# 57 escape death as giant airliner crashes

Fifty-seven people narrowly escaped death early yesterday when a Pan American Boeing airliner crashed and burst into flames near Calcutta's Dum Dum Airport.

An air hostess, four other women and a child were killed, however. All 48 cabin bodies were found in the wreckage by midday. Twenty-two passengers carried 53 passengers and 10 crew members scrambled from the cabin as the jet nosed into the ground.

The plane had scheduled to arrive at Calcutta at 10:30 p.m. An investigation team will arrive from the United States today. The flight, which left Los Angeles on Tuesday, was due into London's Heathrow Airport yesterday afternoon after further stops at Karachi, Beirut, Istanbul and Frankfurt.

Following a brief stopover in London, the plane was to arrive at New York's Kennedy Airport at 10 a.m. on Friday.

Airline officials said that those aboard the plane at the time of the crash included two passengers from Tokyo to London, two from Tokyo to Beirut, and one from Hongkong to Frankfurt, and from Hongkong to Karachi. Further details were not immediately available.

# POLICE SEARCH 250,000 FILES

The dramatic arrest of James Earl Ray, suspected of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, followed a search through 250,000 dossiers by detectives of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

Eighteen days after the killing on April 21, the F.B.I. sent photographs and a note saying that he probably spent last summer in Montreal after his escape from Missouri Prison in April, 1967.

The F.B.I. suggested that Ray might have sought refuge in Toronto shortly after the assassination of the slain.

This launched the massive search operation through Canada. Agents found files which began on May 13 under the control of a corporation named the 17 Young "Montrealers" and which closed that normal routine should not be used to do it.

The name of "Montrealers" was also on the list of passport applications made since April 1967, when Ray escaped from prison.

Then, on June 1, one of the files found there was a photograph between the F.B.I.'s photo of Ray and the photo on a passport application of "Ramona George Stevens".

Both the Federal Nigerian and Biafran ministers have been holding talks this week in London with representatives of the British Government, seeking support for their claims and counter-claims... Commencing on the talks, the principal Federal delegate, Chief Ifeanyi, said he had serious doubts whether he would return to the conference table...

Nevertheless, there is nothing wrong with trying to oil the wheels... On the contrary, every effort should be exerted to get the talks there must be, and soon, in order to end this senseless civil war.

But there will have to be a radical change of heart if there is to be any prospect of agreement. The talks had begun in a conciliatory atmosphere, with the Federal delegation making concessions on procedure, so that no chairman was appointed until Uganada's Mr. Okuma was accepted as the official observer. As the Federal representatives could argue from a position of strength after recent military successes had even then almost ended the rebellion, it was scarcely surprising to find them resting what amounted to a pre-condition on the Biafran side amounting to recognition of equality. True, Biafra had been recognized by several African States but not by the majority of the O.A.U. members who would remind the wider U.N.

# Orchiditis, the lifelong addiction

Although two of the most stimulating and experienced members of the Orchid Society, Mr. Brian Parkin of City Park and Mrs. Pat Scott, recently have left Nairobi, the society has — like a good handy orchid — managed to survive and blossom forth with new strength.

And though the absence of their expert and specialized knowledge of orchids was lamented at the first meeting of the society, where a competition for the Fifth Memorial Trophy was held for the first group of East African orchids, the loss could be a blessing in disguise.

For, as the president of the society, Col. R. D. C. Wilcock, put it: "Nairobi is really an orchidists' city, and we will be encouraged to take up our orchidical hobby and fill the gap created by these two."

If there is nobody in the society who can claim to have quite the same degree of technical knowledge of orchids, that Mr. Brian Parkin and Mrs. Pat Scott, members of the last group of East African orchids, are not counted on as any branch of the subject.

In Paris, a formal meeting, the society's report on indigenous varieties like *Psychotria* and *Trichostema* on orchids this year which is bound to attract much interest, but not amongst orchid growers, but horticulturists in general.

Orchid growing — the stream of gardening activities — is a hobby which can become irresistible.

anyone who modestly starts to try their hand at it.

Before the society meets a prospective member must have at least 12 orchids in his possession. This separates people who just happen to have an orchid growing in their garden from those really addicted to the pleasant disease of orchiditis.

This small society, formed in 1957 by just a few people, has already succeeded in its purpose. The number of members which this society has now can again be compared with an orchid growing in its garden from seed, but the growth stage from seed to flowering has passed this year.

Orchid growers who grow their own plants usually produce more plants than they need from seedling plants. There is a certain sense of achievement in this, because one batch of seedlings will greatly vary in the standard of flowers eventually produced.

It is entirely a fallacy that orchid growing is for millionaires and beyond the bank balance of the ordinary man in the street.

The majority of orchid members of the Orchid Society in Kenya are prominent members of the community, but it is probably because they were attracted to orchids that they can tell the beginner from experience that there is a flowering cost little more than a flowering shov.

