League Agrees to Raise Sanctions

ETHIOPIAN REQUEST FOR AID TURNED DOWN

The League of Nations on Saturday evening approved the raising of sanctions and rejected the appeal by the Emperor of Ethiopia for a loan of ten million pounds to enable the struggle for independence to be continued.

A resolution expressed the need for strengthening the authority of the League and invited members to submit proposals with this end in view. These will be considered at the annual meeting of the Assembly to be held on September 21.

The new President declared that the Assembly had just passed through the darkest passage of its history but the League must carry on.

Assembly's Darkest Passage

[ETHIOPIAN NEWS ASSOCIATION.] Addis Ababa, July 5. It has been stated that the Government of Ethiopia is established at Addis Ababa and the Emperor is expected to arrive there on Saturday.

HIGH-HANDED ACTION BY JAPAN

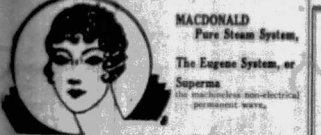

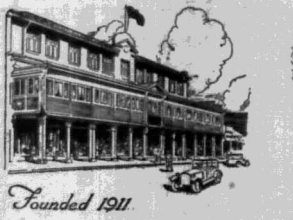

BIGGER RAIL FIGURES Position at End of Five Months

Increased Earnings

THE approximate earnings of the Kenya Uganda Railway and Harbors for May show an increase of £37,731 over the corresponding figure for last year. The respective totals being £239,833 and £200,699.

The total for May is also an improvement on the estimate, which was £240,017. Under all heads the estimate has been exceeded.

For the period January 1 to May 31 this year the total traffic revenue was £1,225,235 as against £1,006,889 on the earnings for the same period last year and an improvement of £218,346 on the estimate.

The total export traffic routed to the Coast during the first five months of this year was 241,296 tons as compared with 190,033 tons for the corresponding period last year—an increase of 26.14 per cent.

The relative percentage for import traffic routed from Kilindi was 55.719 and 60.411—an increase this year of 0.710 per cent.

Increased Traffic Total public traffic dealt with by the Coast for the first five months of this year was 445,957 tons as against 390,754 tons for the corresponding period of last year. This represents an increase of 14.21 per cent.

For the same period there was a decrease of 1,000 tons in the total tonnage of goods handled, the increase being one of 11.11 per cent.

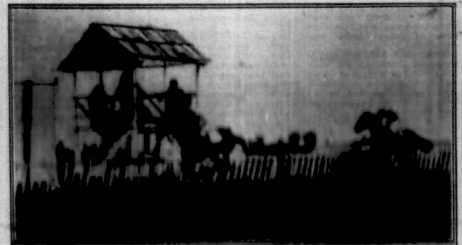

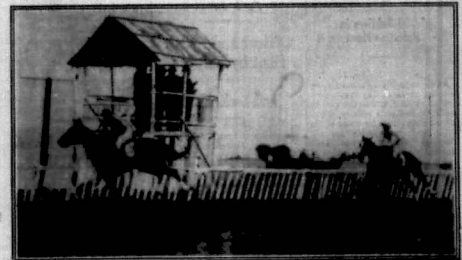

National Defence to be Speeded Up

TO TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER EVERYTHING ELSE

Including Balanced Budget

BRITAIN'S ANXIETY OVER THE EUROPEAN SITUATION

London, July 7. — Heary supplementary estimates for the Army and Air Force are being issued on Thursday, bespeaking Governmental anxiety over the European situation and the need for speeding up the national defences.

The supplementary estimate for the Army will amount to between six and seven million pounds, the additional Air Force estimate is expected to be in the neighbourhood of £10,000,000; and the extra Naval requirements are not disclosed.

URGENT MATTER

Developments in the European situation, it is learned, have convinced Ministers of the urgency of national defence, which must take precedence over all other considerations, including a balanced budget.

CHANCELLOR'S BAN ON NAZI PROGRAMME

The Hapsburgs

GERMANY REFUSES TO AGREE TO RESTORATION

Vienna, July 6. — Strained Austro-German relations have just been improved by the failure of negotiations to settle differences between the two countries.

The Chancellor, Dr. Schuschnigg, is unable to agree that Austrian Nazis should be permitted to publish their views and work on their "cultural programme," especially as regards its anti-Semitic angle.

Germany for her part has refused to agree to the restoration of the Hapsburgs.

Austria is insisting on a declaration in respect of existing frontiers and of non-interference.

ITALIAN AEROPLANES AMBUSHED IN ETHIOPIA

EIGHT OR NINE OFFICERS REPORTED KILLED

Three Italian aeroplanes which took off from Addis Ababa for the Jimma Province were ambushed on landing and eight or nine Italian officers were killed.

The news is not officially confirmed but the first hints are said to include the Deputy Chief of Staff of the Air Force in East Africa and also Colonel Antonio Locatelli who made the first flight over the Andes in 1919.
