NAIROBI'S UNEMPLOYED NATIVE POPULATION

GROWING PROBLEM FOR THE AUTHORITIES

5,000 Who do Not Work

MAJORITY MATERIAL OF WHICH CRIMINALS ARE MADE?

Over five thousand natives, or nearly a quarter of the male African population in Nairobi, are permanently unemployed or unemployable, it is estimated.

These are startling figures and raise immediately the question—how these five thousand live and by what means?

Danger to Rising Generation

The Nairobi Medical Officer of Durban and other South African cities, in the Union a native employed as a casual labourer may earn £1.00 per month.

With these figures taken as a fairly accurate guide of the 28,000 Africans approximately 35,000 are employed, and 28,000 unemployed. Unemployed natives may obtain a place, of a specific colour, in regular employment, if the authorities, renew the passes of those native girls, owing to the difficulty of reasonably accurate estimation, not being included. That leaves some 10,000 natives who are unemployed, whom it is estimated that no more than 10,000 are in regular employment. This figure includes 6,000 native men, many of whom are manual labourers. Of the women, about 150 are employed as ayahs and 1,000 as domestic servants. The native men and maid-servants are married and the balance exist as best they can.

Thus, among the 10,000 unemployed, a few are used gainers, porters and so forth, possibly two thousand, and the remaining 9,000 are really "hard luck" cases, but it is a reasonable assumption that the majority of these are engaged in small thives and often actual vagabonds.

African Minnows?

It is a common sight at the end or beginning of a month to see a crowd of anything up to 150 to 200 native waiters in the vicinity of Nairobi, Repulse Avenue, in the hope of obtaining employment. MAKING THE ARMY MORE ATTRACTIVE

(Continued from page 3.)

going the whole Army in a short time and it was hoped that in a year or two they would be in sight of doing so.

Recruiting for the Territorials had been extremely satisfactory, and the Government had requested the Army to recruit from the general body of the Navy and the Royal Air Force.

Mr. Duff Cooper announced earlier innumerable measures including four months' duty instead of three, while the pay of recruits and officers would be increased. This also included its overseas equipment.

The Territorial Service intended to open a wider and a longer period of service stations, an increase in mess allowances and a special allowance for married men. The Army would in future provide the soldier with everything. Kit allowances were increased and arrangements improved.

Other Changes

To add still greater opportunities was given to men to get promoted to higher ranks. The system of keeping troops overseas for a year beyond their normal tour of duty was discontinued, though the authorities would retain the right to do so.

An additional Territorial Reserve would be formed and officers, with service would be liable to be called up on mobilization.

Mr. Duff Cooper said that he was hoping that the Ministry of Finance would take over the whole responsibility of recruiting.

Men would be trained in future after leaving the colours instead of beginning their training during the last six months of their service.

The ends of the grades to the Territorial Army would now be

referred to and also those in respect of rated corps.

Motor Transport

The aims of the future, he explained, must rely almost entirely on motor transport and in future a fully mechanized installation of transport would be accompanied by two light tank units.

The question of the shortage of horses in the Army would be investigated.

In the new barracks the men could be able to sleep, wash and shave in comfort.

Officials of Government's press followed the usual lines of recent debates in the House. It was agreed that the Foreign Service policy was not clear and that the House did not know what the Government intended to do. IMPORTANT CHANGES IN CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT ON FARMS

The new Squatters Bill has been published for information and criticism.

The Draft Bill (to give it its correct title, "The Resident Landowners Ordinance, 1957") embodies a number of alterations to clarify and make more fundamental changes, however, as compared with the 1955 Ordinance. Local authorities may prohibit the engagement of squatters or squatters, on any farm, or group of farms, having due regard to the wishes of farm occupiers within their areas of jurisdiction so far as can be reasonably and conveniently ascertained.

The Governor in Council may make similar orders regarding forest areas, Crown land and unalienated Crown land, where the old Bill applied only to farms.

