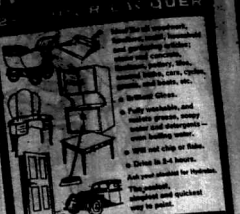

GENE COHEN, chairman of the Second Business Efficiency Exhibition Organising Committee, writes on the vital part which office machines are playing and continues to play in the East African economy.

Cash registers are to be found in most shops, hotels and bars and restaurants.

Duplicators are used in schools as well as in government offices. Adding machines are employed by farmers and estate agents.

Quantity measuring and testing cannot work without some mechanical aid to calculation. Dating machines are saving thousands of pounds annually in salaries.

SHOE PARABLE

Throughout the country there are operating up-tying schools and technical colleges. If East Africa is to progress, and progress it will, it must rely on scientific methods to help it on its way. It is no longer a question of *if* we are offered it, but *how* we are offered it.

The question now is "Can we do it without it?" In the coming year, and keeping in mind the development of this country, we shall have to start increasing the number of our operating machines. It is not only a matter of training them, but of training them with the machine.

IVORY SOUVENIRS AID WILD GAME IN EAST AFRICA

"PLEASE give us a drink of water," said a charming collection of sovereigns, passim, as they made their way to the National Parks at Mito Andei and Voi, and so on in the offices of the Parks' director in Manton House, Nairobi.

They are the work of Mrs. B. B. Clay, of the little game line left over from her duties as housewife of two small children. Her unimpeded task came about through a discussion she had with Mr. C. W. Marshall, Warden of Thores Island National Park. They were talking about ways and means of raising money for a fund to pay for water for game in the dry season, when many animals die of thirst.

Mrs. Clay offered to paint some ivory souvenirs, and Mr. Marshall undertook to supply the plaques from ivory confiscated from poachers. She had done very little at school. She has since been aided by the Kenya Olympic Association, who saw her work for the purpose of drawing another law for their emblem.



Mr. Marshall has now recruited a few Africans to cut the ivory which is performed with a common saw — an operation which is not as profitable as it is often supposed to be. About 50 plaques a day can be turned out, and already a little over three £100 worth have been sold. All who sell the plaques do so for the purpose of commission. Mr. Marshall, for instance, had sold over £200 worth.

Paper-weights are another novelty carved for the same fund and later on today will probably be added to the plaques, such as the painting of an elephant's head. Mrs. Clay is herself a very handy carver, which helps her with her painting as she does the designs and studies them by the hour.

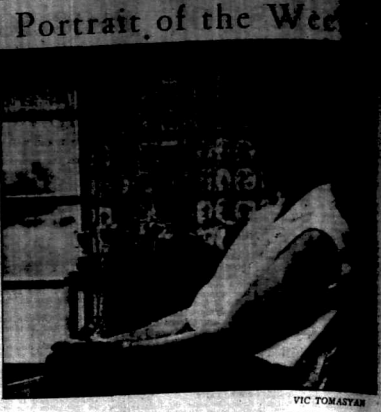

Here are some of the prices of meat on the market here: Beef (standards) 2/9; pork (Grade A) 3/6; mutton (Grade A) 2/6; Grade B 3/-; poultry 3/-; chicken gizzard, ham 3/- a pound.

Their own cooked pressed beef is 2/6 and their own corned beef 1/6.
