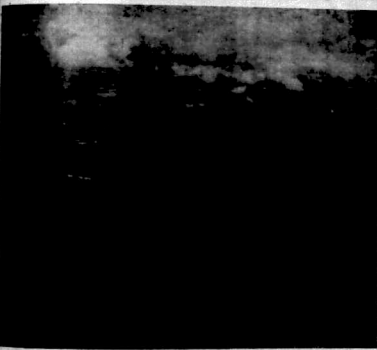

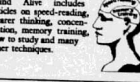

## Amid traffic's roar they remembered Anzac Day

A small group of civilians, harked, stood to attention in the main thoroughfare of the clock struck eleven. Behind them, in Kenyatta Avenue, Nairobi, there was the roar of the traffic.

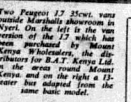

Headlong to starvation

So much has been written about "population explosion," both by demographers and agronomists, who have bombarded the Third World with columns of statistics and pie-charts of data.

In some cases the most ardent workers are lulled with the flowery statistics, the trends and the graphs, but the Faddish books that will call for serious study not only concerned a book, but also a series of articles in Africa, Asia and Latin America that have been written by the affiant scientists in Europe and the United States.

In *Janine 1975* the two brothers, one an agronomist with several years experience in Latin America and the other a farmer and member of the American Foreign Service in the Far East, set out to prove, with a wealth of data and literary references, that it is impossible for man to hold off collision between a

burgeoning global population and a stagnant agricultural production.

The book talks of the dilemma facing both the agronomist and the demographer. The latter will not predict 1975, but the latter will increase food production.

According to the authors it is now too late to head off this catastrophe and by 1975 famine will be a fact of life.

By 1975 the brothers predict, the only country with the capacity for substantial food will be the United States.

Quoting Malinoff who argued that while population increases in

Until the 1950s, the maximum food production possible in a population was believed to be four-fifths of the population.

For the classical European population it was quite true to calculate: one of every 1000 people there were 200 women, of these 400 were non-fertile or too old for child bearing.

The majority of these countries are in Africa, Asia and Latin America where the bulk of the

population is made up of young people. The authors' arguments are so convincing that it is difficult to think why they had not given sufficient food in the form of national Co-operation Year.

It should be noted that in the United States and the Soviet Union, the countries which have the most advanced food production and the possibility of changing to food production in Asia where millions would rather starve than eat "Mother Cow".

Some shortcoming in the book is the lack of up-to-date statistics about population growth in Africa and information on the efforts of African governments, particularly Kenya, Uganda and so on, to increase food production.

But that as it may be, this book should be compulsory reading for all those engaged in development planning.

## Israelis parade in defiance of U.N.

Israel faced almost certain censure for staging its massive military parade through Jerusalem yesterday in defiance of the Security Council. The council was called into further session to hear a report from the U.N. Secretary-General on the situation in the Holy City and informed sources said a resolution condemning Israel would probably be adopted.

The hearing was held in the open air and the court was surrounded by a large crowd of people. The case concerned the alleged misappropriation of public funds during his tenure as President.

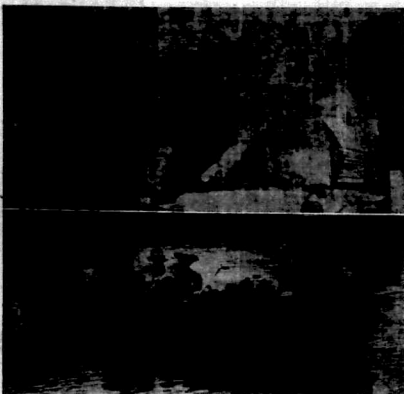

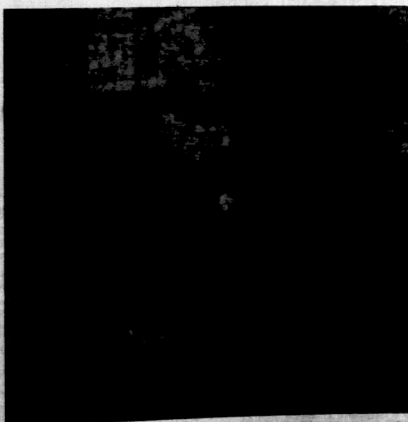

**Marines killed in heavy fighting**

United States Marines have killed 23 North Vietnamese but lost nine dead themselves in a conventional heavy fighting in the southern province, a U.S. military spokesman said yesterday.

Following details of the latest clash in the north, the spokesman said a South Vietnamese unit was overrun as a result of Marines on Wednesday only two miles from the major southern supply base at Dong Hoi.

The battle raged for two hours and over as they retreated the South Vietnamese battalions and American with mortar and artillery fire. The U.S. military spokesman said the American unit suffered 30 dead and 70 wounded in a similar clash.

Further south, it is believed the 10th Airborne Division's 1st Battalion, 10th Airborne, killed 10 North Vietnamese and captured 100 rifles and 100 machine guns.

Other paratroop units placed a cordon around the town of Son Tay, 100 miles from Hanoi, and captured 100 rifles and 100 machine guns.

The White House immediately welcomed the idea and said "military aid on a neutral basis would be a good measure."

## The rule of law

When President Kenyatta swore in Kenya's Acting Chief Justice, he specifically pledged the Government's support for the rule of law. The hope that Judges of the High Court and the Magistrates will help him and the Government in all its efforts to maintain peace, law and order.

