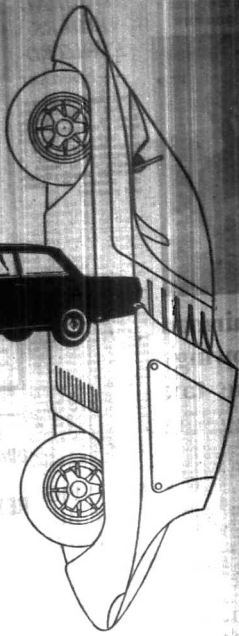

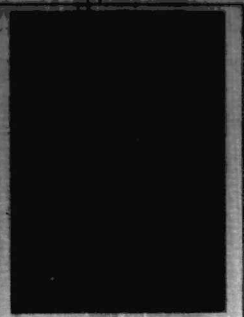

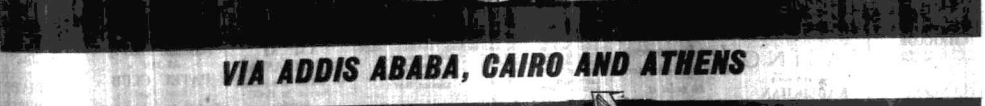

# Amnesty plea to S. Africa approved

THE United Nations Security Council has approved an appeal to South Africa to grant an amnesty to all people restricted and under the apartheid laws.

The voting on the proposal by Morocco and Benin took place in N.Y. with four abstentions through amendments, the United States, France and Brazil all abstained through amendments, and the United Kingdom abstained through amendments.

An unanimous appeal to the Government of South Africa to grant an amnesty to all people restricted and under the apartheid laws was approved by the Security Council. The vote was 12-0 with four abstentions.

The South African Government must implement the United Nations Security Council resolutions which have been passed here to support the appeal.

The Moroccan delegate, Mr. Dey Ould El Mouk, spoke in favour of the proposal. He said that the United Nations Security Council has a duty to ensure that the apartheid laws are not used to oppress the people of South Africa. He called for an immediate end to the apartheid system and for the granting of an amnesty to all people who have been restricted and under the apartheid laws.

## Expert to advise on training of nurses in Kenya

A nurse consultant advised the Government of Kenya that the training of nurses in Kenya should be based on the standards of the International Council of Nurses. He said that the Government should consider the possibility of sending students to other countries for training.

## Policy of genocide caused million to flee Angola

NEARLY a million refugees have fled the Congo for Angola in recent years to escape a Portuguese policy of "genocide" in the territory, the United Nations Special Committee on Colonialism said.

The committee said that the Portuguese policy of "genocide" was based on the desire to maintain the territory as a colony. It said that the Portuguese had used force to suppress the independence movement and had caused the death of many people.

POLICE at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, made 96 arrests of demonstrators who took part in a peaceful demonstration against the segregation laws.

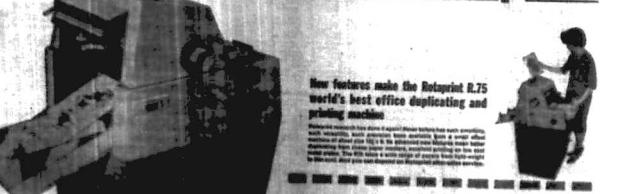

# S. African 'sabotage' verdicts condemned

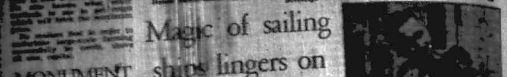

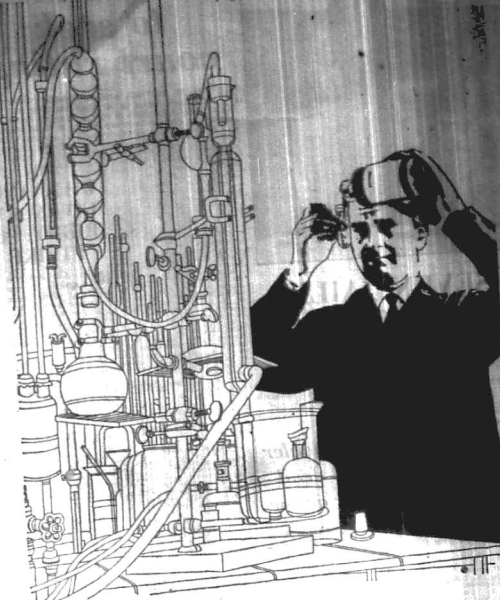

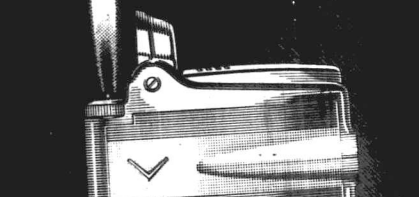

# Regional Constitution 'To Be Ended'

## Premier prepares federation path

The regional constitution was unsuitable for federation so it should be scrapped, the Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta, said in the House of Representatives yesterday. Kenya would be a republic and would join a federation, he said.

He refused to set a date for federation, however, and so sparked off strong criticism from Kikuyu backbenchers who demanded that August 15 be made the deadline and said they would oppose any Government move to escape from fixing a date.

The House was debating a private member's motion brought by Mr. J. M. Shikuku (Mau Mau) calling on the Government to accelerate the machinery for establishing the federation which had been promised to the people of East Africa.

Accepted wholeheartedly.

Although the Government is not normally a private member's day, yesterday the Government moved two resolutions to allow the Opposition to take precedence over other business and to remove from it the time-limits normally imposed on such speeches.

The Minister for Justice, Mr. Mboya, said that in view of the urgency of the issue he was unable to discuss it fully.

Mr. Kenyatta, who made his first speech for the Government since his resignation, now to which he declared himself opposed, said that the Opposition had introduced the subject, and he proposed that what the Government accepted the motion wholeheartedly.
