RWANDA BURUNDI CELEBRATE INDEPENDENCE

Refugees in Uganda a threat

THE United Nations has no intention of abandoning Rwanda and Burundi, which passed from trusteeship status to independence yesterday, a U.N. spokesman said here.

Economic and security conditions in both territories are in a parlous state. The United Nations had voted about \$20,000,000 to be divided between the two countries, though this is less than the amount Belgium has been providing annually.

"There will be this help from the U.N. and we hope it will continue to come from Belgium," the spokesman said. "We will be free to make whatever arrangements they think are necessary for their economic life," the spokesman added.

On security, which represents an even more immediate problem, the U.N. has made no proposals. There is no threat of a U.N. rescue because each other's goods and services are so scarce that the territories would be unable to support themselves.

The United Nations will try to get the two countries, Rwanda, where the Hutu majority was rejected in a referendum last September, and Burundi, where the Tutsi majority was rejected in a referendum last September, to agree on a common constitution and to hold democratic elections next the end of August or September.

Congo marks its second year of independence

THE Congo celebrated its second year of independence yesterday with a military parade, cycle races, soccer matches and official banquets.

However, after two years of self-rule, with United Nations assistance, the republic's major political problem is the accession of Katanga — still appears to be far from solution after last week's breakdown of the talks in Leopoldville between Katanga's President Thombe and the Central Government Prime Minister, Mr. Adoula.

But behind Leopoldville's stability, hidden the Congo now one of Africa's richest nations is struggling to get on its feet. The supply of consumer goods to the interior is down to a trickle, while a major share of the country's valuable exports — coffee, diamonds, uranium and gold — escape across the border from government revenue.

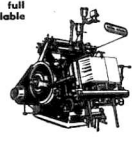

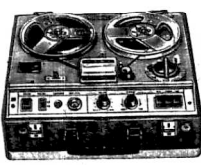

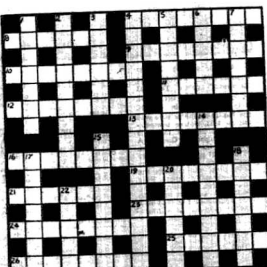

U.S. WANTS UNITY WITH EUROPE

PRESIDENT Kennedy yesterday called for a declaration of interdependence between the United States and the new union emerging in Europe to form "a concrete Atlantic partnership." A United Europe, the President stated, would be a powerful union, capable of building and deterring a community of free nations.

He said the building of the new house of Europe was following the same practical and purposeful course as the United States had followed after it declared its independence. The President declared in an Independence Day address prepared for delivery to the annual conference of the nation's State Governors.

"What I will say to the United States will be that for a century and a half we have been a nation that we will be prepared to discuss the Atlantic partnership in a way and manner of forming a mutually beneficial partnership between the new union emerging in Europe and the old American Union in the first century and three-quarters ago.

"All this will be completed in a year, but let the world know that this is now our goal."

Yoke of poverty
President Kennedy urged Americans to "think interdependence."

He said the United States, acting on its own, could not establish justice throughout the world, meet common defense and other needs. But joined with other free nations, it could do all this and more.

"We can assist the developing nations in their quest for the yoke of poverty. We can balance our world-wide trade and payments at the highest possible level of prosperity."

"We can count on deliberate powerlessness to prevent all aggression. And ultimately we can help to achieve a world peace and free choice, including the world of war and peace."

The President continued: "For the Atlantic partnership, which I speak would not be a yoke of poverty, but a yoke of mutual aid, mutual respect, mutual respect, mutual respect, mutual respect."

Envoys sent out to talk to Army

Two Algerian Provisional Government Ministers left by air yesterday for Morocco via Tunis in an attempt to solve the crisis caused by the withdrawal among newly independent Algeria's leadership.

Mr. Boukhalil on Saturday denounced Mr. Ben Bella as the "traitor" of the Algerian revolution by concluding a "humiliating agreement" with French extremists of the O.A.S.

The gravity of the crisis facing the Provisional Government was stressed by Mr. Boukhalil in a statement that it was a "serious and delicate situation" and that it was a "national emergency" which required the attention of all members of the National Council of the Algerian Revolution.




