Trade unionists in the United States have sent forward in favour of Africa doing all she can to help Great Britain, in a letter to the British Government.

A number of leading officials of the American Federation of Labor—one of the two big trade union organizations in the United States—have sent a private document to the Washington Anglo-American financial conference saying that the economic collapse of Great Britain would be "a catastrophe for the freedom-loving world."

They point to the fact that Great Britain through hard work and years of self-denial helped the E.E.P. countries in industrial production and in the rate of her dollar earnings.

Ladybirds wilt in Kenya's dry spells

THIRTEEN years ago Hongkong's name, Ladybirds, was chosen for the beetles from which it was hoped to breed an army which would destroy Kenya's jacaranda blight.

The ladybirds—hyparsipus locosae—were released in the Arboretum and City Park on May 11, 1946, and at first appeared to be doing quite well.

Now, some 13 months later, their numbers are still to be found, but they are still in the areas where they were first released. But they do not appear in any large numbers.

'Uncertain now'

Mr. F. G. H. Peake, the Forest Department's entomologist, says that the ladybirds cannot yet be said to have gained control of the blight, and it is now uncertain whether they ever will.

The Hawaii ladybirds are the only species in the world which do not migrate. There is still hope that future generations may grow to be more suited to the Kenya climate, and long dry spells seem to be hard on the ladybirds, which apparently lay eggs only during the rains. In Kenya only the blight continues to thrive in both rain and drought.

MOMBASA RAISES RENTS FOR RECOVERY OF EXCESS

THREE members of Mombasa Municipal Board opposed the decision of a report on the general purposes committee's decision to enter upon spending on European temporary housing.

Ministry of Health rejects British doctors' claim for extra £16½ millions

CONTRIVERSY between the Ministry of Health and the British Medical Association over the payment of extra £16½ millions for the health service in 1959-60 has been rejected by the Ministry.

The Ministry has actually rejected a claim by the B.M.A. that the sum available for distribution among general practitioners under the National Health Service should be increased to £16,500,000 a year, raising it from the present £14,000,000 to £15,750,000 retrospectively from 1958.

The proposal was made in a memorandum prepared by the B.M.A. in February. The Ministry declined to consider it before making its own investigations.

These have been carried out and the result presented to the General Medical Services Committee of the B.M.A. with the general conclusion of the Ministry.

The Ministry considers the doctors have not justified their claim, that broadly, the remuneration of the general practitioners is adequate.

The next step to be a deputation from the B.M.A. to the Ministry, whose conclusion will be challenged.

It is contended that there is abundant evidence of the satisfactory character of the remuneration paid to general practitioners in terms of effective purchasing power.

Tanganyika call for centralisation

DECENTRALISATION of the Tanganyika Administration and the formation of provincial councils was urged by Mr. E. Cooper when speaking to a Northern Province motion that was unanimously supported by the Nakhosha members of the Association of Chambers of Commerce and Industry of Eastern Africa.

Because of poor communications, he said, the main towns of Tanganyika were having to wait weeks and weeks for instructions from local authorities from Dar es Salaam.

The Acacia 'serotone fiasco' was a typical example. Had the local representative, to whom the matter was finally referred, been empowered to make on the spot decisions for the not very expensive repairs, about six weeks would have been saved.

Centralisation of authority, he claimed, was helping up business and trade in Tanganyika. In major matters the waiting-time imposed upon them was too great. Senior Government officials in the provinces should be given greater authority to enable them to act on their own initiative in some matters, they should have a greater measure of financial responsibility.

Mr. Cooper said he understood the Tanganyika Government was prepared to give a committee of officials representative of all races, provinces and districts, the right to elect members, later by elected members, to the Provincial Councils. A small amount of self-government would result, he argued.

IMMEDIATE STEPS TO HELP BRITAIN

Move to close the dollar gap

CRIPPS SAYS THE RESERVE POSITION 'NOW MANAGEABLE'

HELP for Britain and the co-operation of the United States and Canada to this end was the keynote of the communique in the report which was the result of the Anglo-American financial conference in Washington.

The three Finance Ministers—Sir Stafford Cripps of Britain, Mr. John Snyder of the United States and Mr. Douglas S. Abbott of Canada—announced an agreement to save Britain's gold and dollar reserves by a "satisfactory equilibrium" between the sterling and the dollar by that year, when Marshall Aid is due to end.

The communique contained a ten-point programme to bridge the dollar gap between what Britain buys and what she sells to the rest of the world.

No further cuts in British imports

The programme covers overseas investment, commodity shipments and stockpiling, limitations on items which may be imported under the present Economic Cooperation Administration controls, customs procedures, tariff policy, liberalization of foreign trade and payments, sterling balances, petroleum, shipping and provisions for continuing consultation.

In pursuit of this programme agreement had been reached on the immediate steps. They include, however, that a number of measures requiring closer examination would be under continuing discussion by the three Governments.

Sir Stafford Cripps said that he was not contemplating any further cuts in British imports as a result of the talks.

THE TEN POINTS OF THE 'RESCUE' PROGRAMME

THE ten points of the programme announced in the 2,500-word communique issued after the end of the Washington financial conference were:

ONE—Overseas investments—All three countries will try to increase the investments of American private capital in Britain and vice versa. American specialists for development projects in foreign countries to the World Bank and other international financial institutions.

