ARRANGEMENTS FOR MEMORIAL SERVICE AND HILLSIDE PILGRIMAGE

Over 500,000 people have passed through Westminster Hall during the lying-in-state of the late King George. At midnight on Sunday the queue was over a mile long and was 15 people deep.

At the funeral to-day the King, who will wear naval uniform, will walk with his brothers behind the coffin. During the last rites at Windsor King Edward will kneel earth upon the coffin. Every effort is being made to ensure that the lowering of the coffin synchronously with the two minutes' silence, so that the British Empire will form an unseen congregation about the grave.

The full arrangements for the observances in Nairobi are outlined below.

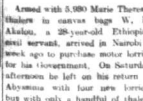

AFRICANS' SORROW AT KING'S DEATH

New News Was Received at Kinshasa

The following report of a meeting of the native people of the Kinshasa district has been written by Chief Philip Karamba Juma, Dapouti, with a request for publication—

The meeting was opened with prayer, and the meeting kept stirring for two minutes. The chairman expressed in the name of the great loss of our King George.

The Senior Chief said to the meeting that when he heard the news of death, he called many people and had kept a silence for two minutes. It was 11 a.m. on Thursday. Also the Divisional Chief Juma and Chief Philip expressed to the meeting that when they were heard of the above news they went straightway to the Chief Office, Kinshasa to see the Postmaster, whether it was true and they were told that it was true. Within a minute Chief Juma sent a man with letters to reach the Native Tribunal Court from their work and it was done. Also the Vice President, Central Tribunal, Kinshasa stopped his Court the same hour.


We Kinshasa people are full of sorrow for the death of our King. Therefore we have the deepest regret, mourning with the Royal Family, whether it is King Edward the eighth that we welcome him as our new King.

"Germany cannot pay high wages."

"We must become a nation of savages."

Referring to colonies. Dr. Goebbels said: "We are a poor nation. We have no colonies, no raw materials."

"If we must sell the other nations that the time will come when we must demand our colonies back."

"It will not do that we continue to live as a poor country while the wealth of the world is rolling in."

Danger to the World

"We are beggars. We are surrounded with difficulties which we cannot overcome by interior methods. The others do not need the colonies which they have taken from us."

"We want to remain neutral, but we understand that a nation like Italy cannot be neutral."

"It is dangerous for the world to continue such demands, but some day the bomb will explode."

Speaking on Germany's rearmament, the Minister (according to Goebbels) explained:

"We can well do without better but not without guns. Because better could not help us if we were to be attacked one day."

"Some people say there is a world conference which is the League of Nations, whose part it is to preserve the peace of the world. But I prefer to rely on guns."

Dr. Goebbels then dealt on the unexpected increase of unemployment in the last and Dr. Goebbels was asked by the audience:

"This is due to the weather; the lack of raw materials and to other things."

"We are at present in a precarious situation, but we hope to overcome it by the end of February or the beginning of March."

Defending the street collections Dr. Goebbels said—

"If we did not give pensions to the unemployed people they would starve to death."

"We are doing everything to prevent our people from starving, and we are guaranteeing in this way the stability of the National Socialist regime."

Dr. Goebbels then declared that Germany could not pay high wages, this would be followed by high prices, and in the long run by inflation.

"Therefore, we must hold on. We don't want foreign credits. We could have them for the taking, but we want to be a free nation."

League Unstable

Talking to foreign politicians Dr. Goebbels remarked:

"Sometimes there are moments when one has to realize the sword and cut the knot. We do not wish to interfere with the conflict between Great Britain and Abyssinia on the one hand and Italy on the other. If Germany is learning a lesson from the situation."

