

100,000 EAST AFRICAN STRIKE

out on Saturday

Leaders of 150,000 East African Common Services Organisation workers yesterday stated that all E.A.C.S.O. employees would go on strike on Saturday because of the failure to implement awards of the Kenya Industrial Court and the said Staff Tribunal.

The strike will affect the Railways and the General Fund Services, as well as the Post Office, whose workers are already engaged in a go-slow throughout the country.

Statements were also issued yesterday making it clear that the disputes involving Kenya workers are no longer governed by Kenya legislation but by the Settlement of Disputes (East African Common Services Organisation Employees) Act, 1965, which came into effect on October 1.

The strike decision was made at a meeting in Nairobi of the general secretaries of the Railway Africa Union, the Common Services African Civil Servants' Union and the Union of Postal and Telecommunications Employees. Mr. W. Otieno, Mr. P. P. Ooko and Mr. C. Adogo.

No longer bound by Act

They told a Press conference that after a day-long discussion with officials of the Ministry of Labour, they had been told workers in the East African Common Services Organisation would no longer be bound by the Kenya Trade Disputes Act since the E.A.C.S.O. disputes bill became law on October 1.

They claimed that this meant, in effect, that the decisions of the Kenya Industrial Court in regard to the disputes involving the East African Railways and the E.A.C.S.O. General Fund Services might have to be quashed since the issues raised in it, in accordance with the procedures laid down in the new E.A.C.S.O. Disputes Act.

Seeking an abate of his anger, Mr. Otieno said he had been surprised at the attitude of the Government towards the protest, and that the Government would not be holding any talks with the workers. 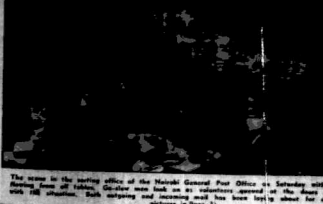

TSHOMBE SAVED TO GO SHAKE-UP

President appoints ex-Katanga Minister

PRESIDENT KASAVUBU yesterday dismissed Mr. Tshombe's transitional Congo Government and named Mr. Evariste Kimba to form a new Cabinet. Radio Leopoldville said Mr. Kimba, aged 39, had accepted the call to form a new Administration.

He is the leader of the Regional Balakakat Party which is a member of the newly formed Front Democratique Congolais. He served for three years as Foreign Minister under Mr. Tshombe during the secession in Katanga Province.

President Kasavubu told a packed session of Parliament he had forced the resignation of Mr. Tshombe's Government in spite of its objections. The President's action follows general elections in the Congo in April and the later establishment of the F.D.C. party headed by the late Mr. Tshombe.

The F.D.C. backs President Kasavubu's concept of a new National Union Government, and is strongly opposed to Mr. Tshombe and his Convention National Congolais.

Predictions refuted

The President's action refuted diplomatic predictions that a compromise between Mr. Tshombe and Mr. Kasavubu had been reached. It was said that Mr. Tshombe would remain in office under a new broadened Cabinet. Besides Mr. Tshombe and the two men who had been talked about as the new Prime Minister were Mr. Nendaka and Mr. Kimba.

Mr. Tshombe, whose Government has been in office since July last year, looked somber as the President read his statement in spirit of which he referred, they fitted into the new Constitution and to follow all legal obligations. He said that he would not resign but would remain in office until he had handed over power to the new Government.





ANTI-RELIGIOUS Chinese and Muslims in pitched battle

Over 500 anti-Communist Muslims burned down a Chinese-owned university during a pitched battle in Djakarta in which one student was believed beaten to death and an estimated 250 people injured, police said yesterday.

The infuriated Muslims completely destroyed the Republica University, an institution on the outskirts of Djakarta with an enrolment of 500 students, almost all of them Chinese. The two-hour riot marked the first occasion since the abortive coup of October 1 that anyone was killed or injured in a series of Djakarta demonstrations.

Shortly before the outbreak, the Muslims held a procession through the streets of Djakarta. They shouted the Republica University was a 'nest' for the coup movement which had tried to overthrow President Sukarno. The demonstrators - students from other schools in Djakarta - stormed into the university grounds after the parade, armed with bricks, stones and sticks. They attacked about 60 Chinese students, who fled into the building.

After 20 minutes of firing and when police had cordoned the area, another two thousands of demonstrators arrived. They smashed into the university grounds through a back entrance while a mob in front pelted police with stones, bricks and rocks, striking the building. They broke everything in sight. Police summoned reinforcements but failed to halt the riot. Police handed out tear gas to disperse the demonstrators.

Mr. Smith described the proposal as "not practical" in a personal message to the British Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, released in Salisbury. He told Mr. Wilson it would be impossible for Rhodesia to "reverse a principle and to commit ourselves to the decisions or recommendations of any Commonwealth mission".

'Could lead to bitterness'

He said it was "less than fair" that Commonwealth countries should be asked to "sit in judgment upon the Rhodesian case". Such a mission suggested by Mr. Wilson "must have within its ranks people who have openly expressed themselves as enemies of the present Rhodesian Constitution," he said.

Mr. Smith added: "Such an exercise must, therefore, lead to bitterness and resentment — something which is absent at the moment and which would prove tragic to the continent." The message, he said, was decided in principle at a Cabinet meeting last week and completed by Mr. Smith over the weekend, as was announced by the Premier before he addressed a Press conference in the Foreign Ministry building in Salisbury.

In his reply, Mr. Smith referred to the breakdown of the London independence talks although Rhodesia has not yet indicated whether it will accept the British Government's bid to move away from the original stand. He added: "I regret that in spite of the fact I dropped over in London for an additional three days, you did not discuss this matter with me before I departed."

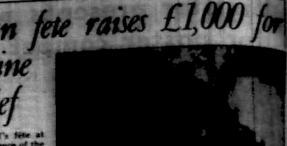
