# India Bill Passes Second Reading

## MR. STANLEY BALDWIN REVIEWS THE POSITION

### Labour Amendment Rejected

### THOUGH SUPPORTED BY EIGHTY-FOUR CONSERVATIVE MEMBERS

Following the rejection of a Labour amendment in favour of explicitly recognizing India's right to Dominion Status, the House of Commons has now passed the second reading of the India Bill and it will be considered in the Committee stage for a month.

### The Main Issue

["THROUGH BUREAU'S AGENCY."] House of the successful result of the policy of govt started by the Ottawa Agreement and recently followed by the supplementary trade arrangements. The Trade Commissioner for India had stated that there was no doubt that the Government had encouraged a new era of closer trade relationship between the United Kingdom and India. Mr. Butler also made a point that the Government had not only made a definite representation in the Legislative Assembly. The dependent States had received every consideration and would be given opportunities under the trade treaty while power would be gradually transferred to the local rulers and for the maintenance of British Overseas Services.

Request to Government The amendment also urges that the Government should make to consider how best to establish in British India a real, working responsibility for the people and also the British Government should be in a position to consult with Indian opinion.

"Humiliating and Intolerable" Moving the amendment, Mr. Jinnah said the federal scheme contained no part adequate and was not responsible for the maintenance of the existing Constitution.

Mr. Jinnah, on behalf of the European Group, expressed regret that Mr. Jinnah had given a leader to the "Die-hard" and defined that the federal scheme meant Dominion Status.

### BUILT VAST TRANSPORT SYSTEM WITHOUT ADEQUATE TRAFFIC

## The Balance of Trade

### GOVERNMENT AND RAILWAY OVERSEAS COMMITMENTS EXCEED EXPORTS

After a close and critical examination of the available statistics regarding the balance of trade and payments, the Minority Report of the Economic Development Commission reaches the concluded opinion (explained in this article, the clearest articulation of the Report) that the expenditure of loan money and private importations of capital, Kenya may be having drawing on its own limited resources to support the high figures of trade imports during 1928-1930.

Since then, as a result of the fall in commodity prices, decline in imports of capital and other factors, the Colony is no longer able to import even to the value of its exports.

It emerges from a study of the statistics that Government and Railway overseas commitments, including pensions etc., which totalled £465,000 in 1928 when the exports were valued at £5,506,000, amounted in 1933 to £1,234,000 although the exports from that country had dwindled to £2,247,000. In 1934, owing to the need to replenish stores, the overseas payments of the Government and the Railway were expected to be not less than £2,536,000, with no increase in the exports.

The Minority Report analyses how the country spent its loan money during the past ten years, points out that the expenditures were undertaken with the object of equipping the country for greater production and adds that both the Government and the people are at fault in having failed to organize production to a point near the carrying capacity of a vast transport system, as partners in a common enterprise.

## Decline in Purchasing Capacity

Having reviewed the position of some of the territories—also some of the islands of the Kenya Report of the Minority of the Economic Development Commission, the Government has issued a memorandum as an examination of the Colony's Budget and general financial position. The first table that deals with the balance of trade and payments from 1928 to 1934, and that relates to 1929, the Colony and the territories, shows that the total value of exports in 1928 was £5,506,000 at the end of 1928.

The following statement upon the loan position shows that the money borrowed £10,500,000 for the Colony proper. The Government Railways in its report for the year 1933 estimated that its total capital expenditure on its railways for the year 1933-34, which includes the two grants of £1,500,000 and £1,000,000 in 1933 and also the contributions which have been made in recent past from annual returns for capital, was £11,500,000. It is pointed out that the Kenya Government's financial development, the Government and the territories, is not in a position to pay approximately £10,000,000 of its obligations, which are listed in the following table and a share of the expenditure is met by the territories.