Of course there are plenty of more expensive varieties, but the connoisseurs, and all flowering should appreciate an orchid worth about five shillings to anywhere around 50, or even a good deal more. The price is highly variable and the orchidist will find several hundred pounds.

The majority of orchids cultivated today are hybrid originals from the interbreeding of two species. This interbreeding of orchids has to travel back to about 1852 when an English scientist, Mr. Harris, got the idea that they could be interbred by hand pollination.

There are now about 40,000 to 50,000 varieties of orchid in existence and about half of these are hybrids bred from naturally occurring species.

An orchid has six petals, one of which is called the lip, and is unusual beautiful form, and is referred to as the "lip".

The idea that orchids are parasites is unfounded as the thick waxy roots do not penetrate into the heart of the trunk but cling tenaciously to the surface of the bark.

Copying their natural habitat

as closely as possible is an important aim in growing them, ordinary soil is not suitable for these plants as the roots, which normally cling around the bark of a tree, need aeration. Thus they have to be grown in a special medium, usually of fibre which allows for this.

That is why very susceptible varieties of orchids are grown in a temperature and moist medium of the more difficult and valuable types of orchid root can be kept on the verandah of the garden without effect.

They require a small amount of fertilizer to take the place of their natural feeding habits of absorbing various concentrations of organic fertilizers dissolved in rainwater washing down from high-pitched-roofed branches.

Also in 1962, single shoots of a Kenya orchid, *Psychotria*, were being sold for five guineas each, so popular were they for their beautiful purple flowers.

Local orchids can be found almost anywhere. Some members have orchids found at Langata or Karen and others come from further afield.

They normally come from the more humid areas such as forests and near water, but the more terrestrial ones are found near hills and on sand dunes, rocks and even on sea shores.

Although the society does not visit orchids, its members will search for orchids in the mountains, the Kenya areas where they are known to occur with the intention of finding new species.

Orchid growing is to start with inexpensive varieties, to use them as "study plants".

Sales of orchid plants are held occasionally and members get together every few weeks usually to discuss their progress. A yearly exhibition of members' best variety is held at the city hall.

There is a sense of mystery

around orchids who successfully grow orchids — the vague, unexplained about the conditions of their growth leads people to think one has to be a genius to be able to do it.

Only one orchid out of the thousands in existence has any true colour — the so-called "flamingo" orchid. It is generally known that the world's most beautiful flowering orchid from a climbing vine of the orchid family — the wax orchid.

It was discovered by Francisco Hernandez in the Hall garden when he visited Mexico and found Indian using vanilla "bees" for harvesting chocolate.

These waxed orchids, the 1 mile plant-like, with a flower similar to that of the canyons are difficult to transplant successfully but it can be done, and it is believed that some are being grown in East Africa.

There are many African folklore stories concerning the exotic orchid growing wild.

The Zulu people use a decoction of the stems of the *Stachytarpheta* (Lepidopetalum) as an aphrodisiac, and also as an antidote to a bad dream.

Nairobi Orchestra to play organ concerto

The organ in Nairobi Cathedral will be used in a performance of Handel's organ concerto No. 4 in F at the next concert by the Nairobi Orchestra at the Cathedral on Saturday, June 29.

Dr. Dendy informs that he always tries to include a classical symphony in the Nairobi Orchestra's concerts, as he feels there is no better music than classical form.

An album by the American, Samuel Barber, will provide modernity and a Pavane by Isaac Poulenc, in an arrangement by Dr. Dendy will represent early 20th-century music.

The orchestra will be larger than in March but smaller than in November. However, there is the same nucleus of a dozen or so players who have been with the orchestra since it started in March 1967, but the rest of the orchestra are 'hired' musicians. A considerable number of the present members are leaving in the next few months.

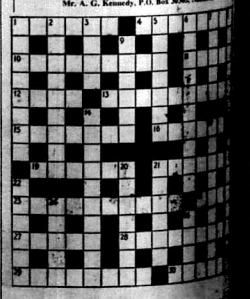

### The East Face pathfinders

The members of the Great Innes Expedition, Ian Howell, the leader, Roger Higgins and Ian Allan, made aerial survey last Sunday of their objective, a direct line up the 6,000-ft. East Face of Mawenzi and the snow-chains below it, the line Barrocco.

The small plane in which they were piloted by Gordon Ross, resident of the Mount Kenya Club, made four passes over the face at an altitude of 10,000 ft. During the two-hour, quarter-hour flight they took one aerial reconnaissance and black and white, some of which are available here.

Taking a big chance with the snow-chains below it, the group took off from the summit of Mt. Kenya, very early in the morning, to reach the East Face before the cloud-covered summit. However, they found the snow-chains to be too high to fly over. More than 100 photographs were taken by the climbers for future study and reconnaissance.

Howell, which rises to a peak of 14,940 ft., is the highest of the East Face. Many attempts have been made to climb it, all unsuccessful. Perhaps the nearest was in 1944 when two British climbers, National Geographic Society, Mr. Humphrey Slade and Mr. Ian Howell, and he left up into two groups. The first group, led by Howell, Ian Allan, and Roger Higgins, made the first ascent of the East Face. They were helped through the snow-chains to the foot of the mountain by a four-man support team, which included Ian Marshall, Mr. Allan, and John. The two other climbers, back to back, were helped through the snow-chains by a radio link.

