THEFT AND ASSAULT

Charges Against Nairobi Indian

Charges of assault and the theft of a golf watch were preferred on the Indian, Manoj Singh, of the Indian Embassy, on Friday against an Indian named Baboo Singh. The case, which charges Baboo Singh with the theft of a watch, was taken last week at the District Court and the Magistrate, Mr. G. G. Kinnaird, sentenced Baboo Singh to 12 months imprisonment and 100 lashes for the assault and 100 lashes for the theft of the watch. Baboo Singh is a resident of the Indian Embassy and is believed to be a member of the Indian Police Force. He was arrested on Friday at the Indian Embassy and taken to the District Court. The watch was valued at Rs. 100 and was found on Baboo Singh's person. The Indian Embassy is located in the City Centre, Nairobi.

Globe Notes

On the festive quarter of a European nation in Kinross Avenue now external, and closing on 28th, 29th, and 30th, the ultimate value of the interest in public affairs which inspired their perhaps too indulgent protest. A special article today, written against the London Convention, controversy, happily indicates that whatever may be the result of the public or the manner of their ignorance of events and problems, the subject is not being isolated. The task which the presence of a representative delegation to the Montagu authorities falls into the main category of health (which includes the wider field of social, economic and sport) and within the outer boundaries of those aspects of the native-protection work is in a great deal of essential work to be done. There is no doubt as to the health aspect, and the exception of the work which the record of work accomplished in the form of social, health visitors, maternity and general work (which includes the work of the Lady Grey Welfare League which is not strictly a maternity organization) is a tribute to the industry and enthusiasm of the Kenya Council and its Native Affairs Committee and particularly to the Medical Officer of Health, who has shown whose duty and responsibility is to give the native population the best of the governing trust of mind.

Those held by the East African Traders' Association. The Management Committee would probably be able to find a way out of difficulty. The commercial community, he said, was split on the question, and he did not see it as a good plan to split the Nairobi Chamber in the particular matter.

Mr. Epstein remarked that the matter had been discussed very thoroughly by other bodies, while the coupon system had existed in England for 50 years, and he did not see why they should pattern themselves on both Africa, when the trouble had arisen owing to a large amount of fraud, which had necessitated the Government adopting the trading coupon system.

Continuing Mr. Epstein stated that in his opinion the natives were getting a tremendous amount of benefit, and were receiving articles which were obtaining them. They bought goods, receiving in addition credit and the maker got a smaller percentage while the natives benefited considerably.

Mr. Churchill suggested that there should be further consideration, and that a representative of the Traders' Association should attend the meeting of the Government Committee before they made their final decision. He suggested that Mr. Epstein should be invited to attend the Committee meeting.

SERIOUS REVOLT IN SPAIN AND MOROCCO

(Continued from page 1).

Delayed Transmission Madrid, July 19. A mutiny is reported to have broken out in the Spanish Frontier in Morocco. Some of the rebels are understood to have landed in Southern Spain.

Towns Bombed

A Paris message says that according to reliable Spanish broadcast the army and aircraft are now bombing rebels at Melilla and Ceuta. Unconfirmed reports have been received, that several garrisons in Southern Spain have revolted, and it is stated that a prominent leader has been assassinated.

"Rebels Squashed"

Thanks to measures taken by authority a great movement of repression against the Republic has been reported as having been squashed, says an official statement issued in Madrid on Saturday night. The statement adds that Spain is absolutely normal and that several generals who are alleged to have been concerned in the rising, have been arrested.

It is also stated that the police have arrested and acquitted which, it is declared, was intended to carry ring-leaders of the Moroccan revolt to the gallows.

The rebels have taken possession of the Ceuta railway station from which they have committed false reports of disturbances in the Ceuta railway station. A letter from Ceuta states that the first official admission that the revolt in Ceuta is not confined to Morocco, is in reference to an announcement that the Spanish Government is of the opinion that the Government should longer be regarded as a neutral or registration charge in respect of private, inter-office telegrams and telegrams which are not accompanied with the usual telephone system, which have been installed at the sole expense of the Government.





WHAT IS BEING DONE IN LOCAL LOCATIONS

Welfare Clinics

Largely because of the monotony in which the work is carried out, very little is known by the average person in Nairobi of what is done for the Natives in the local locations through official and other channels.

