Two-tier system for gold

The International Gold Pool has split the gold market into two, cutting off private speculators from official gold supplies. The move was aimed at stopping the feverish private speculation which threatened to topple the international non-Communist monetary system.

Yesterday despite the move, which was under pressure in Paris, the London gold market - biggest in the world - did not remain closed for two weeks to stabilize the decision in Washington.

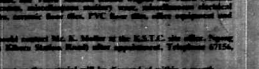

Britain's standard of living was cut back yesterday by the Chancellor Budget the country has had imposed since the end of the Second World War. The Chancellor of the Exchequer, Mr. Roy Jenkins, issued "two years of hard sacrifice".

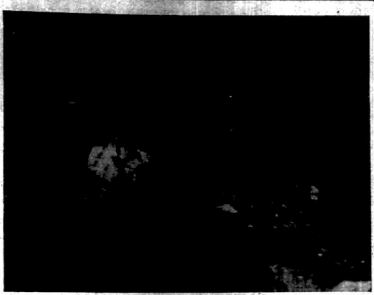

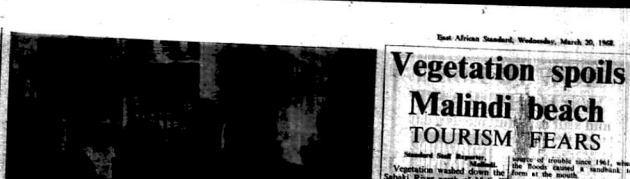

Indonesia and Malaysia draw closer

By Felix Abdiwijaya, Kuala Lumpur.

The promise of another step towards security and stability in South-East Asia springs from talks between the Malaysian Premier, Tunku Abdul Rahman, and Indonesia's leader, General Suharto.

The Tunku's four-day visit to Jakarta appears to have set the seal on the progress made towards rebuilding good relations between the two countries since the collapse of the Sukarno régime early last year.

The rapprochement could not come at a more opportune time for Malaysia, which is facing the withdrawal of British forces.

Friendship with Indonesia, Malaysia's largest and nearest neighbour, is regarded as an important safeguard against aggression, particularly from Communist China.

The highlight of the Tunku's visit was an agreement to conclude a fresh treaty of friendship and co-operation between the two countries in 1970, a pact which replaces the 1959 pact which expired.

Malayan-Indonesian relations today differ from those in 1959 two major respects. Malaysia has been upgraded by the United Nations to full membership.

The terms of the new friendship treaty are almost identical with other's in a paragraph of self-determination and sovereignty and agreed on diplomatic relations.

Also, it was agreed to minimise restriction on travel between and residence within the two countries by nationalising diplomatic missions through diplomatic channels.

Should that fail, the treaty laid down "other other means of settlement which accord with the Charter of the United Nations."

The treaty also provided for harmonisation of Malay and Indonesian languages and promotion of education, culture and sports.

In the land of 'moonshine'

Britain has adopted road-testing tests to determine drinking driving and, in the process, brought about a revolution. People are so scared of getting nabbed driving home from a country pub that they have gone back to the local at the street corner.

After the breathalizer comes the gas chromatograph. This is a device perfected in Guyana as a new weapon against "bush rum", which must be a kind of local moonshine. It is a chromatograph which can detect a moonshine brew by means of a drop of dye, even if such a tiny quantity of the brew is present. Legally produced alcohol, known as Nabalun, purr, moola, wozey or zibibwa in East Africa, acid and orange in the South countries, moonshine is brewed in Guyana in illicit stills.

Since sugarcane grows almost everywhere in the coastal strip, illicitly distilled rum is produced by the peasant folk, while special squads of police and Customs officials keep up a 24-hour watch for bootleggers running away from Georgetown and other populous centres.

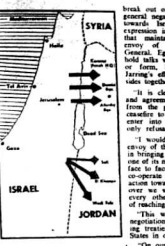

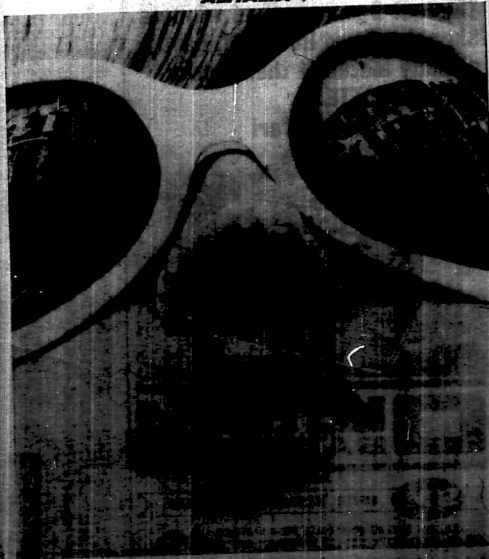

Ring around Rhodesia

During this week, the British Parliament will debate the continuing crisis in Rhodesia, where security forces have been only engaged against guerrilla forces. The encounter has developed into a "little war" as the guerrillas mounted attacks from across the Zambezi River, penetrating further than in any previous action.

Guerrilla leaders in Zambia have described what amounts to a minor invasion as a "vengeance attack" for the execution of the Afrikaners in Salisbury. Exactly where the invaders were trained is uncertain. The report says they came from South Africa and were trained in foreign countries. One of the original 37 who entered Rhodesia in 1966 and is living in asylum in Britain, has said he was trained in Ghana by Chinese instructors.

Although a Zulu spokesman maintained all the guerrillas being used were captured from the Rhodesians, a Press party taken to the scene of operations in the Zambezi Valley was shown Rhodesian automatics, Russian explosives, Czech hand grenades, even an American bazooka and mortars.

The British Defence Minister has described what amounts to a minor invasion as a "vengeance attack" for the execution of the Afrikaners in Salisbury. Militarily, the Rhodesian forces are fully extended to cope with the invaders. Politically, events have led to the formation of a right-wing splinter group with the formation of a pro-partisan party. Its emergence could have the effect of helping Mr. Smith, since it clears his Rhodesian National Front of some extremist, and could readily attract support from moderate frontiers who may not previously have voted for him, but would rally behind him in preference to extremism.

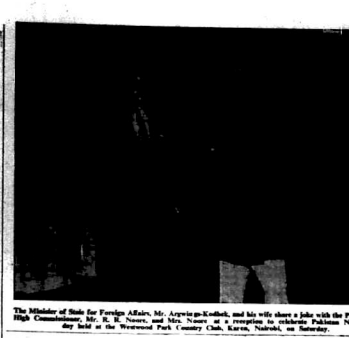

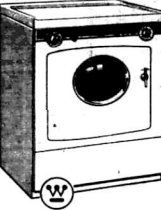
