



Bill limits period of succession

A new Bill to amend provisions for Presidential elections in the Kenya Constitution was published yesterday in a 'Kenya Gazette' Supplement. It replaces the Amendment published in March, which had not passed through the National Assembly when it adjourned last month.

The major difference in the provisions of the replacement President in a case where the President dies or resigns, and there is an election of a President by popular vote within the following six months.

Under the former Amendment Bill, the proposal was that the Vice-President would assume office as President until the next general election following a dissolution of Parliament.

The new Bill also provides that in the event of there being no Vice-President who was appointed by an elected President, following the occurrence of the vacancy, the President will be elected by popular vote.

In other respects the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill is the same as the Bill it replaces — is similar to its predecessor.

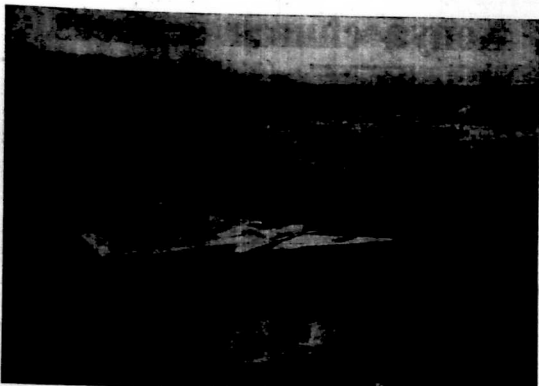

MESSAGE TO TROOPS

The Commander of the Kenya Army, Brig. Ndolo, and the Assistant Minister for Defence, Mr. Njeru, flew to Kisumu yesterday and addressed the two stations of the Kenya Army stationed there for flood relief work.

As they landed, the Provincial Commissioner, Nyirira, Mr. Charles Murgor, met them and briefed them on the flood situation.

Also present was the officer commanding the platoon, Maj. J. J. Ayodi, who told the Brigadier and the Assistant Minister that two boats recently lost to the Army and Naval officers had arrived from Nairobi and were now operating in the Bwalya area.

The boats are an loan from Mr. Clift, Nairobi, and are being used in addition to the two Naval boats for rescue work along the Bwalya area.

In a K.A.F. Agent-Commander, Brig. Ndolo, said that the Kenya Army, Brig. Ndolo, and the Assistant Minister for Defence, Mr. Njeru, and Mr. Murgor, flew over Fort Victoria area and Kibanga and saw from the air the extent of the flooding, more than 1,000 people rendered homeless by the recent rains.

They were followed in a K.A.F. Beaver piloted by P.O. R. M. Chama and P.O.-I. J. Adams, who carried Major Nyirobi to the two areas.

Before leaving the affected areas, Brig. Ndolo read a message to the troops from the Minister for Defence, Mr. Mwangi, in which the Assistant Minister thanked the Armed Forces for the good work they were doing to help the civil population of Western and Northern Provinces.

Some 123 homes at Kibanga Location of Mera District have been flooded and about 600 people have been forced to leave their homes and seek refuge from neighbours living in the high ground of the location. In many homes water level has risen as high as window level.

In addition to rendering several people homeless the floods have, according to the Mera District Agricultural Officer, Mr. G. M. Kimani, damaged an estimated 300 acres of crop around Kibanga Market.

At Nyirira, in the same location, about 300 acres of sorghum has been destroyed.

The Assistant Minister for Agriculture, Mr. Malinda, on a tour of the Central Province, visited the 12,000-acre farms of Mr. Robert Whelan in Timau, the settled area of Mera District.

The Kenya Red Cross headquarters in Nairobi has dispatched medical supplies to the flood-

stricken areas of Nyirira and Western Province. This follows visits made to these areas recently by a representative of the organization.

