



Parades and parties mark Nyatta Day celebrations

...the anniversary of the President's arrest at Githunguri in 1952 was celebrated throughout Kenya yesterday with parades and festivities at which Mr. Kenyatta and his Ministers called for renewed co-operation between the Government and the various races and communities in Kenya.

The President himself made a tour of Nairobi ending up at a Kamba rally at Kamukuri where he spoke to an enthusiastic crowd of thousands of the need for all to buckle to the task of nation-building.

The crowd gave a warm welcome to the Government's latest measure to provide free education for Forms V and VI in Kenya's secondary schools and applauded the achievement.

Call for positive action

After the meeting the President launched a self-help scheme to raise money for a new Kamba headquarters in Nairobi which he said would cost about £100,000. He also hinted 15 years ago. The fifth, Mr. M. Kagga, was not introduced.

In Mombasa where a long procession, headed by members of the National Youth Service, was held, the Minister for Labour, Mr. Mwendwa, made a special appeal for people of all races to demonstrate their loyalty and allegiance to Kenya by positive action.

A similar theme was taken by the Minister for Home Affairs, Mr. Njuguna, in Nakuru where it is estimated that Kenyatta Day functions have raised more than £300 for the National Family Relief Fund. The anniversary, which was celebrated in Kenya's 16 provinces, was held in a large number of towns including Nairobi, Mombasa, Kisumu, Nakuru, Eldoret, Kericho, Malindi, Lamu, and Kilifi. In Nairobi, the President's message was read in the National Stadium and the President's portrait was displayed in the streets of Nairobi.

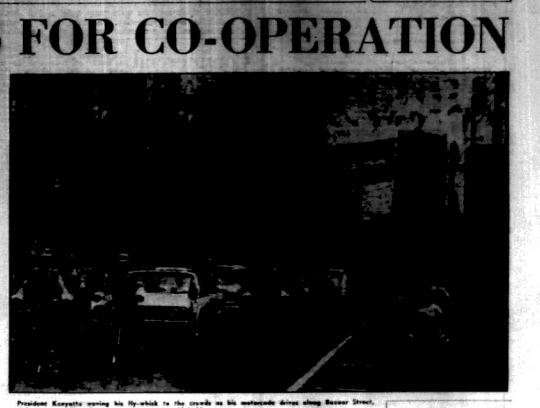
In London the Kenya High Commission has issued a statement for the first occasion in the Commission's history to the Press. Members of the British Government are expected to visit Kenya in the near future.

Commercial refining tests start

A NEW copper-plate processing method which would revolutionize Zambia's copper industry started commercial-scale testing yesterday.

The method is being tested by the Anglo-American Corporation Limited plant at the Copperbelt Mine in Kitale on Zambia's Copperbelt. The plant handles 500 tons a day.

Known as the treatment of refractory copper ores, the process treats refractory copper ores which can not be treated by conventional methods. A by-product of the process is a gas which has added value for 40 cents.

There has already been led by the corporation in a small pilot plant which handled only one ton a day.

KENYATTA was given a rousing welcome yesterday by thousands when she returned to Nairobi, where she was met by a huge crowd for Independence Day celebrations. The crowd was estimated at 100,000. The President, Mrs. Ngina Kenyatta, arrived at the field in an open car, followed by a motorcade of Ministers of the National Assembly and representatives of the Diplomatic Corps.

HITS PLANE

Addressing his audience, the President warned that any individual or group attempting to undermine or wreck the Government would be dealt with ruthlessly. The Government had sufficient forces to deal firmly with any situation, he said.

The huge crowd then pledged, by a show of hands, to support the Government and to give the President a mandate to deal with troublemakers. They also resolved to support the Government policy of African Socialism as contained in Sessional Paper No. 10.

On arrival at Kamukuni, the President was welcomed by the chairman of Nairobi branch of KANU, Mr. Kibara Kabutu. The Police Band played the National Anthem, followed by the tune *Kana ga Jenga Nchi*. The crowd, led by the Kana general secretary, Mr. Mboya, joined in singing the song.

