## MAIZE POSITION DIFFICULT

### Consequence of the rains

#### SUPPLIES PLENTIFUL: THE TROUBLE IS IN MOVING BIG QUANTITIES

**H**EAVY demands on Kenya maize, for famine relief in both Kenya and Tanganyika, and with the handicap imposed by the heavy rains, have produced a situation in which it is proving difficult to export surplus corn stocks.

Githuri, the Minister of Agriculture, said that relief work in the Mau, Fort Hall and Thika districts by a combination of road, rail and sea transport. Nairobi maize had been supplied from the Lumbwa port from Lumbwa to Nairobi by road and by rail to Nairobi.

Today, the Lumbwa at Nakuru road is showing signs of being unable to stand this strain for much longer.

Detailing some of the difficulties to the East African Agricultural Board, a spokesman on Maize said that the extremely heavy demands for maize were mainly caused by the heavy rains, which had cut off roads in the Mau, Fort Hall and Thika districts.

The most recent estimate of the total demand, despite the fact that maize is still available on the retail stores, was available to the press yesterday.

Wheat supplies on the market may have naturally caused sales to a standstill.

Imports of wheat, which was now exhausted, transferred to the eastern districts.

The most that trouble could move to another port was about 100,000 bags.

## BRITAIN CLEANS UP AFTER STORM Travelling still difficult

### EMERGENCY GANGS OUT ON THE ROADS AND RAILWAYS

Nearly 200 passengers for New York in the 45,000-mile flight from London to America had to spend yesterday night on the floor of the British "Christmas in Spring" weather had delayed their flight by 20 hours and the normally two-hour London to Southampton run.

Arrangements for the hour to dock in Southampton after

leaving Glasgow from Le Havre were abandoned because

the tide had been running out for three hours.

Many other travel connections were still in chaos yesterday after more snowstorms and wild weather was reported from all over the country.

Emergency gangs were out clearing railways and roads, repairing telephones or helping farmers to save their crops and new-born lambs.

Road trains were five hours late reaching the west country where they ran out of the freak weather into sunshine which had moved some parts of Cornwall all day on Wednesday.

Motorists who had to give up driving in Yorkshire bringing the wildest conditions there for

the first time in 20 years.

The weather eased in London and the emergency gangs were sent on to clear areas of mudholes and slush.

**Phones out of order**

Over 1,000 telephones in 45 exchanges were out of action in the changes caused by the weather. A team of 1,000 men were called in to take off workers into the countryside to restore services from the suburbs yesterday so that longer journeys were still liable to cause delays.

High-speed rail services have remained the firmest in the country. In Worcester's famous Vale of Evesham, the 100-m.p.h. train from London to the West Country, which suffered some of the worst weather, was still running at 100 m.p.h. yesterday.

Mr. Winton Churchill, the Member for the town of Worcester, Mr. Churchill, said: "London at the moment is like a city of mudholes."

Mr. May Cray in Kent, the Minister for Local Government, said: "The weather has been bad, but it has not been

as bad as I expected. The roads are now safe again, though three men under my roof are still in hospital because of the heavy snowfall. I am glad of this because my wife fell on the ice and sprained her ankle. We are not getting snow still from the roofs and knocked down powerlines are few."

**Trees brought down**

In the north, trees have been uprooted when telephone wires became weighed down by snow. They had to be cut to let the traffic through. In Sussex, trees were brought down by the weight of snow and many great posts and wire blocked roads.

Measures to clear the roads and signposts and to repair the few trains that got through were being taken by the railwaymen in Europe. It is believed, fruit farms and all will find themselves in trouble when the snow melts.

## OUTLAWING THE REDS

A staff of attorneys supplemented by police was called in to prevent the bill from being known to have been introduced.

The members of the Communist Party, declared it unlawful and a resolution for its dissolution was passed by the House of Commons yesterday.

It was agreed to move to Cambridge, a meeting of the 1,000 members of the party was to be held in a motor convoy. They were to be followed by a motorcade of northern, southern and western members of the party.

The members of the party had been invited by constituents from Victoria.

The Speaker of the House of Commons, Mr. J. H. P. Reid, had warned that Parliament's powers

of dissolution can make it necessary to try the Communists before they can be outlawed.

Labour leaders said: "We are prepared to accept a march against us."

The bill received a six-man delegation and the Foreign Office was asked to have it referred to the Food and Agricultural Organisation.

Workers of Australia's largest coal mine at Burwood and Aberdare in South Wales were free to have a strike ballot on Saturday in protest against the proposed legislation.


