## SOVIET PLEBS OFFER ON RIVAL PLANS

### Mr. Molotov: 'Let Germans choose'

#### U.S. REASSURANCE MOVE

A PLEBISCITE to determine whether German people in the British, American, Russian and French sectors preferred the Eastern or Western proposals for the reunification of their country was suggested by Mr. Molotov at the resumed conference of the "Big Four" Foreign Ministers in Berlin. The French delegate rejected the proposal.

Mr. Molotov passed no comment, but pressed the Soviet Foreign Minister to say definitely whether he agreed to the British five-point plan for free elections and German unification. Mr. Molotov promised to give his views later.

The American Secretary of State, Mr. Dulles, made another attempt to reassure Russia, saying that the Western plan to take Germany, East and West, as a European Defence Community, where she would neither seem nor be able to use her regained strength for aggressive purposes, was as beneficial to the East as to the West.

When Mr. Molotov claimed that under the Bonn Constitution and Para. Treaties, setting up the E.P.C., Western Powers would give his views later, Mr. Dulles offered to clear up Mr. Molotov's "misunderstanding" by amending the clause.

Mr. Molotov refused to allow a United Nations Commission to investigate the Bonn Government's freedom to discuss, whether or not to accept, the Bonn Constitution and E.P.C. treaty. The agreement provided for the extension of these treaties to the German Democratic Republic.

DURING a study, made at the conference of East African Directors of Public Works in Dar es Salaam, comparative building costs in the four Territories, it was noted that the Tanganyika Government domestic buildings were much cheaper than those of Uganda and Kenya. Uganda's were the dearest.

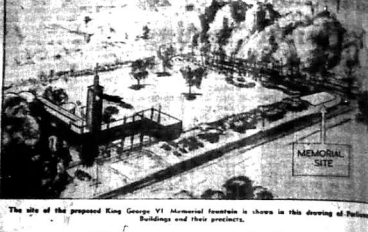

# 150-MILE PIPELINE TO SOLVE MOMBASA'S WATER PROBLEMS

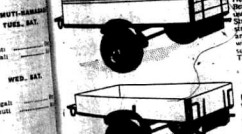
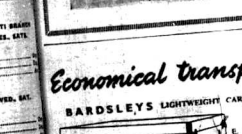
WHEN the surveyors were looking for a coastal terminus for the Uganda Railway last century they chose Mombasa because of its ideal harbor and its abundant water supplies. Just over half a century later Mombasa has expanded to such an extent that the water supplies are nowhere near adequate and, without more water, East Africa's chief port cannot grow further. Behind the fairly fertile coastal strip the Kenya hinterland becomes semi-desert and nowhere is there a good steady water supply to provide water at the rate of millions of gallons every day. Nowhere except for Mombasa Springs—a freak of nature in the heart of the arid bush country. This is volcanic country, home of the elephant and rhino, and the last lava flow occurred less than 100 years ago. Had the molten rock not stopped four miles short of the springs, there would have been no such solution to Mombasa's water problem. The £5,000,000 project now begun, to carry 10,000,000 gallons of water a day to Mombasa through a pipeline 150 miles long, is no easy one.

Even so, the solution is certainly the biggest job ever taken on by Kenya's Public Works Department, which prepared, supervised and planned the whole scheme. The pipes themselves were a major problem.