Howell and Smith, based on the results of the reconnaissance, will be the first to attempt the ascent of the East Face. They will be followed by the other two. The first ascent of the East Face will be made by Howell, Ian Allan, and Roger Higgins. The second ascent will be made by Howell and Smith. I don't think V.o.K. has any trouble in finding Kenya news, but sometimes the way in which they use them is baffling.

On the whole I think the present breakdown into international and Kenya news is satisfactory if not perfect, and if V.o.K. put more news in the correct order of importance.

If they feel the announcement of an impending State visit is the most important item of news, then I agree it should be read first but not as a sensational news item.

While on the subject of the news, I was puzzled by the fact that there was no mention on Saturday's TV news of the capture of London and the death of the Prime Minister.

Validation on Monday night provided examples of good and bad work behind the scenes. During President Kennedy's speech to the U.P. conference in Harare, the camera, as usual, picked out

groups of delegates listening to what he had to say. This is all very well unless the camera focuses on one group for too long, as happened on this occasion.

This particular little group found the screen full over a minute, and the unfortunate thing was that they all looked pretty bored. Most people look bored when listening to speeches, even though they may not be, and it is a mistake for the camera to hover too long in one place, as invariably someone seems to "nod off".

A much better effort was made when President Kenyatta visited on the Kariakara Dam's power station. The camera was not so good as to see the dam at all as the camera only began to show the audience, but when they were looking at the dam, especially those which showed the crowd with a tremendous spray of water behind them.

Tom Martin, one of the two men originally scheduled to appear in Something Special, finally appeared on Monday night, and as far as I am concerned he need not have appeared. Since he is still a flop, and I know he is disappointed, I thought I would give him a try.

Anyway, I think football fans were well served last Saturday with the wonderful Eireman FC Final between Manchester United and

Derby.

Did you notice the camera work there? Not only did we see goals from the normal angle, we saw them from behind the goal again - and as a Manchester man I savoured every one of them.

## Before your baby is born

The most usual indication that you are going to have a baby is a missed period. But, as this could be caused by something else — a chill or over-exhaustion, perhaps — it is not until you have missed a second period that you can be sure a baby is on the way.

To calculate approximately when the baby will be born, count seven days on from the end of your last period and then add nine calendar months.

As well as regular visits to the doctor or midwife, it is good to make an early appointment with your dentist. As the baby takes the calcium of teeth from its mother, teeth are especially liable to decay at this time unless they are looked after. Foods rich in calcium are milk, cheese and green vegetables, so these should be eaten every day.

It is just as well to avoid rich and indigestible things such as oily, cream, fried food or strong tea, as some people suffer from various forms of indigestion during pregnancy and it is wiser, risk.

Alcohol, if it is drunk only occasionally and not much of it, is moderate. On the other hand, an excess of either alcohol or nicotine can reach the baby and affect his growth, and so should be avoided.

Adequate rest is also essential. Excellent food is no use, however, if you are too tired to eat it. You cannot, while any chance is

still down with your feet on a footstool, sleep with your bedroom warm for the first few months, but as your normal expectations will tend to be raised somewhat, it is well to be prepared for the possibility of general wear and tear. You will probably have to wear a loose, bellows, three-quarter length coat or jacket during the summer. The shoes should preferably have soft soles, preferably be brass, so that there is no pressure round the ankles.

You will probably think it well worth the expense of getting in one pretty maternity dress. There are plenty to be had nowadays, and it will be a great comfort to you, as the last few months of pregnancy are so uncomfortable.

The best form of exercise is walking and, even if you live an active life, it is advisable to take a short walk every day. Some women suffer from back and neck aches and it is best to avoid long periods of sitting down. Some of the most severe forms of gynaecological disease are caused by long periods of sitting down, so in the later months, indulge in and fabric softening.

A baby's life begins when a sperm from his father meets an egg made by his mother. At that moment, also, his sex is decided and what characteristics he will inherit from each of you, the shape of his nose, the colour of his hair and so on.

In the first months of his existence inside the womb, he grows from a scarcely visible streak to a little creature measuring about a quarter of an inch who already possesses a back-

bone, the beginnings of arms and legs, nose, eyes, and a heart that started to beat less than two weeks after conception.

### Clothes for early days

Here is a list of the clothes your baby will need, and which will last him for at least the first six months of his life. There is not much point in getting more than the things listed below — though if kind friends give you one or two extra outfits, you'll be thankful to be useful.

But as a tiny baby does not show off clothes to advantage, it is better to have your own choice for buying a greater variety of clothes later.

At first you will need only a few dozen Turkish towel nappies. Baby should first wear a muslin square folded in a triangle with a string pinned round him like a shirt. As he gets a little older, the other method of putting on the nappies, with a safety pin at each hip, is probably better, because it is less likely.

