Obote congratulated the Ministry for Cooperative and Small Scale Industries, Mr. Njiru on his visit to Egerton.

## Big triumph for Gen. de Gaulle BUDGET APPROVED

The French National Assembly yesterday endorsed President de Gaulle's (€17,000,000) economy plan to save the franc by a massive 30% increase in the price of goods.

It was a resounding victory for the 70-year-old General, who last weekend deflected the spectre of a French devaluation by forcing a second presidential election over a 100-day period.

The opposition vote was cast against the Government by the group of the Federation of the Left. Another vote came from the group of the Independent deputies.

Reaction to the anti-inflation programme, aimed at restoring France's competitive balance by slashing the 1967 Budget, almost unanimously approved, was that the Budget had been moderate.

France's largest trade union grouping, the Communist C.G.T., said that it was not expected to increase prices by an extra 10% over the inflation rate. It said that the only trouble would come from the fact that the Government had not taken any steps to reduce the cost of living.

Under Government economic package prices are expected to rise by 10% in 1967. The Government has also announced that it will increase the price of goods by 10% in 1967.

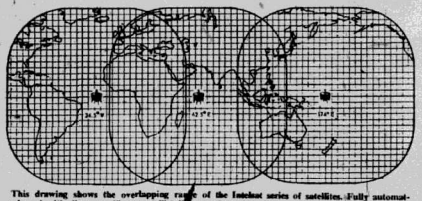

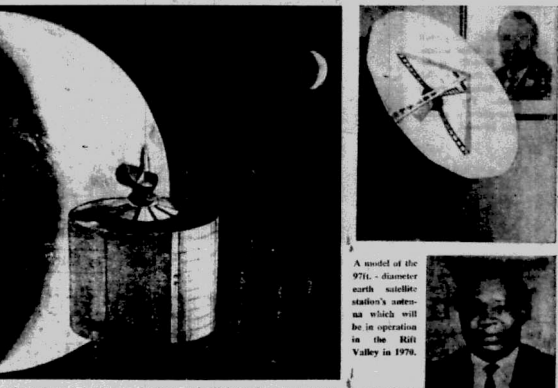

# TIME

What a strange phenomenon time is. When you are absorbed in your work or in some amusement, time flies. When you are impatiently waiting for somebody, time drags endlessly. When you are fast asleep, the night is over in an instant. When you fast or are under an anaesthetic, you entirely lose your sense of time.

We perceive the passing of time through personal impressions. Thus men are aware of time, but when, instead of living alone, they become members of a community, they also need a conventional means of measuring time so that they can share in the activities of their fellow-men.

Without any objective means of measuring time, community life is impossible. Add, if there is no community life, there can be no civilization and no progress. But where is this objective time to be found? For thousands of years man has been subject to the law of time. He noticed the decline of the day and the rising of the sun, the phases of the moon and the periodicity of the months. He experienced periods of cold, budding trees and falling leaves. The recurrence of these phenomena enabled him to

discover the year. Anticipated and sometimes fulfilled by the mystics which attributed mysterious powers to the sun, moon and stars. He then appeared movement. It was in these countries where the day is always blue and the sun shines from morning to night that man began to divide up the day into hours, according to the horizon. The division of the day into 12 parts seems to have originated in Egypt. The Romans were content with four daytime "hours" and three night "watches". These divisions were elastic. As at the equinoxes, the parts of the day were of unequal length, and longer in summer.

A man who lives by winter, instead of using the sun hardly moves a uniform measure of time. But when he builds towers, organizes his lands, harvests up against the sun, he needs a watch by which he can tell time. Hence the adage "Time means, he works by the clock".

The modern scientific instrument for measuring time is the atomic clock based on the cesium 133.

## QUEST AND CONQUEST

A history of the measurement of time from the earliest sundials and water clocks to the atomic clocks and the theory of the contraction of time of today.

It is known that the word "time" in Greek means "indicator". It is famous that the word "time" may also be a technical, a column or a cone needle, throwing on the ground a shadow which serves to indicate the time. In the Middle Ages, the sun's direction varies according to the position of the sun in the sky. The gnomon was known to the Chinese as early as 2000 B.C. In Egypt, obelisks were used as gnomons. In the Middle Ages, tall towers served the same purpose.

