REVIEW OF LEISURE TRENDS AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN EAST AFRICA

By their sitting-rooms, their kitchens and even in their bedrooms, Kenya coffee farmers have been fighting a battle against the weather.

The battle was waged to save their crop and in some cases to save themselves from liquidation. The indications are that the fight has not ended.

For this year Kenya's coffee producers generally have been the dreaded C.I.D. — coffee berry disease — and with excellent weather conditions at the plantation many farms have produced their best crop for three years.

But grave major problems have hit them. First was the fact that the coffee berries on the estates and holdings all ripened at about the same time, resulting in a great demand for pickers. Second, and even more critical, was the seasonal drought of the short rains.

This made it impossible for the growers to sundry their beans in the normal fashion and forced them into adopting emergency drying systems.

To get the beans dry enough to send to the mills the growers have had to resort to rapid and ingenious methods. Throughout the coffee-growing areas every available inch of covered space has been utilized in the operation.

One farmer even took the window of his bedroom and wadded inside. In other cases fittings from doors have been covered with them and at Nairobi, probably one major producing country, Central Ltd. has taken over a block of empty flats and used them as a drying shed.

The short rains followed the long-awaited rain and one of the houses and barnyards the wretched beans.

AFTER THE BAD YEARS...

Kenya's coffee farmers come back fighting

to dry off as they should on the long drying trays.

The executive officer of the Kenya Coffee Growers' Association, Mr. H. W. Brown, commented: "The emergency measures enabled the sector to save their crop but it has meant a lot in transport and the charges for using facilities offered by those estates where either the coffee was not ready when the crop was small."

All concerned in the industry agree that it is still too early to say with accuracy how many tons of coffee will be produced. But it is already clear that the quality is going to be very good.

In the words of the executive officer of the Coffee Marketing

advised spraying throughout the rain which, if it has been discovered, is the danger period for the spread of C.I.D.

Similar advice was given to Societal by a French expert from Cameroon and this year — again for the first time in three years — Societal expects a good crop.

The general manager of Societal, Mr. M. J. H. Husu, said that the company expects to produce more than ever their average of 1,000 tons this year.

But Mr. Husu is not prepared to put his finger on any single factor as the one which did the trick. For three years the company had had poor crops and it could not be that the three years' "rain" was responsible.

DAVID JONES reports that after three lean years many Kenya coffee farms are producing fine crops. But even success brings its problems.

David, Mr. Claude Desmetzere, judiciously says that it will be a surprise year from the quality point of view.

Many producers, particularly those with limited financial resources, this year's crop has been "good". In many cases it has been the first real crop they have had for the past three years and it came just in time as one grower said in happy tones of the back-packer courts. Several estates have, relatively, had to sell managers to get.

Mr. Husu said that if this year's crop had failed, many growers would without doubt have been forced out of business.

The majority of them are having their good fortune on two factors — ideal weather conditions during the growing season and an American-produced fungicide — Captafol, which although expensive at 15/- a lb., has managed to hold it back the C.I.D. which accounted for up to 80 per cent of crop loss on some estates last year.

Last year farmers were advised to Captafol on the day of the long rains but this type of spray is now being used in the coastal. This year the experts at the Coffee Research Station at Egerton

One thing he is sure of and that is that this year's crop will allow the company to carry on in coffee. If they had suffered yet another bad year the company would have even coffee up.

Spraying with Captafol is certainly expensive but if it ensures a reasonable crop the grower is assured of some kind of return.

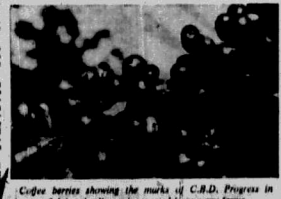
And, according to the experts, the growers in Kenya will be faced with the prospect of opening for a long time to some extent of importation of coffee trees, are found, and introduced.

None of the Coffee Research photographs says that to be sure that crops will not succumb to C.I.D., which is more established in the country, growers will have to spray with Captafol fungicide for about eight months of the year.

During the harvesting of this season the growers were hit by the widespread demand for labour. With the crop picking on estates about 100,000 seasonal labourers were in short supply.

Particularly hard-hit were the plantations where the members of the Kenya Coffee Growers' Co-operative Union, which has 17,000 members (including 14,000) had to ask for help from the Coffee Growers' Association members.

