The general pace of Nairobi activity this week has compared favourably with that of the past few weeks and turnover of business was maintained at a satisfactory level on a fairly widespread scale. Prices on the whole remained at around the same levels as those of last week with rather more buying interest being displayed among the popular issues.

There were some signs of strong demand, with East African Breweries and East African Power and Light at the dividend, ranging between 15:50 and 15:75 and closing 50 cents up to 15:75 but was 1:50 down.

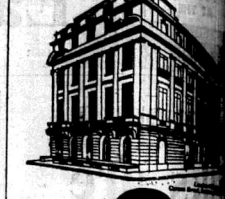
An international consortium has agreed to develop a large-scale copper project in Kenya. The project is being led by Anglo-American Corporation.

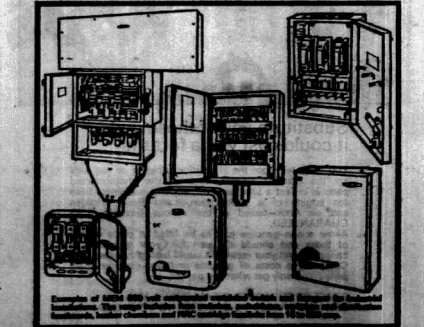

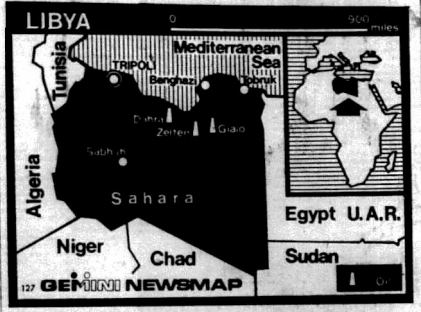

The victories of peace

...and indeed there are all gratified in the affected areas, assisting the civil police in maintaining law and order. But it is not unusual for people to question the need for military expense forces in peacetime when every cent is demanded for Kenya's fight against ignorance, poverty and disease. There is a need for continuous training in the Services. It is not possible to reduce them to a minimal size in peacetime when at the flick of a switch to have them ready trained at full strength and prepared for action the moment an emergency occurs.

There is a constant need to develop a sense of responsibility and initiative at all levels, so that they may always be ready for any emergency.

The Services are the country's

ill insurance policy and like all good policies the premium is high. Kenya, therefore, has a right to expect the maximum support in such an expensive business. Recent events have shown this support is being given on an increasing scale. The fact that the servicemen himself is showing an increasing realization of this important aspect of his service, and is taking an increasing pride in the part he is playing in nation building augurs well for the future progress of Kenya.

An important side-effect of this development is a closer relationship between the Services and the civilian population which can only be beneficial. A closer look at the peacetime role of the Services shows that their efforts are reflected in almost every sphere of national activity.

Their training for war gives them the added capability of acting as a "fire brigade" ready to assist in any emergency. A centralized administrative organization and overall control from the recently established Land and District Headquarters meant that maximum efficiency in the field and the ability to react swiftly to changed circumstances.

Although the shifra campaign during the last few years inevitably highlighted the welfare role of the Services, throughout all this time (and increasingly since the end of the fighting) the forces have been carrying out many unobtrusive tasks which are nevertheless of great importance to the community. A catalogue of these tasks

- Bridge building in the Aberdares settlement schemes.
• Transporting sugar at the height of the season from the Government scheme at Chemelil and wheat from its projects in Masai Mara.
• Taking cattle by air to Tanaika, thereby opening up a new export market.
• Hydrographic surveys of coastal waters by the Navy.
• Aerial photography for development projects.
• Construction of roads and airfields in the North-East.
• Operation of a regular air bus service between Nairobi and Mandera and other outlying townships.
• Support for agricultural shows all over Kenya.
• Protection and transport in remote areas of scientific expeditions, wildlife and tourist officials, teams hunting for oil or water and oil-drillers bringing cattle to K.M.C. markets.

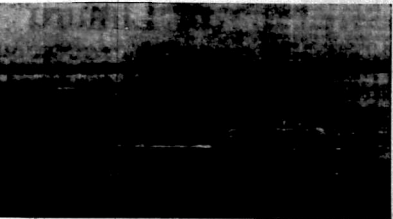
These operations can generally be planned in advance and are usually fairly straightforward to carry out. There are, however, other missions which are less predictable.

Kenya's weather creates conditions which vary from flood to drought - and either situation can cause sudden disaster. Frequently the civil engineers are not called in to deal with such emergencies and it is necessary to

bring in the Services to help in the last few years flood and famine relief operations have been carried out in many parts of the country. These emergency operations may be on only a small scale, such as the flying of a plane load of food and medical supplies to a remote area. They may be hazardous as when the Kenya Navy used rubber boats to ferry heavy supplies through heavy seas at Kilifi or rescued the crew of a cargo vessel wrecked on a reef. They may be urgent as when tents were hurriedly set

up to provide accommodation for earthquake victims, or they may reach the scale of the recent help in the Nyandarua floods when elements of all three Services were required for several weeks of digging and repair work. A recent example of the Nyandarua area was the rescue of a school bus which had overturned. It is possible that the Services will be called upon to help in other similar situations.

Kenya's weather creates conditions which vary from flood to drought - and either situation can cause sudden disaster. Frequently the civil engineers are not called in to deal with such emergencies and it is necessary to

to fighting a war. Now that the country is once more at peace, the opportunities for the servicemen to help in nation-building seem to be endless.

