Military Service

Recruitment of British conscripts must only proceed pending the decision of the War Office, and whether they ought to assist and, if necessary, assist, in the maintenance of law in the Middle East.

Numbers 1 was that defensive or offensive warfare is right and proper (see also Deut. 9-17). No aggressive warfare is allowed, and no sword, the latter being a temptation towards raiding. Moses and Aaron were told to smite every able-bodied man over twenty years of age and train them for the army.

In Deuteronomy 20 further instructions are recorded for the conduct of war. When an enemy comes to fight, the Priest addresses the soldiers, explains that the cause is righteous and proper one, and that Jehovah is with them.

The officers then address the troops and tell those soldiers who have some responsibilities to go home, and also all those who are unwilling to fight. The various reasons for exemption are detailed.

It is clear therefore that conscription is for training, not active service in the Westfront only. In these days we have reversed the process with unfortunate results. We have voluntary training in times of peace and conscription in emergency, so that unwilling half-trained conscripts were sent to the front and to the country.

One has only to think a moment to realize that, out of a trained army, few, if any, would fail to volunteer for service. And that those who failed would be better out of the line.

Seeing that the Bible gives such explicit instructions about military service, no Christian has any right to go to the front and die all that he can for the defence of his country, both by fitting himself by training and by study, and by volunteering for active service in times of national emergency. — Adv.

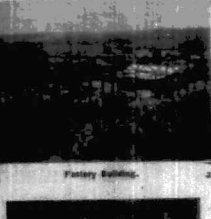

It is singularly appropriate that Mr. T. A. Wood, C.M.G., M.B.E., should be Mayor of Nairobi in the Coronation year. He has had a larger consecutive period of residence (17 years) in the Colony's capital than anyone, whether an official or non-official member of the European community here has, for the past 15 years, taken a prominent part in the affairs of the town, having served on the local authority and numerous other bodies, since 1901 (with the exception of a few postwar years when his duties as an Unofficial Member of Legislative and Executive Councils absorbed all his time); as Nairobi's oldest citizen in point of time it is therefore fitting that in the year he should be its first citizen, a post which carries responsibility as well as dignity.

Mr. Wood has been Mayor in 1927-28, 1929-30, 1931-32, 1933-34, this last being his fourth term in the Mayorial chair of the Colony's capital. The "East African Standard" asked Mr. Wood for his impressions of the two previous Coronation years that he had witnessed at Nairobi, that of Their late Majesty King Edward VII (on August 7, 1901) and King George V. (on June 22, 1911).

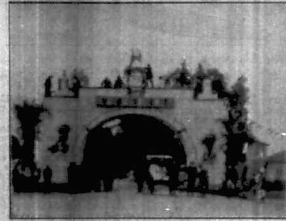

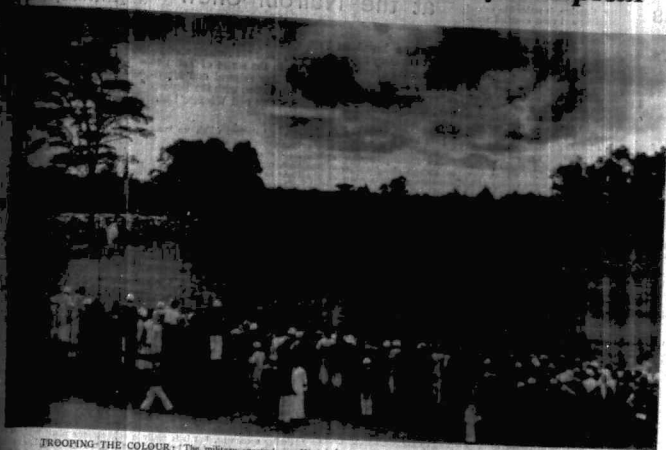

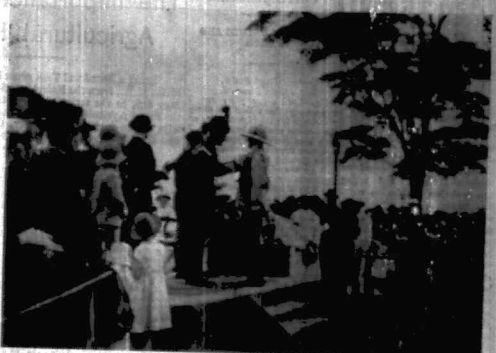

AIRSHIP COMMANDER'S AMAZING ESCAPES

Dropped Bombs in Blankets on Antwerp

Captain Lehmann (one of the commanders of the Hindenburg) who fell as a result of the disaster was after the Zeppelin burst, the most experienced airship commander in the world.