The manager of the union, Mr. Isaac Kibiki, said that the average estate which comprises about 100 acres, allows its labourers to plant on Saturdays and Sundays to let the smallholders employ their hands in the work.

Consequently, one member in the Lower Kambo area, where the crop was ready, managed to get the berries in, he said.

This year the union anticipated that it will have a total crop of around 2,000 tons — compared with 714 tons last year.

Then the Kambo co-operatives were hit even more badly than the larger estates in the area and their production sank to its lowest.

The disease was responsible for Kenya being unable to meet its international coffee quota of around 40,000 tons. In fact the country was only able to export 17,000 tons. This was a bitter blow from the financial aspect and from the point of view that Kenya's negotiators had fought a hard struggle to have the International Coffee Agreement quota increased.

This year the basic quota has been fixed at just over 30,000 tons and high coffee boards and Ministry of Agriculture officials are confident that this will be fixed.

And not only the growers will benefit. The Government and local authorities too will show a handsome return, which is one of the reasons the producers will continue in it.

The local authorities receive a 10% per cent share from the growers which works out at \$10 a ton and the growers feel that they are not receiving much in return.

Their total contribution last year amounted to \$157,747 and they would like to know what happens to this money.

They point to the fact that during these short rains when they had double enough drying their crop they were severely hampered by bad roads, which they claim should be kept up to a reasonable standard by the councils.

Co-operatives particularly have suffered from impassable roads. Unlike the estates they often have



to make fairly long trips from their shambas to the factories and this year many were unable to do so without extreme difficulty.

Mr. Husu said that growers are still disheartened at the continuation of the quota market tax which takes another \$10 per ton from them for every ton exported.

From May, 1964, to September of this year this tax brought a total of \$114,000 to the Government.

In addition, this year the Government has introduced a distribution levy on growers of

\$3.125 on each ton of coffee produced. This is to help in paying the cost of changing from picking to some other crop and it is estimated that this will cost the growers \$15,917 this year.

Mr. Husu added: "The growers feel that no industry, whether prospering or not, can continue to pay out sums of this magnitude without giving their owners at least the other hand the growers are looking to the Government for assistance in financing further research which they feel must not be ignored or omitted.

Because of the severity of the short rains Kenya coffee growers have had to resort to emergency measures for drying their crop. This picture shows how Societal Ltd. solved part of the problem. 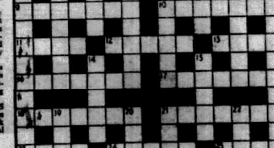

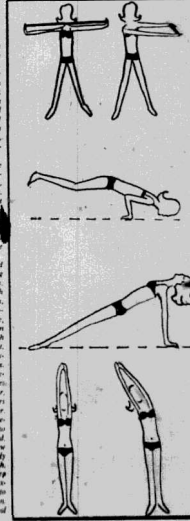

New move to heal Muslim schism

Standard Staff Reporter, Dar es Salaam.

The crisis which brewed within the Muslim Community in Tanzania and culminated in the breakdown of several Muslim groups in several parts of the country from East African Muslim Welfare Society may soon come to an end.

A resolution was made this week in a new Tanzania Muslim Organisation which will be known as the Tanzania Muslim Welfare Society and will be compatible with Tanzanian Muslim aspirations and the country's policy of self-reliance.

The resolution was made after a Commission which inquired into the crisis, existing in the East African Muslim Welfare Society. The Commission consisted of seven men elected at a special meeting of Muslims, convened in Dar es Salaam last month.

After the inquiry, the secretary of the Commission, Mr. Kawinga, indicated that the Commission had found that the society being a trust society, was unable to bring about the envisaged progress.

The proposed reorganisation will be affiliated to the East African Muslim Welfare Society and will be under the leadership of a Council who will guide its spiritual activities.

The Commission also recommended that the administration of the organisation should consist of properly qualified people and of adequate proposals for a light work on the finances of the organisation were included in the recommendations.

While the stand of the Government on this issue was not immediately clear, it is expected that the position might soon be clarified when the First Vice-President, Mr. Karamira, opens a three-day meeting of Muslim splinter groups at Malawi High School on Thursday.

An otherwise dull week at Kampala was broken up by a protest by President Nyerere's speech over the radio in the nation in which he made a strong warning against practices of racialism and tribalism within the country.

The President said that he wished to bring workers of tribalism and racialism around the country into the open. In a social and racialist atmosphere, he said, he would prosecute people because of their tribalism.

