Financial Confusion

CAUSED BY BAN ON EXPORT OF FOREIGN CURRENCY

Diplomat, June 21.

According to an authoritative source received here the Italian occupation in Abyssinia is confined to the principal towns and the population in the greater part of the high areas in between are not only unquiescent but are in open defiance to Italian rule.

The Italians have in any event not yet attempted to penetrate to the west or south of Addis Ababa, and there is an organized Ethiopian Government in the Galla districts under Isipachatch Marjan, who is preparing to resist the Italians.

The majority of the Addis Ababa population have fled to join the Christians still in the field.

FROZEN ASSETS

In the monetary financial confusion prevails throughout the country. The ban placed on the export of lire, as well as all foreign currency, has virtually frozen the considerable assets in the hands of British, Indian and other traders.

Moreover the continued delay in liquidating the Bank of Ethiopia is alleged to be designed to encourage Italian trade at the expense of British and other firms.

A MAJOR ISSUE

The French railway authorities are refusing to accept lines in payment of Italian military freight fares, and the railway is likely to become a major issue soon.

Rome, June 21.

The King to-day gave an audience to the Ministers of Austria, Egypt, Haiti and Iran, who presented their credentials.

Italian political circles claim that this represents at least a tacit recognition by the nations concerned of the fact that the King is now also Emperor of Ethiopia.

The official communique, however, does not indicate what formula was used in the credentials.

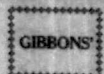

**TROUT FISHING IN KENYA**

Attractive and Well Written Booklet

**"FISH FARMING"**

(Reviewed by T.L.E.)

No angler in Kenya and certainly no Angling Association should be without a copy of a booklet entitled "Kenya Trout stream fisheries" written by their very knowledgeable angler Mr. Hugh Cogley in which, for this and for many other low classes services, all anglers owe a debt of gratitude.

One feature to which it has to be a characteristic of local fisheries that we take things for granted without considering the structural movement of most streams on our behalf by those far-sighted pioneers who had the vision to appreciate how much would be added to the stream of our Colony were the glorious streams revealed by the authors of sporting fish. Mr. Cogley's book is a timely reminder that the present and coming generations must ensure their recommendations if the work of the pioneers is to meet with full success and if Kenya is to retain the reputation she has already gained as a paradise for trout fishing.

Experience has taught our dams that it is not enough to have a large storage but that every acre planted, be it with coffee, maize or sugar, requires constant care and attention if the best results are to be obtained and damage from erosion and other causes prevented.

**"Farming the Water"**

Mr. Cogley calls his methods "Farming the water" and his booklet deals with the improvement of one stream up to the ultimate limit, when such help shall become a balanced unit, self-supporting in the supply both of food for the trout and trout for the angler, equipped with everything for the streamer, bank, outcrop for the immature and attractive places where the catchable trout may enjoy life. "By regulation" life and soil give the angler a sporting

chance of making it. The destruction of dams, defences and covers of various types are clearly described and illustrated and the importance explained from the book. A few simple and the methods and need that it is possible to be derived therefrom.

**Some Examples**

Every streamer angler must have stretches of water, when the conditions are applied with little trouble or expense and which are suitable for the trout. The author's methods are underlined by Association and by those far-sighted gentlemen known as "riverside owners", there is much that can be done for the private angler. There is a small part of the Malava River below the "Dudley" Trestle which has been transformed from an uninteresting and empty run of white water, into a most interesting stretch of thoroughly good fishing of the expense of nothing more than the use of a few boulders and a lot of timber. The North Malava is another example of how a stream, fast flowing river can be made to afford some excellent fishing for trout.

**Kingfishers and Otters**

One is glad to note that Mr. Cogley has a word to say in defence of the two delightful varieties of Kingfishers that grace our rivers and that he does not regard them as a share of the trout, but one regrets his almost average feelings towards the otter. Let us hope that some place will be found in the "habited" and that the grateful inhabitants of our rivers and that needed and not interference will be the aim. That they take a heavy toll of our trout is certain, but they are very rare, and at a safety which is not always the case with some anglers who prey on trout on their killing spree that depends on daylight or their own sense of human decency. No one who has watched a pair of kingfishers at play and confided their joyous abandon, their graceful movements, their strength and fearless whishes, will grasp there a reasonable share of the beautiful sample of the fish that on which they thrive.