These devices were so far from perfect that we cannot say that precision was one of their qualities. The gnomon was the forerunner of the sundial, which appeared in Egypt about 11 centuries before the Christian era. The style of the sundial is parallel to the earth's axis and throws its shadow on a vertical wall marked with a precise scale, which is bound on a remarkably accurate knowledge of the respective motions of the earth and the sun.

After the Egyptians, the Greeks and the Romans used the sundial in their time. It was still used during the Middle Ages and the Renaissance, when its application was improved. Nevertheless this instrument remained rudimentary and could not be used for the measurement of short periods of time, such as the minute, they worked only during the hours of daylight and then only in fine weather. Moreover, the duration of the day varied according to the season of the year.

Though farm work is limited to the daylight hours, the activities of an urban civilization continue during the night. It is also necessary to know the time when the weather is dull. Man was therefore obliged to discover means of measuring time without referring to the stars.

The Chaldeans, the Egyptians and the Chinese used the gnomon, or water clock, in the 15th century before Christ. Two tablets, one placed on top of the other, communicated by way of a narrow orifice. The water in the upper tank flowed down into the lower one, which was graduated in conventional units of time. Man, in his ingenuity, invented a great variety of devices.

The Romans improved them by using their working mechanism to turn a hand on a dial. Another ancient instrument, based on the same principle, is the water clock.

The first clock or hourglass, which was more economical and simpler than the sundial, was made of glass containers. Fine specimens are still to be seen on old church pulpits, where they discreetly remind the hearers that the body is not immortal by the hour.

The first clock or wax clock had to hold at the same time as the hourglass. A candle was contained in a given time according to the quality of its wax. An ingenious arrangement of gears and graduated wheels divided up the time into

seconds. These systems had one disadvantage in common. They could not measure quite short periods of time, for wax was not melting in accurate enough water, sand or wax in the reservoir. They were complicated to assemble, and rather than measuring it, the sundial implied by the desire to know the time of the day. It is not surprising that man tried to solve this problem by mechanical means. This need for even greater accuracy led to a series of discoveries, some of them more than a century apart, whereas a satisfactory result could be obtained.

In the first place, it was necessary to have a motor to give power to the mechanism. The idea of a weight led to a chain clock in the 14th century. Secondly, it was necessary to have a regulator to divide the time into parts of equal duration. The rotary movement of the middle wheel of a watch movement is the escapement, which allowed the movement with its own pulse, the first escapements were of the so-called "crown-wheel" type, which the regulator was merely an oscillating bar, which was known as the "foliot".

Lastly, various gear trains were used to connect the motor to the escapement and to work the hands marking on the dial multiples of the fractions of time given by the motor. The methods used by the medieval craftsmen were not sufficient for the production of clocks of small dimensions. The trains and other parts were forged, while the driving weight was cumbersome. The first astronomical clocks were

made up in church towers and town hall offices. Some Cathedral, in France, had one as early as 1170. Tower clocks became very common in the 13th and 14th centuries.

The first domestic clock made its appearance in the 15th century. It was also at that time that the motor spring was invented to replace the weight. The mechanical clocks to be improved and also to be made smaller, for it was no longer necessary to allow room for the weight.

This opened up the way for the first portable instruments, which were probably produced in Mantua probably around 1500 and were the property of Italian and French nobles. They were small pocket watches, model only the dial of a watch, the dial and the mechanism.

Until the 16th century, clocks and watches had only one hand making the hours. Their precision was something like 1 per cent, in a day. The regulator organ of a watch was formed of an oscillating bar, whose movement was limited by one or two balls, called "scapillings". Usually, something better had to be found. The first step towards the solution of the problem was the discovery made in 1581 by Galileo (1564-1642). While studying the swinging of a lamp suspended from the vault of St. Peter's, with his own pulse, he noted that its oscillations were of equal duration. Thus he came to the laws of the pendulum, which were first tried to apply to clocks by the measurement of time.