Hundreds of young men are being trained in mechanical and technological skills as well as the arts of leadership and management. In years to come, but rapidly increasing pool of knowledge will be of continuing benefit to the community. 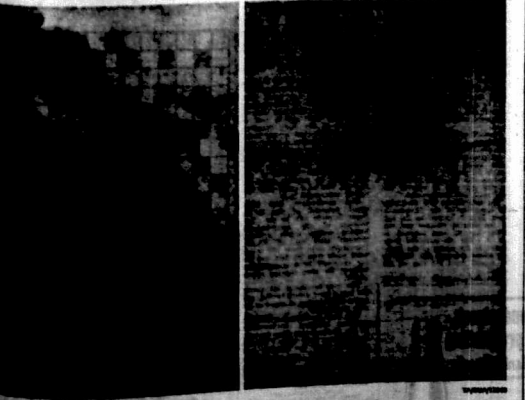

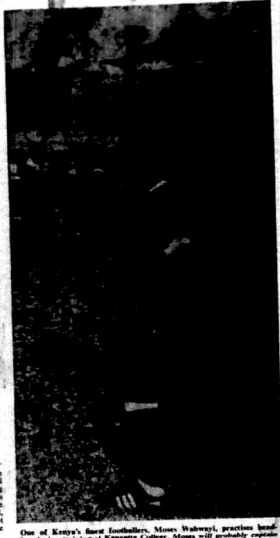

Harsh sanctions against Rhodesia approved by U.N.

The U.N. Security Council has unanimously approved a sweeping sanctions resolution against Rhodesia which all nations will be obliged to implement.

The resolution also called on Britain, as administering power, to put an end to the revolt if all comply with the sanctions. It calls for the complete isolation of Rhodesia through embargoes on imports and exports, an end to travel abroad by her citizens and to air services.

The council allowed some exceptions, for the shipment of medicines, educational material and publications to Rhodesia; the supply of news and information and remittances to penitentiaries.

This is the first time in its consideration of the Rhodesian problem that the council has acted in unison. France had previously abstained on the ground that it was a British problem.

Speaking after the vote, the chief British delegate, Lord Carleton, defended Britain's own actions referring to earlier selective sanctions orders, he said no country had done more than Britain to give these practical effect. Britain would "take care and fully carry out the resolution."

He confirmed that the principle and implementation of a Rhodesian problem must be acceptable to the Security Council as a whole, but Rhodesia must be declared and maintained as a separate entity.

But he also cautioned that the U.N. should not produce immediate results. "What we have to do is to show a steady determination to succeed in this end," he said. We have to con-

sider them in the illegal régime that the council on November 11, 1965 is hoping.

"We have to convince them that their rebellion can lead nowhere but to economic stagnation and political isolation."

The council's resolution stopped short of mentioning South Africa and Portugal by name — as the African-Asian members demanded.

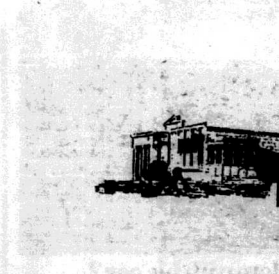

Underneath East Africa

As a human activity, caving probably has a longer history than most, as it is well-known that man spent the formative years of his evolution living in the caves and caverns which existed in fortunately large numbers.

Whether early man made any studies of his environment is unknown, but there was certainly a considerable time-gap before modern man returned to interest in caves, for sporting and scientific reasons, at the beginning of this century.

Part of the reason for the neglect was that caves, like so many other things, became associated with the devil and the powers of darkness during the Middle Ages until a few hardy souls began to make brave forays bringing back with them tales of awe-inspiring chambers filled with rich decorations.

Since the present craze on and caving were formed all over the world to explore caves on an organized and scientific basis, cavers have brought knowledge of the underground chambers, with their stalactites and stalagmites, into everyone's lives.

There are few caves in the world whose unexplored caves still exist and, until 1964, when Cave Exploration Group of East Africa was formed, East Africa was one of them.

The group was formed largely on the initiative of three men, who are still its leading officials: Mr. Jim Simons, who came out to work on paleontology with Dr. Leakey, Mr. Ian Mason, an insurance official, and Mr. Bill Tanner, an entrepreneur.

Since then, Simons has become active there, as a result of their activities, caves in at least seven areas have been explored, although even now, by standards set in the rest of the world, much work remains to be done.

A glance at the map of East Africa would appear to rule out

any chance of caves — as Ian Mason put it, "I did all my first caving when I lived in Washington."

Limestone, the rock in which most of the world's great caves exist, hardly occurs in East Africa at all. Being out of the world's oldest continents, few parts of Africa have been under water, where limestone is originally formed.

But there were many reports of holes in the volcanic rock which makes up much of the surface geology of the Rift Valley and surrounding areas, and Jim Simons, with the help of his newly formed group, decided to investigate. Caves in volcanic rock were rare, outstanding examples being those in Hawaii, and the group hoped that the East African caves might have some surprises.

Among the first caves they investigated were on Simons, the rambling collier which can be seen from the top of the escarpment road, on the floor of the Rift Valley, looking south.

They were first explored in a small way by a professional prospector, by N.G. professional prospector, but they have since been known for ages by the miners of the area and had been visited by a hunter as early as 1930.

What the group found exceeded all their expectations. A total of 24 caves were found involving six different interconnecting systems, some of them more than a mile long.

Since then, Simons has become

surprise found it thoroughly enjoyable. To start the expedition of Jim Simons and Ian Mason had a rope ladder and ladder at the point where we would eventually have.

We then entered the cave from another point and after turning a couple of corners we were in complete darkness, with only our lanterns and carbide batteries to light our way.

The darkness was unbroken by the bats, only occasional shadows of their diurnal slanders, although during the night-time, if you sleep in the cave as we did, you can hear their rustlings and the eerie swirl of their wings as they fly overhead.

The bats had, however, left a permanent reminder of their presence in the form of guano through which on occasions we had to make a deep. Although the caves are comparatively re-

lax, and if you are not used to it can cause a considerable burden on your arms. I was glad of the lighting, which even experienced cavers find of an extra precaution when climbing ladder pitches. (Cavers take great precautions as an accident down a cave can have serious consequences if the victim has to be carried out through tortuous passages.)