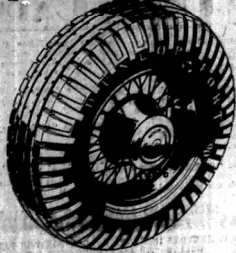

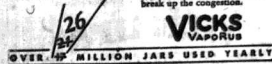

First Sea Lord Sympathetic

VALUE OF BRITISH FLEET IN KEEPING WORLD PEACE

London, June 25. The plan of the journal of the American Navy League for co-operation between the British and American navies to make future wars impossible was noted with interest and approval by Sir Stanley Hoare in a speech to the Royal Navy Society in London.

He declared that there was no need to panic and no need to assume that war was inevitable. No country in Europe desired war, but there was so much inflammable material in Europe that a spark might start a conflagration which great powers like Britain were strong enough to make their influence felt in the course of peace.

If the British forces were adequately strengthened in those there would be no world war. If a well balanced British fleet capable of deterring the enemy and keeping the seas open, and equipped to go anywhere, could be built in time there would be no world war.

USE OF AIR POWER

The advent of air power had not changed the functions of the navy and had not made it impossible to build a fleet capable of deterring the enemy and keeping the seas open.

The fleet in the Mediterranean embodied collective security and complete fulfilment of the duty of preventing an extension of conflict. Foul and mischievous talk about lost prestige was mostly propaganda by enemies of Britain and would be proved to be altogether futile and foolish.

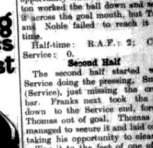

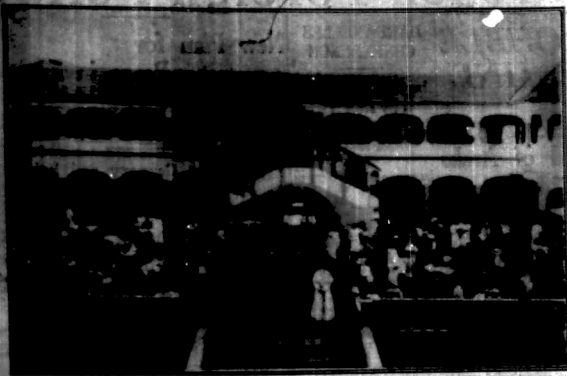

He said the British Government in the present circumstances felt justified in looking for an early reply from His Majesty's Government to the question recently raised.

#### The League's Future

During the Home of Commons debate on foreign affairs, the Foreign Secretary, Mr. Anthony Eden, said that the Government had not withdrawn the offer of mediation in the case of Italy, but that the League of Nations, which had been established in 1919, was now in a position to be re-established in a form which would be more effective than the League of Nations as it was.

DRAMATIC STORY TOLD BY RAS KASSA

Women and Children Blinded

WEAPON AGAINST WHICH IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE TO FIGHT

RAM KASSA, the famous Ethiopian general, who is in London with the Emperor, in an interview described Italy's barbaric methods of warfare, and the difficulties which the Abyssinians found in establishing contact with white Italians.

The General, who fought through the heaviest encounters of the war with the Ras of Seyoum, received the "News Chronicle" representative in the saloon of the Ethiopian Legation.

"I cannot say much for the conduct of Italian troops in the field," he said in his native Amharic, "for the situation of affairs is such that, at the outset of each engagement with the enemy forces, we had to fight exclusively against the native troops, whereas the Italian troops, properly speaking, were entrenched in the rear in fortifications.

LEFT FIGHTING TO PASSIVE

"When we had succeeded in planting the lines of native troops on either fighting location, it was possible because the Italian soldiers took to flight."

"As we went through, 'When we got together they were' replied, 'I cannot fight an enemy you cannot see.'"

Questioned about the use of gas, he said: "The first time that gas was used was in the Northern Front at the beginning of December, when the Italian planes dropped fire by the army of Dejazmach Ayouf at Adig-Ok in the Sudd."

Famous Russian Novelist ROMANTIC CAREER Persecuted in Time of The Tsar

[REUTERS' SERVICE.] Moscow, June 18. The death is announced of Maxim Gorki, the famous Russian novelist, at the age of 67.

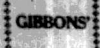

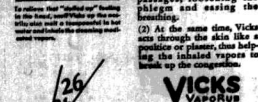

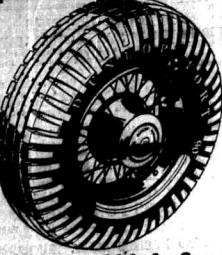