Another fundamental difference in the new draft Bill is that the maximum of a squatter's contract is raised from three to five years, but the 1890 limit on the maximum period of compulsory acquisition remains unaltered. A contract under the new Bill will last at most three months' notice instead of six months as formerly.

Another important modification is the provision requiring acknowledgement of a squatter's contract on his "kipendi," or Native Registration Card, before the squatter within the terms of the Native Registration Ordinance as applicable to minors and servants. The labourer must also be signed off on his Upendi on the termination of his contract.

Provisions of the Contracts

The new Bill is designed to give effect to the recommendations in the Report of the Committee appointed to review the Resident Land Bills of 1955, and to cover what amendment was necessary for its implementation.

With the exception of certain minor amendments relating to general and local charges, it corresponds in all the main to the Draft Bill appended to the Committee's Report.

One of the main changes is that a person engaged as a "resident labourer" is stated to mean a Native or Somali who is in the service of another for a term of years or until he reaches the age of 50, or until he becomes a pensioner, or until he is engaged in agriculture or any other work which is not prohibited by the proposed new law.

Once the bill is passed, no Native or Somali will be admitted to a farm or remain for a longer continuous period than 18 months without the permission of the farm owner, or until he is engaged in agriculture or any other work which is not prohibited by the proposed new law.

On a change of occupancy of a farm, the owner will be deemed to have been engaged in his new occupation and to have entered into a contract before the new occupier and his considerable property do so.

RATES OF FREIGHT

War Clause Governing Questions

The Nairobi Chamber of Commerce has received from the East African Railways Board a circular dated March 12, 1957, in which it states that in future all rates of freight quoted will be subject to the following clause:

"If the normal business working of a freight engagement resulting from this quotation should, in the opinion of the Board, be interfered with—whether through physical or legal difficulties or otherwise—in such a way as to give rise to a reasonable cause of non-delivery of or non-acceptance of any of the instruments or apprenticeship of any of the Indian, Chinese, Arab, or other nationalities, or by reason of any war or other wartime operations between any nations, and/or civil strife, cessation or prohibition of intercourse, embargoes or otherwise, between any nations, whether such be caused by Government or by the League of Nations, and measures taken by any nation or nations in accordance with or connected with any of the above matters, the shipper will be entitled to cancel this quotation or to suspend its operation until such interference has been removed, whenupon his liability to pay freight will be suspended.

"So far as cargo actually shipped may be concerned, the pro-

portion of the cost of the shipping of such cargo to the port of loading shall apply in addition to such special war charge and/or other special charges as may from time to time be determined."







NG FIGHT TO CONTROL WATERS IN FEN DISTRICT

Broadcast Warnings

PLANS TO REMOVE PEOPLE IF POSITION BECOMES WORSE

A desperate fight is being waged in the Fen District of England to keep the flood waters in check and latest reports show that despite unceasing work the flood is gaining. One of the banks broke on Wednesday night with the result that a large area is inundated.

Inhabitants in a wide district are being kept informed by special wireless broadcasts of the position so that if the danger becomes acute they can leave their homes in time.

In the South of England one of the main railway lines is threatened by flooding.

S.O.S. for More Workers

THROUGH STAFF'S AGENCEY London, March 18. The position in the flood-threatened Fen country is still causing anxiety. The water level has now risen so high that the situation was described as extremely critical. A number of small bridges have collapsed in the river banks but everything was done to prevent flooding. The main stretches of roads are now under water but what is feared is that a small bridge will give way and the flood will sweep over the whole of the Fen country.

The situation is a break hearting near Ely. About fifty men were working there but in response to the emergency many more came and another hundred were rushed to the spot.

FINANCIAL STABILITY IN UGANDA

GOVERNOR STRIKES WARNING NOTE

Large Reserve Funds

COTTON ESTIMATE OF 330,000 BALES LIKELY TO BE REALISED

General matters of considerable importance to Uganda were touched on by His Excellency the Governor, Sir Philip Mitchell, in his opening address to the Uganda Legislative Council at Entebbe last week. He also outlined the objects of the different measures to be dealt with by Council.

The Protectorate's actual revenue for 1936, subject to final adjustment, was £17,166, and the actual expenditure, including a sum still reserved to receive, £15,239.

The total surplus on the year's working, including the sum to be paid to the Reserve Fund, was £159,161. At the end of the year the Reserve Fund stood at £353,549, and the general surplus at £1,101,562.

COTTON POSITION

Reviewing the cotton position His Excellency declared that on the evidence before him there was no reason to depart from the estimate of 330,000 bales for the Protectorate.

On that basis there would be a shortfall on the estimated revenue from cotton tax; but as the previous year's cotton tax had increased considerably of late, it was possible that the improved import duty might compensate for that loss.

Proposed New Legislation

Kampala, March 14.—The Uganda Legislative Council met last Friday, and after attending the opening of session, His Excellency the Governor, Sir Philip Mitchell, began a short debate.

In his opening address His Excellency welcomed back from Scotland the Hon. Duncan MacKenzie, who as a temporary member, the Director of Public Works, who presented in Council an estimate of revenue from cotton tax, with which he had great a deal to do.

Capital invested. At its present rate of progress it could, if the management considered it were to do so, pay back all its capital within about 10 years. That there's a general policy of devoting some of the gross national product and equipment to waste, I have no doubt.

The substantial majority of the financial statements in the files of the Christian Action Committee which has been investigating the activities of the Kenyan Government show that they have been failing to meet even a minimum standard of economic development.

The Kenyan market is steadily improving. The value of the crops produced in Kenya is estimated to have increased from £12 million in 1947 to £20 million in 1952. Total production of maize, cotton, wheat, and other cereals in Kenya is estimated to have increased from £3 million to £6 million. The total value of exports is estimated to have increased from £1 million to £3 million.

The market is a little larger but East African remains well below its potential. In the last two years, despite a considerable increase in prices of 100 per cent. for tea, Kenya has not even approached the level of tea production in India or Ceylon. The average annual yield per acre is estimated at 100 kg. per acre per year. It is believed that with reasonable care and attention to production, yields could easily be doubled.

Kenya's chief cash crop is tea, which is grown mainly in the southern highlands. The tea plantations are situated in the Kericho, Naivasha, and other areas of the highland districts.

Kenya's tea production is aimed at a market which is entirely foreign and which is not interested in tea produced in Kenya. The market is largely comprised of tea produced in India, Ceylon, and elsewhere, and the tea produced in Kenya is not competitive in quality or price.

FRENCH DEFENCE DEBT LOAN

[THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCEY]

Paris, March 12. The Ministry of Finance has issued the first portion of the French defence debt loan, amounting to £100 million.

A number of subscriptions to the loan, totalling £100 million, have been received by the Ministry of Finance since the loan was announced early this afternoon owing to the large number of the loans.

The Minister of Finance will commence efforts to enable these sums to stand in sub-subsidiaries in the United Kingdom.

The advantage of the issue is that the new portion of the defence debt will probably be issued on Friday or Saturday and is likely to amount to £10 million.

The French Council of Ministers has warmly congratulated the British Government on the issue of the Defence Loan, which has caused much jubilation — France.

The loan, which has been subscribed, 200 million francs, is an encouragement to uniting to fight.

Paris, March 13. The whole of the new defence debt will be spent before December, during which time it will be used in the course of a war.

Twenty-six per cent. of the loan will be used on armaments and another 10 per cent. on the land forces.

Paris, March 17. The second portion of the French Defence Loan opened on Tuesday and the amount was again £100 million, the same offer and it is believed that most of this amount has been taken up.

It is now expected that the third instalment of £100 million will not be issued before June or July.