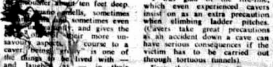

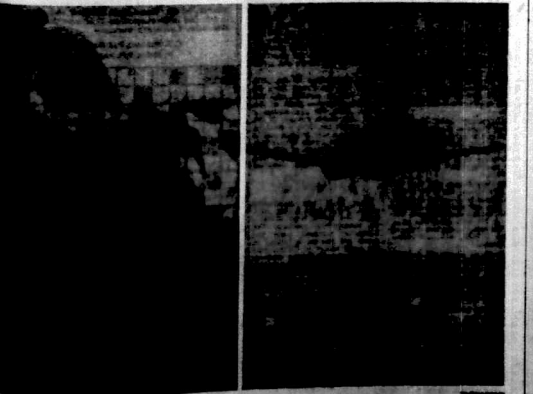


Coming up for air: Ian Mason emerges from a slit after a ladder ascent.



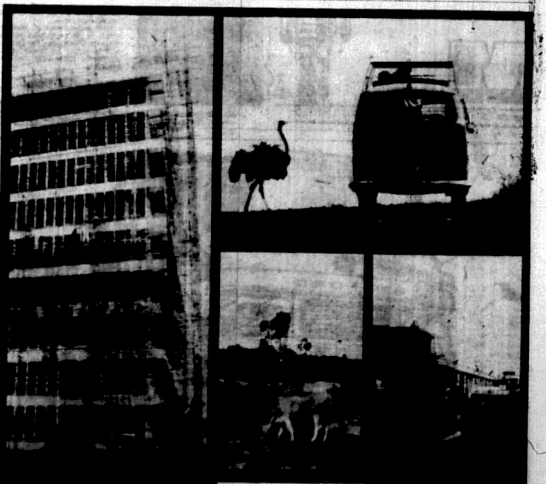

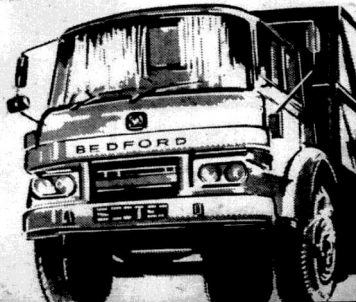

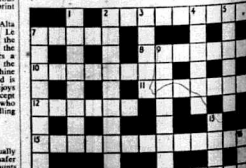

A great mass of black lava has been to the southern shore of Teleki's Volcano, extending around coast and providing a dark contrast to the pinkish blue waters of the lake. Count Teleki is believed to have first arrived about 20 years ago. It is said a tremendous sign for the land, shortly a grey and hot of horizontal ash that rises some 100 feet above the surrounding ridge. But from the air the whole picture comes to life. The scene takes life at the southern end. The spill of lava can be clearly seen creeping from a prominent gash in one side, and where it has found all vegetation has died.

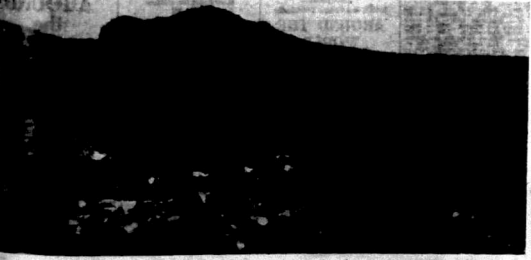
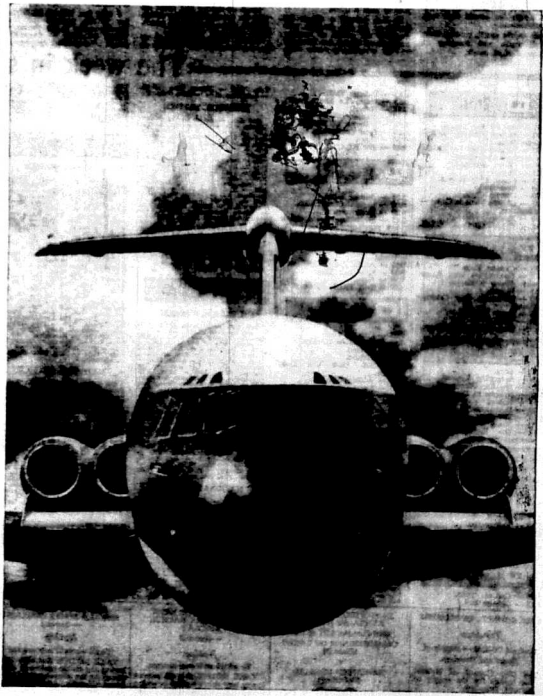

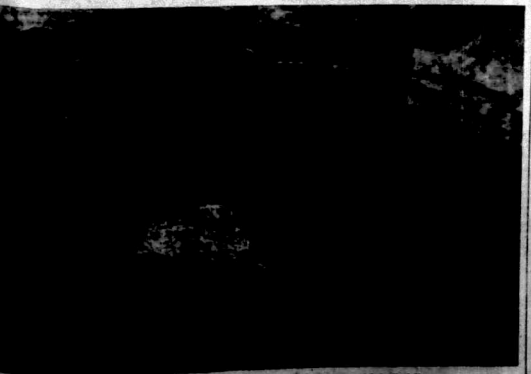

President acts as America mourns

President Johnson yesterday proclaimed Sunday as a day of national mourning throughout the United States in honour of Senator Robert Kennedy and ordered the formation of a special commission to investigate violence in the country.

The proclamation was issued from the White House minutes after Sen. Kennedy's death was announced at the Good Samaritan Hospital, Los Angeles, where he had been struggling for his life after an operation to remove a bullet from his brain.

The Senator's wife, Mrs. Ethel Kennedy, who is 57 years old, his brother Edward, Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy, wife of the assassinated President John Kennedy, his sister, Mrs. Stephen Smith, another sister, Mrs. Peter Lawford, and his three eldest children were at his bedside when he died. A priest also was present.

Partially paralyzed and in a deep coma, Sen. Kennedy died about 22 hours after his operation began. Throughout the night he was in the St. Patrick's Catholic Altar. His death was announced by a team of doctors had become more serious. The last one, at 3 a.m. EST African time, said his condition was "critical to life".

