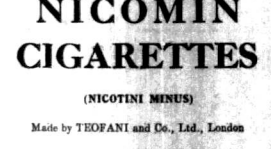

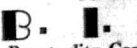

For the four months January-April 1935, inclusive, the increase in the value of the exports compared with the equivalent four months of 1934 is more marked. For the first three months of the year the Kenya's exports increased in value by 74.7 per cent, or over 83 per cent, over the corresponding period of 1934, and a further increase amounted to £17,196, or a total of 80.7 per cent. Respective figures for January-April 1935 in brackets are: Jan-April 1934: Kenya, £1,400,013 (£1,032,630); Uganda, £1,904,313 (£1,792,210); Total, Kenya and Uganda, £3,304,326 (£2,824,840).

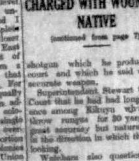

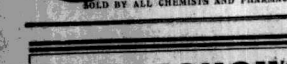

### Selection, Grading and Storing of Eggs for Incubation

(By H. H. G. B.)

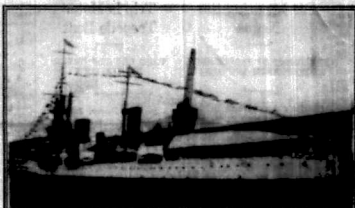

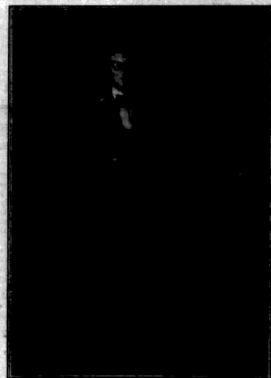

### Arabs' "Guerrilla Warfare"

#### PHASE FOR JEWISH RESTRAINT UNDER "GREATEST PROVOCATION"

From Jerusalem, special correspondent in a series of the disturbances during May, describes the tactics of "guerrilla warfare" which the Arabs have been pursuing in their attempts to intimidate the Government against the Jews.

"The Arabs, on their part," the correspondent states, "are to all appearances adamant in their demands for a cessation of Jewish immigration and the creation of a national Government. By fair means or foul, the strike is being maintained."
