Mr. Murgor expressed disappointment in the fact that, despite efforts by the Ministry of Agriculture and the companies carried out by the civil servants, cotton productivity has fallen.

The Kisumu County Commission, he said, showed some improvement and ended with a surplus of £1,465,000, which was mostly due to the deficits sustained by the former council of £5,000,000, he concluded.

Doubts still hanging over Addis peace talks

possibility of Nigerian peace talks starting in Addis remained doubtful. Federal Government officials said that the role of the late Gen. Gowon at such talks and the same time continued to be the most qualified person from Lagos yesterday might make a final decision but no date has been taken by late morning. The Head of State, Maj. Gen. Gowon, left Lagos for a two-day trip to Nigeria.

the Biafran leader, Gen. Odumegwu, has always insisted that the talks be held under O.A.U. auspices, while Biafra insists that O.A.U. officials have nothing to do with the talks. Nigerian External Affairs Commissioner, Dr. Vikki Arko-Okor, said after Wednesday's Executive Council meeting that he was taking the line that the External Affairs Commissioner was hardly the right man to negotiate a solution to what Lagos considered to be an internal affair. Other possible negotiators include Mr. Alison Ayida, Permanent Secretary for Economic Development, who has taken part in previous Nigerian Ambassador in Washington, who is currently in Lagos for consultations. Mr. Ayida, one of Nigeria's most experienced and senior diplomats, is believed to be waiting for a possible order to go to Addis before returning to Washington. A Super Constellation aircraft

from the Canadian mercy organization Capirelief was destroyed on Wednesday night during a Federal attack. A Capirelief spokesman announced in Toronto. He said that the three-man crew escaped unhurt, but the 16 tons of American foodstuffs on board the aircraft were a total write-off, as was the plane. Speaking to reporters at Heathrow Airport, Lord Carrington said he was not optimistic about an end to the year and added he thought there was no great possibility of a negotiated settlement. He said: "I cannot honestly say I am optimistic after meeting both sides of the conflict. He thought the Biafran and Nigerian sides would meet in Addis Ababa, but there was little prospect of their getting together, after repeated clashes with Afro-Asian delegations.

Resolution on Viet ceasefire approved

US State Department has approved a resolution to end the Vietnam conflict. Mr. Mike Mansfield, Chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, said that a cease-fire agreement had been reached between the North Vietnamese and the South Vietnamese. The resolution was passed by a vote of 85 to 12. The resolution calls for a cease-fire and the withdrawal of all foreign troops from Vietnam. It also calls for the reunification of Vietnam.

Scared to go says Beate

Beate John Lennon has said in Toronto that she and her wife, Yoko Ono, have turned down an offer to visit Biafra because they had a wish to be "dead by now". Lennon told a Press conference that he and Yoko had decided not to go to Biafra a few months ago because "we're scared to go where we want to be dead soon". The bearded Beate, in Canada for the latest phase of his pacifist campaign, told of his plans to organise a professional travelling peace festival. — Reuters

Portugal may quit U.N. debates

The Portuguese Prime Minister, Dr. Marcello Caetano, has raised the possibility that Portugal might not attend United Nations debates after repeated clashes with Afro-Asian delegations. In a national broadcast on Wednesday night, he defended the Lisbon Government's administration of its African territories and accused Afro-Asian countries of waging a war of nerves against Portugal. On December 9 the Security Council approved a resolution condemning Portugal after Senegal complained that several people were killed by shells fired by Portuguese troops from the West African territory of Guinea (Bissau). Dr. Caetano said: "The condemning resolutions come in succession in an attempt to stir our nerves and break our moral resistance. I ask myself, I ask the country whether it is worthwhile to continue to be present at these sessions where the decision is prepared before the discussion". The U.N. Security Council on Wednesday adjourned its debate on a Guinea complaint against Portugal after hearing representatives from Algeria, Senegal and Madagascar give support to the Guinea charge of Portuguese aggression. The Algerian representative told the Council that the responsibility for Portuguese action in Portuguese Guinea was shared equally by Portugal's allies and claimed that only the total liquidation of Portuguese colonialism and national independence in Africa would guarantee peace in Africa and in the world. Mr. Ibrahim Bove, for Senegal, stated that Portugal should realise that Pretoria and Salisbury were bad advisers and suggested that Lisbon would do better to follow the example of other European countries which had led their former colonies to independence without bloodshed, while maintaining their friendship. — Agencies