Outside the hospital a crowd of about 1,000 had maintained a vigil throughout the night. Negroes, Mexican-Americans and Whites took turns when the death was announced.

President Johnson echoed the feelings of people throughout the world when he said in his proclamation statement: "The tragedy and the unreason violence of Robert R. Kennedy's death casts a deep shadow of grief across America and across the world."

The Senator's body was being flown to New York where it will be laid in St. Patrick's Cathedral. After a funeral a special train will take the body to Washington for burial at Arlington Cemetery, in a grave alongside his brother. The family of Sen. Martin Luther King were also present, which was provided by President Johnson.

The death of the U.S. General Assembly was cancelled because of the killing.

Inquiry ordered into Nigeria massacre report

A full-scale inquiry has been ordered by the Nigerian Federal leader, Maj.-Gen. Gowon, into reports that Federal troops massacred between 200 and 400 men in a Midwest State village and in another incident tortured civilians by stripping their skin off with broken bottles.

Maj.-Gen. Gowon told foreign correspondents in Lagos, "we are definitely going to get to the bottom of this. He agreed to allow newsmen to visit the area to make their own investigations."

According to reliable independent Nigerian sources, the massacre began digging in around the Midwest State village of Ibadan about April 23. The troops encircled the village to prevent any help and then used the situation, killing between two and four hundred.

The troops then reportedly fired shots at one fleeing father and another, burning down those of the men who refused to come out. Surviving women and children were subsequently taken to the village center at the Midwest State village of Ibadan.

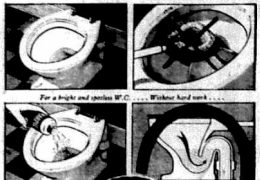

V.O.K.'s big step ahead

-Donald Beet reports

Foundations for the future

Since July 1, 1964, when the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation became the Voice of Kenya, a great deal of effort and thought has gone into plans to provide wider and more reliable radio and television reception throughout the country.

Although V.O.K. has succeeded in many of its aims, it is handicapped by a lack of technical facilities and inefficient development capital. But proposals for development in 1971 which are at present being studied by the Government, will lay the foundations for a modern but efficient system within the development budget.

Obviously V.O.K. cannot hope to match the services provided in other countries, because of the size of the country and its scattered population, but the proposals seek to utilize available funds in the best way possible.

The main object is to improve and extend both radio and television reception and to provide services for a larger portion of the country's population than at present. Priority has been given to radio, because of the relative cheapness of receivers.

Television receivers are very expensive and there is the additional obstacle of the restricted availability of the domestic power needed to operate sets in the home. The basic high-power, medium-wave transmitting station near Nairobi,

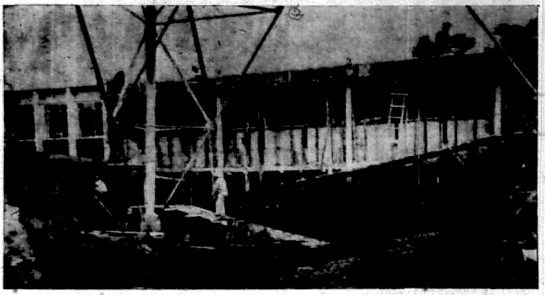
which was opened by President Kenyatta in December, 1966, has greatly improved reception in the central area.

During V.O.K.'s present five-year plan it is hoped to establish additional medium-wave relay stations for the second National Service at Kakamei and Nyali, to serve listeners in Western Kenya and at the Coast and a number of smaller stations in suitable townships.

The Nairobi television transmitter at Hillcrest is to be double provided better reception and the "tower" at Emberton is to be increased in power. An additional tower is to be erected at Mombasa. It is hoped that more amplified frequency project in the next five years, and the kind of which future planning will depend on the setting up of a relay station on Mt Kenya to provide a television service and two radio services.

This will not only provide a greatly increased coverage for the heavily populated Central Highlands, but will permit programmes to be beamed to remote stations in areas further north, west and east, which are beyond the range of existing plant.

A second 100-kilowatt short-wave transmitting station is to be set up at Langata to provide backing for medium-wave and VHF services for the under-populated areas. These areas account for 80 per cent of the land mass of Kenya, but contain only 20 per cent of the population.



These buildings will contain new production offices, badly needed by V.O.K. for their service expansion plans.

The present 100-kilowatt stations at Langata will be diversified by the National Service and a new "beamed" radio service using the existing long-wave short-wave transmitter will take its place.

Thus, both National Services should eventually cover the whole country, at adequate strength, with enhanced reception in densely populated areas.

In spite of all this technical support the average man in the streets of Nairobi or Butirogo is going to ask, "When am I going to be able to hear the radio properly, or be able to watch television?"

The following provisional target dates for establishment of new services or improvements to new services may help.

1969 - Work of Nakuru VHF - Work of Kisumu, Nairobi and Eldoret Medium and High Power Medium-wave transmitting station near Nairobi.

1970-71 - Kisumu, Kulu, 1971-72 - Butirogo.

During the next five-year plan it is hoped that most of the V.O.K.'s present and planned

transmitters are made known through campaign stations and people simply interested in hearing about Kenya.

To enable V.O.K. to carry out its ambitious plans, it is obviously going to need many more trained technicians and other specialists than it has at present, and this is where the new Kenya Institute of Mass Communication comes in.

The Institute, to be fully operational by the end of this year, has already attracted world-wide interest. It is the result of nearly seven years planning and effort.

It was first conceived in 1961 as Election House, which was intended to be an engineering school for the training of technical staff to work for the Kenya Broadcasting Service.

The following year saw the Institute established in Kenya with the Government of Kenya and the Kenya Corporation as the principal sponsors. It is now an autonomous body with its own staff, which has been formed by the National Service and the Public Service. It will provide the Public Service with the best technical opinions on its staff, thus helping the contribution to economic growth and development.

