The Spanish vessels, however, steamed off.

It is learned that when the three British ships carrying food to Bilbao were outside territorial waters they were ordered to return to the "Atlantic Current" and an order to return. A shot was fired across the bows of one of the food ships and the "Hood" opened fire.

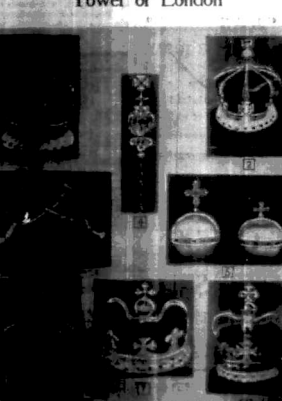
