AT TACKS ASIANS Se CONDEMNED Member warns of disaster

MALEVOUS propaganda aimed at the Asian community in Kenya was denounced by Mr. A. J. Pandya (Kadhi, Mombasa Island Kevu) in the House of Representatives.

Mr. Pandya, speaking in the Budget debate, reminded members that it was impossible to condemn racialism in America and South Africa if that sort of thing was practised in Kenya.

Mr. Pandya said he anticipated a good deal of controversy, interruption from members who began to speak on the relationship between tribes and communities in Kenya.

Really must not be ignored

The House must not ignore the reality that in Kenya a variety of peoples lived together. Mr. Pandya wanted to make it clear that he was speaking on an Indian, or an Asian, but as a Kenyan and an African.

He agreed that there must be increasing local participation in the business and economic structure of the country, but systematic derogatory propaganda against the Asian community would not achieve these objects.

Mr. Pandya referred to a speech made before the House on the subject of East African development in the week of the Independence of Kenya, when Mr. Mboya, who said that such propaganda should be like the plague or leprosy.

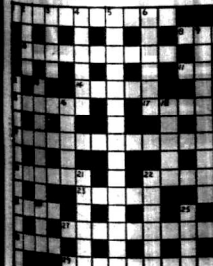

Commonwealth plans change on outcome

London (AP)—Prime Ministers held meetings in London last night to hasten the achievement of an African majority government in Southern Rhodesia on the basis of a one-man-one-vote franchise.

They are expected to agree for an early constitutional conference to which African leaders from Southern Rhodesia would be invited.

Kenya's Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta, had a long talk with President Nurnahm of Ghana on tactics for dealing with the Southern Rhodesian issue. He also conferred with Dr. Eric Williams of Trinidad and Tobago.

Political proposals first

The Foreign Minister of the United Kingdom of Tanganyika and Zanzibar, Mr. Kambona, said last night: "There is a desire on the part of the African Commonwealth to resolve the problem of Southern Rhodesia as a whole as quickly as possible."

Mr. Kambona said African countries regarded Southern Rhodesia and the apartheid policy of South Africa as presenting a common danger to the African continent.

Kenya points to opportunities

ED IN UGANDA PLANS

Nyerere urges

The call for military action — with troops from Commonwealth countries under British command — was made in a memorandum circulated by President Nyerere to the British Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home, and the other Commonwealth Heads of Government at their conference in London.

In his President Nyerere notified his Commonwealth colleagues that if they failed to take any positive action to prevent the Southern Rhodesia Government from declaring independence, he would be compelled to resign and give military support to a Southern Rhodesian Government in exile.

Real and imminent danger

The memorandum, prepared for the opening discussions in the Southern Rhodesian and other colonial issues, said a similar declaration of independence by the present Southern Rhodesian Government was a "real and imminent danger".

If it happened the Commonwealth individually and collectively must take action which involved three things. The first was to ask all Commonwealth countries to grant recognition and British use of the veto in the Security Council to prevent admission to the United Nations.

Another was full economic and financial pressure to operate, including withdrawal of Commonwealth aid and any other trading preferences on all Southern Rhodesian products and a denial of all loans and credits.

The third measure was joint intervention with troops from Commonwealth countries under British command.

President Nyerere said that there was a grave danger that the Southern Rhodesian Government would put up on the Southern Rhodesian issue, but that the Commonwealth could put up a united front.

He said that the Southern Rhodesian Government was not only a threat to the stability of Southern Rhodesia but also a threat to the stability of the Commonwealth.

Whether or not there was any attempt to raise independence, the memorandum said, the Commonwealth must be prepared to act.