The Institute will take the place of the present V.O.K. Training School, which has been limited in its scope by the small size of Nairobi and the need for a wider range of facilities and staff. It will be a more modern and better equipped institution, with a staff of about 500, of whom about 100 will be full-time staff. 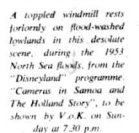

First step completed in far-reaching project

This morning's formal opening by President Kenyatta of the Kindaruma development of the Seven Forks Hydro-Electric project is the first step in the ambitious and far-reaching scheme which will ensure the provision of electricity requirements for the foreseeable future.

The main dam, which has a maximum height of 80 feet and a length of 1,000 feet, is of concrete with an asphaltic concrete membrane on the upstream face. The road connecting the access road to the power station runs across the top of the dam.

A low saddle dam upstream of the main dam is used to prevent the water escaping from the reservoir at this point. The saddle dam is 400 feet in length and has a maximum height of 15 feet, and also an emergency spillway about three feet above the normal water level. An exceptional flood existing the capacity of the spillway gates. In each event the saddle dam would be overtopped and discharged the surplus water back into the Tana, thereby protecting the top of the dam.

Any flood which might come in to happen would be considerably larger than any record of flood conditions in the area and the cost of reconstructing the saddle dam would be modest compared with the damage which might otherwise occur to the main works.

The intake channel is cut through rock at approximately right angles to the power station. The cut is 100 feet deep and leads to a concrete intake structure which contains three vertical gates protected by screens with mechanical lifting devices.

Each intake gate supplies a 15-ft diameter penstock sloping down to the power station. A separate 21-in diameter connection water pipe discharges 200 cusecs directly from the intake into the tailrace when the station is shut down.

The power station itself is situated in a rock cutting at the lower end of the penstock. Its installation consists of two

generating units, with provision for a third. The two turbines are 28,400 h.p. Kaplan type driving generators rated at 21.5 MVA. Output is controlled by electro-hydraulic actuator governors. The turbines discharge water through draft tubes into a tailrace channel, and thence back to the river.

The switchboard is adjacent to the control building and contains the main 22 kVA transformer to convert the power from 11 kV to the transmission voltage of 112 kV. The switchboard also contains the necessary switchgear and protection apparatus. A 112 kV transmission line carried on steel towers will deliver power to the main load substation on the outskirts of Nairobi. It is

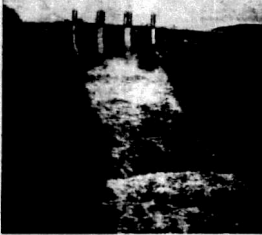

These future developments give an eventual maximum capacity of 100,000 cubic feet of water per second at 1966 prices of £53,000,000 which is a further 600 megawatts of peak load plant could be added at a comparatively small reduced cost per kilowatt installed.

Enough power to supply all Kenya's future needs

The development of hydro-electric power is one of the keys to Kenya's future prosperity. The Tana River, which rises in the Aberdare Mountains and flows across 500 miles of mountainous and largely arid country before discharging into the Indian Ocean at Kilifi, 100 miles north of Mombasa, will have an ultimate hydro-electric potential capacity of some one million kilowatts.

Today Kenya's electric power consumption amounts to about 250 million kilowatt hours per year. In 20 years' time these requirements may well have increased to 3,000 million kilowatt hours per annum.

An increase of this magnitude is well within the realm of possibility when considered in connection with the evolutionary changes that are now taking place in the way of life of the people of Kenya.

As the present time agriculture accounts for some 35 per cent of the country's gross domestic product and 1,200,000 families out of 1,600,000 earn their living from the land. With a population of some 6,600,000, estimated to be increasing at a rate of three per cent per annum, an ever-increasing population drift to urban centres must be expected within the next 20 years.

The maintenance of a balanced economy will depend upon commercial expansion and industrialisation and the disappearance of economic subsistence farming in favour of more viable and profitable agricultural units.

Kenya's economic development is of course dependent on many factors, external as well as internal. Political events both inside and outside the country can affect the availability of financial capital and foreign investment to finance development, but whatever the possibility of development must be planned in accordance with the apparent trend of events.

The Government is acutely aware of this need and has clearly stated its plans for the immediate future in the Revised Development Plan for 1962-70. Looking further ahead, it has recently published through the Town Planning Department of the Ministry of Lands and Settlement, a regional development plan for the Central Province, which gives some indication of the scope of the developments that could occur during the next 30 years and the plans that are being implemented to ensure that the country and its people will benefit from these changes.

The Kenya Government and the East African Power and Lighting Company Limited commissioned locally in 1962 and have now received from Balfour Beatty and Co. Limited a National Power Development Plan for 1962-6.

Many potential commercial and industrial developments would be impossible without the electricity which this plan proposes to develop. 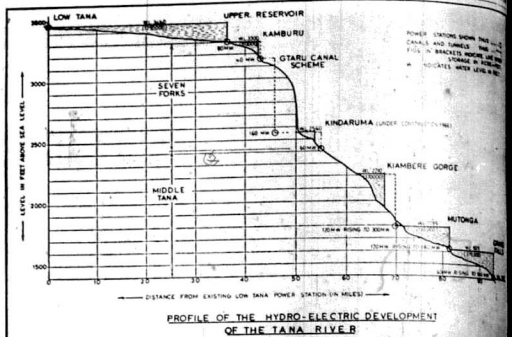

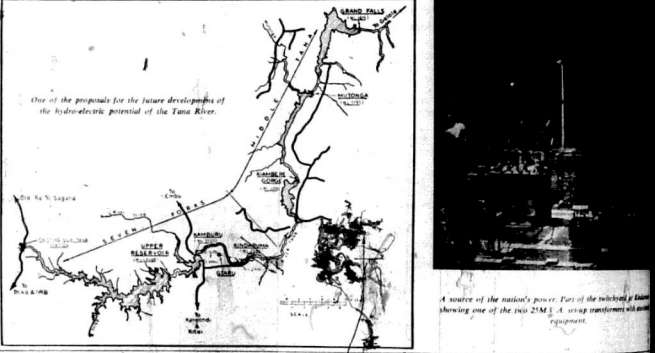

The Kindaruma development comes last 60 years after pioneers began a search for a prime mover that would in time serve the most advanced needs of East African industry.