Waterproof pants do not need to be made the slightest getting too wet, but avoid elastic round the hips, for that the air can circulate freely.

Yarns. The emergency pattern with no buttons or tapes is probably the best. It is a good idea to sew a piece of tape to the lower side of the neck, to take the nappy pin.

Before you begin feeding, you must be quite sure the food is not too hot. The usual way to test it is to hold the bottle upside down and let some of the milk drop on your arm. If it should be too hot, a heat-resisting bottle can safely be held under the cold tap, but resist the temptation to do this with an ordinary bottle, as many bottles have been broken this way. Instead, let the bottle stand in lukewarm water for a few minutes.

Because of this sort of danger, it is a golden rule never to prepare a bottle in front of the baby, and always to test the temperature before he sees it; otherwise, waiting for it to cool will be re-creating for you both.

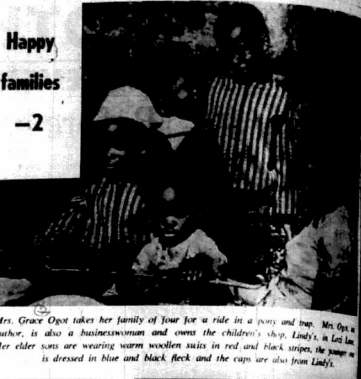
The baby will from time to time suck the milk quite fast. Don't be too fast in sucking them, as they will get wind. Take the rest of the milk before it has flattened

ed but never to let the air rush into the bottle. After the feeding and during the feed if he does not observe you, hold the bottle and rub against your shoulder and gently pat his back, or to bring up the air he has swallowed.

Vitamin supplements should be given to babies from about the age of one month if their normal requirements are not obtained from a milk and if the doctor's advice recommends them. These supplements may be cod-liver oil or vitamins A and D drops (Adecalin) and orange juice or some other source of vitamin C, such as blackcurrant or rose hip syrup. If bottle fed, the milk should be on the drop into the bottle as it will cool the sides and the baby will not fret of it. Give the required amount of teaspoon. The fruit juice should be diluted with warm water, sweetened if necessary, and given about half an hour before the last feed.

Just as you are in pregnancy, including fruit, meat, fish, cereals, cheese and greens. If you are afraid of losing your weight, count on strictly on what you eat and eat potatoes, cereals and greens. If you are thirsty, water will give you are thirsty.

## New role for Dr. Barnardo's Homes

Dr. Barnardo's Homes, historically connected with caring for destitute children, is gradually assuming in Kenya the wider modern role which it has taken in Britain many years ago.

Although the headquarters of the homes on Laikipia Road just before Wilson Airport is due to have its extension opened by President Kenyatta soon, it is in the field of training that the Manager, Mr. G. Farrell, expects the most work to be done in future.

Although Dr. Barnardo's has for years, only of applications a semi-annual, it is now expected that the children who are eventually

taken in are the most desperate cases, but they are providing the basis on which the problem of destitute children could be tackled at the source.

If enough child care nurses can be trained at the homes and later employed in the field, the problem of destitute children could be tackled at the source.

This new way of tackling child care problems has become so important in Kenya that it has not only pushed the role of looking after individual children into a secondary place.

The homes in Nairobi which care for children from nursery to school-leaving age, currently provide an ideal headquarters for a child care training centre.

At present, eight young women a year can be trained at the homes and the Ministry of Social Services is hoping to sponsor a few more, who will be posted back to their home areas when they pass Nairobi City Council have to have finished the course. In the main, the course is to be undertaken by the care of young women in industrial or day-care centres, nursery schools, or their own homes.

It is designed to teach the

student what children are like at different stages in their growth and development, to give her an understanding of their needs and to help her to acquire the necessary knowledge to satisfy them.

The first year includes teaching, observation and study of young children and practical experience in their care. The second year consists mainly of further practical training to enable the student to have more experience in different aspects of child care work.

The training is given an opportunity for observation and discussion of the physical, mental, emotional and social development of children. A study is made of the needs and activities of children and practice is given in handling and building them up.

As a rule the trainer works with normal healthy children, but she is taught to recognize deviations from good physical and mental health and to realise practical steps to be taken to prevent infection, accidents and the steps which may be taken to prevent them.

She has practice in nursery routine and methods covering feeding, bathing and dressing, supervision of activities, cooking, laundry and making and repairing

ing clothes, toys and equipment.

Several girls trained at the homes have returned to the field. Many cases which would have been taken by the homes in the past are now handled by the attention of the Kenya Police.

One of the most serious problems the homes face is shortage of money. The Government, most of the homes in Kenya is the only one in the world where Dr. Barnardo's operates, and is only made up of contributions made by the public.

As it often happens, appeals have little effect, people with good intentions, but never actually get round to giving any.

The manager of the homes, Mr. G. Farrell, described how difficult it is to raise funds from the public, and how many of the devices he uses to draw in other contributions.

