## Royal Coffin on a Gun Carriage

### CEREMONIAL PROCESSION TO THE WESTMINSTER HALL

Naïrobi Memorial Service  
LOUD SPEAKER EXTENSION AND A HILLSIDE PILGRIMAGE

Arrangements were made for the conveyance of the body of King George VI. to the Cathedral yesterday afternoon, to Westminster Hall for the lying-in-state. The Royal coffin, on a gun carriage drawn by a battery of Royal Horse Artillery and flanked by Grenadier Guards, was to be followed on foot by His Majesty the King, the Royal Princes and Lord Howland.

In view of loud speakers and other devices those of the public not able to find acceptance in the Cathedral will be able to take part in the official memorial service on Tuesday, and the open space in front of the Cathedral and the surrounding area will be used for this purpose.

As personal tributes may be paid to the memory of King George the Dean of Naïrobi has arranged for a pilgrimage, at the end of the service, to a bridge over the river Swana which will be dropped into the design of a cross cut in the grass.

## Crown in the Grass

## Help for Britain in Event of Attack

ITALY OBJECTS TO PRINCIPLE OF ENQUIRIES

"Never Menaced Anybody"

Italy has taken exception to the presentation by Britain at Geneva of a memorandum intimating its effect that, as well as France, Greece, Turkey and Jugoslavia would assist Britain in the event of attack in consequence of the application of sanctions. Italy also objects to the principle of the British enquiries, declaring that she has "never menaced anybody" in connection with sanctions.

It is recommended by the Committee of Eighteen that a committee of international experts should examine the effectiveness of an oil embargo against Italy.

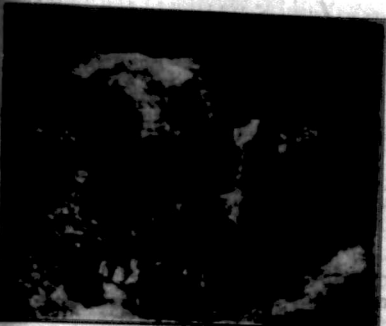

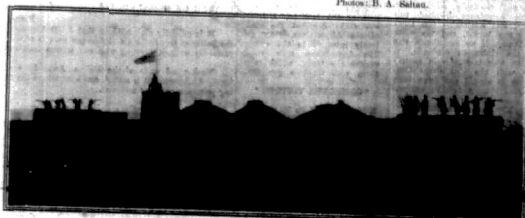

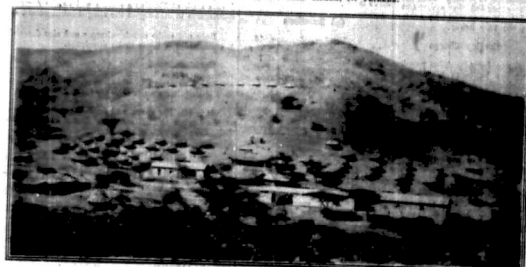

# DEATH OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING

## Peaceful Midnight End of a Beloved Monarch

### TOUCHING LAST MOMENTS AT THE BEDSIDE

#### THE QUEEN'S GRIEF

#### Great Public Demonstrations of Sorrow

#### HIS MAJESTY KING GEORGE V. DIED AT SANDRINGHAM AT 11-45 G.M.T. ON MONDAY NIGHT.

The official bulletin announcing the end was as follows—  
"The death of His Majesty King George V. peacefully at 11-45 in the presence of the Queen, the Prince of Wales, the Duke of York, the Princess Royal and the Duke and Duchess of Kent."  
The bulletin was received by Sir F. Williams, Sir S. Hewett and Lord Dawson of Penn.

Earlier moments of increasing gravity despatched by Reuters from London traced the sequence of events up to the death of the King.

An urgent bulletin issued at 5-30 on Monday evening stated that the condition of His Majesty showed diminished strength.

All hope was abandoned when the following bulletin, signed by the three doctors, was issued at 9-25—  
"The King's life is moving peacefully towards its close."

The touching scenes which were witnessed towards the end and after the announcement of the King's death are described below. The Queen broke down at the bedside of the dead monarch.

It is now disclosed that the late King had a mixture ten days ago.

### Worldwide Tributes

(British and British Overseas Service.)  
London, Jan. 21.  
Tributes of sympathy were expressed by the Indian, the Arab and the Chinese, which reached London on Monday. The British and Chinese tributes will remain the ground laid in what was regarded as a critical stage.

At this juncture it was emphasized that the King was suffering from general weakness and the absence of particular symptoms which the doctors could not see was one of the difficulties in the case.