The pendulum is far more accurate than the foliot, but it can be used only in large clocks. Now, since the discovery of navigation, it became necessary to have portable timepieces and thus portable Galileo also had to find a means of making a portable clock. He was unable to find a practical solution. It was Dutch physicist,

Christiaan Huygens (1629-1695), who opened up the way for modern horology. First of all, he gave mathematical proof for the isochronism of a pendulum in a state of small duration, whereas, that amplitude, the more along a cycloid, and not a circular arc, the period of the oscillation, for instance, by the value of a, the length which is running along a circle.

But Huygens was, above all, the first man to think of the balance as the motor spring. The second escapement succeeded the crown-wheel type and, about 1720, was followed by the cylinder escapement. The most striking advance was the invention of the lever escapement by the Englishman Thomas Mudge in 1777.

Another important invention contributed to the progress of horology: the invention of methods of drilling holes in ruby, made by the Genevese Nicolas Fatio (1664-1719) in 1704.

This 18th-century century gave the watch "jewels" or "sapphire" which could easily keep time to within one second per day. It enabled people to gain a better

knowledge of the "time equation", the noticeable variable difference between the hour according to the sundial and the hour of mean solar time.

Marine chronometers and watches, with complications developed at the same time. The horologist has never been at a loss to find problems to solve.

At the beginning of the nineteenth century watches were still being wound by means of a stem-wind, but later on, attempts had been made to find more practical systems.

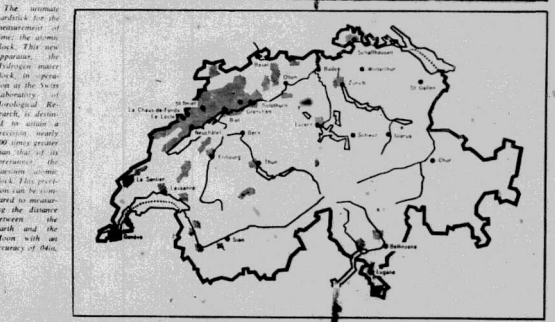
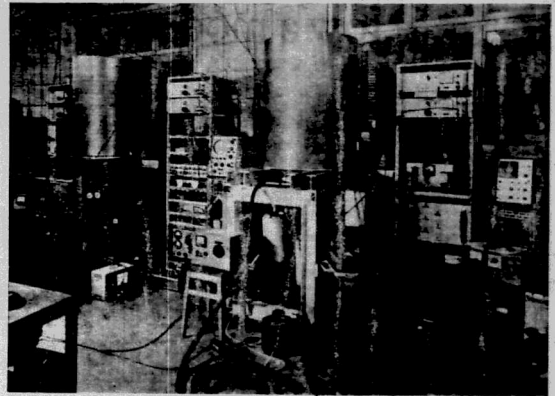

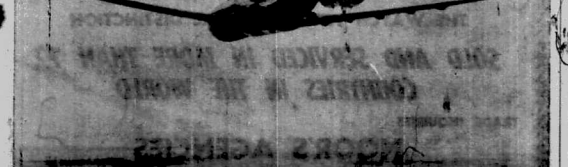

TIME SUPPLEMENT

Our various types of motors are fuel by petroleum, wood, wind, heat and the atom. In a watch this power is supplied by hand winding or in an automatic watch, by the ingenious motion mechanism.

The rotor is held principally on a jewel bearing. The watch is an intricate work of art, finely according to the government of the maker's art. The effect of the rotor is to make the watch always fall on the hour-point at the same time driving the wheel which continually winds the spring.

The power is stored in a special power which is driven by the motion of the rotor. This pressure electricity of a special piezoelectric crystal is a thin strip of special alloy, resilient, elastic and unchangeable, which is held in place by a special action round a fixed point in the centre of the rotor and, as it ticks, it produces a small force to drive the barrel of the rotor which is connected to the rotor.

The train linking the barrel with the escapement includes the wheel which receives the power transmitted to its shafts. These have from 20 to 40 teeth, depending on the number of hours the watch is to run.

The barrel completes three or four revolutions in 24 hours. The crown wheel has 24 and the fourth wheel 20 teeth. The barrel is driven by the rotor.

