Mr. SHASTRI CHOSEN AS PREMIER

'I will carry on Panditji's task'

To thunderous cheers, Mr. Lal Bahadur Shastri, the right-hand man of Mr. Nehru during his last illness, was yesterday unanimously elected leader of the Congress Parliamentary Party and automatically, became Prime Minister of India.

He will be sworn in soon — probably next Tuesday — in place of the caretaker Prime Minister, Mr. Gulzarilal Nanda, who yesterday proposed that the party resign. After receiving an ovation from the Congress members, Mr. Shastri, 60, a former general secretary of the Congress Party, addressed his colleagues, saying: "Socialism is our objective."

There were prolonged cheers when he declared that the Congress Parliamentary Party would for the longest time to come be the sole spokesman of socialism in the country. He said: "Our policy has already been defined and enunciated and now it is the responsibility of the party to implement it."

He had every faith that Parliament and the people would give their full support to him in carrying out his task.

Expressing his gratitude to the Congress Party for their confidence in him, Mr. Shastri said: "We have been entrusted with a very important and difficult charge."

"We have to face with courage the situation in the country and carry out the task which Panditji has left behind."

He continued: "Mr. Nehru has also overruled that we should postpone the election for several months. That's trite now."

He was given a glass of water with a cigarette in which he continued reading his speech.

Mr. Shastri said: "The country was faced with a critical situation in which the party was unable to act."

The party was unable to act because of the lack of a majority in Parliament after the recent general election.

The Government White Paper on wage structures will be handed over to a joint committee of the two sides.

Radio Nigeria announced yesterday that a manhunt ended by arrest.

Under Correspondence, Mr. James Ondondo, who had been the author of a joint statement by the two parties, was arrested.

OMO, the man wanted in connection with the killing of former magistrate, Mr. J. G. M. Kibria, was arrested yesterday evening. He was at the scene of the killing when the man was found on the floor of a room in a house in the 2nd stage of Kitale near the railway station, from which a bullet was fired at him.

He was arrested on May 15; he had been in custody since then.

Judy Garland on of hospital

Judy Garland, the American singer, has been admitted to a Nairobi hospital, suffering from appendicitis. It is her first visit to Kenya.

The 44-year-old diva, who left Nairobi yesterday, had to leave her from a coma. She had been ill for three days.

External telecommunications director of Uganda joined the strike, and a company spokesman said: "The strike would be halted to allow delivery of essential services."

Civil servants and municipal workers reported for work as usual yesterday despite mass strikes in the largest department stores in Nairobi.

Mr. S. Nanda, who is the permanent secretary of the civil service, said: "The strike has been called to demand that the public sector be headed by a single leader."

Later Mr. Shastri called on Mr. Nanda to meet him to become Prime Minister, and he accepted.

He held a press conference here yesterday to announce his appointment as Prime Minister, and said: "I am leaving from the scene of my birth in the Ganges of Allahabad."

After a brief stay in Pakistan, Mr. Shastri will return to India.

He told a press conference here yesterday that he would be leaving for India on June 10.

"The Services of India," Soviet Russia, was founded in 1920 and managed by Mr. Shastri.

Meanwhile, it was learned in Nairobi yesterday that Mr. Shastri's daughter gave her own blood to a child who had been bitten by a snake a few hours before he died last night.

A religious order, which had suffered a religious outbreak, had appealed to Mr. Shastri for help.

Mr. Shastri invited that her blood should be given and what was done.



Destiny on side of African liberation, Mr. Kambona says

For the right for liberation, destiny was on the side of the African countries and destiny was responsible, the Foreign Minister of African Affairs, Mr. Kambona, said when he opened the meeting of the African Liberation Committee of Nine in Dar es Salaam yesterday.

Mr. Kambona, who is also chairman of the committee, said that "the right for our countries must be outcomes of our struggle." He said that the African countries had joined the ranks of the free in Zambia; it was a matter of days, when in Bulawayo the bells were rung in honor of the independence of Rhodesia. All of them argued one point, namely that Africa must be free.

LIMA RIOT SPARKED BY 'ERROR'

In Angola, the war was seen as a critical stage where the "liberated" army had to prove its worth to the people. A Trotskyist group, the "Workers' brothers," were putting up a front.

In Southern Rhodesia, the "irresponsibility, racism, political greed" of the white minority was exposed out of the forces of nationalism.

The president said: "In South Africa, the Government of Dr. Verwoerd has failed to live up to its record of 'representativeness, moderation and dignity.'

Policy unchanged

"It is with particular dismay that we have seen the recent change in the attitude of the metropolitan countries toward us," said the president.

They still believe in the relevance of the colonial countries.

An article of remonstrance was published in the Chinese daily of the Chinese People's Daily, directed to the Chinese Comintern, with a warning to the Chinese Communists to stop propagandizing.

A gang of 20 French "Rockers" set fire to the audience during a performance at the Olympia. Paris rioters, including about ten thousand, were reported as having taken part in the rioting, the cash desk of the Olympia was looted and several chairs were broken.

At the Olympia, a 10-year-old girl was killed when she fell from a balcony. More than 100 persons were injured.

Hundreds of British spectators were held up in a near riot after the show.

On these Normandy beaches, the United States, Britain and Canada have built monuments to the fallen soldiers who made the world safe for democracy.

THE Algerian Front yesterday announced that it had captured 100 rebels by Government forces against rebels led by Abd el-Kader in the Kabylie Mountains.

After Republicans said that Abd el-Kader, leader of the Kabylie National Army, had been killed in battle, the government denied the report and said Abd el-Kader was still alive.

At present the British, French, American, Canadian and Australian Legions and the American Veterans of Foreign Wars are the main organizations that have come to the Normandy beaches.

The veterans said that one of the main reasons for their visit was to "memorialize" the fallen.

The veterans said that 12,000 Americans had surrendered to Abd el-Kader in the village of Chercell, about 10 miles west of Algiers.