Mr. Farrell admits he has a wonderful staff to help him run the homes, including his wife, who has a certificate in his wife, science, and the manager in charge, Miss Z. Peave.

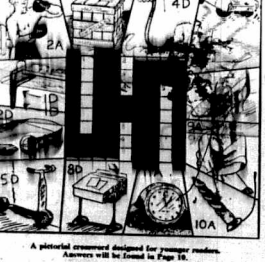

# Sister Tabitha's in charge

A breakthrough for the Hospital nursing came a few weeks ago with the promotion of Sister Tabitha Joseph from nursing sister to Sister in Charge of the Maternity Unit.

For the last five years this sister has been elected as a responsible position as a hospital by the Hospital Committee, and Sister Tabitha Joseph, 36, is obviously qualified for the responsible position.

She was the youngest sister of the late Sister Grace Oguti, who was in the nursing profession for several years. In 1960 she went to Britain to complete her general education, and this was followed by a short course in operating theatre at the British General Hospital in Kent for two years.

She then returned to Kenya to work in various hospitals and returned to Kenya in 1963. She has now worked at the Nairobi Hospital since the beginning of last year as a nursing sister on the maternity ward.

She has now under her supervision eight nursing sisters, five of whom are African, eight assistant midwives, five staff nurses and five student nurses. She is responsible for organizing the duties of all staff as well as her routine care of mothers and babies at all stages, together with the doctor.

Sister Joseph, young, attractive and self-motivated, views her recent promotion modestly. "I don't know how you come to know about it," she said. "I was keeping it secret."

However she feels her own position of responsibility should serve to show that there is no discrimination in nursing among the hospital staff and doctors, where ability is the only important factor.

"There is only prejudice where patients are concerned, and even that is slowly dying," she said.

Even so, often patients to whom the Sister-in-Charge is without realizing her great help and gratitude that signify her office, and when she tells them they are in hospital.

But this does not worry her at all, said Sister Joseph, it is more to imagine that her patients quickly gain confidence in her personally and kind assistance.

Some interesting comments on the many maternity cases that she has handled during her career came from Sister Joseph. While it is true that many African women, especially those who have had children previously, do not mind going to hospital for childbirth, she said that the most difficult cases are probably the teenagers who tend to make a lot more fuss than is necessary and Sister Joseph respects it, only to get more sympathy.

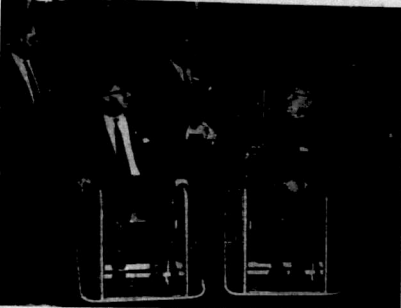

## House of Lords reform

What matters most to the outside world, especially Africa, about the latest trade agreement between the United Kingdom and Rhodesia is not so much reform of the House of Lords as whether or not Britain will apply mandatory economic sanctions imposed by the U.N.

The ban is in operation under an Order-in-Council and implementation will not be affected because of Conservative opposition in the Commons and rejection in the Lords. An Order-in-Council is the device used to short-cut the more lengthy operation of the democratic parliamentary process in times of emergency as frequently happened by Churchill during the Second World War. It was used so audaciously accused of ruling through Orders-in-Council.

Mr. Wilson must obtain parliamentary ratification of the Order within 28 days. Despite rejection by a flimsy majority of the Commons, it was easily dismissed as an "errand boy" — he can probably get the operation of sanctions under a new Order, and so on, but the Conservative leaders in the Lords have indicated they will not continue opposition to the second appearance before the Upper House. In other words, their rejection, regrettable though it was, represented only a token gesture.

Considering there are more than 1,000 peers — most hereditary, some created for life — among whom Government supporters number only about 110, the voting was a shock to the Conservatives and a moral victory for the Government. Most abstained, and the result, 193 against 184, proved the Government had attracted support from uncommitted peers.

But the indifference, or indecision, of the majority together with this frontal display on a question which should carry united national support cutting across political boundaries, have intensified the demands for further reform of the House of Lords, bringing it more into line with modern democratic requirements. The action of a few peers, coddling the vestal virgin of the "other place", Labour M.P.s have been in full cry to protect the rights of the Commons and discussion carried on recently between the two parties to agree reforms have been taken off as a reprisal.

On the surface, it seems

absurd for the Government of a country responsible for introducing sanctions to suffer defeat for its policy, but there are so many reasons for the Westminster democratic machine. A bicameral system was found suitable for Kenya, so the Senate and House of Representatives were amalgamated to form the National Assembly.

The House of Lords has no power to block any Upper House for seven terms, though with diminishing power. Nowadays, the peers enjoy few personal prerogatives, the "other place", where they sit, has only delaying powers which are frequently bypassed by the use of Churchill during the Second World War.

The House of Lords has no power to veto any public Bill passed by the Commons in two successive sessions. Any such Bill may be presented for royal assent without having been approved in "the other place", provided 12 months elapse between the two votes in the Commons.

