BURGESS AND MACLEAN CLEANLY

Police wait at London Airport

Detectives waited at London Airport last night to arrest Donald Burgess and Guy Burgess. British diplomats who defected to Russia in 1951 and who were reported to be on the plane from Moscow. British European Airways said they would land during the night.

Warrants for the arrest of both men were issued by a London magistrate earlier in the day under the Official Secrets Act. A Scotland Yard spokesman said there were compelling reasons for supposing that they were contemplating leaving Russia or may have fled.

It is felt that they may be arrested should they come back to the United Kingdom within the jurisdiction of our courts. Arrangements have been applied for and issued for their arrest should they be arrested in any other country.

The first definite news of them after that came from the newspapers in London on August 23, 1951, when Maclean was arrested in the United States. Burgess and Maclean, then aged 42 and 40 respectively, were members of the Foreign Office's American Department in London. Burgess was an executive officer at the British Embassy in Washington.

Officials at the launching site in Florida used colorful language to express their disappointment over the failure of the telemetry system. One said that the signals being received were fibrous and added: "All we have got is an idiot with a radio signal."

It was felt that any further attempt to send commands might deflect Ranger IV off its present collision course with the Moon—the only major result which it was hoped could be obtained from the probe. It is expected to reach its target tomorrow.

Electronic 'surgery' fails

Earlier signals were sent from a tracking station in an attempt to correct the trouble with electronic surgery but it failed. Officials of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration said that Ranger IV held its present course and would travel across the face of the Moon at a height of about 80 miles over the top of a soon from Earth and destroy itself in the dark side. It would not eject its instrument capsule as planned or send back television pictures.

Russians launch another Sputnik

Russia yesterday put a satellite into orbit around the Earth. First reports said it was followed by a second one. The satellite was launched at 10:30 a.m. Moscow time. According to the Soviet press, the satellite was launched from the Baikonur cosmodrome in Kazakhstan. The satellite is expected to orbit the Earth for several months.

U.N. URGED TO GO SLOWLY

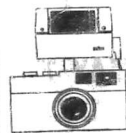

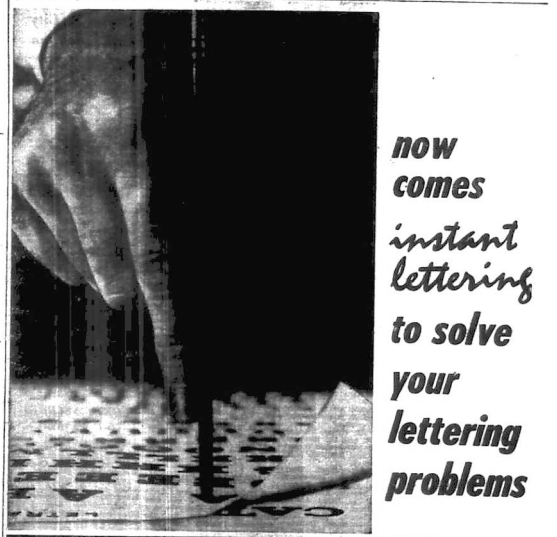

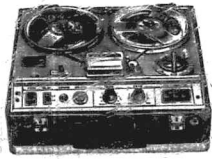
