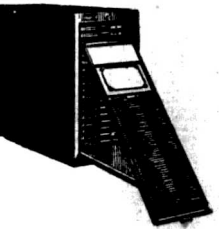

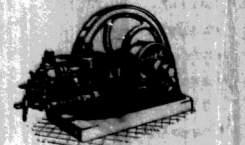

**A PIONEER OF FLYING IN EAST AFRICA**

Mrs. F. K. Wilson, founder of the British Wireless Airways and the Pioneer of Flying in East Africa, is also one of the earliest settlers in Kenya. "I wish to speak on the roads now," she said, "because it is all such old news. Everybody knows what I travelled over when we first took up land between Nairobi and Mombasa. The railway finished at Tika, there were no bridges over the stream and we got waders back to foot them. In one place only was there a bridge of logs, and when it gave way as invariably did when we crossed it it had to be built up again before the cart could be taken over."

**Early Days**

Mrs. Wilson had her husband's first name on a big game hunting expedition in 1914. "I consider it was," she says, "Kenya so much that they formed a syndicate after the war, and five ex-guns and bought land to establish a settlement. It was out for a few months over for the shooting and the forest. Later they bought land on their own account and formed wireless stations there and three years ago Mrs. Wilson's wireless station that it was a being game and came to Nairobi."

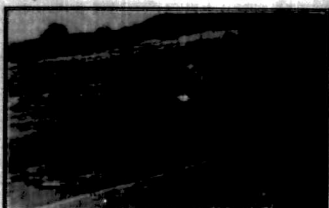

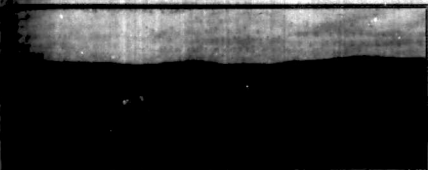

## MR. THOMAS AND SIR ALFRED BUTT RESIGN THEIR SEATS

### House of Commons Debate

#### NEED FOR GUARDING JEALOUSLY THE PRIVACY OF PUBLIC LIFE

Mr. J. H. Thomas and Sir Alfred Butt whose conduct was the subject of adverse reports from the Budget Leakage Tribunal have decided to resign from the House of Commons.

Mr. Thomas said he accepted without challenge the findings of the Tribunal but declared that he had never consciously given away any secret Budget information; while Sir Alfred Butt stated with emphasis that neither consciously nor unconsciously had any confidential Minister disclosed to him any confidential information.

The Prime Minister who moved the adoption of the Report emphasized the distinction between the Tribunal and an ordinary court of law and pointed out that the two Members had not been found guilty of a criminal offence.

Mr. Baldwin and the Leader of the Labour Opposition paid tribute to the loyalty and distinguished career of Mr. J. H. Thomas and regretted that it had been brought to an end in such a manner.

As a result of recent happenings it is probable that the Committee of Lays will adopt a "drowsy season" near the close of the Budget year.

Mr. J. H. Thomas announced that he had resigned from the House of Commons and that he would be leaving the country in the next few days. He said that he had never consciously given away any secret Budget information, and that he had never unconsciously or unconsciously disclosed to him any confidential information.

Mr. Thomas had been a Member of the House of Commons since 1905, and had held various offices of honor and distinction. He was a member of the Privy Council and had served on several important committees.

His resignation was a surprise to many, as he had been widely regarded as one of the most distinguished Members of the House. He had served in the House for over 25 years.

Mr. Thomas was born in 1856, and was educated at Eton and Balliol College, Oxford. He was called to the bar in 1881, and was a member of the House of Commons from 1905 to 1932.

He was a member of the Privy Council from 1911 to 1932, and had served on several important committees, including the Committee of Lays and the Committee of Privileges.