CALL TO WORK AS A TEAM

After explaining how Kenya has struggled for their independence, the President urged all citizens to obey the laws of the country and work as a team in the task of nation-building.

Nairobi stopover meeting with Mr. Kenyatta

British Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, and the Commonwealth Secretary, Mr. Bottomley, arrived in Salisbury last night in a late attempt to stop Rhodesia from declaring unilateral independence. Earlier, Mr. Wilson passed through Nairobi — where he had a 60-minute talk with President Kenyatta.

Mr. Wilson told reporters at the airport that he had "useful discussions" with President Kenyatta on the Rhodesian problem, but would prefer not to talk about his next move because it might make the problem even more difficult. "I hope to have talks with the leaders of the Rhodesia Government and also to say something to contribute anything that can help to solve the crisis."

Mr. Wilson and Mr. Bottomley, who were acceptable to all sections of the people of Rhodesia, were met by President Kenyatta, the Minister for Internal Security and Defence, Dr. Mungai, the Minister for Works, Communications and Power, Mr. Mwaipemba, the Attorney General, Mr. Njoroge, Sen. C. K. Lubembe and Members of Parliament.

Large crowd at airport

A large crowd, mainly of Europeans, was at the waiting hall to see Mr. Wilson. As he stepped on to the tarmac, he was met by the staff of the British High Commission in Nairobi, led by the British Commissioner, Mr. Malcolm Macdonald.

Mr. Wilson and Mr. Bottomley, who travelled in an RAF Comet, were accompanied by 20 advisers. In Salisbury the Rhodesian Prime Minister, Mr. Smith, under pressure from Right-wing members of his ruling Rhodesian Front, issued a statement declaring that he would not even discuss the issue of unilateral declaration of independence with Mr. Wilson.

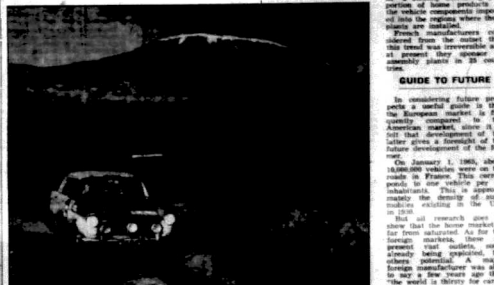

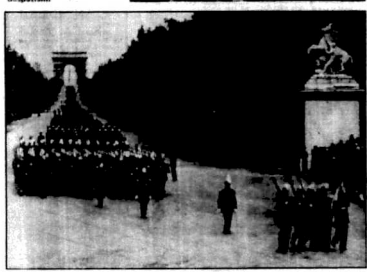

K.N.F.U. puts case to U.K. Minister

Members of the Kenya National Farmers' Union, led by the president, Mr. J. B. Pallard, yesterday met the British Minister for Overseas Development, Mrs. Castle, for preliminary discussion on the take-over of mixed farms to which the union is asking Britain to put up £15,000,000.

"We are not going home without a firm answer on the purchase of the remaining European-owned mixed farms," Mr. Pallard told the East African Standard. Yesterday, the K.N.F.U. presented Mrs. Castle with a memorandum which said that the Kenya Government had made it clear that it intended to take over the remaining available European-owned mixed farms as soon as possible, and would not pay more than the land was worth to it—at least about two-thirds of the valuation used for the 1,000,000 acres already bought.

During a British press conference the members would be asked to call at the press conference and to answer questions which Mrs. Castle would be asked to answer. They might be asked to answer questions on the take-over of mixed farms.

The only way we can see to save the remaining mixed farms is to buy them from the farmer and the injury to the farmer would be made good by the grant money from the U.K. The memorandum would cover all the mixed farms in Kenya.

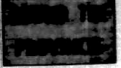

Another African was led away in handcuffs, while Albanian police dogs bit demonstrators and tore their clothing.

A reporter saw at least four people arrested and several others mauled by the dogs as police dispersed the crowd of several hundred Africans outside Government House. The order to disperse the crowd, who were becoming noisier and more dense still, came after police reinforcements were brought up.

'One man, one vote' placards

Some of the demonstrators held crudely painted placards with slogans including "Africans must now rule" and "We want our country — without the Constitution" and "Without: One man, one vote" in Zimbarwe.