On the southern border of the country, a Tanganyikan labourer was killed and other minor injuries were reported. It is believed that the labourer was fishing in the Kevuwa River this week.

According to police, the incident occurred at the village of Katumbungu.

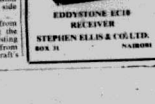

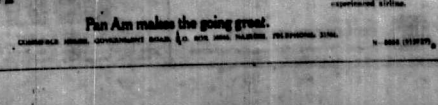

Man in 2,000 sees again

Richard Amiani, 31, is a man dedicated to his people.

His professional designation is "clinical assistant." In fact he is much more — one of the foremost eye surgeons in East Africa.

As a student in his 21st year, three years ago, Amiani was the recipient of a hand anaesthetic while one of the anesthesiologists, Mr. Wilson Kipson and Mr. Sam Adya, prepare for the operation.

Dr. Njiru turned one eye, which had commanded the attention of Mr. Amiani's mother. His first teacher, he had operated. And glad to see my children around me happy to be free to what I wanted.

That was two years ago. Yesterday Njiru travelled some miles from his 15-acre abode in Kapsabet Health Centre, situated in 1961, in the Fort Hill area of Mt. Kenia.

At one of several of blind or partially blind people, Njiru had a date with Mr. Amiani in the conference center with only the bare minimum of facilities.

He was operated for an operation on his left eye. In fact, the other eye of his father, Mr. Amiani was operated.

For, through the young surgeon's qualified but not professional colleagues in Kenyatta National Hospital, Nairobi, have spoken highly of him. "His clinical judgment and surgical skill are outstanding," was one comment.

Mr. Amiani has decided to make a big professional sacrifice. With time, which he doesn't have, and

with each, which would take time to acquire, he should reach quality.

But the demands on his skill now are increasing. There is too much for me to do now as personal desires will have to wait. I will, therefore, modestly to be drawn on the subject.

At Kapsabet he was working with a mobile unit of the Kenya Society for the Blind financed by the annual *Play It's* programme on V.O.N. television, whose target this year at Christmas time is 10,000.

Much of the year he spends in the remote areas of Kenya. For each year he has been treating people's eyes. For the past three years as a surgeon. In an average year he performs 200 cataract and 500 other operations.

Njiru's complaint was another another cataract, a rare disease.

Flanked by his assistants, Wilson Kipson and Sam Adya, Mr. Amiani got to work in the small theatre (the one side was Kipson's, a medical nurse, the other side, Wilson Kipson, staff nurse and general handmaiden).

Njiru's eye had received three operations. The first operation, the second, the third, and the fourth. The assistants held a cap light over the eye. A car light over the eye. A car light over the eye.

Local anesthetic were administered and a flap was inserted. The thread was pulled open. A silk thread of the eye is visible. Then the skin was closed.

Mr. Amiani held the eye steady with his left hand and another hand a knife. The surgeon cut into the eye to reach the lens, which became opaque. But before the lens was removed a suture was inserted to ensure that the lens would fall into the eye.

The wound was closed and the lens slowly drawn out and dissolved. A little blood was removed by a hand sponge of saline solution. The conjunctiva was closed.

The wound was washed and the silk for holding back the eye was taken out. At the end of the operation an antibiotic drug was injected in the eye. A specific drug was used to dilate the pupil.

After the operation Njiru was asked how he felt to be fully conscious with only a local anesthetic. "No pain" was his reply as he was led slowly to a rest room.

This painful and barren course may be improved, depending on the success of the Nairobi Room

Bed wiring led to girl's death, inquest told

Standard Staff Reporter
Had electrical wiring at two buildings in Glasgow Road led to the electrocution of a four-year-old Nigerian girl in May, a Nairobi magistrate, Mr. P. A. Hiar, was told yesterday.

He was hearing evidence in the case of Jennifer Maria who died on May 30.

He had electrical inspector Mr. P. V. Haines, who was the court that he inspected the building in Glasgow Road after the incident after he was called by an officer of the East African Power and Lighting Company.

He visited the premises of East Partners Garage, 110, where he saw an electrical socket in the wall with wires running to the premises of Ideal Steel Works, which had been used as a workshop nearby said they got electrical supplies not direct from the East African Power and Lighting Company but from connections to Ideal Steel Works.

He noted that a wire had come from a socket inside in the lower part of the United Partners Garage. There was no earthing to the socket in the United Partners Garage.

