DOCUMENTS ANGRERS LEADERS Pro-Chinese call for E. Africa 'revolution'

Anger and indignation were expressed by Kenya leaders last night over a document which had been widely circulated by a body calling itself 'The People's Front of East Africa'. The document made a bitter attack on the Kenya Government and denounced its policy of African Socialism.

It described the Government as "hottering" and its policy as "Fascist" and "dishonest". It went on to call for a revolution in East Africa and Salama to Kenya Cabinet Ministers, M.P.s, civil servants, official bodies and individuals. A Kenya Manifesto, strong condemnation of the document was approved yesterday by Kenya M.P.s who had received a copy. They included the Vice-President, Mr. Odingo, who was loudly praised in the document.

Mr. Odingo described it as "an invective and an insult" and "intended to stir the minds of disoriented" and "misguided" writers - were imperialist agents and tools of a previous document which had called for a plot in the murder of Mr. Fasil, M.P. Communist com-

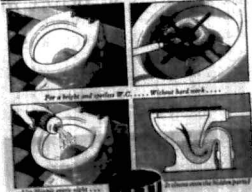

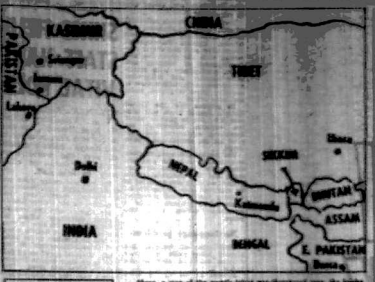

Pakistan regret at demand's terms

Pakistan and Britain were giving careful consideration yesterday to the United Nations Security Council's demand that both sides stop fighting by 9.00 a.m. tomorrow.

The Indian Premier, Mr. Shastri, said he might make a statement today about the resolution. In Rawalpindi President Ayub Khan of Pakistan summoned the Cabinet after having met the Foreign Minister, Mr. Bhutto, and other Government leaders.

There was no official reaction in Pakistan to the U.N. demand, but disappointment was registered over the resolution, which was claimed to have originated in the Khabizina.

This is only the second time in its 20 years of existence that the United Nations has made such a demand. The first Council action of this kind was taken in 1949. The Security Council also asked the Secretary-General, U. Thant, to make the ceasefire and withdrawal of all armed Indian and Pakistani personnel.

China 'looking for excuse'

According to well-informed sources in Rawalpindi it would still be likely to defy the United Nations call for a ceasefire made in 1949. It was thought, Premier Ayub said, that any ceasefire should be followed by major powers perpetrating negotiations to settle the Kashmir problem.

In New Delhi, Mr. Shastri said China was looking for an excuse to start aggressive activities with a view to the invasion of India. The Premier said that the determination to fight back, if attacked, was firm.

TWO SURVEYS OF RAIL LINK

Tanzania says China will continue work

SEPARATE surveys of the Tanzania section of the proposed rail link with Zambia are to be made by a Chinese team, which is already at work, and a joint British-Canadian one.

This was disclosed yesterday by President Nyerere of Tanzania. He also said China had agreed to finance a survey of the entire 1,033-mile route, at an estimated cost of £100 million, to be paid by grants from the two governments.

Quintessential about this deal is the implicit invitation by the two Governments to build the link and that this was the only offer received so far.

It had been announced earlier, in a joint public statement by the two Governments, that the British and Canadian had agreed to finance a survey of the entire 1,033-mile route, at an estimated cost of £100 million, to be paid by grants from the two governments.