The balance and regulating force of the watch is provided by the hairspring, which is held in place by the regulator, which is adjusted by the watchmaker.

How a modern watch works

Many of the tools used in the manufacture of watches are made of hardened steel or of tungsten carbide. Formerly they were given their correct shape by polished grinding.

Today, however they are formed by electroerosion, which makes use of the property whereby electric sparks tear away particles of the harder material at their point of contact. The amount removed depends on the duration of the operation and the electric force employed.

Holes are made by tools called "drills" or "bits". The end of a drill is cut into the form of a cone for an angle of 120 deg. The smaller holes that can be drilled mechanically in series production are about 1/64th in diameter. If special precautions are taken, it is possible to drill holes as far as 1/200th. Even smaller holes are drilled in ruby by means of copper wires charged with diamond powder known as "diamonds".

Holes of small diameter can also be made by electroerosion. The possibilities offered by the laser concentrated radiation of high frequency, the discovery of which goes back almost to 1900, are just beginning to be used.

Lapping consists in cutting a wire thread in a hole that has already been drilled. The tool used is called a lathe. It is in the form of a special screw, slightly larger than the hole. The metal screw is 1/100th in diameter.

When the parts are assembled the other components must be perfectly clean. Any impurities adhering to their surfaces are liable to cause oxidation and wear. The slightest drop of sweat left on a hole may fall into a gear or a pivot hole and cause the watch to stop or at least seriously disturb its working.

During the machining process, any foreign body that remains adhering to a workpiece may alter its dimensions. It is therefore most important that the parts should be perfectly clean during the manufacturing process.

The most perfect cleaning is obtained by means of highly advanced ultrasonic waves. The frequency of these ultrasonic waves is 100,000 vibrations per second. They remove all the impurities, breaking down and detaching the matter that has to be eliminated, by facilitating the action of the detergent.

After the parts have undergone ultrasonic cleaning, they cannot be held without further aid. The extreme cleanliness of the surfaces would cause the oil to creep. The oil would not remain concentrated at the points of friction, where it is necessary moreover, it would become oxidized, brought into contact with the air, and would form harmful films.

For the life of the watch, therefore, important to the oil, while at the same time treating the advantage of the oil, i.e., its cleaning.

The parts on which the creep of oil must be avoided undergo a treatment whereby they are coated with an extremely thin layer of a product which never requires any further action. This layer is called "epoxy".

The incessant progress of miniaturization gives rise to many new forming processes which can no longer be served by human eyes and hands. The work is becoming fully automatic.

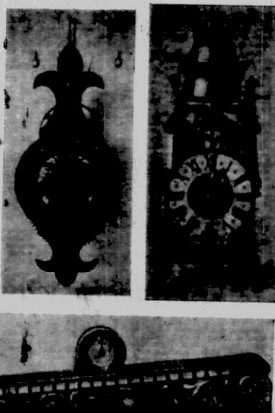

# Hour behind —but world relies on it

To tell Britain and progress, the British public may soon forget Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) which has been the world's guide to time since 1884. But although GMT from now on they know the standard in Britain, the world's chronological truth still lies in a narrow lane only at Greenwich.

"Remember that time is money," advised Benjamin Franklin. But he was not the first to equate the two.

In Rome, for example, before Julius Caesar took a hand in it as 44 B.C., the Roman calendar which if it were to keep anywhere since the year of our lord had an inter-calendar month interpolated among the others every sixth year.

So far nobody has been known to change the one hour gained, or has it been lost?

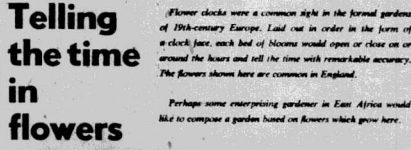

**Research cuts  
out error  
in timing**

As a rule, research requirements are beyond the financial and technical possibilities of a large number of watch companies. As a consequence, collective effort was made necessary in the field of applied research for the improvement of existing products as well as for the creation of new timepieces.

The Swiss Laboratory for Watch Research (L.S.R.H.) was created in 1921 at a time when scientific and technical research was not defined as clearly as it is today.