This declaration must have been especially gratifying to the Attorney-General, who was present at the ceremony for nobody has done more to erode respect for the rule of law in Kenya than has Mr. Nyumba. Doubtless, he will recollect the high hopes of the gathering of lawyers from 31 African and Middle East countries, at Lagos in 1961, for the first African conference on "The rule of law" replacing the "rule of force", which led to the African Charter intended to safeguard the rights and liberties of the individual and the people, as do all others who abide by constitutional methods, the bloody divergences which have occurred there in some of the African States which were represented.

Constitutional change there must be determined in the developing conditions of contemporary life. Every constitution must be viable, but the changes may be in any country under the right, indeed the privilege, of being a democracy should be legislated for, obedient to the law and in recognition of the supremacy of the people's Parliament.

In a special article published last yesterday, a West African Journalist expressed in a paper read to the Conference of Commonwealth Chiefs of State, Lord G. Jones was quoted as saying: "By far the greatest need in West Africa today is for the courts to protect civil liberties". Fortunately, the same principles do not exist in East Africa, but the same principles hold true. It is the observation of these principles, the executive protection and application of the laws of the land, that President Kenyatta is supporting.

The author of yesterday's article held the detail of, or attempts to suppress, civil rights provided the justification for the military coups in Africa during the past six years. He argued that once honouring of the law was in the breach rather than the observance, military intervention became justified. This cannot be entirely true, since the overthrow of a political

and its replacement by a system frequently lead to the suppression of basic human freedoms, warping the law in totalitarian regimes which are not subject to the final verdict of the people; firstly expressed at the polls.

There is much less chance of unconstitutional action, indeed it becomes negligible, in a country such as President Kenyatta is striving to make of Kenya, where the Government and the Bench strictly defend the legal order. The total function of the law must be to provide the effective solutions for social conflicts.

Some years ago, an eminent jurist, Prof. A. L. Goodhart, discussing the foundations of law, asked: "How can we explain this supremacy of the law?" If law is merely an expression of the will of those who hold the supreme power in the State, then how can it control that force?"

He found the answer "In the fact that we do not think of law in terms of power or force", and went on to say: "It is in terms of power or force, which we are compelled to submit, as Jeremy Bentham has said, that the foundation on which our freedom is based. There is all the difference in the world between obedience based on fear and obedience based on a sense of duty."

## Summit etchings hold key to a long-forgotten age

Lake Rudolf, though discovered by Count Teleki in 1888 and named after the Crown Prince of Austria, was never really known to the outside world until the expedition of Dr. Vyvyan Fuchs in 1955.

Even today, travelling along the shores of the great "Jade Sea" set in the midst of a

barren and inhospitable desert evokes a spirit of adventure.

All looks so calm as the waters of the lake shimmer in the heat of the day, yet in a matter of seconds a squall can whip the lake into a lethal frenzy. It was such a storm that drowned Dyson and Martin, two members of the Fuchs' expedition who attempted to reach the mysterious South Island by rubber boat.

All around are signs of a violent volcanic past. At the southern end of the Lake looms the most recent volcano, named after Teleki, which last erupted in the early years of the 20th century.

Stories and legends abound and it is not easy to discern the truth in this remote and exciting place. One story concerns South Island which was said to have had until quite recently an indigenous tribe, yet its members have completely disappeared without trace and all that remains are beds of wild goats and numerous cobras.

Neither the remnants of the El Molo, tribe living by the

south-east shore nor the neighbouring Turkana tribes have ever visited the island, which to them retains a certain forbidding mystique.

Some 40 miles from Loiyigalani, at the end of a wide bay, stands Mount Por, a prominent landmark that rises some 2,000 feet above the lake. Though this mountain now stands a mile or so inland, it was once an island. The ascent of Mount Por requires a degree of perseverance since the slopes are steep

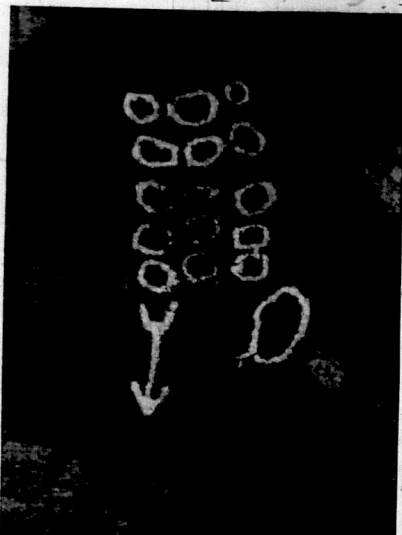
and rocky and the mountain has a reputation for providing sanctuary for vicious cobras. Moreover, it is likely to be very hot since the daytime temperature rarely goes below 100deg.

But the exertion is worth the effort for, at the top, scattered on large broken stones, lie numerous carved etchings: circles, arrows, figures and animals, symbols of a long-forgotten age.

These drawings and diagrams have not been dated but they are almost certainly of great antiquity.

In the legends of the El Molo tribe the mountain is sacred and it may be that these etchings had a religious significance. The stark isolation and prominence of Mount Por above the lakeshore, together with the magnificent panoramic view from the top, certainly encourage such speculation.

A map below gives an indication of the location of the etchings, in circles and arrows, that hold no clue to any meaning. They are found on the summit of Mount Por, once an island in Lake Rudolf.

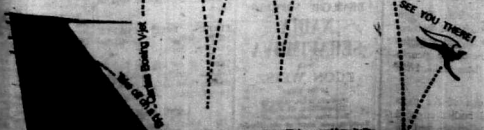

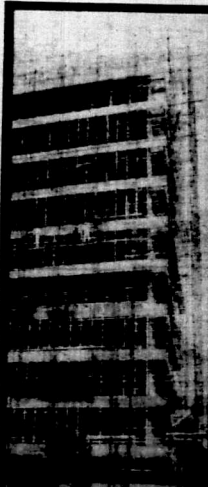
