

CALL FOR MORE TRADE

to development Commonwealth

STANDARD STAFF REPORTER LONDON. Commonwealth Prime Ministers' conference turned from trade and other colonial problems yesterday to economic and trading scene, the Kenya Prime Minister, made an appeal for greater Commonwealth independence.

He said that the best means of achieving a higher degree of Commonwealth self-help would be to boost the volume of trade between members. His Government's aim was to build a nation where all citizens enjoyed a reasonable standard of living. Economic development had to be given high priority. If the Government failed in this there would be growing frustration and disillusionment despite success in the political field.

Best from all economies

He said ideological labels were of no account to Kenya; the only criteria were the effectiveness of the institutions, and whether they furnished the welfare of the people. Kenya was choosing its models from the "successful economies" of the world's leading nations. Economic development required Commonwealth co-operation for development projects and for technical advice on management. Mr. Kenyatta said the Prime Ministers that it would help if other Commonwealth countries would declare their intention to join a concerted approach to East Africa's manpower needs.

Mr. KAUNDA FEARS Violence

Cautious approach to S. Rhodesia problem

The opinion of Northern Rhodesians' attitude to a declaration of unilateral independence by Southern Rhodesia was dealt with cautiously by the Northern Rhodesian Prime Minister, Mr. Kenneth Kaunda, at a press conference at Nairobi Airport last night.

All he would say was that if the Southern Rhodesian Prime Minister, Mr. Ian Smith, decided to declare independence unilaterally, "with or without outside support, there will be violence in the country."

Staying overnight in Nairobi en route from the O.A.U. Conference in Cairo — Mr. Kaunda said only a short time had elapsed since the Prime Minister of Malawi, Dr. Banda, had decided to make any commitment.

'Big mistake of past'

Mr. Kaunda said that unlike what had happened in the past, when Northern Rhodesia had declared what it would do, he felt it would be unwise for him to say what action Northern Rhodesia would take if by some way it was to declare unilateral independence. "With its Southern Rhodesia 'definitely would raise serious questions," he continued. "I cannot say whether we would support or not support violence within the country; but I think declaring independence unilaterally with or without outside support, there will be violence in the country."

Such a retrograde was what he said, "I do not know what it is, but it does not happen," he said.

But he added that a unilateral declaration by Southern Rhodesia would raise serious questions, he continued. 