As the police, accompanied by policemen, moved to start dispersing the demonstrators, they were angry shouts broke out.

COMMONWEALTH trade growth rapidly rose over a quarter of 21 per cent of world exports and 22 per cent of imports, the Commonwealth Economic Commission reported yesterday.

Britain was the largest beneficiary of the rapid growth in trade with non-Commonwealth countries, with a 26 per cent increase in exports from the Commonwealth and a 25 per cent increase in imports from the Commonwealth.

Exports from the Commonwealth rose by more than nine per cent last quarter, compared with a 10 per cent increase in imports from the Commonwealth. Large storage by board

Members of the Kenya National Planning Board, headed by the Minister for Finance, Mr. E. A. Adams, yesterday strongly urged the Government to take adequate steps to deal with the current food shortage.

"My Board has never denied there was a shortage of maize, but we most vehemently deny that the distribution organization is in chaos. 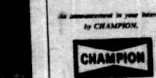

Rhodesian Prime Ministers met again yesterday in Salisbury and it appeared to be a final attempt to avert a break between Britain and the Central African group by a unilateral declaration of independence. At the meeting Mr. Smith was expected to announce Mr. Wilson that Britain could not protect the colony from strong Rhodesians and that any hopes of getting oil from Portugal were falsely based.

If necessary, the rest of the world would organise a Berlin-type airlift to protect Zambia's economy.

An unconfirmed report in Salisbury said Britain's High Commissioner to Zambia, Sir Louis Mountbatten, flew yesterday from Lusaka at Mr. Wilson's request. It was announced that Mr. Wilson might stay in Zambia for talks with President Kaunda on his way home today from Rhodesia.

No definite confirmation

A British High Commission official said there was no definite confirmation of the meeting Mr. Wilson has also been expected to visit to one or more Commonwealth States in West Africa on his way home.

The announcement said in Salisbury President Kaunda came out Hansary, the Archbishop of Canterbury, who is expected to guarantee Africans' rights.

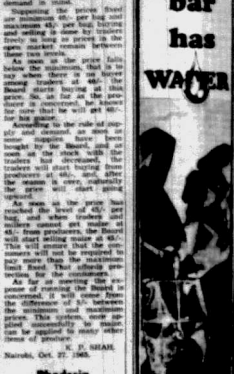



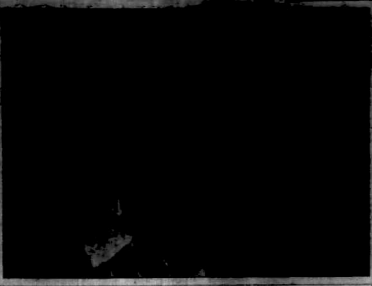

PEOPLE LINE UP TO BRITAIN Commons welcomes Wilson's report

Independence could come only by the authority of the Government, a packed House of Commons was told by the Minister, Mr. Wilson, yesterday.

Mr. Wilson, when reporting on his visit to Rhodesia, was cheered when he said: "I hope the House will concede that I have done everything in a man's power to avert a tragic and dangerous development which only last days ago was imminent, and cannot even now be said to have been removed."

In a long, detailed statement, the Premier first outlined the events leading up to the Rhodesian threat to declare independence unilaterally and stressed that the Labour Government had consistently followed the principles laid down by its Conservative predecessor, regarding the legality of U.D.I.

Mr. Smith, Mr. Wilson outlined the five principles which he considered must be realised before independence was granted, and which the Rhodesian Premier had accepted. These principles were:

Need for all to be satisfied

The principle and intention of unimpeded progress to majority rule, already embodied in the 1961 Constitution, would have to be maintained and guaranteed. There would have to be guarantees against retrogressive amendment of the Constitution.

There would have to be immediate improvement in the political status of the African population and progress towards ending racial discrimination. Finally, the British Government would need to be satisfied that any basis proposed for Rhodesia as a whole.

Rhodesia could survive sanctions

THE Rhodesian Prime Minister, Mr. Smith, said in an interview published yesterday that there was no doubt that his country could survive if economic sanctions were applied as a result of its dispute with Britain over Rhodesian independence.