"This is, that a nation without power is not to preserve power even if she is willing to do so, and"

CADDO. His Mohab, a cheikh of the Egyptian Embassy in Khartoum, and attached to the Egyptian Ambulance at Daggabbar, who had returned to Cairo, made a wireless statement, summarized by witnesses and confirmed by Mohammed, Red Lamb, Sultan, and Sami Georges, insurance attendants of the same hospital, stating that Ahmed Alyemman, when Italian aeroplane was in sight, would take refuge in the Convent where the ambulance was situated and from the ambulance of the Convent opened fire against the aeroplane. The military of the Egyptian mission repeatedly protested against such abuse to the British and General Vaux Pasha, calling for attention to the consequences of such actions, acceptable of provoking justified retaliation by the Italian aeroplane. On November 11, Italian aeroplane bombed Daggabbar, Red Sea, and the ambulance of Dr. Hoshara, present there. Dr. Hoshara presented them. Dr. Hoshara (British) explained that such action was inconsistent with the principles of the Red Cross and the embargo against the members of the mission.

On December 1, Dr. Hoshara picked up, as he had done before, an unexpected bomb which had fallen at about a kilometer from the ambulance and brought it to the tent, trying to dynamite it, but the bomb exploded, destroying completely the tent and Dr. Hoshara was picked up seriously wounded. He was taken to Aden, where he died. Mohab and the other Egyptian military staff also that the Egyptian Ambulance at Jiga, did not have any Red Cross emblem and that at Daggabbar there was an Egyptian Ambulance. They added also that the Italian aeroplane never bombed the Ethiopian ambulance at Daggabbar, limiting themselves to flying over it and dropping bombs in Amharic language in which they urged the natives to keep calm.

At Jiga, the emblem of the Red Cross was placed over two schools used as Abyssinian hospitals. At Harar on the first floor of the building where the Swedish Ambulance is lodged, there is an Abyssinian wireless station, the staff of which wear the Red Cross emblems.



would be greater than the Colony could at present offer. It would be no means inappropriate to seek assistance from the Colonial Development Fund for the purpose. As regards the second difficulty, namely that of adequate hospital facilities in the neighbourhood of the laboratory, it is now fortunately the case that there are likely soon to be provided on what we hope will be an adequate scale. As regards public health, the opportunity I have I think already mentioned as an adequate supply of water I have no doubt but that if the opportunity could be investigated it would be recommended by some members or persons of outstanding reputation in the world of medical research, it would deserve all the publicity which it requires not only in the world of medical research but in the more progressive world of successful commercial enterprise which elsewhere, though not yet in Kenya, has so often and so successfully supported enterprise in scientific research.

Health Among the Africans

In the annual Medical Report for the year 1952, arising from certain detailed information which had been collected with regard to the health of two important tribes which inhabit the highlands and the highland Maasi, and from such general information as was available, I indicated that but one conclusion could be arrived at with regard to the state of the public health of the native population of the coast and highlands of Kenya, namely, that the general standard of health among these peoples was poor. The comparison, however, it may be well to note, was with the general standard of health which prevails in England, and not with which might prevail elsewhere in Africa. For the information which is available with regard to the native populations of Africa is not such as might suggest that taken as a whole, the standard of health among these populations is better than that which prevails among the native inhabitants of this Colony.

No information has been collected during 1953 which might suggest that the conditions advanced above, which in fact, no conclusion can be drawn from these reports for many years in succession, should be modified in any way, though some data have been collected with regard to one important tribe, in respect of which we had no information in the past. In the public health of the native population, which gives additional support to the view that the state of the public health of the native population of the highlands of Kenya, is far from satisfactory.

Sometimes birds are found which are not parasites, but on the other hand, one bird often carries a large number of parasites, and these are many hundreds. The parasites are in a flash, and the bird is pinned and arranged in a flash. As the bird tumbles down the camera drops off. The parasites are collected and put into alcohol.

Ready Knowledge

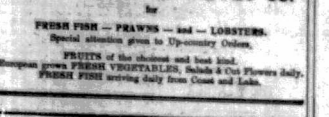

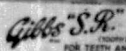

BRITISH AMBASSADOR AND HITLER

Sensational Account of German Demands

TRUTH OF THE INTERVIEW

["Special Correspondent"]
London, Jan. 8.