At the turn of the century there were hopes that coal, the major source of power at the time, would be discovered in the Coastal area by Mr. Winston Churchill but there was visualised the need for a prime mover that would in time serve the most advanced needs of East African industry.

It is now trying to lay hold of tropical Africa with the scaled finger. Civilization must be armed with machinery if she is going to subdue those wild regions to her authority; her roads, not jugging porters, tractors, machines, tractors, cheap power, not cheap labour, steam and steel, not meat and fanning, but iron, less the way to tame the jungle, more timber than she can use.

The station was opened in 1925, and was continued to give excellent service to the present day. In the meanwhile the development of Kilindini Harbour at Mombasa necessitated a greater supply than the plant currently being installed in 1909 by the Government. The new station was set up by a 121 hp p.m. turbine of 1,000 kW in a Mombasa shaft water factory, and the purchase of which might well be considered by anyone seeking a reliable unit.

This machine was superseded in 1913 by a modern Garrett set with two dynamos each of 25 kW. In 1924 the new Swami power station was opened by Sir Robert Coryndon who was then Governor and Commissioner of the Colony and Protectorate. 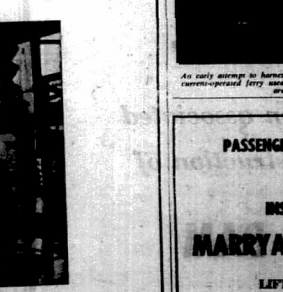

Snakes, scorpions and other amusements

When a project such as Kinjaruma takes three years to plan it may be wondered how anyone managed to live some sort of lonely life when the day's work was done?

The site of the beeman track, a few miles from Nairobi, means a two-hour drive. Temperatures are high, with an average of 90 degrees F. The area has not many natural amusements and it was up to the staff on the spot to generate and maintain amusements.

Ball dancing was completed in 1957 and has become more in vogue in the Kinjaruma (K) because the focal point of all social life. The committee organised films, shows and dances. There were conducted on the site during the day. The staff was made and golf and tennis on the site of a college. He had been driving across the site half who lived in the army were on the young side, again being some 25 and 35. Their children were born to senior staff before their first two years of the contract.

Children were very much in fashion in both sexes and junior wives at the peak of domestic life. The committee made sure that the staff was not away from trouble at the army school, for junior staff were sent to the African Island school. There was also a

Between them they dealt with minor injuries and ailments. There was also a driving range, fruit and vegetable store, a school, a beer hall and even a local trader approved by the Government, thus providing further employment in the area.

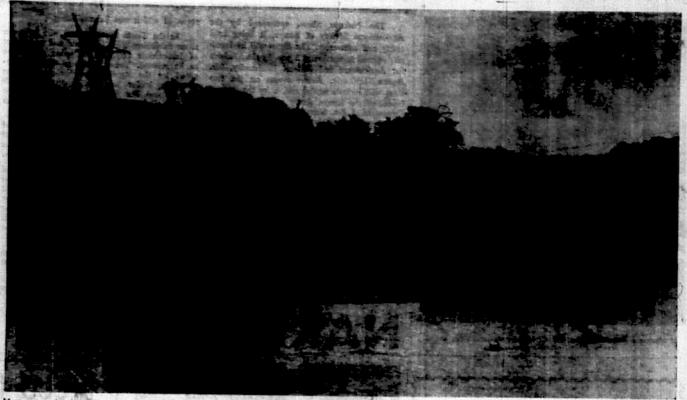
Organised activities of social activities in the junior camp was the Mountain Construction Company's safety and welfare officer, Mr. Matthew Oguni. He looked after an area at the back of the bars, presented the floor and had everybody dancing to an Emba band about a month. He also organised regular film shows and tennis athletic activities like football and volleyball. Evening classes in adult literacy were also popular.

Kinjaruma was not only a meeting place for the water but a social meeting place for the staff. It was a meeting place for every kind of snake, scorpion and spider.

And during the rains, if people preferred to be indoors, as they were, the snakes and scorpions which invaded houses and offices at every period. One Nubian soldier on his morning found him on a drawing table. Most people looked under their beds at night and no one would think of putting on a show unless it was locked first to dislodge a possible occupant.

The men and women of Kinjaruma have now finished their stay in the bar. They will have recollections of the heat, the snakes and the scorpions. They will also remember the transformation of the site from bush and trees to the finished project. Some of the company men, women and children will be dispersed, some moving to other sites in the bush.

For while boiling dream of projects such as Kinjaruma are always those who are willing to make the dreams come true, despite the nightmares they encounter on the way.



Indefinable nature of electricity

CONTROL FROM 75 MILES

Supervisory control of a Kindaruma Hydro-Electric Power Station will ultimately be carried out from a Control Centre near Nairobi 75 miles from Kinjaruma.

The remote control is already equipped with electronic control equipment which consists of a transmitter, modulator, and is supplied by Standard Telephones and Cables Limited, an associate of I.T.E.

The plant, which is under the control of telecontrol, will be two 20 Megawatt units, each with a 11 kilovolt turbine. The system uses a remote control, providing the local dispatcher, stationed at the Control Centre near Nairobi, with an up-to-date picture of the state of the system at any given moment, as well as varying regulations for the turbine and control of circuit breakers.

Information is presented on a panel diagram, mounting local telecontrol, and also on a set of shut-down controls, and the Control Centre near Nairobi. The system is designed to be operated in the event of a power failure. Everybody knows about electricity. Everybody knows that it is the form of lightning and, when turned, can be used to heat and work the refrigerator.

