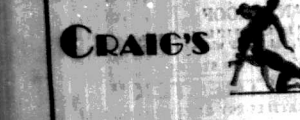

ITALY TO BOYCOTT THE CORONATION

ITALIAN CORRESPONDENTS WITHDRAWN FROM LONDON

Ban on British Newspapers

VITROLIC PRESS ATTACK BY MEMBER OF FASCIST GRAND COUNCIL

INDIANS IN KENYA
To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
Sir—Mr. S. G. Amin's letter in your issue of the 29th April has brought to the notice a grievance which the Indian community in this Colony has felt for a long time. It is a very easy matter to discuss the incident by that official tone saying that officially there is no cause for complaint; or by quoting a few lines from the learned Scottish lords which both the Indians and Europeans believe to be their advantage. The fact is that government do exist and Mr. Amin's experience is not a very isolated one. It is high time now that the matter is discussed frankly and in a sane, sober, honest manner.

Those and again at the present time when the performance of the Indian community is being treated in a self-respecting manner, and in the face of it, it may be the time of giving some consideration to the Indian community in the European States. This also happens in the Agricultural Show where a European Assistant was extremely rude to me when I asked him a pertinent question about the exhibits displayed in the stall. Further, very few people must be aware of a little incident that occurred at the last year's sports. The Indian operators were not allowed to sell in the sports as Europeans. The matter was, however, put right afterwards. Incidents of this kind are not rare in the months of the recent Indian and certainly do not restrict the relations of the communities.

In contrast to this, the arrangements made by the K.L.T.A. at the last games championship matches may be mentioned here. The seats were reserved strictly according to the principle of the race and color. I have heard many remarks about the general management, and I feel certain that there are not many Europeans who would have taken so much against the general behaviour of the Indians as those natives.

I suggest to you that your correspondence in the "Critic" should be fit to mention the Aga Khan's Garden Party on a non-racial basis. The guests were there by invitation and the distribution of seats was not based on racial discrimination. The fact is that better seats were given to more Europeans.

It is very difficult to say why this population exists. If the fact is that our white brethren think that we are not so well governed as they, they should be invited to say that all things are not in India. There is a large number of Indians in towns who both in India and Europe have been the highest society and the "social" class is nothing but a blind population. It may be true that there was cause for complaint in the past, but conditions have changed now.

Most people will agree that each race has its own share of defects and excellencies. It is good to have the best of both. It is only evident in India where it has been the absence of political freedom and the absence of a national movement. Moreover, the rights of social justice are not given to Indians in British Colonies only but to a just form.

I would appeal to both Europeans and Indians to be the best of friends. It is only by the friendly relations between the two communities that the best interests of the King under whose banner (as the Indian poet has said) the hand and the loins drink from the same fountain.