'WE WILL USE FORCE' WARNING

Saudi Arabia is maintaining its policy of non-interference in the internal affairs of other countries, the Defence and Interior Minister, Emir Sultan Ben Abdel Aziz, repeated in a Radio Jeddah speech. In a resumé of incidents on November 26 on the Saudi Arabia-Yemen border, the Emir said: "We will not allow an act of aggression to be committed against us and we will react with force and violence against any threat against our tribes." Saudi Arabian policy as formulated by King Faisal was "one of indulgence and non-interference in the affairs of other countries, but we will never allow aggression against us and will reply with force against any new threat", he added. The Emir said that on November 26 the Saudi Interior Ministry published a communique stating that South Yemen forces, with armoured support, had occupied the frontier post of Wadhwa after "violent fighting" against 26 Saudi frontier guards. "The communique also stated that criminal elements and certain states were supporting the movement aiming to cause trouble among Arab nations at a time when on all sides we are preparing for the decisive battle against the common enemy," he said. — A.F.P.

PILOTS SEEK DEATH OR HIJACKERS

International Airlines pilots' union, meeting in London, has urged the death penalty for hijackers. Representatives of pilots from more than 50 countries who met Wednesday's meeting also agreed to stage a series of 24-hour strikes to force governments to take a firmer stand on the question of "skyjacking". The pilots also proposed a boycott of airlines which refused the demands of hijackers. Representatives of 13 countries met in Washington on the same day to discuss the problem of hijacking. The U.S. State Department denied the four-day conference, which opened on Tuesday, as an annual exchange of views and it is hoped to have a statement

towards the end of the week. Attending the conference are officials from Australia, Brazil, Britain, Canada, Denmark, France, West Germany, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands, Norway, Sweden and the United States. American officials said the United States would like an international agreement to prevent men who hijack planes from claiming political asylum. The French Cabinet, at its weekly meeting, approved a draft law ratifying the international Tokyo convention on air piracy. Informed sources in Paris said the treaty represented only the first step in the fight against hijackers. The International Civil Aviation Organisation is already drawing up a document, which will be finalised by the organisation's Judicial Committee in February. Agencies

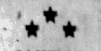

The lorry, proceeding towards Murrumbidgee in broad daylight, was turning right into a farm track, while the last, trying to overtake at high speed, struck the lorry just behind the right front wheel with a powerful momentum.

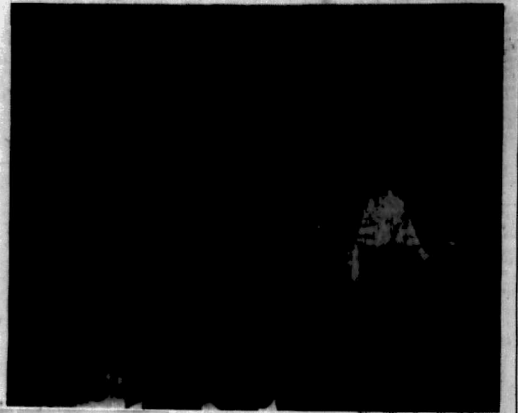
It is not for the reader to appreciate any blame but rather to understand a number of pertinent conditions which inevitably arise, as a result of the crash.

The lorry was the last of a long line of vehicles coming up the road and into the centre of the farm track, determined to overtake, even if it means missing the lorry.

**Memories of the first
Lamu Show**

The A.S.E. Show at Lamu was held yesterday. Miss C. G. OATES leads back 39 years in the first reprint of the show held on the island.

The holding of a Show at Lamu by the Agricultural Society of Kenya belongs to what the first show held there, in September, 1930, more than 39 years ago.

The Show had been organized and preliminary arrangements made by V. C. Oates, District Commissioner, who had been moved up-country to Nairobi, Kenya, by J. E. C. Oates, District Commissioner, who was then in being a District Commissioner in Lamu. There was, in fact, no official record of the show.

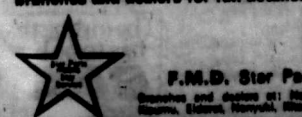
