### ons arrested on pying charges

Twenty people were killed in a clash with Government forces at Khartoum yesterday as the capital of Sudan's southern Bah' Ghazal Province, an official said in Khartoum yesterday.

He described those killed as outlaws, and said they carried out a similar attack to that at Juba, the Southern Sudan capital, last Thursday. There reports opened fire and up to 20 people were killed, according to an Interior Ministry statement.

The newspaper *Vigilant*, the organ of the Southern Front Party said more than 1,400 people had been killed in Juba recently, but this has been officially denied.

Reports reaching Khartoum from Juba said many villagers in southern Sudan had been arrested, including three British agents of spying on Northern Army operations in the south. The reports also said film and documents had been seized.

There have been persistent disturbances in Sudan's southern provinces since 1955 when Sudaners there mutinied.

The three provinces are mainly inhabited by Africans, some of whom are pagans and some Christians, while most of the non-Muslim Sudanese are Arab Muslims.

Southerners have been pressing for a new constitutional and administrative setup, ranging from complete independence to local autonomy. A round-table conference of Northern and Southern leaders in March failed to reach a settlement, and elections held over the next month did not include the South.

### Total independence sought

In Kampala yesterday the Sudanese African National Union secretary for education and youth, Mr. Lawrence Wel Wol said he was concerned at what he considered attempts to promote divisions among the Sudanese.

Sudan's national objectives for the future of the Sudan is a fundamental principle.

Mr. Wel Wol said that religious and tribal differences should not be allowed to divide the Sudan. He said the Sudan should not consider force until all means for a peaceful settlement have been exhausted.

Mr. Wel Wol is appealing for the intervention of the Organization for African Unity, as well as of the United Nations.

Refering to the formation of the new Assisi League Front from Mr. Wol said that there seemed to be no real difference between its objectives and those of Senuc. But he denied suggestions that more than half Senuc's members were back-lash leaders from the colonial period.



# Why machinery given as cause of Manu differences





# VIETNAM WANTS MORE help in monsoon campaign

## Fears of Vietcong

U.S. military rulers yesterday asked the United States Secretary of Defense, Mr. Robert McNamara, to increase the number of troops committed to the Vietnam war. On his previous visit last year a Vietcong plot to kill Mr. McNamara with a bomb was foiled, and the would-be assassin was publicly executed.

Mr. McNamara's talks with Vietnamese chiefs were concerned with future United States aid to the South Vietnamese. In the past few months the Vietcong have been heavy toll of Government forces in battle after battle. The guerrillas control large areas of the country.

# RED AIR ON MARS MAY BE PROBLEM

THE atmosphere of Mars is very thin — only one or two per cent as dense as that of Earth, it was reported by scientists who studied radio signals beamed from the Martian atmosphere to Earth by the Mariner 1 probe after it skinned past the planet last week.

The reports said the radio signals indicated that the outer surface composition of the planet is very different from Earth. They also showed that the atmosphere was a solid mass, rather than a gas, as was previously assumed. The Mariner 1 probe was launched by the Air Force on Feb. 28, 1962, and is expected to reach Mars in May.

## Russians put probe round Sun

**THE Soviet Union has launched a new Zond rocket probe into orbit around the Sun to gap a week's off-limits space activity.**

Both previous Zond shots last year were aimed at Earth's neighbor planet, Zond 4 from Zond 3 at Mark 2. The Zond 4 was launched at a point at this distance from the Earth.

The Soviet News Agency's announcement of the launching said the idea was to check the Zond's activity in conditions of prolonged space flight and to carry out scientific studies in space.

The experts said that in view of the failure of the two previous Zonds to complete their assignments, this new shot may be simply a test of instruments in preparation for another Venus and Mars probe.







## PEKING ENVOY LEAVES ON SAME PLANE

**WANG TEH MING, the Chinese journalist who declared a unilateral immigration on Thursday night and given 24 hours to leave Kenya, flew out of Nairobi yesterday morning on an East African Airways Comet bound for Karachi, on his way to Peking.**

He was accompanied by his wife and by the Chinese Ambassador to Kenya, Mr. Wang Yu Tien, and his wife who left on the same flight. But the embassy would not confirm this last night. All a spokesman would say was: "The Ambassador has gone on leave. I do not know when he went but he has left the country".

Like all correspondents of the Peking Government-owned Huashia News Agency, Mr. Wang travelled on a diplomatic passport.

Speculation continued yesterday in diplomatic and journalistic circles in Nairobi about the reasons for Mr. Wang's expulsion. No official explanation was given by the Kenya Government but reliable sources suggested that the deportation order had been issued on account of his political rather than journalistic activities.

These sources believed Mr. Wang had been writing for the past few months on sensitive parts of Kenya, using his position as a news agency reporter as a cover for other activities.

He was known to be in touch with a number of political leaders, including some Kenya party officials and Mr. M. J. Njoroge. 