Perhaps the principal service is in connexion with health. The Nairobi Municipal Council runs three clinics for Native women and children and other centres of welfare work are the Lady Grey Maternity Home and the Salvation Army's institution.



The fact that the Memorandum is entirely correct and its publication is almost sure to do great damage in providing practical indications in Tanganyika, even in England, I should be most grateful to you if you gave the letter of mine to the Chairman of British Mandates Committee, justifying the situation, the same procedure you gave the Memorandum. While the last twenty four hours my attention has been drawn by an article in the "East African Standard" (Tanganyika's Reply to German Claims) to a Memorandum compiled by the recently established body known as the British Mandates Committee. This article, which appears in the issue of July 21st 1936, quotes from the Memorandum what it calls an interesting paragraph dealing with Missionary opinion on the Mandates question. The article says: "It is stated that there are in Tanganyika six Roman Catholic Missions, including French, Swiss, Italian and Belgian representing 100,000 church members, and claiming to speak for thousands of thousands of Natives residing in the Mission. Thus, Missionary views on the Mandates, including the various Missionary organizations, are given no consideration at all in the transfer of the Mandates and the meeting of German envoys which they visit with honor. At a recent meeting of the Rt. Rev. Salama at which 13 Bishops and Heads of Missions were present, resolution was passed unanimously in this effect and serious representations have been made to the Mandates House."

The political nature and importance of this Committee, of which the Memorandum is a mere step to everybody. The aim which the Memorandum exclusively seeks here and Europe, is obvious. It is to produce something for beyond the actual, the thought or the intention of the framers of it. It is to show that the opinion of the Catholic Missionaries is not to be taken into consideration, and to inform the Committee of the fact that the intention of the framers of it is to show that the opinion of the Catholic Missionaries is not to be taken into consideration.

The instructions issued by the Holy See to the Bishops in 1925, regarding the Mandates, are ordered to abstain from all interference in political affairs and to concentrate all their efforts on the spiritual and moral training of humanity. Pope Benedictine incite all the more on this point because, as he says, any interference in worldly affairs will impede the work of God. Thus are the principles that must guide the Catholic Missionaries everywhere.

As regards the alleged "resolution" of the thirteen Bishops and Heads of Missions at a recent meeting at Dar es Salaam, and the various representations to the Mandates House of the Memorandum, it is a statement of the fact that the Mandates House of the Memorandum is not to be taken into consideration, and to inform the Committee of the fact that the intention of the framers of it is to show that the opinion of the Catholic Missionaries is not to be taken into consideration.

Further, for the reasons given above, I, as spokesman of the Catholic Bishops and Heads of Missions, must ask you to

publish all references to the Mandates House in your Memorandum.

On account of the publicity given to these allegations I am obliged to send the letter to the Press and to the Secret Commission in charge of the Mandates in Rome in view of possible disclosure that might arise.

Britain and the Mandates Question

CANNOT IGNORE VIEWS OF INHABITANTS

Matter of Principle

A SINGLE AND INDIVISIBLE ISSUE. SAYS MR. SANDYS

In a review of the work of the Mandates Committee in the House of Commons, the Secretary, Mr. Duncan Sandys, M.P., told the Joint East African Board that the only thing the British Government could not ignore was a strong and clear expression of opinion by the inhabitants of the territories involved.

Mr. Sandys said he thought the matter would be decided one way or another in the course of the next four or five months.

Early Decision Expected

London (By Air Mail) Mr. Sandys said that there was serious cause to fear that the British Government might be inclined to consider the surrender of some or all of the territory involved in the result of an arrangement to get Germany back into the League of Nations. The most serious danger had been made to emerge from the Government's own assurance that it was not their intention to use the mandate territories as a bargaining counter in European negotiations. The fact that the Government had previously refused to give any ground for a case for their giving away was a serious cause for concern.



Ding Dong Struggle Continues in Spain

Largest Battle of the War Beginning Near Madrid?

Loyal Warships Sunk. Rebel Planes Take Refuge Over Rock of Gibraltar.

It is well impossible to say, owing to the conflicting nature of the reports, which is likely to triumph in the civil war now raging in Spain.

Reports from Madrid are said to have made contact forty miles from Madrid and the main battle of the struggle is thought to be imminent.

