ATOMIC STANDARD PLANNED British scheme for Geneva talks

Geneva talks yesterday announced new plans for preventing the spread of nuclear weapons, which will put to today's Disarmament Conference in Geneva, sources there held little hopes of agreement on the subject. Russia stands firmly against two specific British and American proposals.

The chief Soviet delegate, Mr. Sergey Tarasov, told reporters yesterday that his country would not accept any non-discrimination plan that left the door open for the special forces suggested by the Western Powers.

The Americans have proposed a seaboard multilateral nuclear force, known as S.E., and Britain has advocated an Atlantic Nuclear Force (ANF). The Western powers are adamant that they will not give up the concept of the Western alliance against its nuclear arrangements.

West Germany held strongly the concept that any East-West non-discrimination agreement must prevent the establishment of a nuclear deterrent within the Western alliance to meet the security demands of non-nuclear NATO partners.

Announced at Nato meeting

Britain's Disarmament Minister, Lord Chalfont, who will represent Britain at the Geneva talks, said in Paris yesterday at a special meeting of the Nato Foreign Ministers Council that Britain's Geneva proposals contained two main points.

These are that nuclear powers bind themselves not to create control over nuclear arms to countries which do not have them, and that non-nuclear powers should pledge themselves not to acquire or make nuclear weapons.

No start yet on Soviet hospital

PRESIDENT KENYATTA has postponed until later this month the start of his hospital tour of the United States. The foundation stone of the hospital which will be built by the United States in Kisumu, Kenya, will be laid on the 28th.

Mr. Kenyatta is expected to arrive in the United States on the 29th. He will spend several days in Washington, D.C., before heading for New York City, where he will spend several days with the President and Mrs. Johnson.

Kenya orders 'subversive' teacher out

EXCLUSION of Mr. Hassen Jaffe, a teacher at the Duke of Edinburgh School, Nairobi, was demanded last night by the Minister for Internal Security, Dr. Mwangi, as an indication of the determination of the Kenya Government to deal with subversives, particularly foreigners, who aid groups which are trying to overthrow the popularly elected government.

Mr. Jaffe had earlier in the day been given a 24-hour probation. He was arrested on charges of subversion. He had been a member of a subversive group in the U.S.A. and had been active in the U.S.A. and in Kenya.

Aden: Still scope for agreement

ADEN State Chief Minister, Mr. Abdul Quares Maqsood, said yesterday it was clear from his talks with the British Ambassador, Mr. Anthony Greenwood, that there was scope for an understanding within the framework of the 1962-63 Memorandum of Understanding.

The memorandum called for the early return of the British military base in Aden, and also for the withdrawal of British troops from the garrisons of Aden and the port of Soqatra. Mr. Maqsood said that he had discussed the memorandum with the British Ambassador and that he was hopeful of reaching an agreement.

A British President has been elected in the U.S.A. and the new President is expected to take office on the 20th.

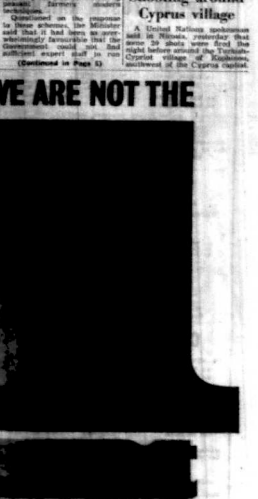

Social Security Fund will be kept separate

Social Security Bill was published yesterday as a Government commitment. The main object is to establish a fund which employers and employees will each contribute to at the rate of a small percentage of their earnings. The fund will be separate from other Government funds and will be under the control and management of the Minister for Labour and Social Services and administered by Government officers.

Provision is made for the exemption of certain employees, mainly those employed by the Government in certain statutory pension schemes, and for the reduction of contributions to private provident schemes in respect of employees who will be members both of the National Fund and of a private scheme.

Five kinds of benefits are proposed. Benefits payable on retirement will be up to 50 per cent of the employee's salary, but withdrawal benefits granted to a member who is more than 40 years of age will be in employment covered by the scheme. Emigration grant is payable at any time on emigration.

FOR DEPENDENTS

The last type is survivor's benefit payable to dependents. Every benefit consists of the money in the member's account made up of employer's and employee's contributions. Money and interest added to the account.

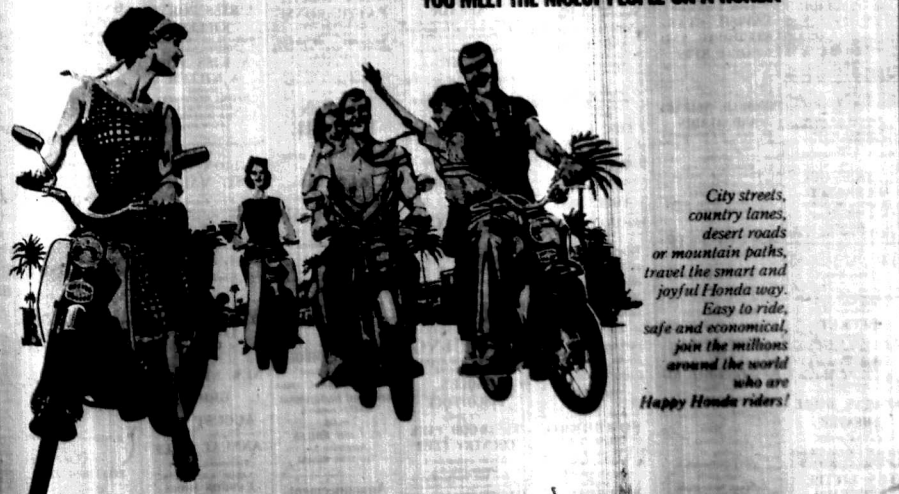

Wages for child mortality rate

rate in East Africa was one of the highest in the world but blamed mainly on the low wages paid by Government, the general secretary of the Communist Party (Kenya), Mr. P. F. Oduh, told the Industrial Court in Nairobi yesterday.