Mr. Sutton told the court that he saw the absence of earthing in a "metal" factor workshop. It was simply connected to earth, because a fixed socket had been supplied from the main supply of another building by means of a wire in the wall.

In this case he did not say the socket had not a third pin connected to earth.

He added: "Had an earth wire been connected the accident would not have occurred. The Ideal Steel Works were doing wrong by using their power to other premises."

As the counsel, Miss Barro Diba, outlining the incident, said the girl fell close into contact with the body of a boy that was being held by a Mr. Mlake, an employee of one of the garages in the area.

In the process of the washing operation the insulation of the electrical wire which was used to carry the washing machine motor from heat generated by the metal plate that was being welded over plates.

This metal was resting on the electrical cable when the metal plate melted away, the copper came into contact with the live body and the whole of the body became electrically charged.

"The deceased, who was playing with other boys, was in the park where the washing was being taken place in the street of the boy who was electrocuted."

U.S. division strives to halt drive on Saigon

An American division based at the tiny village of Phuoc Vinh, 60 miles north of Saigon, is making massive use of bombs and artillery to block the advance of an estimated 10,000 North Vietnamese troops towards the capital.

An almost continuous flow of high explosive bombs dropped by giant high-flying B-52 bombers and tactical fighter-bombers has rained the deserted countryside in the province of Binh Long and Phuoc Long along the Cambodian border north of Saigon into a starting line landscape.

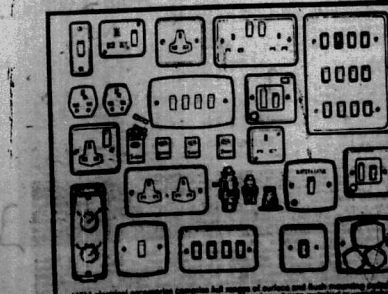

Peace offensive in Nigeria

Despite the British "peace offensive" in what appears to be the farthest hope of achieving a ceasefire in Nigeria before Christmas, it is becoming tragically obvious that the only effective means of ending the civil war is an outright military victory.

For some time it has seemed the end was in sight, but the death convictions have continued. Federal troops pressed forward after the last round of negotiations through the O.A.U. bodded down. The Biafrans gave ground until observers' believed their leadership would collapse. Yet, later, they have renewed the initiative, having replenished military supplies from the French.

No wonder, in line with President de Gaulle's militant anti-British policy in this case, the Biafrans condemn Mr. Wilson as a "hyphen" and a "partner in Nigerian genocide". Poor Mr. Wilson has been unable to land a peaceful Rhodanian solution in Premier's conference in January and looks as though he will fail to provide the substitute of peace in Nigeria.

