not used here as although it looks attractive it is difficult to get right. It will come up as a soft, fresh green but the weather is not what it should be.

Before you choose the kind of grass you feel you would like, make sure that the soil has been well turned over and levelled, and that all weeds and foreign grass have been removed.

Wool ash superphosphate and sulphate of ammonia are all helpful in bringing on your grass and can be purchased in small quantities for a little over 1/2 for 25lb.

It is not a good idea to mow too often. It is better to mow once a week and to keep the grass at a height of 2 to 3 inches.

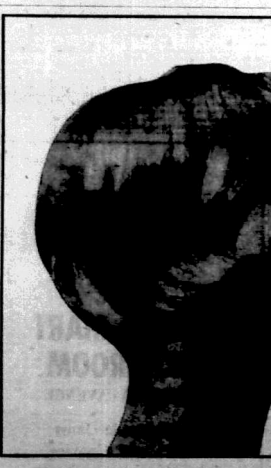

# 440 SQUATTERS GIVEN LAND

## More allocations soon

Chesport said that roads, hospitals and other amenities were provided by the Government in the district out of money and salaries paid to the staff. It was impossible for such services to be provided.

He pointed out that President Kenyatta had been very kind to reduce the amount of tax paid by poor people from 4% to 2% and that this was less than the cost of cheap oil.

The Minister appealed to the Nandi people to send their children to school to learn the modern knowledge needed to carry out development projects.

Increased interest was shown in East African Breweries, forcing the price up 10 cents to 1570 buyers, 1575 sellers, with transactions recorded as high as the sellers price, where as the rest of the Brewery section remained quiet.

The Trading and Miscellaneous section experienced a generally lively week with most prices remaining firm at last week's level, the exception being Car & General which put on 25 cents to 1825 buyers, 1875 sellers and Kenya Cement which put on 11 1/2 buyers, 11 30 sellers.

# U.K. TAKES MORE KENYA PRODUCE

British imports of dairy products worth £237,000 for similar items first six times as much during the first two months of this year as during the corresponding period of 1967.

Board of Trade figures released in London on April 18 show that the UK imported £240,000 worth of dairy products from Kenya during January and February this year. Last year's total for the two months period was £39,000 for 30 tons.

Imports of beef were up in all eight categories but more than double in the most popular beef under review. Britain paid £240,000 for 2,000 tons of beef.

Imports of lamb and mutton were up 100 per cent for the first two months of this year compared with £127,000 for similar items first six months of 1967.

Tea imports also show a considerable increase. The figure for the first two months of this year was £1,600,000 compared with £1,010,000 for the corresponding period of 1967.

Imports of animal feed stuffs rose by 110,000 for January and February last year to £187,000 for the first two months of this year.

Unquestionably both are potential winners, but I give Mr. Preston an edge over his Peugeot rivals as he is in a faster car and has the advantage of an early start.

mentioned are all brilliant, my personal choice is still among these names. I predict that the Safari will be won by the 1967 East African Rally Champions, Robin Hillier and Jack Ford, who will be competing in a Cortina Lotus number 4. My prediction is based to a large extent on a comparison of the speed of the drivers in group one.

Hillier is in his mid-thirties, but has acquired a sufficient blend of skill and experience to win. Many of his rivals are in their late thirties and some are 40 — and I feel that the advantage of long experience is severely offset by their age.

Although the winner of the Safari will almost certainly emerge from group one, there are several promising entries in group two which are likely to finish in the top five. Car 25, an Alfa Romeo Giulietta, will be driven by Bert Gillingham and Clive Ginn. Alfa Giulietta was number 41 last year. Car 14, a Peugeot 404, is driven by 14th Mike Armstrong, who finished 10th last year with Nick Nowinski in a Peugeot 404 which was again a 4th in 1967. Peugeot starts at number 28 with Derek Paddy as his navigator.

The Porsche marque has had tremendous success in rallying this year, including first overall in the Monte Carlo Rally, and the Porsche 911 of Edgar Hemp in the Grand Prix of Europe. The interesting entry is group 2. This

car is number 22 and represents Porsche's first attempt to win Safari honours for the class wins are: Class A — A. G. Mayer, and J. Brett in a Saab Monto Car, number 49. Class B — E. C. Bates and J. B. Jones in a Peugeot 204, number 27. Class C — C. Hillier and J. Ford in a Ford Cortina Lotus, number 25. Class D — R. B. Randall and W. H. B. Parkman in Mercedes Benz 250, number 40.