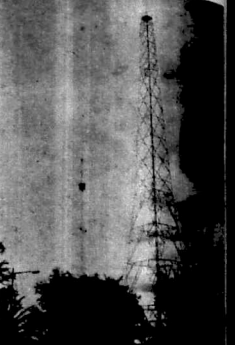

The Government inquiry into the Uganda Labour Congress began in Kampala last week and Mr. Abu Mayanja, representing the U.L.C. President, Mr. H. M. Lwiza, and other members of the official executive of the Uganda Labour Congress, clashed with the one-man commission.

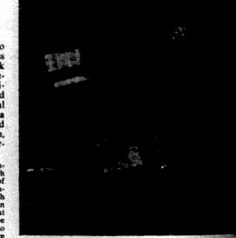

The Herd, with two hits under their belts and a third about to break big, are currently one of the most popular outfits on the British pop scene.

The lead-singer, Peter Frampton (faded in the face of 1967), is a sort of South Western seagull-eyed, wavy-haired, prominent-cantons female face to scream hysterically in admiration.

Peter apart, this group has plenty going for it with a whole load of musical talent and an organ, guitar, bass, drum line-up that has promoted them from even the most mystical and discerning of pop purists.

Coming as they do from the same management stable as Dave Dee and C.10, it is scarcely surprising that the Herd should draw their material from the formidable Ken Howard-Alan Blackley song-writing machine.

And considering the vastly differing sounds and styles of the two groups, it says something for the composing ability of Howard and Blackley that they should be instrumental in the success of both.

Whereupon I am modestly contentedly admitting to being a huge fan of The Herd's latest hit, 'I Don't Want You Leaving'. It is a typical pop song, lead quickly in a direct ballad style, rhythm that is in complete contrast to the complex patterns of The Yardbirds. Paradoxically and the majority of the work on their first LP.

But though it may be surprising that it was, undoubtedly good—clothing the charts and a cut far next week's Top Ten.

Peter Frampton and Scott Walker—yes they are the trend-conscious group. Both are young, both are handsome in the rather fragile, off-beat way that fits the concept of modern good looks, and both stand on a dream pedestal built by thousands of stary-eyed young girls.

20 COUNTRIES TO MINT FOOD COINS IN SUPPORT OF U.N.

Collectors around the world can look forward this year to a host of new food coins supporting the work of the United Nations.

So far more than 20 countries have signified their interest in issuing coins with designs and inscriptions promoting higher food production and international development co-operation.

Through the ages coins have depicted agricultural scenes, but this is the first time a group of nations has in one and the same year deliberately used their currencies as an educational means for raising agricultural production.

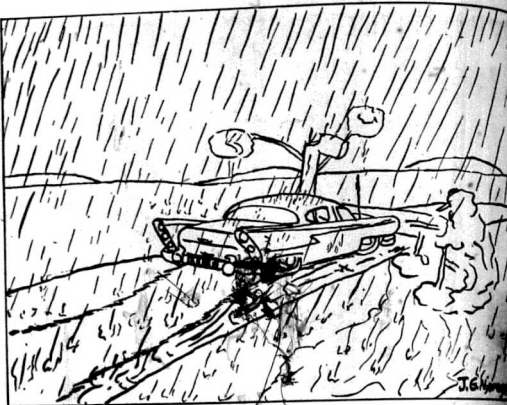
Four countries plan to issue their new coins in October. The first was A.D. which issued the first of 2,000,000 five-cent coins, Uganda 100,000 five-cent coins, and the Republic of Vietnam 500,000 20-cent coins.

Other governments expected to issue insurance coins, soon include Afghanistan, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Cameroon, Ceylon, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, Egypt, France, Germany, Greece, India, Italy, Jordan, Lebanon, the Netherlands, the Philippines, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka, Syria, Thailand, the United States, and the Vatican.

Developing countries the coins—with an average life of 25 years—will stress the importance of increasing food production over the next generation. In the developed countries, the emphasis will be on international co-operation for progress in the fight against hunger and want.

The largest issuance considered to date is the Viet Nam's proposal of 5,000,000 1,000-lire coins in silver. The Viet is an unusual type of eight coins.

