Rescue operations get under way

ABOUT 600 people—including 200 women and children—are marooned on an island in the flooded Pangani River area of Northern Tanganyika. Last night they were reported to be without shelter and facing a serious shortage of food.

There was no immediate danger of food shortages, but it was not possible to take the necessary steps to ensure that the people if there were more than 200.

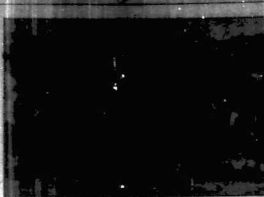
