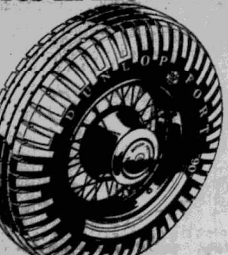

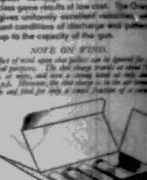

Danger of Vague Hopes

(LONDON OFFICIAL WIRELESS PRESS)

London, July 27.—In the course of his debate on foreign policy, in the House of Commons on Monday afternoon, Mr. Eden reiterated the Government's willingness to discuss at an international conference the question of giving former colonies free access to raw materials from Mandated Territories and colonies.

Turning to the question of the transfer of Mandated Territories he said this was a question which would be raised at the appropriate moment. The Government had not considered any other power on the subject, but as far as the British Government was concerned the question would inevitably arise.

The British Government, he said, did not intend to propose a drastic amendment to the main structure of the Covenant and the British Government's principles connected with the positive organization of peace.

It was essential to maintain, and to which the Government was determined, the most important of these principles was the prevention of war, and that included of a number of important elements of which he would mention four, namely, machinery for peaceful settlement of disputes, machinery for international arbitration, the creation of a deterrent to war, and the maintenance of international peace.

During the interim period that might be necessary for the maintenance of the subject the Government would be prepared to take their part in any definite steps which might be taken which might ultimately agree should be taken.

REBELLION DEVELOPING INTO WAR OF ATTRITION

Slaughter Near Gibraltar

ALL GOVERNMENT RESERVES USED UP IN WINNING GUADARRAMA VICTORY?

Government broadcasts from Madrid continue to stress that the rebellion has been mastered. There are reports from the south and central Spain to the effect that heavy fighting, with varying success, has taken place in several areas.

The heavy fighting has been successful in beating back the rebels who have threatened the capital, but it is feared that the rebels have a strong body of reserves which are threatening. The Government has used up its reserves.

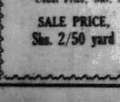

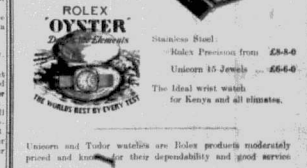

POSTMASTER GENERAL THINKS THERE IS CASE FOR REDUCED CHARGES

The size and colour of some East African stamps are likely to be altered in the near future.

The postage on letters in Uganda and Tanganyika may also be reduced soon, but owing to the financial position in Kenya, the present rates may have to continue to apply to the Colony.

The Postmaster General thinks there is a reasonable case for the reduction of charges for residential telephones and it is suggested that for improved telephone exchanges at Kampala and Mombasa.

New Exchanges Needed

There is every possibility that the recommendations made by the Kenyan Chamber of Commerce as to his meeting in connection with the new name of the East African postage stamps will be adopted by the Postmaster General, Mr. H. H. Holden, who returned to Nairobi last evening after a three weeks' tour of the principal postal centres in Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika.

In an interview with a representative of the "Standard" Mr. Holden stated that all the questions raised by the Chamber of Commerce in regard to the new stamp issue were already receiving the attention of the postal authorities of the three territories. He was discussed by the Chamber, and he felt that the Chamber's recommendations were reasonable and in the interests of the Chamber in the territories.

The Chamber's recommendations were that the size of the East African stamps should be reduced, if possible, without increasing the postal revenue. While agreeing that the ten and 15 cent stamps were too large, Mr. Holden stated that it would be possible to have any of the stamps smaller than the present size, but that the stamps would have to be redesigned to fit the new size. The colouring of the ten cent stamp will be changed to suit the new size, but the design will be kept the same.

Postal Rates. Asked whether there was any prospect of a reduction in the postage rates for letters, Mr. Holden replied that there was a possibility of a reduction in the postage rates for letters in Uganda and Tanganyika, but that in Kenya, owing to the financial position of the Colony's deficit, it was not possible to reduce the rates. He stated that in the three territories, the rates were quite separate, he said, and it was possible to reduce the rates in two territories and not in the third.

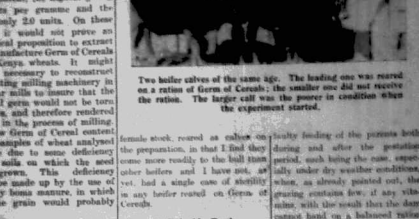

This year has not been too good for the rearing of young stock, from most quarters I have heard the same tale, many fertile eggs and the youngsters not growing as quickly as they should. 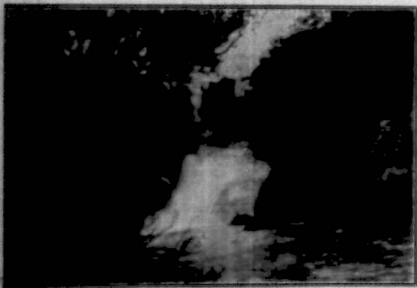

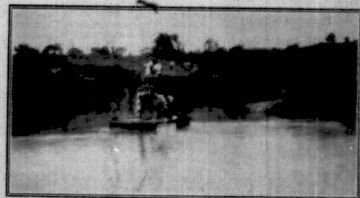
