K.P.U. candidates 'barred'

Nominations in the local government elections are due today. Kani and Kamau, Nairobi, which the K.P.U. regards as comparative strongholds. He declared all Kani and Kamau returns unopposed.

Though some of the facts have changed, Kani continued the capital's council without a dissenting voice. Kani leaders were given a tumultuous reception from the crowds below the City Hall. Later, jubilant Kani and K.P.U. supporters gathered in groups facing one another. Police, who were stationed, were called to break up one incident.

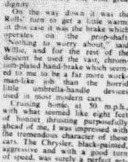

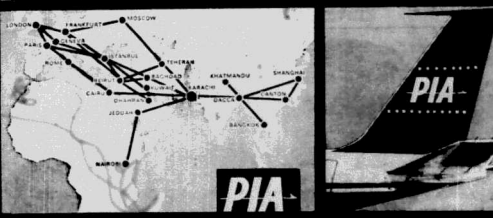

Kisii pyrethrum growers earn £900,000

Pyrethrum growers in Kisii district earned more than £900,000 in 1967, but last year's crop was estimated to be worth only £500,000, according to a report from the Kisii District Council.

The report, which was presented to the Council on August 7, 1967, stated that the total area under pyrethrum in the district was 12,200 acres in 1967, compared with 11,500 acres in 1966. The yield per acre was 1.2 tons in 1967, compared with 1.1 tons in 1966.

The report also stated that the total value of the crop was £900,000 in 1967, compared with £500,000 in 1966. This was due to a combination of factors, including a higher price for the crop and a higher yield per acre.

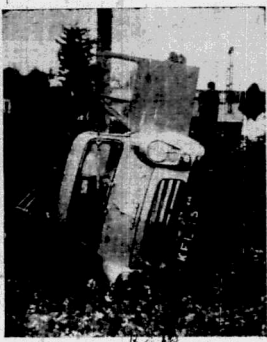

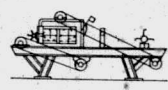

Most of the quantities of gasoline are measured with laboratory burning apparatus, and indicate the temperature at which the motor will pay little or no attention to the octane number.

Generally speaking, the higher the compression ratio the higher the octane number required to avoid engine knocking. Similarly, the older the car and the longer the engine, the higher the octane number required.

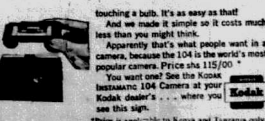

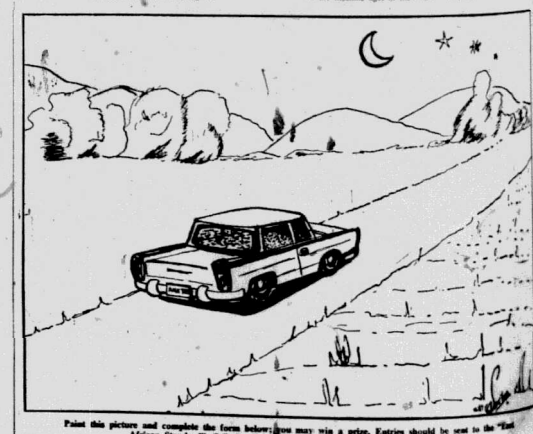