At the time of the annual meeting of the international series, the U.N. plans to assemble a set of the coins for an international coin album.

Barrier that a nun must beat

Although the Church in Kenya is all too willing to Africanise, young men and women interested enough to devote their lives to the good work are few and far between, and problems in this respect abound through the process of Africanisation considerably.

Overcoming the formidable opposition of parents and family is one of the greatest obstacles that beset an African girl who wishes to become a nun. It is difficult for the parents to understand the Church and its way of life, and consequently they urge their children to steer clear of it.

Also, they expect their educated sons and daughters to start supporting them after they have left school, which is hardly possible as a member of the church.

It is therefore surprising that there are as many as 515 African Roman Catholic nuns in Kenya, and that seven-tenths by African sisters. There are altogether 12 novitiates scattered over Kenya with a varying number of novices in each.

To become a nun, a girl has to have a reasonable amount of education. Many novitiates, including the Loreto Convent Novariate, insist that the girls must have their school certificates before they are taken on.

Novices are given plenty of time in which to make up their minds fully on whether they want to become nuns. They are taken into the novitiate for a year during which they learn a nun's way of life.

At the end of the year if they want to continue, and if they are thought to be suitable by the nuns running the novitiate, then they ask to be received into the congregation.

The Archbishop sends somebody to look side into each case to find out if there is any outside pressure being put on the girl. If not, then she is usually accepted as a member of the congregation, and starts wearing the nun's habit.

Another two years are spent concentrating mostly on spiritual formation — theology, prayer and spiritual reading, and also a little teaching as well as continuing their studies.

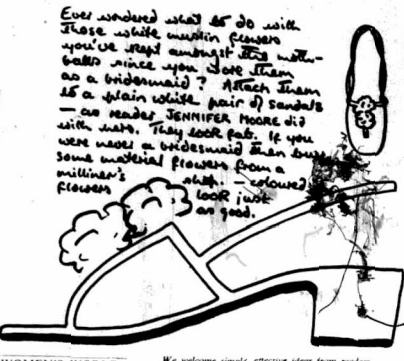
At the end of each year they continue in this way for another five years. At the end of this "training" period — eight years altogether — they take their perpetual vows.

The life of a novice during this time is ordered, though not dull. Recreational activities such as needlework, cards, tennis and swimming are allowed.

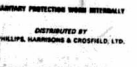

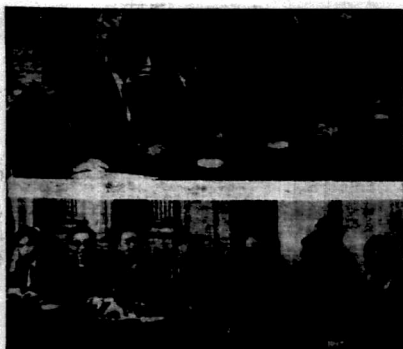

The Congress Party swept into power in Haryana State yesterday with an absolute majority in the State Assembly after a midterm election. With results in 73 of the 81 seats on the floor, the Congress has captured 48 and the other eight parties were in a position to challenge them. The United Front Haryana Party had won 31 seats. The poll was called after President Hainan took over the administration of the North Indian state last November to end 10 months of political instability. The Congress Party had a landslide victory in the 1957 election and its party workers were hopeful that the Haryana state would be a pointer to success in mid-term polls here this year in the much larger States of West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh, both of which were placed under President's Rule with a year of the General Elections.

TORNADOES KILL 55 IN U.S.A.

At least 55 people were killed and several hundred injured when tornadoes swept through the Midwest States of damage in nine States. The worst hit was Arkansas, with a total of 44 killed, according to reports reaching New York. Another 11 people and 10 cows in Illinois and one in Missouri. A total of 30 people were killed in various areas taking in three States: Indiana, Ohio and Minnesota. Hundreds of people were injured as the raging winds razed roofs and blew down trees, uprooted trees, knocked down houses and swept cars high into the air. Worst hit were the Arkansas towns of Jonesboro and DeWitt, where 25 of the state's university—where 13 people died—was destroyed. The economy of Clark City, Mo., where about 100 people were killed, was almost destroyed. The tornado in Iowa followed the worst hailstorm in the history of Iowa City. Hailstones said to be as big as pebbles fell on the town, causing injury and serious damage. The town of Jonesboro was destroyed, but there were no children there. In Illinois, the tornado struck, long after classes ended for the day. Although Arkansas a church was reported completely destroyed and many killed, the congregation to shelter under the trees. Only a few of those killed and hundreds of homes and farms were wrecked. National Guard troops were ordered out and a curfew was imposed until dawn. Reports still pouring in and Iowa was hit by eight tornadoes, Missouri by seven, Illinois five, Minnesota four, Ohio two and Indiana and Alabama one each. A school bus was blown off the road in Louisiana, Missouri, where 10 children, about 30 aircraft were damaged by high winds of hail. Damage in Missouri was also reported at Hickory Falls, Illinois, Chicago.

An increase in Soviet influence in the Persian Gulf may be heralded by the current talk of a Russian invasion of the Gulf. One of Russia's latest military-destroyers, equipped with conventional weapons, arrived in Iraq last Saturday for an eight-day visit. They were welcomed by a 21-gun salute.

Naval sources said this was the first visit by a Soviet warship since 1961, when the 3,000-ton cruiser Boyarin made a much-publicized stop. Some observers anticipate that Soviet naval visits will become increasingly frequent now that Britain has announced she intends to withdraw her armed forces from the Gulf by 1971.

The visit came just over a week before a scheduled meeting of the Persian Gulf rulers to set the seal on a federation to take over from Britain. A federation, announced by the seven Gulf States, Qatar and Bahrain in February, was due to be signed on March 30. An April meeting between the two countries involved failed to materialize and some observers think the Bahrain meeting will take place in the near future.

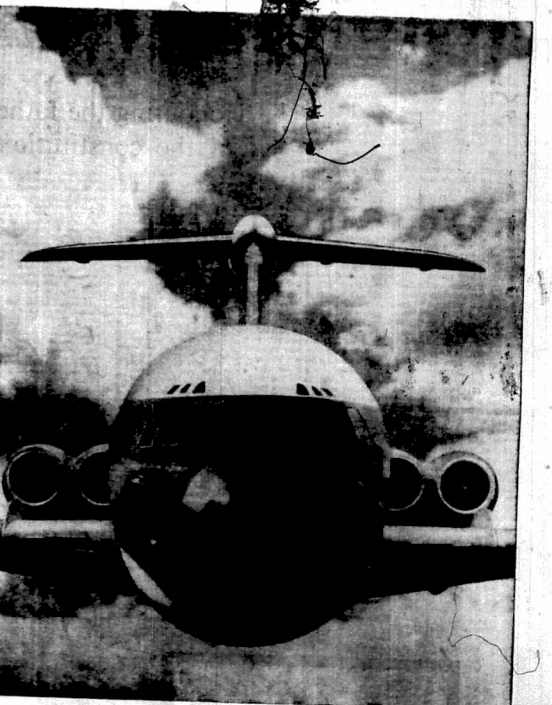

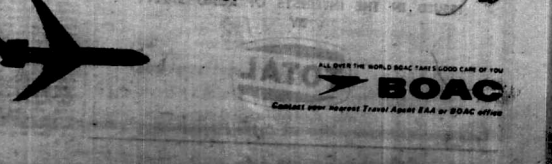

Students' vital work for posterity threatened by outsiders' cash

B. G. McIntosh, Lecturer in History at the University College, Nairobi, writes about a Research Project in Oral History of which he is the director.

Story-tellers find place in history

In recent months university students in East Africa have had some bad publicity. Among other things they are said to be living in ivory towers, cut off from the public and careless of the practical tasks of nation-building.

This article attempts to illustrate one of the ways in which students are in fact going out to meet the public and are making a contribution towards national growth.

For more than two years members of the History Department at the University College, Nairobi, have been engaged, in a historical research project, in recording oral traditions about the district and the oral testimony of witnesses to important events of the past 50 years.

They are doing this as an attempt to solve some of the problems encountered in the study and teaching of East African history at all levels in the national system.

Basically these problems are twofold: the large gaps which exist in our knowledge of the understanding of pre-colonial history and the paucity of historical writing on the colonial period which tells us anything about what Africans were thinking and doing.

Much can be done to solve these problems by establishing a rich but rapidly-disappearing historical source — the stored knowledge and experience of elderly informants.

In January 1966 a Research Project in Oral History was explicitly this source. The project was directed by Professor H. S. K. Brown (now at the University of London) and was headed by Prof. B. G. McIntosh.

The project is organized in the following manner. During their second year of study students are introduced to its aims and

method. Training is given in research methods appropriate to East African conditions. This is followed by the selection of topics for research. The topics are discussed, defined and ways are devised for reaching during the Easter vacation.

Topics may be chosen from within the pre-colonial period and comprise studies of the traditional systems and institutions of a society, or of a society's traditions on migration, settlement, and other activities.

Alternatively, topics may be chosen within the more recent past. A popular choice is the study of a society's structure in the examination of the reactions of its members to the various aspects of the imposed order.

When the topics have been listed and finalized, and when all the available secondary reading has been mastered, students carry out field research during the vacation between their second and third years of study. They select in their home areas amongst people to whom they are familiar and whose languages they speak.

In the field the students make a full record of the questions they ask and the answers they receive. As a supplement to this they summarize particulars about themselves, their informant, and about the time, place and other details of the oral interview itself.

In this way it is possible to make of each oral interview a historical document in its own right which can be used and referred to in the normal way in historical writing.

In addition to oral interviews the student researchers seek out written documents in historical parts of the country. These documents are unwilling to lend them so that they usually copy them as they go.

Many important documents are in the fields of church history and students have thus been preparing for future generations of historians.

The final stage of the project is in any one year some 100 papers from the long vacation "short" study which are brought in many forms and submit the way for grading. Twenty per cent of the total marks is the field work and the remaining 80 per cent is the final report.

Many of these essays are of such a high standard that a selection of them has been judged worthy of wider dissemination. Plans are being made for the publication this year of the first issue of a journal based upon the work of the Research Project.

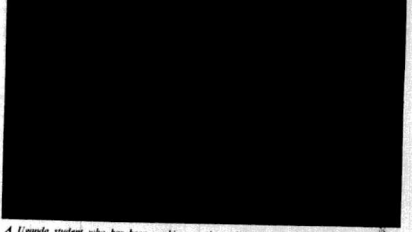
While the students are writing essays the administrative staff of the project are writing and analysing the recorded oral testimonies. Oral interviews are conducted, together with any field work, and are being collected, filed and deposited in the Research Project archives, more than 80 per cent.

The research material prepared in the archives is helping to solve the two major problems in East African history mentioned earlier. Students and staff of the university, as well as visiting scholars, are finding the archives extremely useful for study, teaching and writing.

This account would not be complete without reference to some of the difficulties encountered by students in the course of the field research.

Informants can be fickle. They may agree to use a medical and frequently they do not. They often do not know the way to their work on the project — or they may prefer to do it on their own terms.

They may prefer to be interviewed in their own homes and in their own languages. Informants have the right to expect remuneration for their time and effort. This is a small gift as a mark of respect and gratitude. But large payments to cash are merely producing a situation in which

information may be fabricated in order to command a high price.

Such research is the project has achieved to date has been based upon information freely given. But this year's researchers are finding it difficult to get information.