(By Air Mail)
In a recent mail I mentioned a lengthy statement which appeared in the "New Chronicle" in the demands but forwarded by Herr Hitler in his recent interview with Sir Eric Philips, the British Ambassador in Berlin. This indicated that Germany was demanding air superiority over any nation; the return of Colonies; and the expansion from the Peace Treaty the declaration that Germany was responsible for the War.

I notice that the official Times News Agency denied this version of the Hitler-Philips interview, which was apparently published by Mr. T. H. White, Chief European Correspondent of the "New York Times," which is on this a very reputable paper. On this, the "New Chronicle" writes:
"The official German news agency denies the version of the Hitler-Philips interview which was published in the "New Chronicle" on Saturday, but advances no proof to show that the account is not substantially correct."
On Saturday the "Evening Standard" published the following:
"I have authority for stating that the sensational account published in London today of the recent interview between Herr Hitler and Sir Eric Philips, the British Ambassador in Berlin, can be taken at either less than 1 per cent of its face value. The facts are that early in December M. Francois Ponsot, the French Ambassador in Berlin, had an interview with the Fuehrer on disarmament and a Western air fleet. It was considered desirable that the British Ambassador should ask for a similar interview in order that the British Government might be kept in possession of the state of German opinion. Herr Hitler gave the same answer as he had given on a previous occasion, that so long as the war in Abyssinia continued in good progress could be served by financing this matter.

It is true that Herr Hitler was not so diplomatic as to say "hello." It is quite untrue that he was truculent and that he put forward various demands as essential conditions to any discussion. The question of Germany's former colonies has been raised more than once and may have been mentioned at the interview, but the subject of superiority over all other races was not mentioned. The Fuehrer's demand for African colonies is wholly incorrect. Equally untrue is the story, current in Fife yesterday, that Herr Hitler and Sir Eric Philips, T. H. White, Chief European Correspondent of the "New York Times," were in Paris as anti-Latin propaganda. Certain English and American newspapers have written otherwise.

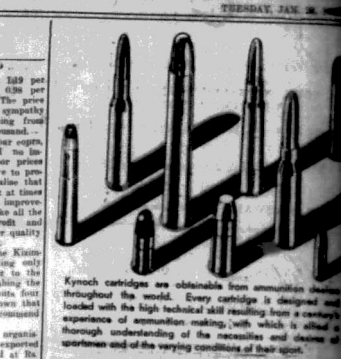

FOUR ROYAL BROTHERS MOUNT GUARD OVER COFFIN

With stately and solemn ceremonial the late King George V was buried at Windsor yesterday.

An impressive midnight scene in Westminster Hall was when King Edward and his three brothers, in Guards uniforms, mounted guard over their father's coffin, standing immobile for half an hour.

As during the last rites the coffin was lowered into the Royal Vault, earth was sprinkled over it by King Edward, who shaved intense emotion.

FIRST UNMARRIED MONARCH SINCE 1760

Princedom of Wales.

100 YEARS SINCE THERE WAS NO ONE TO BEAR TITLE

Some interesting facts about the new King are given by the London Correspondent of the "East African Standard" below. King Edward VIII is the first unmarried King of England since George VIII, became King in 1760, and he is the 17th monarch since William the Conqueror to ascend the Throne unmarried.

For the first time in nearly 100 years there is no one to bear the title of Prince of Wales, an honour which by ancient custom is conferred only on the eldest son of the reigning Sovereign.

By being confined to members of the Royal Family the Council of State set up during the illness of King George established a new Empire principle of forming a direct link between the Dominion and the King in pursuance of the Statute of Westminster.

New Empire Principle

When King Edward VIII died on May 11, 1936, the Lord Chamberlain had to consider these regulations: "Orders for the Crown to go into abeyance for his late Majesty King Edward VIII of blessed memory."

A Bachelor King. King Edward VIII is the first unmarried King of England since George III became King in 1760 at the age of 22, a year before the birth of Charlotte, the daughter of the Duke of Marlborough.



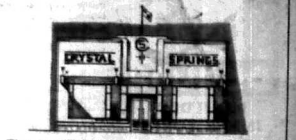

Mombasa, Jan. 27.

Mr. J. B. Ezkine, captain of the Hombasa Golf Club, in making his report on the past year's work at the 25th annual general meeting of the Club and which had passed through another successful year. There would be those who might disagree when they viewed the deficit of over Shs. 6,000. The girls of the year added the club to their list. Mr. H. V. Anderson, who had collected four trophies during 1935. Amongst the ladies two of the lower handicapped players—Mrs. Saver and Mrs. Campbell—were first in the various competitions that their positions were not far from.

Mr. Anderson had won the Barry Cup (championship), the Geraldine Cup, the Captain's Prize, and the Club Jubilee trophy.

Dealing with the course Mr. Ezkine said that though it could not be denied that it was better today than it had been a year ago, the ground had been very good.

TRAGIC DISREPUTE OF LION HUNTING IN KENYA

Proposed Ban

AGAINST LOCAL PARTIES WHO RAVERAGE GAME PRESERVES

The deprivations wrought amongst game, especially lion, by local parties of "motor poachers" was denounced at a meeting of the East African Professional Hunters' Association by the President, Mr. Percival, who spoke of the tragic disrepute into which lion hunting had fallen through the use of cars.

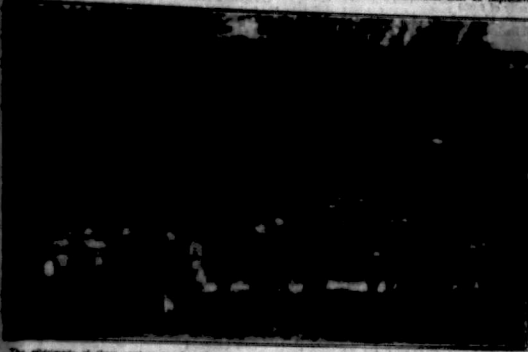

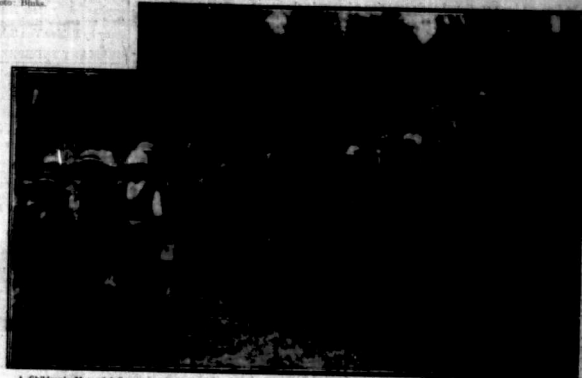

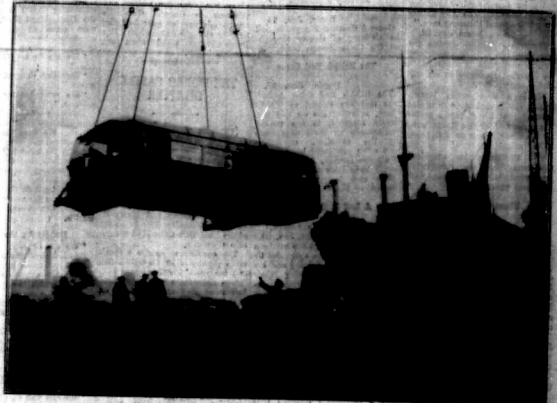

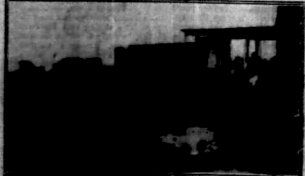

Five Fighting on Northern Front BOTH SIDES CLAIM A COMPLETE VICTORY Three Days' Battle

What appears to have been one of the biggest engagements of the war is reported from the Northern front where both sides claim a decisive victory.