Know your Christmas cards

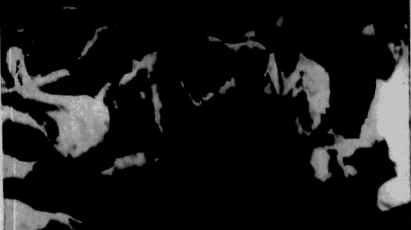

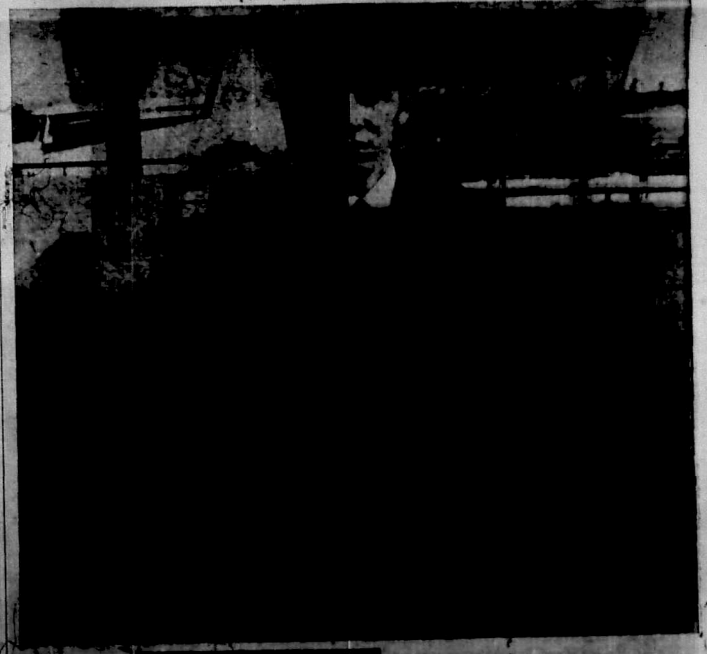

The continued development of National Parks in Tanzania will soon provide a fascinating network of parks throughout this territory.
Three recent parks which are in course of development and improvement:
Ruaha National Park with an area of 1,000 square miles and probably the largest 'elephant' sanctuary in Tanzania. Here birds can be seen almost daily and lower birds, sable and forest elephants and a wide variety of wild life.
Mkombe Park, 100 miles from Dar es Salaam a smaller park of some 500 square miles with high elephant population and a wide range of antelope including 'prong' horns.
The third park is the newest, Uspire. This is more or less an extension of the Mkombe Park on the opposite side of the lake and will be completed by the Mkombe road. It will thus be the largest of the three parks and one day from Nairobi.

It is thought that Kenya will not only be the first to develop the Uspire National Park but also the first to develop the Orphanage.

Resistance heroine tells of daring feats

Kenya has seen many visitors from overseas during the past year, but perhaps one of the most interesting personalities to have come this way recently from France is Madame Viaud, who leaves Nairobi after a short stay early next week.

The wife of the Inspector-General of weights and measures in Paris, Madame Viaud, accompanied her husband to Kenya when he came to assist the Kenya Government in implementing the federal system, and under her married name she is as little known as you or I, but as a young girl Madame Viaud — or Mademoiselle Monique Adhemar as she was then — played an important part in boosting morale during the French Resistance.

She was, each 21 at the time when she, her father and a few others started the *Fig* magazine — or underground, *Fig* at all, near the Swiss border and further between occu-

ped and non-occupied France — the prohibited zone, most closely guarded by the Germans.

Her experiences during the 22 months were many, but Madame Viaud told us a few of them that had led to her being awarded the Medal of the end of the war on January 11, last.

It was in Oyonnax, within this occupied zone, that the magazine occurred. It was the magazine of the anniversary of the armistice of the First World War — on November 11 in 1918 and the Germans were so enraged that three months later they sent soldiers to watch the men in the country because they were shy in this attitude that even pro-Germans were deported.

But the most important role played by Madame Viaud in the Resistance was in boosting the morale of the French people by maintaining underground distribution of news and information — which proved a tremendous psychological weapon.

She and her father organized the distribution of five underground newspapers which were printed in the occupied zone and distributed in the Southern (Vichy)

The laugh here is that the paper first printed by a man who was the official German printer — he worked in other zones in which he did all the printing for the Germans and another of the back which was used for the underground papers — and of course the Germans never thought of smothering the printer by their own press!

Madame Viaud's father spoke French, German, and every day at the age of 66 — he would walk through the mountainous district to have the papers distributed on time.

It was to this magazine that the first purchased weapons from the Allies of France were hidden, and another success was when they smuggled German and Czech munitions after their escape from Germany. The biggest danger, Madame Viaud said, was the German dogs — greater terror than the Gestapo.

In Lyons one morning, Madame Viaud had a triumphant moment when the magazine successfully passed by the Germans, and returned to her father's office on receiving the Allies' leading in North Africa. This of course was a tremendous boost for the people.

Monique Viaud's father had a false identity card as a railway employee, and she helped the magazine in their work in several ways, for he was then able to cross the frontier and bring back information, and in the printing of the newspapers he used to use the hot coals in the engine for smouldering.

What was Monique Viaud's worst moment? "Oh, there were many," she replied. "We once had to organize some young men to blow up a train. The train blew up but the men were caught and sentenced."

Another moment — shattering — occurred just a triumphant moment when Madame Viaud — was in August 1944 and the Germans were so enraged that those people deported to Germany would never return. Instead of being restricted in concentration camps, they had virtually been exterminated.

However, Monique Viaud is not bitter — "I would do what I did all over again," she says. "Freedom has no price."

Monique Viaud has five medals to prove how strongly she feels about freedom — the Military Cross (once exceptional for a woman especially for fighting), the War Cross, the Medal of Resistance, the Voluntary Fighters and the Free France medal.

AFRICA IN HISTORY by Basil Davidson (H. Weidenfeld and Nicolson, 8/11s.)

Judging by the rash of books appearing over the last few months the "hot" thing these days, scholars and hacks are rushing to fill the gaps left by thirty years of neglect with books good, bad and indifferent.