The organizers of the project have, therefore, two appeals to make: an appeal for training in the matter of cash payments, in all respects, though not based, and an appeal to members of the public to assist our students by freely imparting their knowledge about the East African past.

Another difficulty which faces students is their source of support during the long vacation. Most students find employment as clerks or teachers. But the History Department asks its students to record one month of field and preferably two in full-time research.

In 1967 the project received generous assistance for student vacation research from a major Foundation attached to the university. Other departments are now claiming for student vacation employment schemes so that the little money available has to be shared by many.

Appeals are being made in several directions for grants to meet the costs of maintaining student researchers during the long vacation.

In spite of all these difficulties students of history at the University College, Nairobi, become the proud of an exceptional practical addition to their libraries and library-staffs.

Indeed, but for their enthusiasm, their sober appreciation of the pitfalls as well as the possibilities of oral research, and their willingness to work in their own time and at their own expense, the planning and organizing of the project would be of very little consequence.

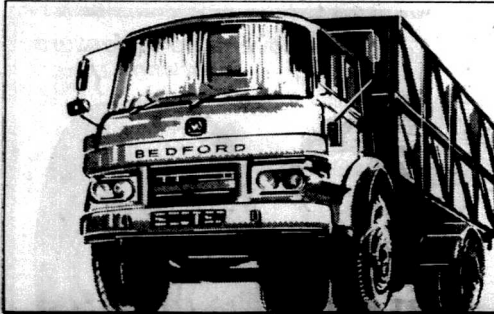

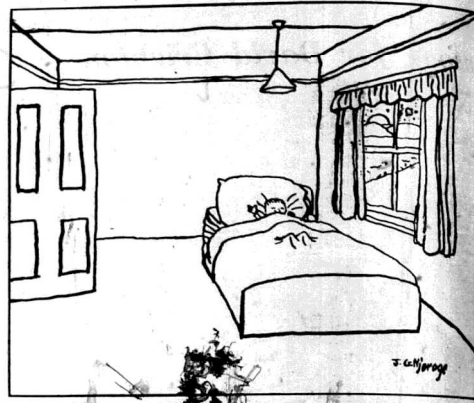

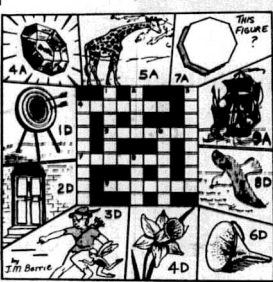

The variety of plants which can be grown at the Coast is not always appreciated and the Coast gardener should be encouraged to try something new and get away from his stand-by — the Zinnia.

For a splash of colour what better than the geranium. The bright flowers last a long time and require little attention provided they are kept fairly damp.

Many gardeners plant them when the water runs and one woman I know says that one year her lavender bush which produces the real result.

Any nursery can supply you with a selection of colours and the price is quite reasonable.

Some people like a selection of colours — others just choose the one colour. They will bloom well at the Coast even if it is not too hot.

Dahlia's will also grow well at the Coast. Here again it is worth to them every two years to get a new one. They will have a wonderful range of colour as they do not necessarily repeat their original shade.

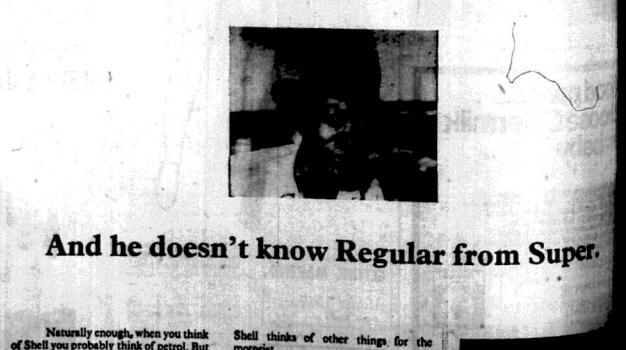

Difficult days for the Transkei

Later this year voters in the Transkei, South Africa's first bantustan, will be asked to deliver their verdict at a general election on the past two years of apartheid-discriminated rule.