The strange thing is, however, that the more that is discussed about electricity the less one is able to define. You can't be a physicist or a power engineer if you can't lay a year's supply and have it away from you. The simplest textbook will tell you that electricity is "a form of energy which can be stored by the effect it produces but cannot be described in other terms". It is invisible and intangible.

A non-technical person once suggested that man electricity is not really a form of energy in itself, but a reproduction of the original energy generated at the power station by the prime mover, actuated by the combination of fuel or the force of running water.

It is that as it may, when you receive your electricity bill you will find that you have not been charged for a specific quantity or measurement of current, but for the amount of work which it has done. It is this work which you pay for.

Electrical energy as a composite of various factors which are related to the terms used in the industry may find which you will find in this supplement.

In 1821, the English physician Gilbert, writing in Latin over three centuries ago, made the Greek word "electron", meaning "amber", the origin of the word "electric". He was the first to observe that when a piece of amber is rubbed with a piece of fur, it attracts small pieces of paper.

So, ever centuries of conductors and experiment, through the successive discoveries of Faraday, Volta, Ohm, Ampere, and others, the science of electricity has progressed until today it provides Kenya with its major indigenous source of heat, light and mechanical movement.

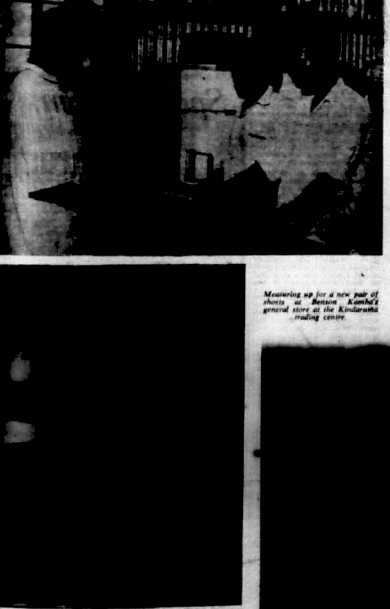

The Nakuru Show, sponsored by the Agricultural Society of Kenya, is being held today and tomorrow. The Show will be formally opened tomorrow at 2 p.m. by the Minister for Agriculture and Animal Husbandry, Mr. Bruce McKenzie. Areas events on the two days will include performances by the matted bands of the Kenya Army and the Corps of Drums of 5th Kenya Rifles who will also give a ground display. The Kenya Navy, the Kenya Air Force and the National Youth Service will also participate.

Ideal setting for story of progress

Nakuru's origin as a major urban centre, like that for most Kenya towns, was undoubtedly fortuitous. It dates back to January 28, 1904, when a proclamation was issued by Sir Charles Elliot, His Majesty's Commissioner, declaring the territory of Nakuru "within a circle having a radius of one mile from the main entrance to the Railway Station at the centre".

That was in fact the birth of what is now Kenya's fourth largest town and the capital of the country's west agricultural industry. Three years earlier, in 1901,

the Uganda Railway line, as it was called at that time, had arrived from Mombasa at a place close to the shore of Lake Nakuru, which was more than three miles from its present site. Engineers, laying the railway along the foot of the Rift Valley, halted at the place to consolidate and survey the route by which they would climb out of the deep depression of the lake. Nakuru, which therefore started from a camping site in the African bush surrounded by hyena, jackal, weaver, reba, lion, leopard and other wild animals, made great strides in its development in the past 60 years to become a modern town. The town stands strategically placed in the centre of the Great Rift Valley. It occupies one of the southern slopes of the great extinct volcano of Menengai Hill, with its enormous crater, several miles in circumference, providing one of the largest formations of its kind in the world. The view of the town and surrounding areas from the top of the crater is not only arresting but grand. About two miles from the town in the picturesque Lake Nakuru, the world-famous bird sanctuary. Flocks of hundreds of birds can easily be seen on the lake, forming a very striking picture of white and pink against the dark grey colour of the water. This is the home of Africa's Hamarings. Beyond the lake to the south can be seen the blue Silburo Mountain. To the west of the town are the Mau range and the

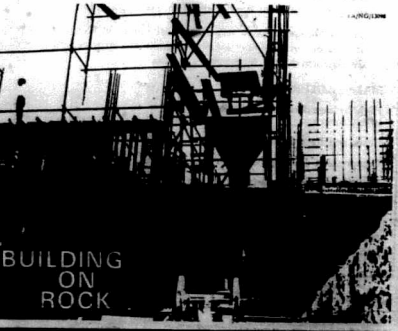

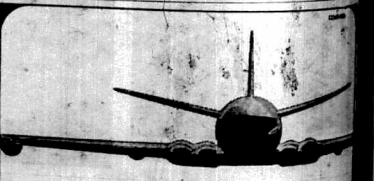

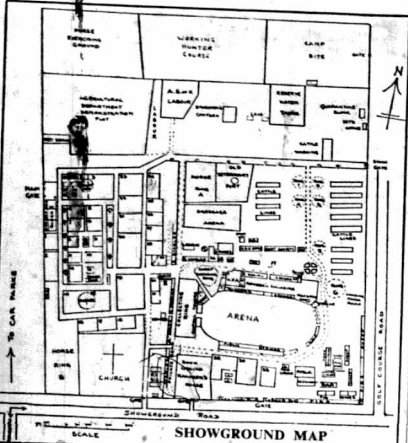

Preparing for expected rapid rate of growth

With a rateable value of £2,500,000 — excluding schools, hospitals, playing fields, charitable and public institutions which the Government has exempted from being taxed — and a population of more than 50,000 people, Nakuru is an important commercial and industrial town in Kenya.

According to the 1962 census the population of Nakuru Municipality was 38,281, with a labour force of 9,835. The 1962 population projection is 74,000 — 72,000 with a labour force of between 25,500 and 27,055.

But the Town Clerk, Mr. John Monahan, thinks these figures are all out of date. The development of the town and population migration into it from the surrounding farms has certainly exceeded expectations which were calculated six years ago.