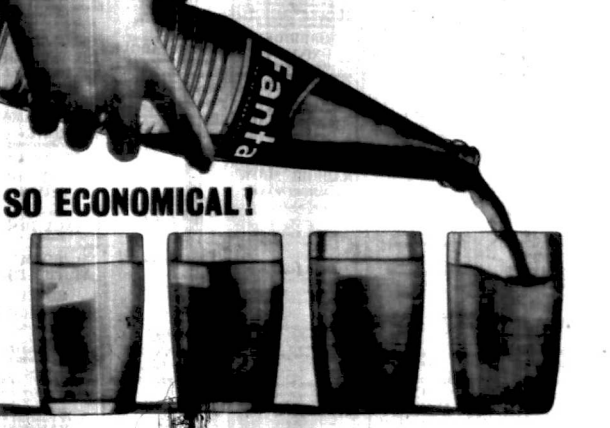

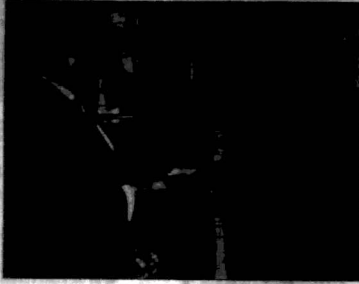

INDEPENDENCE FOR MAURITIUS

Unique protection in Constitution

MAURITIUS has decided to grant independence to its colony of Mauritius, the sugar-producing island in the Indian Ocean, and it will be achieved before the end of next year.

300 KILLED IN BATTLE IN VIETNAM HIGHWAY

VIETNAMESE troops and scaling aircraft killed an estimated 300 in a series of battles along a highway in the north of Vietnam.

The decision was announced in London yesterday by Britain's Colonial Secretary, Mr. Anthony Greenwood, at the end of a three-day constitutional conference on the future of the island and its 750,000 people.

Two-thirds of the population are Indo-Mauritians, with a Hindu majority. Europeans, mostly of French origin, Africans and mixed races make up only 20 per cent, and there are also about 30,000 Chinese.

In deciding on ultimate independence, as sought by the dominant Mauritius Labour Party led by the Premier, Sir Seewoosagur Ramgoolam, Britain has rejected demands by the main Opposition, Parti Mauricien, that the island should instead continue in some form of association with Britain.

One party boycotts final session

The Parti Mauricien—which boycotted the final session—also had its demands for a referendum on the independence or association issue rejected. Mr. Greenwood told a Press conference yesterday that the British Government had concluded that "it was right that Mauritius should be independent."

He said he had decided to appoint a commission "a matter of urgency," to make recommendations on the electoral system for Mauritius and the method of allocating seats to the various parties in the Legislature, as it had proved impossible to reach agreement on these issues at the conference.

The new commission, a five-man body, was set up under the chairmanship of Sir John G. Greenwood and will be prepared to file a date and time, necessary for the holding of a referendum after a period of six months or less, and to make recommendations on a referendum which the Government will then have to accept.

The British Government will also have to accept the new commission's recommendations on the electoral system and the method of allocating seats to the various parties in the Legislature.

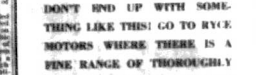

BRITISH CLAMPDOWN ON ADEN

Curfew extended after gun battle

Security clampdown was imposed in Aden yesterday because of a curfew breach in a result of the suspension of the Constitution Saturday. All British schools were closed, an all-night curfew extended to 11 hours, and off-duty British servicemen were ordered to stay indoors for at least 24 hours.

The new security measures were put into effect a few hours after a rooftop gun battle between British troops and Arab terrorists. Bars, cinemas and restaurants were placed off limits for all British servicemen and their families. A 6 p.m. to 5 a.m. curfew was extended to all of Aden.

An Arab driver was killed when bits of explosive blew up his vehicle in the harbour area on Saturday. The man's body and parts of the vehicle were scattered over a 300-yard area. The roof and windows of a nearby building were also damaged. The driver was the only person in the vehicle.

Britain has suspended the Constitution and dissolved the Council of Ministers because of the recent spate of assassination and sabotage.

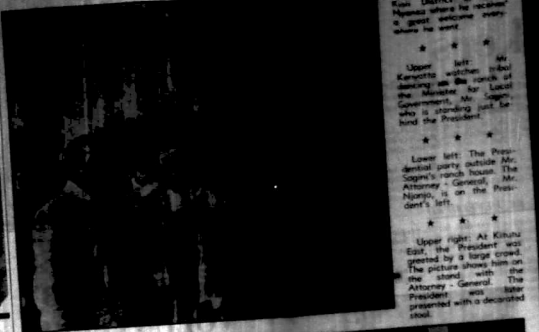

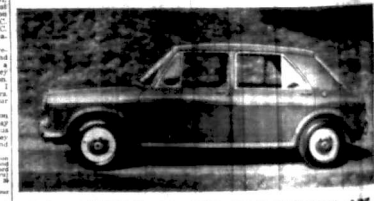