The L.S.R.H. research programme is conducted in the overall interest of the industry. Furthermore, the laboratory handles specific problems that are submitted by individual factories or industrial groups. Last year only, L.S.R.H. received about 500 requests of this kind.

In addition, L.S.R.H. cooperates with the University of Neuchâtel in the training of watch engineers. L.S.R.H. scientists take an active part in the work of the industry's technical and scientific committees.

From a technical viewpoint, L.S.R.H. keeps up to date with the manufacturing methods of all the watch, the study of external phenomena (weather, humidity, magnetic fields) affecting the performance of movements, materials used in watch manufacturing, the study of dust and oil, radiological protection against corrosion, lubrication, acoustic frequency standards and many other subjects.

Since research programmes that are devoted to existing watch products are hardly to be conducted within small companies and must be undertaken at the collective level, it is quite obvious that electronic research must also be conducted at the collective level.

The "Horological" Electronic Centre (CEH) was created in the year 1962 when it became evident that the watch industry was definitely entering the field of micro-electronics. The CEH was to enable the industry to keep its traditional production as well as to create new types of timepieces. CEH activities are not devoted to electronic research exclusively. In fact, an integral action tends to be taken into the entire electronic timepiece. CEH has already performed a great number of watches which have been produced in small quantities.

Although research laboratories are multiplying and their work is becoming more and more specialized, the Swiss watch industry has not been able to obtain the results which CEH has obtained in the field of "applied" micro-electronics. For this reason, the industry has decided to create a "Swiss watch research centre" which will be devoted to the study of atomic timepieces (atomic radio, transistors, etc.).

emits throughout Europe a time signal, piloted by an atomic clock precise to one millionth of a second.

The latest achievement of the Horological Electronic Centre takes the shape of a revolutionary and calibrated by a quartz-crystal element.

This watchcase has set new standards of precision for all to follow. The great precision attained by the watch is owed to the extremely high number of vibrations of the quartz-crystal element (10,000 per second as opposed to 360,000 for a classic movement).

The prototypes of this timepiece are the result of six years close co-operation between chemists, physicists, electronic engineers and watchmakers.

The CEH employs 70 persons at present. It is financed by 25 shareholders representing watch organisations and factories. CEH retains full ownership over its patents, the situation of which is granted by the CEH Board. The Board now grants them to the industry in the form of licences. The CEH research programme must therefore be considered as a joint undertaking for the development of the entire industry.

Today's Swiss time industry is necessarily dependent on a climate of technical evolution. Each branch of science contributes to the ever-increasing and precise definition, analysis and comparison of time units from metallurgy and atomic physics.

In just 20 years, in fact, the Swiss have learned to measure time a million times more accurately.

First came the development of highly sensitive quartz clocks. These had a millionth part second accuracy. Then came electronic time standards, atomic clocks.

In this era of Space programmes, with man speeding through Space at many thousands of miles an hour, these atomic clocks are invaluable in proposing exact orbits and determining landing zones. They can also be used as time synchronisation, measurement of the earth's rotation, time zone organisation, both nationally and internationally, anti-collision systems for supersonic aircraft, and so on.

Today, the accuracy of Swiss instruments has passed from one-tenth to one-millionth of a second in the time span of a minute. In the 100,000 years that have elapsed since the beginning of time, the error is only a few millimetres.

So great is the emphasis on advanced research that the Swiss watch industry has pooled an important part of its effort in the scientific and technical field. The Swiss Laboratory for Horological Research has since the early '20's undertaken basic investigations, notably in chronometry, metrology and lubrication.

Other new research developments have produced a portable quartz chronometer with a watchcase for a year on normal dry batteries and others which work by light. There is even a new electronic rally computer which is mounted on the car dashboard and does everything rally-crew men used to do from a map-and-drive the car.