He begins with a definition of what he takes to be Africa, and the label stuck comes among those that are good, but is apparent to have fallen prey to some of the African "philosophies" of these days.

He begins with three chapters on what would have thought were as well known by now to anybody interested in Africa as to be necessary — one, that African history did not begin with the arrival of white explorers and, secondly, that there is still a great deal to be learned about African history.

Even if it is important to make these points plain, it is difficult to see how returning to the subject implicitly or not explicitly through such a book.

GARDENING

In this way you can be sure of having your own tomatoes available for the greatest part of the year and avoid having them ripen all at the same time — which usually happens when they are being sold very cheaply in the shops.

The home grown variety cannot be reached for flavor and many of the bought tomatoes contain a great deal of water and very little flesh.

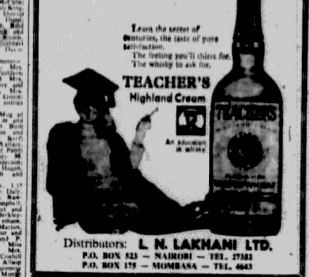

Israel rejects peace terms inspired by Russians

Signs of an early settlement of the Middle East conflict have faded after rejection by Israel of a Soviet-Egyptian peace initiative.

The move came in a joint communique from the Soviet and Egyptian Governments.

The withdrawal of Israeli forces from all Arab territories occupied in the war 18 months ago was necessary for a peaceful settlement.

Prime Minister, Mr. Golda Meir, answering questions

It completely rejected the new initiative and said that Israel would continue to establish peace on the basis of the fundamental principles of the United Nations Charter.

There was in a way a greater thrill even though they were able to maintain, at a distance of tens of thousands of miles, contact with comfortable back home. It is sad that they should not find the sciences, engineering and other backbones to make their fantastic journey possible.

The quest for the Moon is not just purely a scientific effort but a struggle of international power and politics. The United States and Russia are the two main contenders for the control of space. The United States is potentially a world leader because of the major powers, though one hopes the dictator will ever be first on the Moon as it is in space because of the national control becomes ever more urgent as each superpower is brought down.

America's latest triumph appears to have given it a clear-cut lead in the race to be first on the Moon. It is in no way to underestimate the Russians, who for years

Flying high...

At Wajir, in the North-Eastern Province of Kenya, is a house which bears the name "Beaver Lodge" but which is better known to members of the Kenya Air Force as the "Wajir Hilton".

It is not exactly luxurious, but comfortable and is the home for more or less 265 days a year of at least two pilots.

It is here, in the most-desert parts of Kenya, where the young Kenyans who are creating a first generation nucleus of Kenya's future air force begin to prove themselves fully capable of taking the responsibility which comes when they don an Air Force uniform for the first time.

At Wajir, Gordon, Mandera and the more remote areas far from the coast of N.A.F. Headquarters at Eastleigh the young pilots begin to get on his own.

He makes the distinction, both as his aircraft and in the task for military and civilian personnel — so many regarding the only one — in the difficult world of travel and communications.

To us here the N.A.F. works I seem a day here but work in the company of several of the Royal Air Force were recruited to Kenya and with Kenyan pilots just beginning their careers and others who are fully operational.

The day which struck me about N.A.F. Eastleigh was that it looked like a military base. The atmosphere was obvious in the cleanliness of the surrounding and in the working of the station.

As a former member of the N.A.F. it would be fair to say that there still is a strong — and this is all for the good.

The structure of the N.A.F. is basically simple, with a chain of command leading from the Ministry of Defence. There are three main links, the Flying Training Squadron, the Joint Control and Operations and the two operations squadrons which fly Beavers and Cessnas. All of this you have the administration and engineering.

The leadership courses were the best part of the flight training which I enjoyed very much.

I asked him why he chose the Kenya Air Force and aviation. He replied "I think it's most things on the aviation system, the young officers spend on average about 10-12 hours in the air each month but most complete their flight training hours."

The pilots are split into four categories according to experience. A, B, C and D with the latter being the category for the least qualified and meaning that the pilot is not allowed to fly more than 100 hours.

The 100 pilots have to fly their hours on an annual basis. They are allowed to fly only a few hours in the air each month, but most complete their flight training hours.

When these pilots have completed their basic training they will go to Britain for about four months at the N.A.F. training school at Eastleigh where they go through the normal 12-18 weeks of flying — no flying — and some back to the N.A.F. training school at Eastleigh.