Opening the Union's case in its dispute with E.A.C.S.O. Mr. Oduh said the Child Welfare Survey of Kenya, carried out under the chairmanship of Mr. Humphrey Slade, had proved most conclusively that the most serious health and welfare problem was malnutrition and protein deficiency.

Mr. Oduh said the report had asked how it could be possible for the average worker to feed his children on protein foods when his income did not enable him to keep his dependants at a standard received by primary in Kenya's jails.

The child mortality rate among Africans today was nearly 40 per cent of all children born, before they reached the age of two years.

SHOULD BE FIRST TO SET EXAMPLE

E.A.C.S.O. was an inter-tribal organisation serving the three countries and should be the first to set an example to the private sector by paying a reasonable wage, he said. He suggested a man on \$60 a month could be expected to commensurate on work when sometimes he had worked no breakfast or lunch.

At Mungira there were people who had worked full-time for more than six years but were being paid only \$100 under the pretext that they were casual labourers, he alleged.

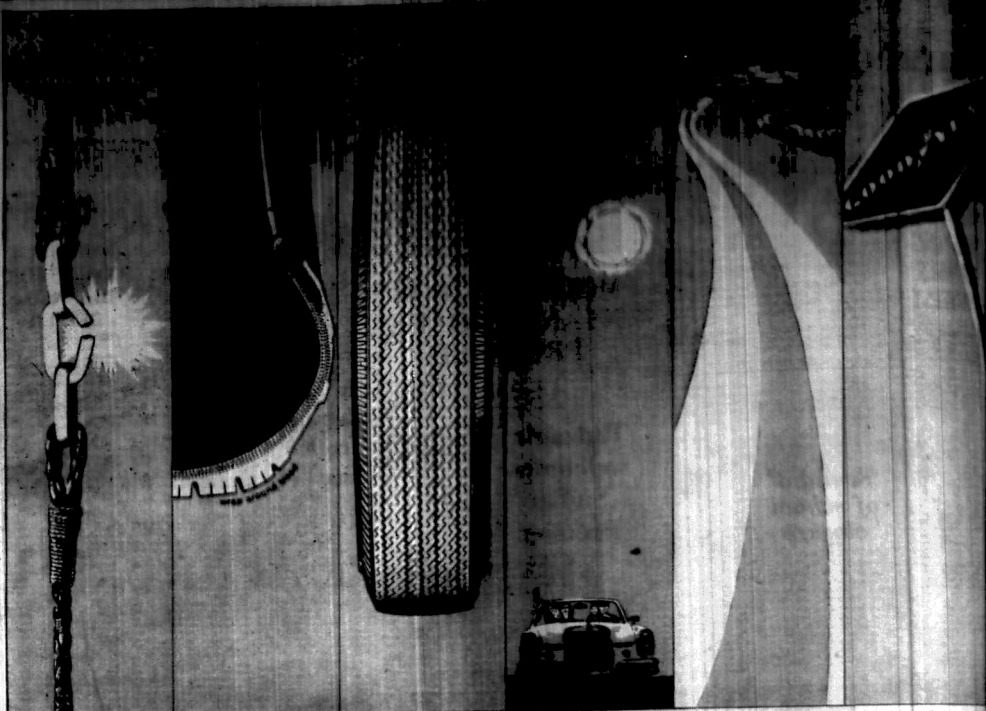

BRITAIN LIMITS IMMIGRANTS Numbers cut from 20,800 to 8,500

Parliament yesterday imposed an 8,500 limit on the number of new Commonwealth immigrants to be allowed in each year. The current annual rate of arrival is 20,800 mostly from India, Pakistan and the West Indies. On top of the new limit an immigrant's wife and child under the age of 16 may also go to Britain.

The Government's comprehensive policy on immigration, published as an official document, also includes new measures against evasion, tighter health checks, and plans to improve the integration of Commonwealth immigrants already in the country.

OBOTE LEAVES VISIT TO INDIA

Will leave for Uganda on Saturday

Prime Minister, Mr. Obote, is cutting short his visit to India to attend an East African regional conference next weekend. He will leave for Uganda on Saturday.

The official said yesterday that Mr. Obote, who arrived in India on Tuesday, will leave Bombay on Saturday instead of next Tuesday as planned originally, in order to attend a conference on the borders of Uganda, Tanzania, Kenya and Zambia. He cannot give further details.

Mr. Obote's party must not say why the visit was being cut short. The Indian Prime Minister, Mr. Lal Bahadur Shastri, speaking at a dinner in honour of Mr. Obote, said: "I am sorry you have curtailed your programme. I know that it is an important conference very much of which you have benefited."

Mr. Obote said in reply: "We have great experiments in Africa. Practically every African State is a laboratory. 'Africa can have big states'."

"Ghana was the first of the African States to obtain independence after the Second World War. If Ghana fails, most of us who followed would be left with no future."

"Nigeria's size and the wealth and resources there will give some of the countries outside Africa that cannot have only small States, but can also have big States."

Mr. Obote went on: "Having been in India for some time, before leaving for the East African regional conference, we were facing the world and all its state size problems. We are now facing particular moments of state size problems. It is not only for our continent, but also for the world, that we are facing these problems."

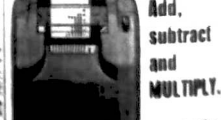

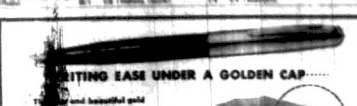