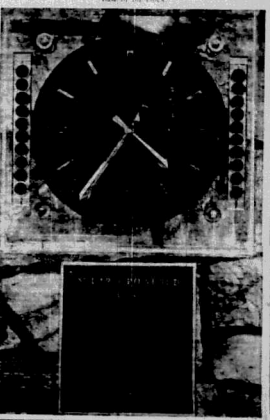

# The watch industry of tomorrow

A state group was set up in 1963 by the Swiss Federation of Watch Manufacturers under the chairmanship of General F. Haerli. Its purpose was to study the development which will affect the watchmaking industry in the course of the next twenty years and to publish the results of its findings in a brochure entitled "The watch industry of tomorrow".

The group summarized the physical, scientific and technical lines likely to emerge from developments such as the generalised use and the perfection of electronic systems for the transmission of information, the revolution taking place in the realm of energy production, the efforts accomplished toward a constantly more total

minimization of space and the utilization of new materials. The increasing use of microelectronics in research, as well as the concentration of research in the United States and in the West. Three chapters are devoted to the economic trend, in particular to mass consumption and to the progressive integration of national economies, and the scientific and technical progress which will be brought about by this development. A special dealing with the Third World and with its perspective of economic growth comprises the first part of the study covering matters of general interest.

The second part focuses on the

possible and which is still being worked out for itself. The development of microelectronics is being defined as the essential part of the watchmaking industry's present and future. Having analysed the technical solutions for a more distant future, the study devises a chapter in the practical procedures used in manufacturing the mechanical watch and the future of electronic watch.

The probable trends in the watchmaking industry, world market, in future dimensions, the possibilities which will be opened up in the industrialized countries and in the socialist States, will prove to be of undoubted interest to all manufacturers concerned about the future of their industry.

To get the best out of the electronic watch, it would therefore be vital to set up a broad overall plan which would come to fruition with the launching of the first electronic watch on the market.

In all events, the watchmaking industry must be prepared to make adaptations and to keep abreast of the changes which are bound to take place if it is to avoid being left behind in the existing equipment.

There remain the human factors, which it is worthwhile to analyse in the light of the probable development of the watchmaking industry. The study group devotes a chapter to this, analyzing the repercussions of that development on the working force employed in the industry. It stresses the necessity of a greater

mobility within the watchmaking field, and analyses the anticipated changes in the patterns of employment, the importance of new crafts-people in terms of qualification and professional training, due to the constantly evolving techniques and methods.

It is necessary first of all to consider the compulsory influences which will be increasingly felt in the technical realm and which will necessitate a concentration of efforts, even to the point of certain independence concentrations of power. The development of the techniques of production, the progress made in the field of the optimal manufacturing dimension and to still greater perfection of the manufacturing methods.

It will make necessary a far more extensive liaison than ever before, and which is established, at the marketing level. The group concludes that the watchmaking industry wishes to continue to play an important part, it will inevitably be required to assume new risks.

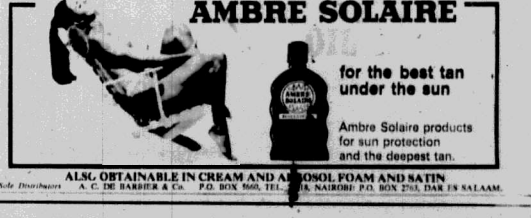

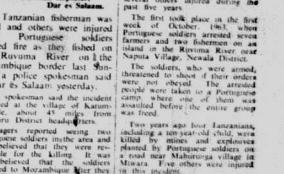

# Britain cannot stop Nigeria war—Minister

Britain's Chancellor of the Exchequer, Mr. Jenkins, made yesterday clear there was no way for the British Government to solve the problem of the Nigeria-Biafra conflict.

He was addressing a student group at the University of East Anglia in a televised lecture programme.

Students, apparently protesting against the British Government's support for the Federal Nigerian side in the war, previously ostracised him with shouting comments.

The Chancellor (Finance Minister) said: "It is obvious to me that there is no way for us to solve the Nigeria problem in the short term."

Answering questions on current affairs, he said: "I do think there is a great danger to this country as the present line of policy is not working and being too costly."

In London yesterday about 150 members of Parliament linked an attempt to persuade the Government to stop the military solution to the Nigeria-Biafra war.

The House of Commons voted on Monday to call for a debate on the Nigeria-Biafra conflict. The M.P.s said they were "appalled by the mounting reports of starvation and killing in Biafra."

