KENYA & UGANDA TRADE

Items from Customs Shipping Return

Among the imports into Kenya and Uganda listed in the Customs shipping returns for the week ending July 18, were 1,140 packages of agricultural implements, 8,511 packages of iron and steel manufactures and 11,089 packages of merchandise. The exports list was a lengthy one, and today headed the list with a total of 4,892 packages. Anglo-Egyptian Sudan was the destination of 1,094 packages, and the other main ones were the Union of South Africa 715, United States of America 731, Egypt 718 and Germany 470.

Other exports included 354 packages of tin for the United States, Netherlands and Belgium respectively; 100 packages of tea to Zanzibar and 730 to Italian Somaliland; 500 packages of tin ore to the Netherlands and 1,045 packages of Witte stannite to Germany. Germany was also the destination of 12 living animals, while 700 cattle were dispatched to Italian Somaliland, together with one lot of ivory. Kenyan, native spare, rails and sleepers figured prominently in the export list, and 340 packages of the first named were for Dar es Salaam; 230 for Lindi; 100 for Mombasa and 25 for Beaufort. There were 2,000 and 2,800 packages, respectively, and Zanzibar 1,000, were the chief destinations for motor spares, while 2,595 packages of rails and sleepers left on route for Mombasa.

STOLEN SACKS

Native Sentenced for Receiving

When Onyango wa Mweri, a Kikuyu, appeared in the Resident Magistrate's Court at Nairobi on the possession of 25 empty sacks stolen from Messrs. Enga Ltd., he pleaded guilty and said he had found the sacks from one of his 150 employees.

Mr. L. B. Thompson, a solicitor at the firm, stated that the sacks were in the region of the 25%. A native constable told the court that he saw a man carrying the sacks and after questioning the man he took him to the Pwaniwa Police post. Later he was informed that the sacks had been bought from the accused, and on searching his room found 40 more sacks.

The native who was interviewed with the sacks told the court he received for cents 15 each. Accused had promised him 14 more but had said he had not got them at the time. His evidence was corroborated by a native police officer.

The accused said he had bought the bags from an employee of the firm at 10 cents each and had asked the employee to question should be called, and the Magistrate agreed to this.

When the employee was produced in court yesterday he was promised by the Magistrate that nothing would happen to him as a result of anything he might say against himself. Witness, however, denied that he had sold sacks to the accused.





UNVEILED BY KING EDWARD AT VIMY RIDGE

To Canadian Dead

SPEECHES BY HIS MAJESTY AND PRESIDENT OF FRANCE



HOSPITAL RATE FOR NAIROBI?

Awaiting View of Government

TOWN CLERK'S SCHEME

At the last meeting of the General Purposes Committee of the Nairobi Municipal Council the Town Clerk submitted a report on the proposed hospital for the town. The Council's proposals to levy a hospital rate on the adult European and Asiatic population of the town when the group hospital scheme comes into being.

As regards the payment to Government by the Council for the cost of treatment of patients in the hospital, the Council has resolved to make a contribution to the cost of maintenance of the hospital in accordance with the number of "patient" days, and that Government be urged to proceed with the proposed hospital scheme as soon as possible in order to enable the Council to bring its proposals into operation.

No Reply

The Town Clerk said he had addressed a letter to this effect to the Commissioner for Local Government on December 2 but that no reply had been received. On July 14 he wrote to the Commissioner for Local Government asking for a reply to the previous letter, and stating that in order to give effect to the Council's proposals it would be necessary to introduce legislation, without the lines of the Local Government (Eldoret) (European Hospital Rates) Ordinance, 1931.

He explained to the Committee that the Council had no power at present to levy a rate of the kind proposed, and that what appeared to be immediately necessary was to obtain the necessary powers which could then be made operative until the hospital was actually functioning.

On Tuesday the Council endorsed a recommendation by the Committee accepting the Town Clerk's report and approving the suggestions it contained.







Less Crime in Kenya Last Year ALL ROUND DECREASE SHOWN IN POLICE REPORT

Road Accident Statistics

It has already been shown, in the report of the Kenya Judicial Department, that crime was again less in 1935 than in the previous year, and this is again made clear by the Kenya Police annual report. There were forty-two per cent reductions at the larger courts and the only exception being Thika and Kisumu.

The number of thefts showed a marked reduction since the Commissioner of Police records with particular satisfaction the diminution in the Lamboia district.

There was an increase of 977 cases under the Traffic Ordinance. The number of road accidents reported to the Police was 414, of which 296 were reported in Nairobi. In 1934, 400 were reported. There were 148 deaths as a consequence of the reports in 1935.

Thirty-seven of the accidents had fatal consequences and 213 caused other injuries. Cars were concerned in 213, trucks and buses in 112, motorcycles in 94 and bicycles in 47. The most common cause of accidents is said to be lack of negligence, which was put down in 117 cases. Intoxication is blamed for eight of the total, and pedestrian faults are said to have been responsible for 70 and those of cyclists for 48.





GENERAL FRANCO PREPARING ANOTHER ATTACK ON MADRID

FRANCO'S ARMY'S ADVANCE. London, July 28. Reports state that General Franco's army has advanced outside Madrid within a column of 5,000 soldiers and militia marched out at dawn to help check the latest advance. Following the receipt of 110,000 tons and 200 young Poenans were shut down with machine guns.

Deserted Streets. All the shops in Madrid are closed and the streets are deserted. Places of worship and public concern are bustling.

It is reported that Government planes bombed and destroyed the Cathedral at Seville which is still in the hands of the Rebels.

The Government claims that the Rebels at Oviedo have surrendered.

The International Committee for the Control of Trade has requested Madrid to withdraw naval units from there, including two battleships.

Gibraltar's Warning. Gibraltar, July 28. A warning has been given that batteries will open fire on Spanish warships if there is any attempt to land on the island. The warships disappeared during the night time in the harbour of Malaga.

Tanager, July 28. The destroyer "Wahkiak" fired three shots at a warning to a Rebel submarine which had straggled two bombs over the British liner "Gibraltar," suspecting she was carrying fuel for Government warships.

Food Shortage. Washington, July 28. The Embassy at Madrid advised that the food supplies of Madrid are only sufficient for two days.

It is reported that the Rebels have killed the guests stationed at the city-convents and the water supply is threatened.

Dangerous Situation. Washington, July 28. An official despatch from San Sebastian says the British and American Ambassadors are spending a holiday here as the war has been going on and through a message requesting the despatch of a warship.

In the mean time there is no indication of an early decision, the conquest of foreign lands. Portuguese British soldiers who went to Barcelona to participate in the fight against the Rebels arrived at Malaga about a week ago. They declared that they had nothing to praise for their treatment by the Spaniards. They stated that civilians had been bombed down but never been.