He had about 25 years of airship flying in a naval lieutenant he joined the Zeppelin company about 19 months before the outbreak of the War.

His look, "The Zeppelin," published about ten years ago, tells a complete and thrilling story of the wartime airship, in many of which Captain Lehmann himself took part.

He had been in countless airships and accidents, and had lost many narrow escapes.

Bombing Antwerp

Before the war he had been flying the Zeppelin in an experimental capacity, and this airship was promptly taken over for military purposes when war broke out.

Lehmann's first job in the war was at the siege of Antwerp, where the Zeppelin handled the fortifications, it was one of the first Zeppelins in history.

The bombs were very accurate in early experiments, the Zeppelin actually used artillery shells with a blanket tied to one end, to make them fall true.

The Zeppelin came up from beneath with the enormous load of 1,200 lbs. of rubber experimental bombs. She got over Antwerp shortly before dawn, and bombarded the forts and started two fires. This dropped incendiary bombs on the forts and started two fires. This was for hours and reached Calais after a flight of exactly 12 hours, a wonderful feat.

One of Captain Lehmann's most dangerous experiments was in the first trial observation over King's Island, Zeppelin. It was made on an old boiler tank, and was lowered 200 feet in a matter of seconds, wrote Captain Lehmann, "exactly as if I had been in a basket on a wire."

A little later, early in 1915, he had a narrow escape, in a new Zeppelin, the Z 12. It was no lighter, at 11,000 feet, during a raid on Nancy, that the engine failed. Lehmann and two of the three engines stopped.

The crew actually slipped open the door, yanked out the blanket of inflated air, and fell 10 miles down almost directly into the region through the net of mine traps.

On March 17, 1915, Captain Lehmann and his Zeppelin tried to bomb London, but for bad illness, and they nearly came to grief when they tried to land at Margate, for the batteries had fallen in reality that their alternative plan of landing, and they hit a railway line when they thought they were 500 feet above it.

Hit by Lightning

Captain Lehmann was flying LE for whom she was struck by lightning. The lightning bolt struck her near 50 feet from the tail, and had almost been knocked off her feet.

In the larger airships a careful inspection was made, but all Captain Lehmann could find was three small spots in the leather covering, the largest about the size of a small pea.

The metal gear under this spot had been visible, but if the body of the airship had not been so dark, they would never have known that they had been struck by lightning.

In March, 1919, Captain Lehmann reported to the LZI across the Atlantic to New York and back. But they were forbidden to make the attempt, and a few weeks later the British ZR4 made the first Transatlantic airship flight from England to Mineola, Long Island.

100 Ocean Trips

Captain Lehmann was second in command of Dr. Eckner when in October, 1921, the Los Angeles was down on her delivery flight from Philadelphia to Lakeland, a distance of 3,000 miles in 72 hours.

Since then he had flown the Atlantic more than 100 times, both in the Graf Zeppelin, and the Hindenburg. It was he who kept the Graf Zeppelin over the City Field at Wembley in 1930.

CAR PARK OWNERS NOT LIABLE FOR THEFT

Important Court of Appeal Decision

["Standard" unimportant.] London, May 7.

A case of vital importance to motorists was before the Court of Appeal this week. A ruling was given that when an unlicensed person took a motor car out of a car park, and the park ticket contained a disclaimer by the park owners of responsibility, the risk was one that fell on the owner of the car, and he could not recover damages for its loss.

The court allowed the appeal of Messrs. Tolhurst, owners of the County Car Park at South-acton-Sce, from a judgment of Judge Beasley in Southampton Court of Appeal for the loss of his car. Asby left his car in a park, and received a ticket which stated that the park proprietor took no responsibility for the safe custody of any car being kept therein at the owner's risk. When Mr. Asby returned he found that the car had been stolen.

No Obligation

Mr. Wilfred Gosses, the Master of the Bench, said that in his opinion all that the car owner got for his liability for the loss of the car was a certain place. The relationship between car-owner and car-park proprietor was that of licensee and licensee, which carried no obligation in relation to the car. He held that the language of the conditions on the ticket was wide enough to protect car-park owners, not only in respect of the goods of third parties but also in respect of the sets of their servants.

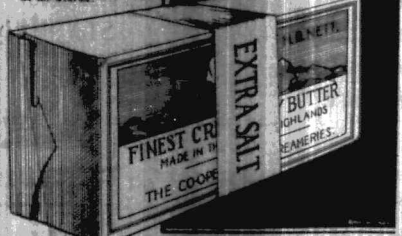

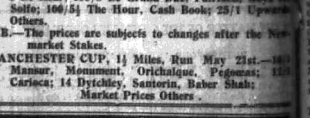