The motion of Commons criticised the ruling Labour, Opposition Conservative and minority Liberal parties, asked the Government to press both sides for an immediate ceasefire and to put other arms-supplying governments in a post-bid on weapons to the combatants.

The war was not of the question. He said: "I have heard many people say that the people would rather have the administration of Col. Gowon and the war effort. I think those are the only stages of what could possibly develop into the stage previously known as Biafra."

Mr. Jenkins said any change of civil war would be that of getting what he expressed the belief that change would come easier from within the Labour Party. A considerable number of Labourers already opposed the Government's pro-Federal policy. The concept of a military solution could not be applied in West Africa as it was in Europe.

Biafran forces have launched a successful counter-offensive in the Akoka sector and overcome three Nigerian strongholds along the Akoka-Owerri road, a well-known Biafran military command reported in a communiqué.

The Biafran and the counter-offensive "ruined" some of the Nigerian advance despite the air force's very heavy and continuous shelling and mortarings.

In the Akoka-Owerri road sector, the Biafran went on, that five towns were taken from three Nigerian strongholds and shelled every the morning.

In another major development, the Biafran forces were reported killed 24 hours earlier in a massive Biafran attack. A down-up operation was said to have picked up thousands of Biafran soldiers in the creek area on the River Niger south of Onitsha.

The new weekly journal, called *Zpravy* and devoted to pro-Soviet propaganda, has been looking its way into numerous Czechoslovakian libraries each week. But it is not clear how it has been getting there.

Mr. Kolnar, who last spring led the inquiry into the death of the former Czechoslovak Foreign Minister, Mr. Jan Masaryk, pointed out yesterday that a large number of the copies of the journal had been appearing at two places under the control of the Interior Ministry — the Police Post at Valasky Mrazek in Prague and Praha-Prison in Prague.

According to the television commentator the Government's Office had asked the Prosecutor's Office a spokesman for the Czechoslovak Foreign Ministry described the American decision, contained in a note delivered to the Czechoslovak Embassy in Washington, as a "violation" of the 1953 extradition agreement.

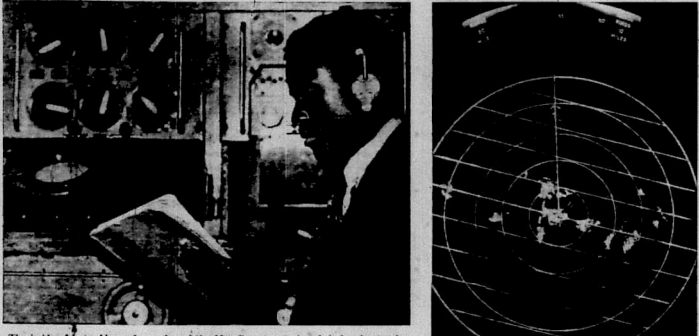

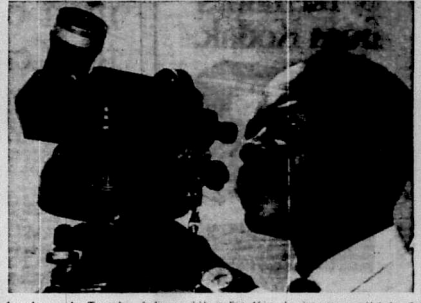

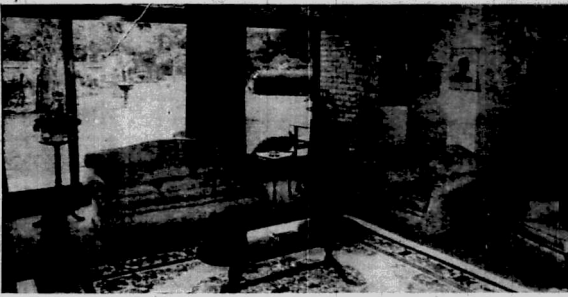

With the wet, warm weather being experienced over most of Kenya this is the time to make a close inspection of rose bushes especially new ones which have been planted this season.

Disasters strikes when the air is damp and warm and the soil is now for between showers of the wet and first of all generally active for some time.