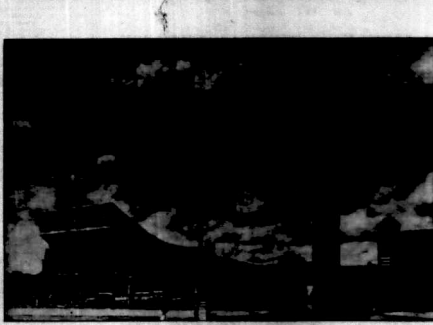

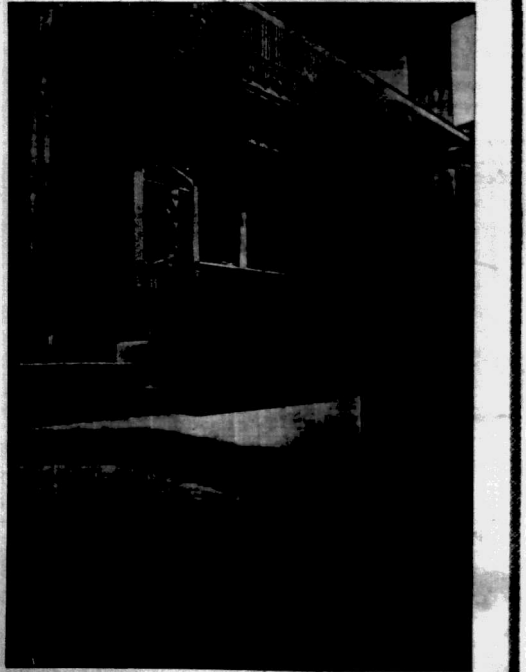

Commission on basis of 1961 Constitution

Mr. Wilson has agreed to put the independence issue to the Rhodesian people — African and European — through a Royal Commission on the basis of the present Constitution. Announcing this, the Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, said his Government disagreed with the views of leading Rhodesian opinion, and would reserve its position to accept or reject the Commission's findings.
 Meanwhile, in Salisbury, the Rhodesian Government laid down conditions for the setting up of the Commission. It said that if Britain did not accept its proposed amendments to the colony's 1961 Constitution, the proposed Royal Commission would not come into being.
 Mr. Wilson told the British Parliament that the two Governments remained deadlocked on the question of amending the 1961 Constitution as a basis for the Commission's work. He had put before the Rhodesian Premier all the Rhodesian people to find out whether they accepted the present Constitution.
 Mr. Wilson went on: "We continue to hold the view that the Royal Commission, before canvassing the views of the Rhodesian people about the setting up of two Governments a unanimous interim report for acceptability will be determined."

Report 'must be unanimous'

When the Commission has completed the process of ascertaining the opinions of the people of Rhodesia, they will submit a final report which we have agreed must be unanimous.

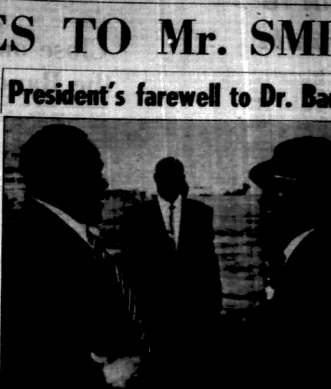

UGANDA FOOTBALL TURMOIL

Suspension of five players explained

A SERIES of acts of alleged indiscretion since 1962 were the responsibility for the suspension of five national players by the Uganda Football Association, it was stated by the association's general secretary, Mr. Cornelius Tamba.

The five players are Noah Mwosa, Ali Kiwinda, John Didiya, Jimmy Sanywa and A. Oundji and the decision to suspend them for "two years" was taken last night. This statement by Mr. Tamba yesterday said that there had been some misunderstanding as to why the suspension had been imposed.

The statement said the U.F.A.'s decision was not taken lightly because the players demanded 200/- each before the kick-off on October 9 of a friendly match with Zambia but because of a series of acts of alleged indiscretion since 1962. Several instances of misbehavior were quoted by Mr. Tamba, including the following:
