ONLY BRIEF DELAY IN OPERATING SCHEME

Italian Press Outburst

FRENCH FEARS THAT ITALY WOULD WIDEN THE BREACH

According to a semi-official report from London recent difficulties in the Non-intervention Committee concerning the operation of the scheme have now been ironed out.

Meanwhile the statement by Count Grandi that Italian troops would not be withdrawn from Spain until the defeat of the Government forces caused considerable perturbation and France in particular was inclined to take a very serious view of it.

Commons Question

[LONDON MARCH 24] Count Grandi's statement at the Non-intervention Committee yesterday that Italy would not withdraw any of her troops until the defeat of the Spanish Republic was noted in the House of Commons to-day.

A Labour Member asked if it was true that Count Grandi had stated that Italian troops would be removed from Spain until the cessation of hostilities.

The Speaker intervened and called for the next question.

Concerns in France

Paris, March 25. There is grave concern in French official circles over the turn of events in Italy and Italy's refusal to consider the Non-intervention Committee as the subject of interviews between M. Delbos and the British and German Ambassadors last evening.

It is believed that it was Italy's intention actively to support the insurgent Government and that the Non-intervention Committee was carrying out her orders.

Kind Words for Germany

It indicated further that the French Government was disinclined to carry upon past lapses provided that the recall of volunteers from both sides was effected.

M. Delbos congratulated Herr Wismarck, the German Ambassador on the fair manner in which Germany was carrying out her orders.

Obdurate Discussion

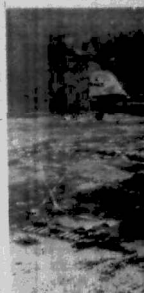

UNITON BUDGET SECRETS

Sequel to Alleged Leakage

[LONDON MARCH 24] A South African journalist was sentenced to-day to eight days' imprisonment for refusing to give evidence before a Committee of Enquiry which is investigating an alleged leakage of Budget secrets. The sentence has been suspended pending an appeal to the Supreme Court.

For the defence it was argued that the "allegation" served on the journalist referred to the Official Secrets Act which, being a British law did not apply to the defendant.

The Enquiry arose from the publication of a Budget forecast in the Johannesburg newspaper two days before the Budget was introduced. The report appeared clearly to the facts.

ITALY AND YUGOSLAVIA

Two New Agreements to be Signed

[LONDON MARCH 24] Two agreements between Italy and Yugoslavia will be concluded when Count Grandi arrives in Belgrade tomorrow.

The political agreement will consist of a mutually advantageous arrangement for the signing of a trade treaty and for the signing of the Adriatic, Italian agreement for the mutual language of the states quo in the Mediterranean.

The economic agreement will attempt to restore the close flourishing trade between Italy and Yugoslavia, almost brought to an end by the imposition of sanctions.

GATHERING FOR THE CORONATION

Troops From All Parts of the Globe

[LONDON MARCH 25] The first of a series of parades preceding the Coronation took place to-morrow, when the Australian contingents of twelve officers, 200 soldiers and 25 women, of whom over fifty per cent served in the front line, arrived in London by the sea route from Tilbury. Large crowds gathered to cheer as they marched through the streets headed by the band of the Brigade of Guards, in their "sacred" Wellington Parade. The soldiers wore khaki with bandoliers and puttees and felt hats with blue feathers. Several of them, the survivors of the Gallipoli campaign, were accompanied by their wives. The Colonial contingent for the Coronation procession is to be formed of men from almost every part of the Empire, including India, Malaya, Hongkong, Mauritius, Fiji, Palestine, Japan, and a number of West Indian Colonies. Colonial contingents to the Empire will include the Army of Occupation, a number of the Sherif's party, the recent "Salute" of the Sultan of Zanzibar, the Sultan of Johore, Yang di Permaisuri, the Sultan of Brunei, the Sultan of Pahang and the Sultan of Terengganu. It is estimated that at least 60 representatives of non-white governing colonies, Protectorates, Mandates, Territories, and other dependencies will attend.