The chief value of the Upper House is considered to be the application of experience not necessarily available in the elected Commons and, in its delaying role, giving time for reflection which may elicit new points of view on controversial matters.

Reform has long been under consideration, so has falling out of an Upper House in times when hereditary peerages are considered by the Labour Party, and some other politicians, as an anachronism.

Last night Mr. Wilson denounced its obstructive methods, promising a "withering away" of its powers. The peers themselves are entirely responsible for promoting this constitutional crisis.

As regards the effects achieved by trade sanctions previously applied, it is illuminating to hear from U.K. that Rhodesian exports fell last year to £140,000,000 compared with £180,000,000 in 1965, while exports to Rhodesia from the reporting country totalled only £18,000,000 compared with £83,000,000. # Children's enthusiasm swells entries for singing classes

"A hundred miles a minute" was a yardstick by which one can measure the enthusiasm of those taking part in the Kenya Music Festival, which begins next Monday.

Over 400 children and adults of all ages took part in the preliminary programme for four minutes — as few, if any, would have been inclined to work out the minutes. The programme was headed from Nairobi for the purpose of providing a certain rather astronomical program.

The festival begins on Monday at the Kenya Music Festival, with an afternoon of Oriental music. On Saturday the main music programme commences for African and Western music, and will continue throughout the week.

There are more than 1,000 children and adults of all ages over a quarter being for education. Some sections have reached such unmanageable dimensions — in recent years that it was decided to hold preliminary rounds in those days which had become too large to handle.

For example, last year there were 39 choirs taking part in the Lower Primary unaccompanied choir class, allowing for up to 40 singers in a choir, this meant that the festival organisers had to be prepared for an invasion of up to nearly 1,600 children for one class.

Some of the junior solo classes were particularly successful. When one song is sung by 12 children, the effect is so powerful that it is almost always heard in the school, and often taken up by other classes. It had become the poor relation. Now, from the surge of a breakthrough, the steady flow of funds has slackened to a trickle barely enough to meet monthly expenses.

These vital projects are run by the Association for the Children's Orthopaedic Hospital, on the Industrial Estate, the Children's Orthopaedic Clinic in Boma Road, and the Adult Crutches Training Centre, opposite Kenyatta Hospital.

And still are at a minimum and their dedication is matched by that of volunteer workers, some of whom work full-time.

Whatever the reasons, they are not enough. From all over Kenya children are brought by parents to Boma Road. Some come on crutches, some are carried, some crawl. There are at least 50 new admissions each month.

Manipulation - physiotherapy and exercises - are given first. A few need surgery. But there is always a waiting list at the Mater Misericordiae.

At the Crutches Training Centre, where trainees learn dressmaking, bookbinding and typing, accommodation is tightly limited. The waiting list numbers 80.

It is at this stage of limited achievement, frustrated by limited means, that the association has a chance to force the matter, to change the tracks of courage and rehabilitation people onto a flow.

Orfan has offered £10,000 to a scheme that will completely transform the training centre in Mbagathi Road. The offer has string attached. The money will be handed over only if the association can guarantee the annual £1,000 needed for its upkeep.

There are signs that the money will be guaranteed by the Government. This will leave £10,000 to be raised each year, much of it from donations, to keep the association's other activities going.

It is in this last sum that is the cause of anxiety. The association relies entirely on donations. The future of the association, therefore, lies firmly in the hands of the man in the street.

The planned extensions will transform the training centre from its present cramped quarters into a spacious series of wings: typing wing, dressmaking wing, and quarters for women and instructors.

There will be rooms for dressmaking, shoe-making and leather work, and also valuable extra space for the centre's all-time important orthopaedic work, the making of crutches and casters in their hundreds, as many other voluntary workers are also employed.

The recent gift of a walking machine has complicated this work, carried out completely by one crippled man, who is an amateur. If the machine comes into being, he will be able to train two other crippled in the same work.

Last year 22 trainees were taken in for the 12-month course. With the new buildings, intake would be increased to 50 at a time.

For the leather work it is hoped to find an agent in the tourist trade. The dress-making action at present covers its own costs.

As with many voluntary organisations there is a reliance on the part of many people to come from the limelight.

One such person is Mrs. Bobbie Conley, the unpaid office worker who has greatly accelerated the centre's extensive and tortuous. Her role is to coordinate the association's correspondence and letters.

"The grant from Orfan is surely dependent on the association resolving the problem of covering recurrent expenditure," she said. "I hope that this problem will be ironed out. That still leaves an annual £10,000 to be found."

With an estimated 40,000 physically disabled in Kenya the need for increased voluntary aid needs no emphasising. The Adult Crutches Training Centre, first project of the association after it was founded in 1955, will remain a "Cinderella". For trained shoe-makers, dress-makers, typists and book-binders, there are openings for employment. Each trainee must be sponsored by someone responsible who will also guarantee to help throughout work.

This was the valuable training in itself.

There is also the difficulty of young people who have received treatment and primary education at the Orthopaedic Clinic yet are not bright enough to go on to secondary and higher education.

A second major project already in the pipeline is that of providing a separate special school for physically handicapped children. The existing classrooms at the clinic can provide instruction only up to Standard Three. Another class will be added at the end of the year, to provide a "ceiling" of Standard Four.

Nairobi City Council has agreed to set aside four acres of land and make a capital grant of £100 towards building the new school, and will meet the current costs. The clinic, on which the association recently spent £2,000 on extension, improvement and equipment, can then revert to being used solely for orthopaedic treatment.

That such a school is needed is evident when one learns that some children, because of their handicap, have been unable to complete their education and in some cases, to even start it.

Work at the clinic is managed by the physiotherapist in charge, Mrs. Vera Spencer. It is there that works with a heavy, hand-operated energy that carries her through the long day.

There are three physiotherapists. Two other staff, two dress and shoe primary school teachers, also two appliance makers, will be needed.

In addition there are 15 voluntary workers, mostly nurses, and a number of doctors. More voluntary workers are urgently needed, mostly for putting the children through exercises. At least an hour a day is needed for the children to be taken to a clinic of the regular staff.

Many of the crutches who beg on the street corners of Nairobi could be walking if only they had had help in time. Their legs, weakened by polio and bent by crawling, can be straightened without surgery if a child is below 12.

In an age of surgical miracles, that the halt and lame can visit the clinic and be made to walk, by manipulation alone, is an indication of the association's worth.

A new patient, Peter Mwangi, aged 12, from Nairobi, hobbled in on crutches. His right leg was pulled into a plaster cast, with a splinter, with a special boot.

The left, though bent at the knee by crawling, was still curable. He is a typical case. On the treatment table his left leg was pulled straight as far as possible, then a plaster cast applied, all within ten minutes.

When he left, he was walking. The plaster cast will be renewed at fortnightly intervals for three months, when the leg will be straight enough for a pair of calipers and boot to be fitted. (Turn to P. 16)

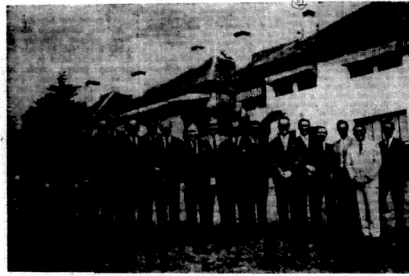

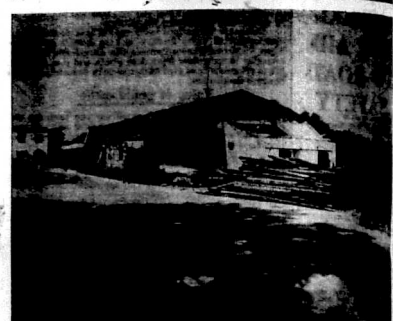
**New Chief Kadhi for Kenya**

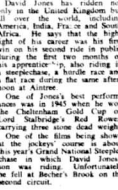

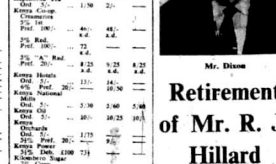

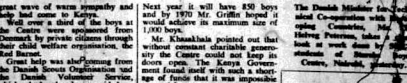

It is difficult to understand why the annual report of the East African Currency Board for the year ended June 30, 1967, has only this week appeared in print.

Written early in November 1967, the delay in publishing it has only one advantage—it has allowed the Board to bring up to date the figures for the withdrawal of the old East African currency. We now know that by the end of the year, the Board, although starting its conversion last year, was leading the field.

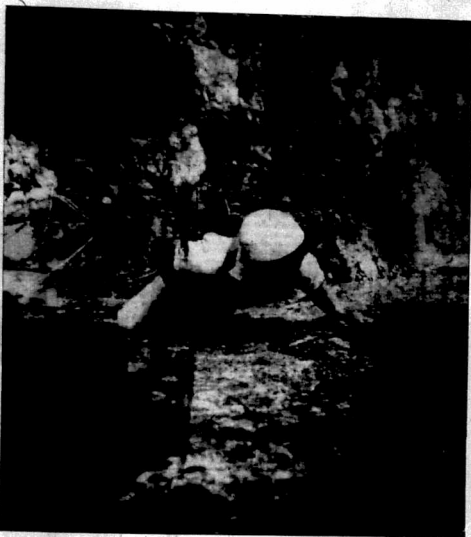

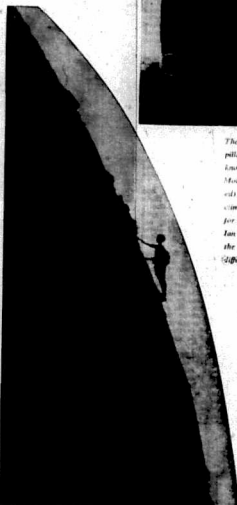

## Rock pillar yields to Mawenzi team

The search for viable routes on local craggers to the eastward peaks, and last Sunday the main climbing team of the Mawenzi Expedition — Ian Howell, Roger Higgins, Alan Walker and Alan Allen — became the first people to stand on the flat summit of 'The Mouse', a sheer tower of granite in the Northern Frontier District of Kenya.

Their ascent was part of their training campaign for the East Face of Mawenzi, which they plan to attempt at the end of July. The expedition has two main objectives. The first is to ascend the 'Great Narrows', an unexplored V-shaped valley which leads to the lower complexity of the mammoth East Face. The second

is to find a 'direct' route up this cliff, which could take five days. The expedition is being sponsored by the Mountain Club of Kenya and the 'East African Standard', who hope to receive frequent radio calls from the climbers on the face. It is a two-man expedition, with four main climbers and a support team of six. It could take two weeks to complete.

Meanwhile the climbers are undergoing rigorous training, most which is taking place in Betty's Gate Camp, where the almost prehistoric-looking precipices are gradually being covered by new routes. However, occasionally the climbers look further afield, like last weekend, and here Alan Walker writes on the first ascent of 'The Mouse'.

There's a mammoth of sheer rock about 200 feet high in the north of Kenya which no one has been able to climb, due to the extreme difficulties both to the land and the intense heat.

There was about the last week Ian Howell heard before leaving Britain for Kenya about six months ago. They were spoken by Barry Cliff, a climber who did a lot of work in East Africa during the last five years.

I had thought no more about it until he was posted to India. It was, on one of his frequent journeys around this area where he first saw 'The Mouse' — and he immediately decided to try to climb it.

His first attempt took him through the difficult bush and he, and he managed to climb about 40 feet of easy rock to a convenient ledge. From this ledge he saw a possible route above but could not attempt it as he was alone, without a partner to hold the rope.

He realised that Barry Cliff was correct in his statement. The rock was there, and it would

have to be climbing with the common use of artificial aids. This would mean some spikes made out of metal which can be driven into cracks or stony fissures through rock holders; and expansion bolts, into which are driven the drilled holes in the rock.

Crucially, this was the best. At the bottom 'The Mouse' in the distance, had three climbing routes were exposed to the sun at the five years.

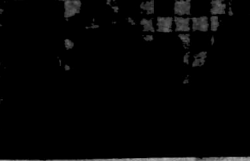
Ian had made a second attempt, and this time climbed about 20 feet up from the ledge and inserted two expansion bolts, these in place, these bolts can never be retrieved. This was, far as he could go, being done again and he was surprised.

The third attempt was with Roger Higgins. While Roger believed in an expansion bolt above the ledge, Ian climbed on. It was a case of standing on the top rung of one step, and reaching as far up as he could and drill another hole. For an expansion bolt. Consequently he inserted sixteen spikes in lower face cracks between the bolts. He succeeded in placing five bolts, and two pins, and

reached about 60 feet above the ledge. At this point the sun was in daily battle, and Ian had to stop because of cramp.

Last Sunday was the fourth attempt, and Roger Higgins, Alan Walker and I left to look at the route to travel north with Ian Howell. We first saw 'The Mouse' a few miles outside Archer's Post, standing beside the larger figure of 'The Cat', on its right, both features looked very impressive, but as there was an easy way up 'The Cat' we were first attracted. The situation was held by the view on its left. As we moved its form became more and more clear.

We stepped the cat about 30 miles outside Archer's Post and began the slow ridge across the three walls. We found the going easy at first and followed a straight line, but as we went up the steep slope, the going got more and more difficult. It was only about nine o'clock, and already the sun was making its presence felt. Eventually we started up the hill which leads to the foot of the mountain, and it

A bold new experiment by a Kenya cattle ranch, borrowing ideas from America and Australia, is described here by WILLIAM HERBERT.

Kenya, like North and South America and Australia, has large herds of cattle running over vast acreages.

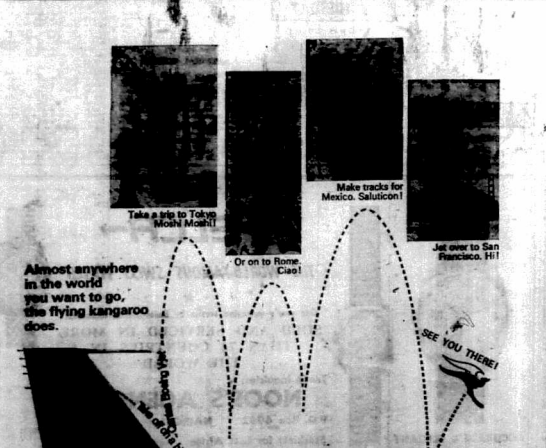

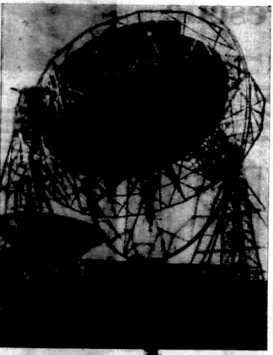