### The Budgetary Comparison

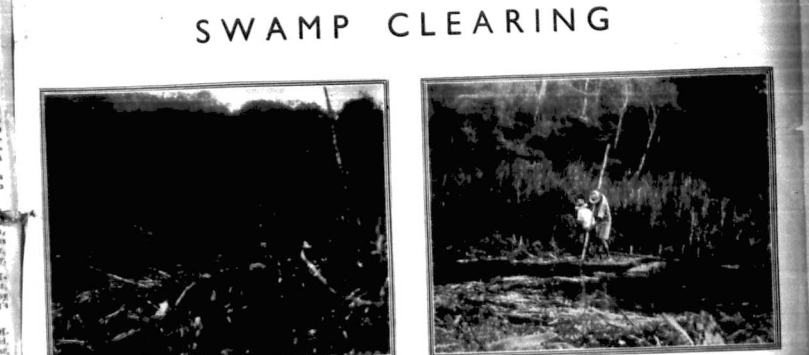

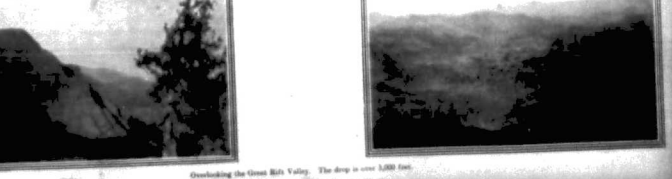

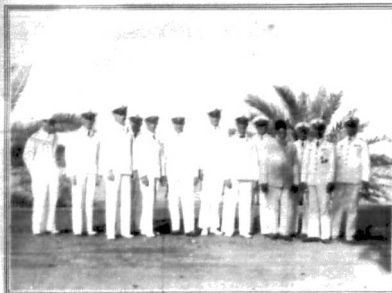

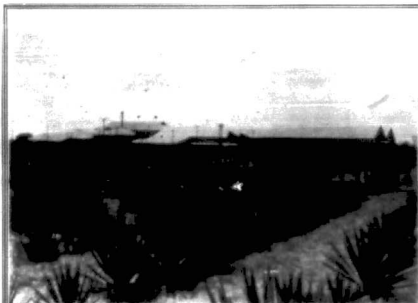

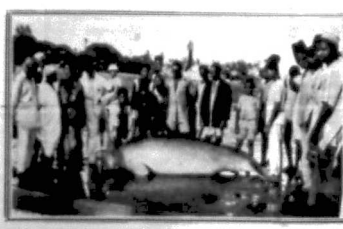
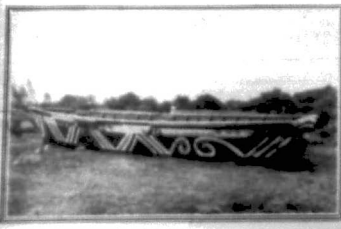

LOSSES FROM NUTRITIONAL ANEMIA

(By W. A. Stewart, Principal, Northamptonshire Farm Institute, in the Farmer's Weekly, England.)

The Department of Agriculture has issued the following notes for the information of farmers. (For posting in the central area of the colony of British Guiana.) It is pointed out that the following are some of the most common causes of sterility in animals.

During recent years various investigations have been conducted in Great Britain with reference to other directly or indirectly with the food intake of animals, such as cereals and other farm crops. The reports of the British Committee for the Investigation of Sterility, and the various sub-committees, contain valuable data.

From the information obtained from various sources, it seems that the most common cause of sterility is a deficiency of phosphorus in the diet of breeding animals, and that this is especially so in the case of the female.

The Government of the United States has won the important Supreme Court case involving the legality of the abrogation of the Gold Clause under the "New Deal."

The Court has held that the Government has no right under the Constitution to make monetary changes but in the same decision takes steps to prevent any claim from bond holders for payment in gold or its equivalent instead of devalued dollars at the current rate and by this prescription has saved the country from a grave emergency.

The commodity and security markets immediately reacted to the restoration of confidence resulting from Government's victory.

The Indian attitude to the economic problems of Kenya arising out of the recent enquiry by the Economic Development Committee is vigorously stated by Mr. D. D. Puri, the sole Indian Member, in Notes of Dissent attached to the Report.

He considers that most of the troubles of the Colony are traceable to the fact that the Highlands have been reserved for European and large areas of arable land for Africans, while the Indian has not been allowed to become a producing community.

He opposes the continued reservation of the Highlands, objects to the use of general revenue for the subsidizing of European agriculture, and contends that the Indian community should not be called to contribute taxation to be used for such a purpose. His remedy is the creation of a special Agricultural Assistance Fund out of the proceeds of a tax on undeveloped land.

Mr. Puri opposes any form of marketing legislation, criticizes the proposed pool for maize, asks for a searching enquiry into the wheat pool, is completely against any suggestion of controlled marketing of native produce, and strongly urges greater production in the reserves.

His support is given, however, to the picture presented by the Minority Report of the Colony's balance of trade as being heavier than the statement contained in the Majority Report.

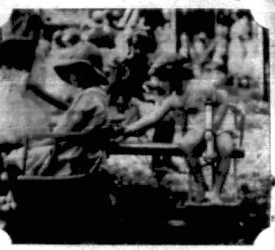

Melt the butter in a pan, add the peeled and sliced onions, also the butter and sliced potatoes. Fry slowly, without browning, for about twenty minutes, then gradually pour in the water, stirring all the time, and allow to reach boiling point. Season with salt and pepper, cover, and allow to simmer gently for an hour and a half. Put the soup through a fine sieve, return to the pan, reheat and just before serving blend in the cream. Sprinkle with chopped parsley, and serve hot.