The rebels claim to have sunk three Loyal warships which were engaged in bombarding Cadiz. Strapped from Madrid by Spanish Government warships at aircraft near Gibraltar fell into the town, but no one was hurt.







CIVIL WAR IN SPAIN

Rebels Gaining the Upper Hand?

CLAIM TO BE IN CONTROL OF SEVEN PROVINCES

Situation Extremely Obscure

BRITISH WARSHIPS STANDING BY

(Cable and British Official Wireless Press)

There have been serious disturbances in Spain and Spanish Morocco during the week-end, but owing to censorship and the contradictory nature of such reports as are available it is not yet clear to the outside world exactly what has happened.

It is believed, however, that the trouble started with a revolt by the Foreign Legion in Morocco and that almost at the same time disorder on a large scale broke out in various parts of Spain.

Despite rigorous censorship and the severance of telephone communication it appears that civil war is raging over a wide area in Spain.

Most of the reports come from the Southern part of the country, and it is stated that Malaga is in flames, and heavy fighting has occurred at Linares, near Gibraltar.

The leader of the rebellion, General Franco is reported to have landed at Cadix with troops from the Foreign Legion in Morocco and to have declared his confidence in the early success of his movement which is stated to aim at the restoration of the Monarchy.

Telephone communication between London and Madrid has been restored and the Spanish Ambassador was told by his Foreign Office that the Government dominated the situation throughout the country although it was admitted that fighting was continuing in some of the big cities.

Despite earlier Government assurances that the rebellion had been quelled, there is much reason to believe that in fact the Rebels are making considerable headway in the Provinces.

On Tuesday evening the insurgents captured the important town of San Sebastian and are now reported to be marching on Bilbao. They are stated to be in control of seven provinces.

British warships have been evacuating British nationals from port towns and others who were on holiday in Northern Spain have crossed over into France. The United States Government is also taking action for the safety of its citizens in Spain.



While Labour and Liberal speakers who took part in the Colonial Office Bill debate in the House of Commons were in favour of acceptance of the principle that the rights should have priority, Earl Winterton, in a vigorous defence of European settlement preferred to believe that all British subjects, of whatever colour or race were entitled to have their rights considered on an equal basis.

No doubt that the threats made by Liberal and Labour politicians led the Kenya settlers could be made for themselves and in feeling which predominated throughout the Empire, saying that they did not believe that the British Parliament know about the overseas possessors.

Considering that no British Government could take drastic and unfair action against settlers in Kenya or elsewhere without bringing up the matter in the House of Commons, it is argued that a method should be devised of getting on with the settlers of our own race overseas.

Organising European Man Power

New defence plans for Kenya are proposed in the report of a Committee appointed by the Governor of the Colony in April.

Briefly the recommendations are:

1. Formation of a Kenya Regiment on a voluntary basis, consisting of to begin with, two companies with its own officers; and a Regimental Reserve.
2. A Kenya Auxiliary Force divided into two classes, one of men from 18 to 30; and the other man over thirty. The principle of compulsion is proposed for this Auxiliary Force, Class 1, men being permitted to attend an annual camp and Class 2 being compulsorily registered but not called upon to undergo regular training. The Force will be under District Commandants appointed by the Governor.
3. Establishment of School Cadet Corps on a voluntary basis beginning with the Prince of Wales' School.
4. The permanent staff of the Kenya Defence Force to be drawn from the Brigade of Guards and not from the King's African Rifles.
5. Disbandment of the present Kenya Defence Force.
6. Mombasa Coast Defence Unit to be composed entirely of regular soldiers.
7. The Commander of the Northern Brigade, K.A.R., to be O.C. all Kenya Defence Forces, with rank of Brigadier.

The Committee, appointed on April 4 to consider the Defence of the Colony and particularly in connection with the proposed formation of a Kenya Regiment, held its first meeting on April 12, 1952, in connection with the formation of a Colonel J. A. Campbell, D.F.O., Commander, Northern Brigade, King's African Rifles (Chairman), the Hon. T. H. Bruce Schuster, General, Mr. E. W. Hornold, C.M.G. O.B.E., Lt.-Colonel A. Duncan Maitland, M.C., Commanding Officer, Nairobi Battalion, Kenya Defence Force, and Capt. T. V. Ward, President of the Kenya Rifle Association.