It is apparent that both Italian and Abyssinian losses have been severe but the messages from both sides make it impossible to say what the real position is at present.

The Italians have continued their sweeping advance in the South and covered 900 miles in eleven days over appalling roads.

Offensive Anticipated

Small bodies of Abyssinians were landed aside by the Italian army being from terror and a sense of half-heartedness were taken. The Italian soldiers were well armed and drilled. The prisoners said they were afraid to surrender because they had been told to hold out until they were ordered to do so.

The fighting is characterized by heavy machine gun fire, sharp, air bombing and machine gun fire. Counter attacks were launched but the Italians were driven back. It is also claimed that the Italians were repulsed.

A message from Amara states that the battle which began the day before yesterday on the Tumbek heights and embracing the whole northern front has not been a complete success for the Italians. In some sectors the Italians have captured and reported capture and have repulsed Abyssinian attacks.

Desperate fighting is reported in the last three days in the southern Tumbek district is referred to by Marshal Badoglio in an official dispatch.

He says a vigorous Italian attack was launched when it was learned that heavy forces were on the move, intent on delivering a big offensive.

The Italian action surprised the enemy and the manoeuvre concluded late last night with complete success.

Three Days' Battle

In the course of the operations 300 Italian soldiers were killed and wounded, while it is estimated 110 Egyptian soldiers were killed and wounded, while it is estimated 5,000 Abyssinians were killed and wounded.

Marshal Badoglio says that on January 21 Ethiopian soldiers were driven back on the heights of Zercherketa and Lata Meskala. The Tumbek heights, ultimately capturing both places.

With stately and solemn ceremonial the late King George V was buried at Windsor yesterday.

The streets along the route of the cortege in London, draped in black and purple in sad contrast with the jubilee scenes through which the Majesty drove so short a time ago, were packed to the last inch of pavement by the mourning public, many of whom took up positions the previous evening.

Buried as King George was with the full naval honours accorded to an Admiral of the Fleet, he was "piped alongside" on the arrival of the cortege at St. George's Chapel and "piped aboard" as Grenadier guards carried the coffin into the chapel.

An impressive midnight scene in Westminster Hall was when King Edward and his three brothers, in Guards uniform, mounted guard over their father's coffin, standing immobile for half an hour.

As during the last rites the coffin was lowered into the Royal Vault car was sprinkled over it by King Edward, who showed intense emotion.

"Piped Aboard"

STRIKING PILGRIMAGE BY ALL RACES TO AN IMPERIAL SYMBOL

Kenya joined with the rest of the British Empire on Tuesday in paying heartfelt tribute to the memory of a beloved King.

A crowd of unrepresented persons, representative of all the races gathered in and around the Cathedral of the Highlands, Nairobi, to take part in the very solemn and impressive national memorial service arranged as the principal feature of the Colony's day of mourning.

His Excellency the Governor attended in State and was accompanied by official and unofficial members of the Executive and Legislative Councils and His Majesty's Judges in their robes. Municipal councillors and officers were also present and many heads of Government departments, all of whom attended in ceremonial dress.

The Foreign Consuls attended in uniform.

The most striking spectacle of the day—one which is probably unique in the Empire—was a pilgrimage to a symbolic crown built in stone on the face of the hill overlooking the Cathedral. Headed by clergy of all denominations and a combined choir from all churches a procession of many thousands of people representative of nearly every race of the King's subjects in the Colony wound up the hillside from the Cathedral precincts to the Crown on which each laid a tribute of flowers.

His Excellency the Governor took part in the pilgrimage, following immediately behind the choir.

In the midst of the Cathedral Service a single bell at eleven o'clock announced the beginning of a two minutes' silence which was ended by the same single chime.

In Nairobi and throughout the country the windows of His Majesty the King were fully respected and in the quietude of the capital there was evidence of King Edward VII's memory of their duty to the memory of their late King.