South Africa's Prime Minister, Mr. Vorster, has said to announce the date, but for some months now the main parties in the Transkei have been involved in some serious political infighting for the election of the 100-member Parliament.

The group to be followed is Chief Kaiser Matanzima's ruling Transkei National Independence Party (T.N.I.P.) and the main group and glorifies the Transkei as the Black man's God-given land.

His rival Chief White, Mr. Shadrack Simba, has broken away and formed the People's Freedom Party. He is demanding immediate full independence for the Transkei and the repudiation of the territory's 20,000 White traders.

The third party, the Democratic Party, controls 75 of the 45 seats, and stands for multi-racial Transkei.

What the 1,250,000 population of the 12,000-square-mile territory is being asked to examine is the record of Chief Matanzima's party since the constitution was imposed in 1962.

The administration was concerned with the election, born in bloodshed, and the first six years of its life have been shadowed by apartheid and ruthless South African Government control.

When the constitution was "decided", the first election of apartheid, Chief Simba of the Transkei party was "called by the telephone". He did not rise.

The first election took place against a background of murder, treason, subversion, public intimidation, jail and detention camps. Thousands of members of the underground movement formed to resist apartheid, were detained or went to jail, several were hanged in South Africa.

The South African Government's insistence that no White man may invest in a bantustan has stultified industrial development, and the policy of settling white border industries just has not worked. Cash, nickel and marble deposits which Chief Matanzima has boasted about have not been exploited at all.

Scarcely agricultural progress is being made. Twenty-two Rhodesian chiefs who visited this tiny state of Bantustan, found a very unimpressive picture of a country which is called "so much soil and so much rain".

Another reason for getting sugar, corn, maize and pineapple from Rhodesia is that Chief Matanzima's tiny budget of £200,000 is not really adequate for the expansion and consistent maintenance.

Plans to build a belt industry have collapsed on the rock of transport. Owners of the 1,500,000 head of cattle will not sell them. Most Transkei peasants value their own personal herds and will not part with them.

In the face of such a pathetic record it seems likely that Chief Matanzima will lose what little public support he ever had. But there seems no doubt that Mr. Vorster, the South African prime minister, and the 64 non-ministerial White men who make him Chief Minister again.

Fishing goes modern in Abidjan

Fishing in the Ivory Coast used to be the haphazard occupation of scattered river folk with canoes and home-made fishing nets. Today it is a major industry.

Seventy trawlers are operated by foreign firms in association with Africans and thousands of men are involved. Last year the catch was about 60,000 tons.

The change, one which has had a marked effect on the Ivory Coast's economy, began in 1955.

Until then fishing was considered a menial job done only by those unfortunate who lived in huts on the rivers and coast.

When the 1,200,000 population of the 13,000-square-mile territory was asked to vote in the 1962 election, it is the record of Chief Matanzima's administration that was imposed in 1962.

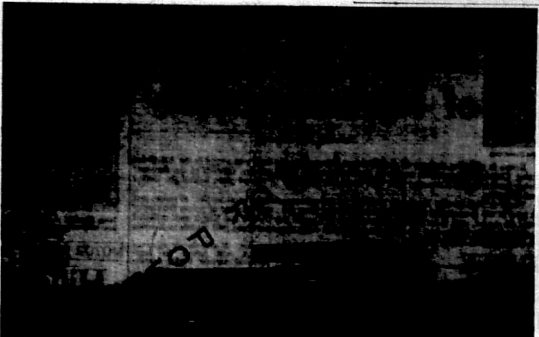

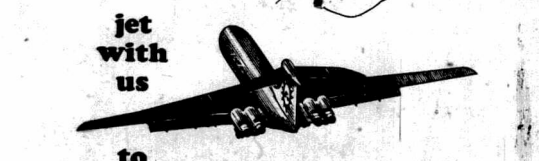