Since Kenya achieved independence in 1963, the town, which is the provincial headquarters for the vast Rift Valley Province and the administrative head office for the Central Rift County Council, has grown in size and importance.

The present area of the municipality is 8,105 acres, approximately 100 times the area that plans are being made to extend the boundary of the town to include the Laam, railway barracks and Nakuru airfield in the municipality.

The Mayor, Ald. Geoffrey Kagan, during the past few years, in which he has been in office, has vigorously campaigned both in Kenya and outside the country to attract commercial and industrial investors to the town. He, however, thinks that Nakuru, with all the facilities and amenities it offers, plus its central position along the Kenya-Uganda railway and road system, has not received a fair share of Kenya's recent industrial investments.

The climate is ideal, temperatures ranging from temperate to warm, depending on the seasonal rains. The unshaded industrial estate comprises 80 acres, of which a large proportion has been allocated and developed.

Land in the estate can be made available by the East African Railways and Harbours Corporation in large and small plots. The estate is served by communication roads, rail sidings, water, electricity and sewerage.

The light industrial area of about 30 acres to the south of the main industrial area has been one of the most popular areas of vacant plots. There is a water supply, adequate water and electric power are available.

The supply of labour is good, the town being surrounded by farming districts but situated between the densely populated Central Province to the east and Nyanza and Western Provinces to the west.

The town is a hub of excellent road systems leading out to Nairobi, Kisumu, Uganda, Tanzania and northern areas of Kenya. Strategically, there is in fact no better-placed town in Kenya than Nakuru.

stains complained ten years ago is a landmark in the centre of the town.

Seven miles from the town is the Nakuru airfield which is capable of taking all but the large inter-continental airlines. There is an air club operating from the airfield for commercial and recreational purposes.

Three principal banks in Kenya, Standard Bank D.C.O., the National and Grindlays Bank, and the Standard Bank, all have large offices in the town along the main commercial area in Kenyatta Avenue.

Lake Nakuru National Park, established only this year, is having an impact on the life of the town. Many more tourists than in previous years are visiting the town to view the famous flamingos.

Industrial and commercial undertakings built in the town since 1964 have cost about £1,500,000. These include the £125,000 Windmill Fertilisers (E.A.S.) Ltd. who set up a large factory in the industrial area and are all of the nature of expanding it to a considerable scale.

There is also the £750,000 Lion Carbide factory built last year to manufacture dry-cell batteries for torches and radios. Other notable establishments are the Forest Training Centre, which was opened last year; the Kenya Industrial Training Institute, opened in 1961; and the 40 Cyprus beds and the big Maize Board store all of which are nearing completion.

The municipal council has built four new primary schools since 1961, making a total of 15 primary schools in the municipality. The number of pupils in these schools has risen from 3,000 in 1961 to 6,500 this year. Since 1963 the municipal council

has spent £245,100 to construct housing for 1,200 families accommodating 5,000 people. All the money for the housing has been borrowed from the Central Housing Corporation.

About 850 housing units were occupied last year and 42 are to be occupied in August. Tenders have been accepted for 70 houses and work should start shortly.

Water and sewers have been laid to 80 plots which are to be developed by individuals as a site and service scheme.

Mr. Monahan, however, thinks that housing in one of the serious problems facing the town today. The Central Government as well as the private commercial and industrial companies in Nakuru have not done enough, he thinks, to build houses for their own employees.

They have, since independence, left the burden of housing the people of Nakuru to the council, which now has 1,500 applicants on the waiting list for houses. The council's immediate need is for 475,000 to build houses during the 1968-69 budget.

The council has also built a number of dispensaries, extended existing maternity services and developed playing fields for recreation. Senior council staff are also contributing to Nakuru's Memorial Hospital Fund which was founded to prevent the hospital from closing down through lack of running expenses.

The hospital was established in 1916 and is mentioned in the people from the Nakuru district who gave their lives in the First World War. In the past five years the hospital has suffered severely from lack of funds and at times has been on the verge of closing.

Exploratory work is to be carried out by the council's sewerage engineers in the town's main sewerage line. The 2,500,000 Malawa Water Supplies built in 1956 and covering a pipeline of 31 miles.

Construction work is to start

next month on a £120,000 new Town Hall and office adjacent to the existing municipal hall. This, together with the new offices of the Central Rift County Council which were opened last year by President Kenyatta, will add yet a new landmark to the town.

Future industrial development in Nakuru looks bright, the Town Clerk says. Many overseas investors have made inquiries about setting up industries in Nakuru.

One important company is from Britain which has already issued a feasibility study of building a leather factory in the town. This has not yet been accepted, and all details are in the hands of the company.

Another is a textile industry, which is still the subject of conditional negotiations. Should this materialize, Nakuru stands to gain one of her biggest employers. The industry expects to employ 1,000 people and to contribute to the town's development.

Other industrial projects must not be put to rest. The year has witnessed the formation of the Nakuru branch of the Kenya Chamber of Commerce and Industry, of which Mr. Wallace Wambua and Mr. Thakkar are the main organizers to promote more economic activity in Nakuru town.

These two bodies have assisted greatly in the revitalization of the commercial sector. Mr. J. H. Paul, who is the Chairman of the Nakuru Chamber of Commerce, says that Nakuru is a free trading area with commercial workers of the town.

Commerce and Government departments are developing at the city's shore all have branches and offices in Nakuru. They all stand to benefit from any increased economic expansion in Nakuru.

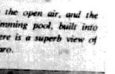

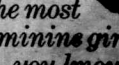

Grand aim in Kenya and why it failed

ORIGINS OF EUROPEAN SETTLEMENT IN KENYA by R. S. Sorensen (London: Pinter 65s), also available in paperback at 35s.

Readers will agree that a report from Mervyn Hill's *The Permanent Way* there have been few detailed studies of European settlement in Kenya.

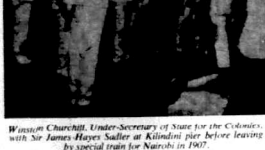