**Noting the Dates**  
His Majesty's condition in the afternoon seemed the darkest the greatest concern. They remained absent throughout the night and evening and oxygen was speedily administered.

The King was not in bed but was kept as quiet as possible, although the Queen, who was seated next to him, saw his frequent and his children, some of them in the room for a short period with the exception of the Duke of Gloucester, who was recovering from a sore throat.

In order to attend the strength of the Air Ministry advised the Queen to refrain from flying within the British Isles.

**SAD VISIT**  
The King was without pain to the end and died peacefully and completely sane.

**FAILING HEALTH**  
A Sickness Two Days Ago  
Although the King's weakness was an epidemic outbreak, it was generally assumed that the King was seriously weakened by his illness in 1928, after which he never fully recovered. Three weeks ago he faintly showed signs of recovery at Sandringham parish church.

They walked only into the death chamber, where all gathered round the bed going at the time, but did not see the monarch's last.

The King had maintained a calm and self-controlled throughout long hours, but breaks down at the end of the day, and he and she exchanged an affectionate embrace. Each took a last loving look at the dead monarch, and they both looked at the Queen, returning to a hearty and calm conversation.

**The New King**  
Edward of Windsor, now King Edward VIII, filled his mind and all about him, looking immediately assumed the appearance of a young man, who had been delegated to him, and the Queen and his brothers largely in terms previously by King George as the last official act of his busy life.

# Better Outlook for Kenya in 1936

## CHEERFUL VIEW OF PRESIDENT OF CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

### Improved Trade Figures

### COLONY'S SHARE IN GREATER EMPIRE PROSPERITY

The view that 1936 will prove a better year for Kenya was put forward by Mr. H. B. Hamilton in his presidential address at the annual general meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce on Friday last.

The President felt that the Colony must share in a general Empire trade improvement; and among international factors he instanced improved commercial statistics for 1935 compared with 1934, increased native employment and better prices for produce.

Speaking of the need for administrative economy which would be urged upon Sir Alan Pinck, he mentioned the "deperate anxiety" of the commercial community and said that while reduction would mean some dislocation of the Governmental machinery, there must not be any repetition of the "spending lunacy" of 1925 to 1929.

### Annual Meeting

An interesting review of general conditions in Kenya was given by Mr. H. B. Hamilton in his presidential address at the annual general meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce on Friday last.

After remarking that the Chamber had spent some useful years in the commercial community, he said that while reduction would mean some dislocation of the Governmental machinery, there must not be any repetition of the "spending lunacy" of 1925 to 1929.

### Air Mail Postage

### Increased Trade

"May I start out by giving you a figure or two in connection with the port of Mombasa. This is always a good thing to do, because it shows the progress for the country as a whole. I naturally have not got the figures right up to the end of December, 1935, but I have got the figures for the first ten months of 1935 as compared with the similar period of 1934, and these are as follows:—

For this period for 1935, there was 412 containers, as against 370 in 1934, and for the first ten months of 1935, there was 1,725,255 tons of cargo, as against 1,599,360 tons for the 1934 period. This shows a clear rise in the figures of both cargo and containers.

"The total exports and imports for the first ten months of 1935 as compared with the similar period of 1934 are as follows:—

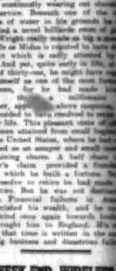

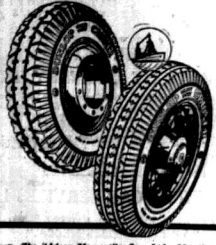

EMPIRE WOOD FOR MODERN HOUSES. Material That Lasts for Centuries.

AMPLE SUPPLIES. [STANDARD] CORRESPONDENT: London, Jan. 25. The efforts being made by the Wood Development Commission to stimulate the use of British and Empire woods in the building of houses are illustrated in the exhibition of designs for all-timber houses at the Building Centre in Broad Street, W. 1.

An immense amount of research has been carried out into the durability of the various kinds of timber for building purposes (various timbers being tested), and Mr. H. H. Wood, the association's technical director, tells us that timber is making considerable headway, in spite of the mass of concrete and steel which is used in the market.

There is no doubt about its durability. There are old timber houses in London—some 200 standing in Hyde Park, Mayfair, and in other parts of the city, and the Tower of London, dating from 1087. They have stood for many years and the structure is remarkably well.

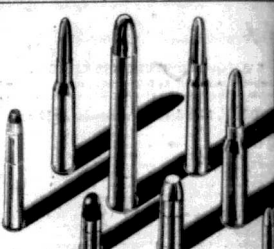