TWO—Commodity arrangements and stockpiling—Canada and the United States will agree to take steps to increase the stocks of commodities in their own countries and in the United States. SOUTH AFRICA WANTS AN OPEN MARKET FOR GOLD

Fixed and free prices proposed U.S. DISAGREES BUT ACCEPTS COMMITTEE INVESTIGATION

The special "gold committee" appointed by the International Monetary Fund met in Washington yesterday to make a recommendation to the Board of Governors of the Fund on South Africa's move to sell gold on the open market.

The Philippines and possibly Britain will support the South African proposal, which would have the effect of giving Africa's gold to two prices for gold—one fixed and one free.

Australia, without expressly backing her sister Dominion, has announced that she would support a move for a relaxation of the current fixed rate of 35 dollars an ounce.

The South African resolution would authorize the gold-producing members of the Fund to sell their newly-minted gold on the free market and the remainder at the newly-estimated price.

'Britain pressed to devalue the £'

Eight gold-producing countries are represented on the 21-member gold committee. They are Britain and Cyprus, the Colonies—Australia, Canada, India, the Philippines, South Africa, and the United States.

South Africa's proposal, put before the fourth annual meeting of the Governors of the Fund by the Union Finance Minister, Mr. N. C. Havenga, was opposed by Mr. John Snyder, United States Secretary of the Treasury.

Mr. Snyder said he could not at the moment recommend to his Government that there should be any alteration in the 35 dollars an ounce price of gold set by the Fund itself. He had no objection, however, to the proposal being referred to a special committee.

This course was taken and the committee will report back to the Board of Governors before tomorrow.

Mr. Snyder's comments yesterday that great pressure was being brought to bear on Britain to devalue sterling went in a fortnight.

NAIROBI DAM NOW YIELDS UP THE 1947 RAINS

100 million gallons will be for year

ONCE dubbed a white elephant, the Nairobi Dam can now at long last be more appreciably defined on a much smaller scale. For a week or more it has been yielding 250,000 gallons of water a day, bringing the town's total daily supply from all sources to 1,000,000 gallons. At the present rate of draft-off, and assuming there is no rise in the level of the dam due to heavy rain, the total accumulation of 100 million gallons will be exhausted in a year.

Built in 1946 as an emergency reservoir, no provision was made at the time for the reconstruction of the dam to enable the dam to be tapped.

There was some discussion as to whether the dam would ever be used for holding water, but after the heavy rains of April and May 1947, many dams were damaged. It was then decided to provide the installation of a concrete lining of the dam, and initial drainage was proceeding when, through the local authority, the Army engineers were ordered to carry out the work.

After the plan was approved, the dam was closed for a period of several days, and the concrete lining was laid down.

'Highly satisfactory'

NAIROBI DAM NOW YIELDS UP THE 1947 RAINS

100 million gallons will be for year

ONCE dubbed a white elephant, the Nairobi Dam can now at long last be more appreciably defined on a much smaller scale. For a week or more it has been yielding 250,000 gallons of water a day, bringing the town's total daily supply from all sources to 1,000,000 gallons. At the present rate of draft-off, and assuming there is no rise in the level of the dam due to heavy rain, the total accumulation of 100 million gallons will be exhausted in a year.

Built in 1946 as an emergency reservoir, no provision was made at the time for the reconstruction of the dam to enable the dam to be tapped.

There was some discussion as to whether the dam would ever be used for holding water, but after the heavy rains of April and May 1947, many dams were damaged. It was then decided to provide the installation of a concrete lining of the dam, and initial drainage was proceeding when, through the local authority, the Army engineers were ordered to carry out the work.

After the plan was approved, the dam was closed for a period of several days, and the concrete lining was laid down.

SOMALIA'S WEALTH IS GROWING

Development forges ahead NEW INDUSTRIES SPRING UP UNDER BRITISH RULE

THE Italian Colony of Somaliland has been in the news recently with reports of warring parties among the Somalis disputing regarding the future form of administration. It is probable that when the United Nations begins again its attempt to find a solution of the problem of Italy's ex-Colony, Somaliland will be the headlines again.

It is generally included among what was once called "Mussolini's lost colonies" a description which was brought to the Duce's Empire in Africa, but in fact this description does not apply to Somaliland, as it was known to the Italians) something less than half a century ago.

The recent exhibition at Mogadishu gave some encouraging evidence that, with careful development and direction, potential sources of wealth, including a limited range of industries, might be built up. This is a side of Somalia problems which has not been given much publicity since the war. Before that time the Italians, at considerable cost, had created a number of industrial and agricultural projects, including salt and banana, for large export.

SECOND STEP ON ROAD TO SELF-RULE Proclamation on Cyrenaica

The official newspaper, *Somalia Observer*, which is published under the authority of the British Civil Administration, has today announced the economic potentialities of the Territory as a background to the proclamation of the economic life of the Territory, which is limited to agriculture and dependent mainly on pastoral and stock raising. It is pointed out that the land is fertile and has been indicated, up to now the production of milk, and the production of milk from the sea was also indicated in the Mediterranean district.

Barter trade

Mr. W. D. Harwood, head of the Kenya Kyanite and Graphite Association, said that the Government had approved a plan to develop the kyanite and graphite deposits in Kenya. 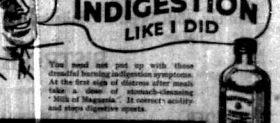
