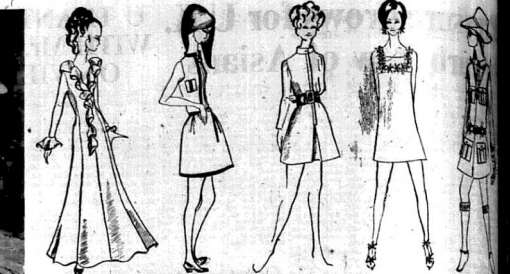

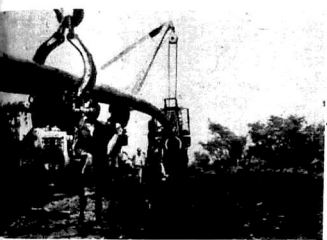

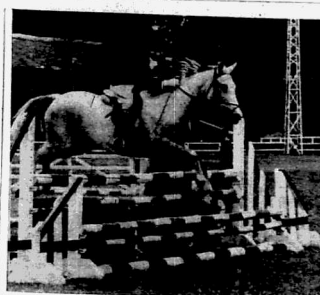
## Delhi may be sympathetic to Kenya Asians

The other systems, dividing the 24 hours into two periods of 12 hours, are a tick and a fong in the afternoon from 3 p.m. The third, Apparent Solar Time, is a pomposity way of saying you tell the time by the sun. Sunrise at a particular place is usually the first hour of the morning and 7 p.m. is usually the first hour of the night, adding one for every hour as the sun and the moon and the stars follow their inexorable courses across the sky.

Old father Time in person was not in the great work of the second century B.C. He was an astronomer living at Naxos and besides inventing trigonometry, he started schooling and he thought up latitude and longitude which started being used all that stuff. How he worked out equinox is not understood. M.C.I. says in summary.

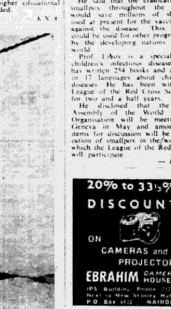

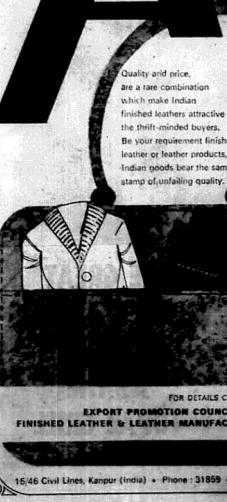

# Arab refugees start return home today

Arab refugees in Jordan will be allowed to start returning to their homes in the Israeli-occupied West Bank today, Israel's State Radio said yesterday.

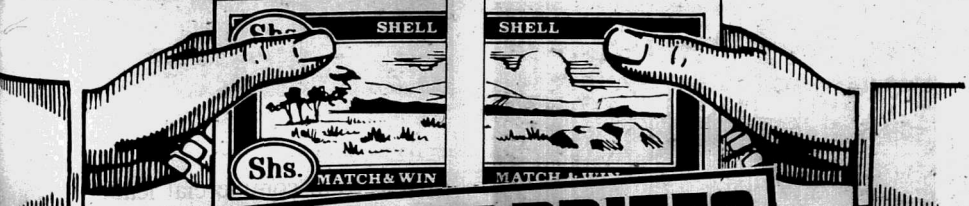

Mr. Fouché is a tough-looking man who in 1948, 1949, and 1950 was in the pocket of the large farm owners who made their money in one year time.

Considered a moderate in politics, he has been a strong proponent of the Afrikaner-Europeans pact, and is a President of whom most English-speaking South Africans disapprove.