At the show for the order of start, the Safari Chairman, Eric Cecil, predicted that the 1968 Safari would be a wet one. The indications are that it will be one of the wettest on record and I will be very surprised if there are more than 20 finishers.

The past weeks have been filled with reports of rain throughout East Africa and gloomy predictions that the greater portion of the southern leg will have to be re-routed. If such action is forced on the organisers by continued wet weather, the southern leg will lose much of its value as a trial of endurance of both car and driver.

Main roads will replace such tiring tests as the Voi/Kisumu and Umanba mountain successions. (Continued on Page 8)

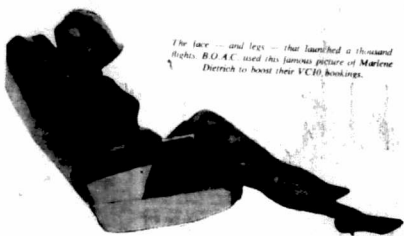

# Kenya vines yield a rich harvest

Kenya who have bought vines from Europe, Australia, and until a few years ago South Africa, must have wondered why wine has never been produced in any quantity in their own country.

The answer they would or doubtfully have been given would be that the climate here, which seems to mature almost every other kind of crop is unsuitable for grapes. In fact, they must have a Mediterranean or Southern European climate. In the tropics, for some unknown reason, they ripen too quickly and are therefore too small and soft for long storage and about the only use for them is as a fruit for eating fresh. Certainly it was not imported in 1963 when the first vines were planted in the Mombasa show and were distributed by the Kenya Horticultural Society to the extent of 100,000 vines.

But since then, little has been heard of the idea except at Taitetu, until three years ago when two people started growing grape-vines in their Ruirua garden and have produced results which today must have astonished the "no grapes in Kenya" theory for ever.

The two pioneers are Mr. Victor Bondell and Miss Joyce Lowrey who after dinner sometime in 1964 happened to show the seeds from the grapes they had been eating out into the garden. Their interest was renewed when, six months later, they found six seedlings had appeared.

Being an Italian and familiar with vine-growing in his native Parma, Mr. Bondell decided to make further experiments. To have wanted to buy seedlings to bear fruit would have taken too long, so he had to cuttings from several houses in Ruirua, where they had been used for decoration only.

He and Miss Lowrey bought books on vine-growing and made preparations to start the crop on 20 acres. Only two years later, the results exceeded all their expectations. Although the crop could not really be considered a success, they were able to harvest 120 lbs. of grapes. The plant alone yielded no less than 72 bunches.

They had experimented with several strains, such as the classic, Fagnola and Fabelle, and to their delight the vine and flowers appeared equal to those grown elsewhere in the world, and certainly good enough for the palate. Their interest was renewed when, six months later, they found six seedlings had appeared.

It is not surprising that the results they have to offer these two crops — and surely they cannot be improved in terms of a weight-per-acre return — are an eye-opening prospect. Miss Lowrey had planted about 200 vines, but she had not yet started to pick them in a jar and waiting for the excellent fruit to form.

Although there was some ready when it visited Nairobi's money "vineyard", Miss Lowrey assured one that the wine was very acceptable, although it represented only a small part of the potential, both in amount and flavour. The grapes tasted delicious, and perhaps a little more tart than the imported ones.

With the high price of imported grapes, these alone should receive attention at school and university commercial proposition.

These are the obvious temptations to think of vines as yet another crop of great potential for Kenya's small farmers, especially of a wine industry is started. Several Government projects, including the Minister for Lands and Settlement, Mr. Argente and the Assistant Minister for Labour, Mr. Fred Kiboi, have already expressed an interest, and the crop is under study by the Ministry of Agriculture.

Miss Lowrey pointed out that there is no great barrier to its adoption as a cash crop for Kenya, although some of the most vines, incidentally, that grapes were ever grown in East Africa because of an agreement reached between the British Crown and Belgian colonial authorities before the First World War.

Vines have to be sprayed twice a month with a copper solution to keep down pests, and yearly pruning without which the vine will not yield fruit, is an art in itself. In addition vines need a lot of root run, and Miss Lowrey has found the best way to provide this is to dig trenches.

Apart from the high yields, vines produce an additional bonus in East Africa in that, because there are in effect two summers, two crops can be produced, although one will be much larger than the other.

Vine cutting planted by the Bahari-Bhambani near Dodoma some ten years ago have resulted in a bumper crop of 1200 lbs. of grapes. A spokesman at the High Commission said that the vouchers covered all applicants who had been established in Kenya and who are required to leave Kenya and return to their home countries by the end of the year.

# In the shops

The row of tins in the grocery shop all look confusingly similar.

There are slight variations in size and price, which are hardly worth the mental lurch the housewife goes through to select one brand.

A closer inspection and the finds that one is local and the other imported. Should she go by the picture of someone's face on the sophisticated label of the imported brand? With the added advantage that it is well-known and reliable, or should she feel obliged to buy the local one, helping to build the country she lives in, but keeping her fingers crossed that her dinner party will not be spoilt by poor quality of the product?

The problem of selection is one which faces housewives more and more as the variety of local products grows. If the imported products do become widely fashionable, it may not be an expensive business. To get an idea of how Nairobi women do their shopping we spoke to three housewives in a large store, then gathered comments from the Housewives' Committee. Elizabeth Adams, the Honorary Treasurer, East African Power and Lighting Company.

"Apart from the apparent marketing problem of price levels compared with imported articles, problems of local products are, perhaps, the design incorporating bees and butterflies against a spray of lilies of the valley, valued at £1.784.

## HOW DO LOCAL PRODUCTS COMPARE?

Factors would wish to encourage her housewife, is to get good value for her money, she should be able to rely on the standards of quality of certain brands of imported goods.

"The Housewife" is an organisation formed in the city when very low consumer goods were manufactured in East Africa. First efforts at home industries were "bric-a-brac" and quality and packaging was poor.

It is unfortunate that the Housewives' Organisation, that was frequently called into existence when we put on the market which were still as good as new, and some still are because of their quality to pass over the local product automatically.

It is little comfort to be frequently told that some are such that it is impossible to keep a local product manufactured in Africa cheaper than its imported equivalent.

Miss Giles made this comment: "I feel that there should be frequently told for housewives to buy local, and I am sure they would buy only too anxious to do so if the price were a little lower. I am not at all against local goods, but I don't buy of my local if the product is not good."

## TEN CENTS A DAY BUYS TOP MARKS

An improvement in all-round performance and particularly in the assessment of children who are participating in the "Ten Cents a Day" scheme, has been noted by the National Feeding Council of Kenya.

The scheme, which has already been tried at the Coast, Embu and the district of the Rift Valley, is in its infant stage in Kilimanjaro District.

Five schools, A.C. Kibamba, A.C. Chugaga, Kibungu Boys, Kibungu Girls and Kibungu Full Primary Schools are already running the scheme, supported by officers who also provide free meals for the children.

The contributions from parents is 700/- a child for meals, which works out at 20 cents for a meal of beans and a high protein mixture known as Injap.

Two shillings and 25 cents for house, operation costs, including "top marks" salaries, and the rest is used for the actual meals.

It is necessary to have at least 10 children and a kitchen before starting the scheme at any particular school.

Any child not normally in the school can join the scheme provided their parents pay the contribution and they are not in a secondary school.

The scheme was initiated by the Senior Field Officer of the Kilimanjaro District, Kenya in the Central Province. She is a member of three Kapsa Dairy Bazaars, a former member of the Kilimanjaro branch of the East African Women's Society and a member of the Nairobi branch in Mombasa.

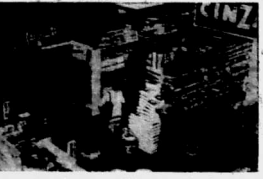
An ambitious and promising project designed to turn our mainly young women as tour officers had been launched by United Transport Overseas Services in Nairobi.

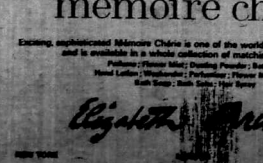
